PEARL HARBOR, Hawaii (AP)—Navy ships crisscrossed the South China Sea off the coast of Vietnam today but failed to find more of 73 men missing after an Australian carrier cut a U.S. destroyer in two. The bow section of the USS Frank E. Evans sank swiftly after it was rammed by the Melbourne during maneuvers about 240 miles southeast of Saigon just before dawn Tuesday Saigon time.

Defense Department officials said South Korea asked permission to manufacture M16s to speed modernization of its armed forces and to help it meet the requirements of a new military force.

The spokesman emphasized that the Korean production plan would not do away with the M16s for the 40,000 U.S. troops in South Korea.

Defense Department officials said that the M16 rifle is a modern weapon. Only 10,000 M16s have been produced since April.

Separate teams from the department and South Korea's "co-production" of the lightweight, rapid fire M16 rifle have been under way since April.

You Should Know

William D. O'Neill

Manchester Public Works Director William D. O'Neill, 30, said, "I wouldn't have written my life any differently."

Because of his job, people might think he would like to write his life any differently. He sits in one of Manchester's best seats during other things, his office is responsible for the city's notorious roads, oversized sewage system and short water supply.

Still, he insists he likes the job and the form. Something is being done about all major problems, and the people they have worked with with him, he said.

The story he would not re-write began in Cutton, Mass., where he was born in 1938. He grew up in the small town and went on to the University of Massachusetts.

He received his BS in civil engineering from UMass in 1962. He then joined the Army Corps of Engineers.

After getting the officers' commission transferred to the U.S. Coast and Geodetic Survey office. The little known uniformed part of the service has only 300 officers, and most are engineers. They make numerous charts mapping the ocean floor. Charting the ocean took him down to look at crew. They worked Long Island Sound while he was with them.

He applied for the Great Up-derwater Swimming School in Key West, Fla., where he was assigned to two ships which dragged wires to look for wrecks. The wires hit an object below the surface, O'Neill would drive down to look at it. They worked Long Island Sound while he was with them.

He received hazardous duty pay.

All the training and mapping took just over two years, and O'Neill was discharged as a lieutenant junior grade in October 1962.

That fall he married the former Miss Cheryl Minkas, a math graduate of UMass. She was working as a computer programmer at Pratt & Whitney research labs.

Three weeks after the marriage was an assistant town engineer in Windsor.

A lot happened to O'Neill in Windsor.

He passed the first test on his way to gaining the professional registration from the state in June 1963.

His first son, Ian, was born. Then, he began working on an MBA in relationship with the U.S. Coast and Geodetic Survey.

Soon after, he won a \$1,000 prize for his research paper, "I promptly spent it," he recalled.

In the summer of 1965, he took the second and final test to get his state registration. His friends told him that the exam results came in a shiny envelope, but the envelope he might as well throw it away unopened.

The summer was skiny. O'Neill opened it anyway. He had passed, but the state did not send his registration papers. They were coming in a later mailing.

As though to celebrate his daughter, Kathleen, was born just weeks later.

After his short but fruitful stay in Windsor, he became South Windsor's town engineer in August 1965. Because the town did not have a planner or a public works director, O'Neill wore several hats.

South Windsor also did not have sanitary sewer systems. Town leaders said they needed sewers and O'Neill's most pressing job was to help plan a sewer system to include a treatment plant.

His sewer plans were passed by town voters in 1966. The town has been grateful enough to leave O'Neill's name on the plaque to go in the treatment building despite his "itchy feet."

O'Neill left South Windsor to come to Manchester in April 1967.

"He did a tremendous job for us," according to Terry V. Spewak, South Windsor town manager. "That's the reason Bob Weiss (Manchester town manager) stole him," he said jokingly.

Among the many items of business to be considered by the Manchester Board of Directors tonight is one for allocating \$40,000 toward the purchase of an 11-acre parcel of land for refuse disposal purposes.

The parcel, contiguous to the present sanitary landfill area, would be purchased from Kohn Bros. The actual purchase, when made, would be by ordinance, to comply with the town charter.

The \$40,000, added to \$15,000 already in the budget for landfill purposes, would be the cash portion of the proposed transaction.

The transfer would also involve the closing of a 4-acre parcel to Kohn Bros., in the same area, and filed about five years ago, plus granting a right-of-way for a road from Olcott St.

The proposed \$40,000 allocation would come from the current Capital Improvement Reserve Fund.

The board will be asked by Town Manager Robert Weiss to allocate next year's Capital Improvement funds also. He is recommending a 12 percent increase which would account for all but \$12,000 of the \$49,200 not aside for 1969's capital improvements.

An item which may produce considerable discussion tonight is a proposed amendment to the town ordinance which created the 23-member Village and Redevelopment Authority. The proposal is for raising its membership to 50, to provide sufficient representation for participating in the two-year CDAEP (Community Development Action Plan) study.

Tonight's meeting is at 8 p.m. in the Municipal Building Hearing Room.

Better Guns Planned for Jet Fighters

WASHINGTON (AP) — Faster-firing, harder-hitting guns are being planned for U.S. jet fighters because of dramatic progress made by North Vietnamese pilots against American planes.

Air Force work on developing the gun will start in the coming fiscal year and the weapon will be installed in the F16, a jet fighter designed to give the U.S. air superiority over any Russian-built jets in the 1970s.

Dr. John S. Foster, the Pentagon's research chief, disclosed recently that North Vietnamese fighter pilots were hitting U.S. war planes on almost even terms in the latter stages of the air war.

Foster told Congress: "During our operations over North Vietnam in 1967 we commanded a five-one-one aircraft carrier in air-to-air combat."

Approval of the measure came after rejection by a 16-12 vote margin of an amendment to the bill to permit games regulated by the State Department.

The main objection to such promotional bills was that many were "fraudulent and deceitful" and the cost was ultimately paid by the customer, said Sen. Jay Jackson, co-chairman of the Commerce Committee.

Seized Papers Show Cong Admit Reversals

SAIGON (AP) — Piles of captured documents show the Communist high command in Vietnam is acknowledging grave battlefield reversals, but insisting its forces still occupy "the most advantageous position."

Plans have been drawn for a series of summer and fall offensives which the Reds hope will drive that latter point home to the United States and to the world.

Extensive documentation indicates that the prime fear of Hanoi is a united front between the young government may emerge.
