Volpe Says Car Airbags Must by '72

NEW YORK (AP) - Transportation Secretary John A. Volpe wants all new automobiles to come with "airbags" - a balloon-like device that inflates to protect passengers in event of a crash.

Volpe told an Automotive Safety Foundation luncheon Tuesday: "I would think by 1972, they should be a must."

The secretary said the Nixon administration was prepared to "fight tooth and nail" with automobile manufacturers if they don't step up safely efforts.

"I would hope they do it voluntarily," he said, "but if they don't I can get tough." He said the federal government might require installation of airbags if car makers were reluctant to do so voluntarily.

Man Hunts Falsely, But Woman Gathers

WASHINGTON — The truth about man hunting is that if it weren't for the women, everybody would go hungry.

It's no recent development, either, for it's doubtful that even our remotest ancestors were unable to make with what the boys brought back from their hunting trips.

Dr. Iren DeVore, associate professor of Anthropology at Harvard University, is the man responsible for this latest look at the image man likes to have of himself. The chances are that DeVore is telling the women as nothing they didn't suspect, but men may never speak well of him again.

DeVore is a student of the bushmen of Borneo and wherever, and he has observed a skill called "hunter-gatherer" society at first hand.

A "hunter-gatherer" society is one in which the men go out and hunt and the women go out and "gather" stuff like roots and herbs, and nuts and beans.

Tolland Developers May Withdraw Bald Hill Apartment Plans

Plans for a proposed apartment complex on Bald Hill Rd. will probably be withdrawn by developers Henry Adams and Fred Blaw.

The proposal was discussed during Monday night's meeting of the Planning and Zoning Commission. In attempting to correct situations which were the cause of objections by residents of the area, developers found it necessary to change the entrance route.

This would necessitate the construction of a road leading from Rt. 74 into the area to be developed. When informed by the PZC that the road would have to conform with town road regulations, even though it would be privately maintained, the developers claimed the project would become financially unfeasible.

Man Hunters Falsely, But Woman Gathers

WASHINGTON — The truth about man hunting is that if it weren't for the women, everybody would go hungry.

It's no recent development, either, for it's doubtful that even our remotest ancestors were unable to make with what the boys brought back from their hunting trips.

Dr. Iren DeVore, associate professor of Anthropology at Harvard University, is the man responsible for this latest look at the image man likes to have of himself. The chances are that DeVore is telling the women as nothing they didn't suspect, but men may never speak well of him again.

DeVore is a student of the bushmen of Borneo and wherever, and he has observed a skill called "hunter-gatherer" society at first hand.

A "hunter-gatherer" society is one in which the men go out and hunt and the women go out and "gather" stuff like roots and herbs, and nuts and beans.

It turns out that the operative word here is "gatherer." Like roots and herbs, and nuts and beans, the women go out and hunt and hunt for game, and occasionally bring back stuff, DeVore reports, but it is not much.

DeVore has studied animal societies, too, and he threw in what he has learned about the women and children live on is gathered by the women.

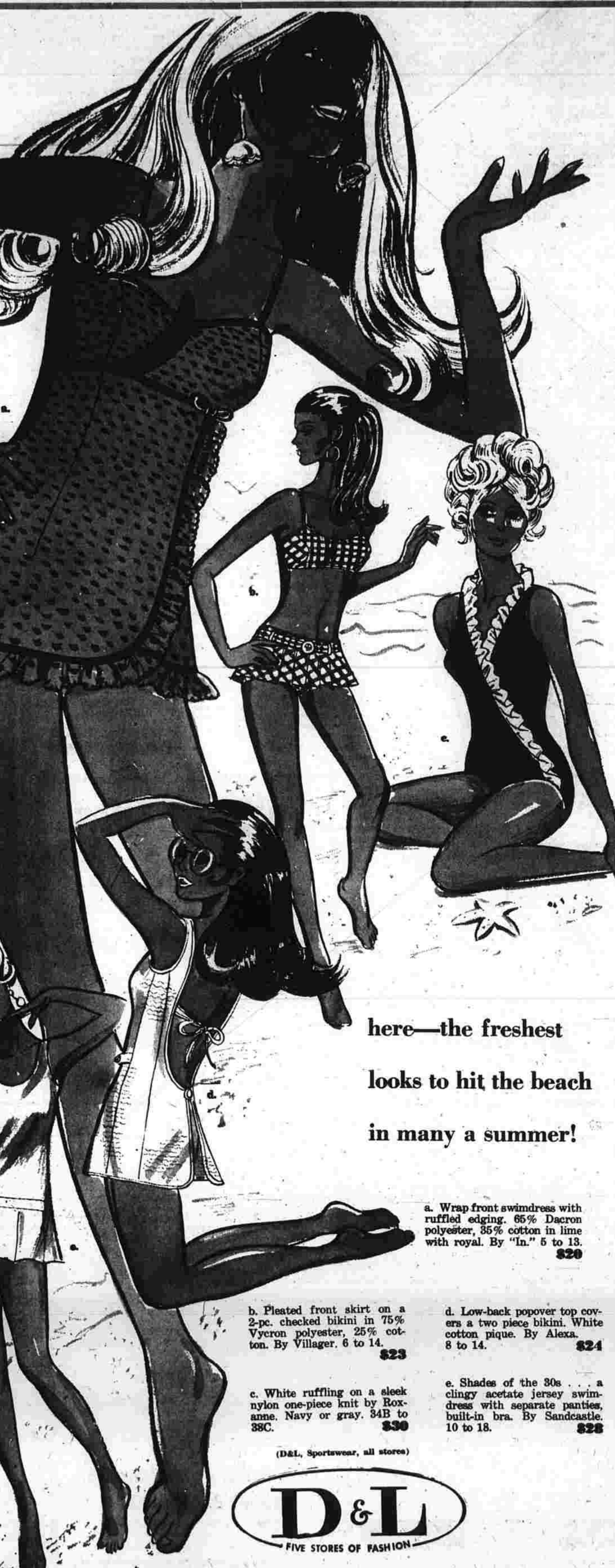

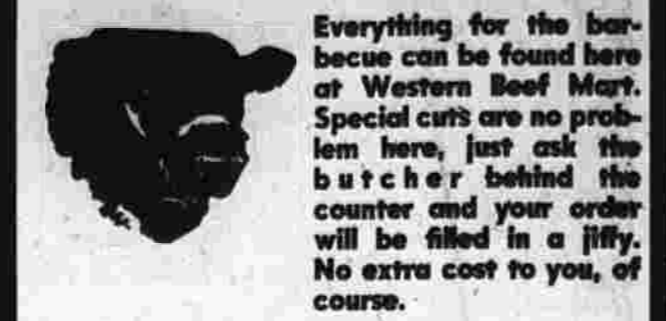

ESCS Students Revamp Courses Without Protests

WILMINGTON, Conn. (AP)—Without fanfare, demonstration or confrontation, the students at Eastern Connecticut State College here have quietly and unopposedly revamped the entire curriculum on their campus.

Students submitted proposals and engaged in discussions with faculty and administration officials over the changes—designed to cut the number of background required courses in half that vastly increase the number of elective courses a student can take.

The revised curriculum eliminated the language requirements for all undergraduates, cutback the physical education requirements and also cut the number of credit hours required for graduation, from 128 to 120.

Many of the 1,800 students at Eastern had complained that more than half their college years, 75 credit hours, was being spent in background courses. There was not enough time for personal enrichment, they said, when they had opportunity to take only 17 elective courses that were independent of their major fields.

The recommendations were presented for ratification to a specially expanded college council of administrators, students and faculty.

The council also received special reports of campus opinion. They showed overwhelming support for change.

The students, many of whom become public school teachers after graduation, felt that the curriculum structure at Eastern did not properly prepare them to teach the upcoming generation to act intelligently. The curriculum was "worded out of the old Latin schools," they said.

The revised curriculum will apply to all undergraduates starting in September.

—By the first Americanizing of the war and now attempting to de-Americanize it, the United States has been driven into a dilemma: how to withdraw its troops without jeopardizing the confidence of its allies.

—One high-level document saw these three alternative possibilities for Vietnam's future:

The United States will force the South Vietnamese to end the war and maintain only a limited army; it will protect the war, hoping to strengthen the South Vietnamese in order to negotiate a solution by superior force.

—Continued American casualties will increasingly distinguish the U.S. public.



Nigerians Grow Weary Of Dowries

LAGOS —There is growing dissatisfaction among many Nigerians against the dowry system of marriage—an age-old custom in many parts of the country whereby a man pays a certain amount to the family of the woman he is marrying. This form of dowry can be paid either in cash or in kind, or both. It has gone up from the token payment it was many years ago to a staggering levy, now believed to be keeping many young men from marrying. It is significant, though, that among those urging the scrapping of this custom are women—who should normally benefit from it, since the dowry is either given to them for their use or shared by members of their family.

A group of African Women, meeting last year in Accra, Ghana, to discuss the rights of women, condemned the system because it gives the impression that the wife is being bought. Even so many of them, and the men also, will not resist the continuation of the system, if only to preserve the tradition—provided the amount paid is not exorbitant.

The bride price is an essential aspect of traditional African marriage; it has the same symbolism as the ring in Western Marriages. In the past, the dowry was meant to be a token compensation to the parents for their trouble in bringing up their daughter. Because of this, young girls were jealously guarded their virginity in order not to lower their marriageable value.

In Nigeria the system varies depending on the particular area of the country along the Plateau of the Middle Belt. It is usual to pay dowries with cattle, and the wealth of the bridegroom is determined by the number of his herd.

Among the Yorubas of Western Nigeria the payment of dowry is made in both cash and in kind. Besides a cash payment of not less than 40 shillings (4.00 dollars) and not more than 100 shillings (10 dollars), the bridegroom must give the parents a bottle of honey, a stipulated number of kola nuts, drama, some bottled drinks (beer, wine, aperitif), a Bible and an engagement ring.

In addition—it depends on how wealthy the groom—the money is given to the bride for wedding preparations, making marriage a rather expensive item for the young Yoruba.

In most parts of Iboland parents demand money from suitors depending on the quality or value of their daughters. For instance, an illustrious girl could fetch her parents about 135 dollars while the girl with a high school education commands a dowry of about 400 dollars.

A dowry of as much as 1,300 dollars could be demanded for a girl with university or professional training. One explanation to this system of high bride prices is that not all the money has to be paid at once. The men are allowed to pay in installments—even after the marriage takes place.

The irony of it all is that, in the long run, it is the woman who pays the bride price. Her bonds inevitably make them work for it by engaging them in some petty trade or even farming.

According to sociologists, the evil of the dowry system of marriage is that while the man tends to look down on the woman and therefore deny her certain basic rights, it has also led to increased break-up of family life. Not even the deliberate raising of divorce fees has kept the alarming rate of separations down.

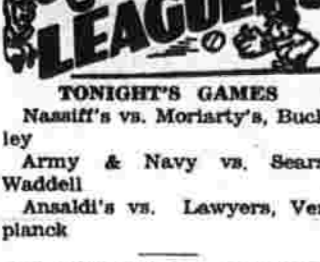

Proxmire Objects To Nixon's View Of Defense Critics

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. William Proxmire, D-Wis., attempted to limit a speech recognizing the value of the military budget in American life. Proxmire, who is chairman of a joint Senate-House economic subcommittee holding hearings on the military budget and national priorities, objected to what he termed Nixon's strong language. "We really need a new way of doing business," Proxmire said. "Do we really need more than 600 major overseas bases, many of which are kept open because of inertia or by habit?" Proxmire asked Nixon to expand military force instead of a more vigorous dedication of our resources to our domestic programs.

Rogers Says Saigon Training Troops Fast

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of State William P. Rogers said today that the training of South Vietnamese forces to take over more combat and release American troops is "moving along at a rapid pace." Rogers also told a news conference in response to questions about peace negotiations in Vietnam that "We're not wedded to any government in Saigon." "We're wedded to the principle that the people of South Vietnam will decide their own future," he said.

Jet Crash Kills 79, Tennis Champ Dead

MONTREY, Mexico (AP) — Seventy-nine persons, including Mexico's hope for the Davis Cup and a former president of the nation's tennis team, were believed to have died in the crash of a Mexican jetliner on a mountain. A helicopter pilot who flew over the wreckage of the Mexican de Avianca plane, which crashed on the mountain 30 miles west of Monterey and was still burning hours after the crash. He said there was no chance anyone survived and no signs of life in the cloud-covered mountain.

Blasts Level DuPont Buildings

CARNEYS POINT, N. J. (AP) — A series of chain-reaction blasts, their origin still a mystery, ignited more than 100 tons of gunpowder Wednesday, leveling three storage buildings at the DuPont Co.'s explosive plant and killing at least four men. Three others are missing and presumed dead. The structures in which the seven men were moving burst bags of powder like sacks of potatoes just disappeared, leaving only shallow craters on soft grassy marshland along the Delaware River. They were destroyed, corrupted from buildings, 30 by 60 feet.

Gasoline Leak Causes Hazard

WINONA, Minn. (AP) — A gasoline leak, estimated at several thousand gallons, escaped from an oil barge docked in this Mississippi River city Wednesday night, sparking what an engineer called a "potentially dangerous quantity of gas into the river." But a Winona fire department spokesman said that although the gasoline would break up in heavy current between Winona and La Crosse, Wis. Robert Norfleet, chief engineer for Towing Co., owner and operator of the barge, said Wednesday night by lantern light he was discovered unloading the barge in Winona. He said the gas was leaking from a valve and warned that it was "extremely dangerous." (See Page Sixteen)
