**Proxmire Objects To Nixon's View Of Defense Critics**

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. William Proxmire, D-Wis., said today that the House subcommittee's speech recognizing the value of the military budget in American life.

Proxmire, who is chairman of a joint Senate-House economic subcommittee holding hearings on the military budget and national priorities, objected to what he termed Nixon's strong language.

Wednesday in a speech on national defense, Nixon said "new technologies" were posing a false choice between meeting responsibilities at home and abroad.

Proxmire protested that Nixon was trying to intimidate "those who question whether America's role in the world can be best served by a large and expanding military force" instead of a more vigorous dedication of our resources to our domestic programs.

Proxmire issued the statement at his subcommittee's hearing.

He said the President's speech recognized the value of the military budget in American life.

"This committee is trying to ask the right questions," Proxmire said. He listed these as: "Do we really need a new nuclear arms race? Are we sitting ducks for missiles or modern submarines, merely because the Navy has always had 15 capital ships?"

"Do we really need more than 600 major overseas bases, many of which are kept open because of inertia or by history?"

Proxmire also asked: "What is the role of the military in the world today? Should we be spending more on the military than on education, health care, and other domestic programs?"

Proxmire issued the statement at his subcommittee's hearing.

**Dempsey Vetoes Tax Plan, Calls Special Session Soon**

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP) — A special session of the General Assembly will be called later this month, Gov. John Dempsey announced Wednesday night as he rejected the tax program enacted by the legislature.

The governor vetoed a bill containing a 6 per cent sales tax and then went before the House and Senate in joint session to tell the legislators he would be meeting them again soon.

"When we met last January to begin this session of the General Assembly," he said, "it was clear that fiscal problems would be our major concern. These problems continue to be our major concern tonight, and share with each of you a deep sense of regret that we have been unable to far to solve them."

Dempsey indicated he thought a one-day session would be adequate if the legislative leaders and he could reach agreement on the shape of the tax increase package.

In his veto message sent to Secretary of the State Ellis T. Gramso, the governor said that a 6 per cent sales tax is a rate which is simply too much to ask of the citizens of Connecticut.

Dempsey, however, had proposed the budget message in February to raise a good deal more money through sales tax—than the legislative leaders of his own party had proposed to raise with a 6 per cent levy.

Although the governor's original proposal was for a 5 per cent sales tax, he recommended extending it to cover persons or services such as laundries, dry cleaning, auto repairs, hairdressing, restaurant meals under \$1, utility bills, fuel oil, magazines, and other items and services which the legislative leaders proposed to keep exempt from the sales tax.

Dempsey's 6 per cent tax would have raised about \$75 million more during the coming fiscal year than the legislature's 5 per cent proposal, "most widespread public opinion," he said.

**Look Back At Session**

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP) — There may be nothing more certain than death and taxes, but there was nothing more certain in the 1968 General Assembly than the ultimate shape of the tax package.

In fact, that package will have yet to be wrapped, although the legislature has adjourned.

Gov. John Dempsey has vetoed a 6 per cent sales tax enacted by members of his own party (although it was a much higher sales tax than the more widely-applied 5 per cent sales tax he had proposed, early in the session) and has announced that a special session of the legislature will be held later this month.

Somehow or other, after months of uncertainty over the nettlesome tax question, the Democratic legislature wound up with a tax program which the Democratic governor disapproved of.

Perhaps the showdown of Wednesday night could have been avoided, but the fact is that it wasn't—although the legislature and the governor were not so terribly far apart.

Dempsey did agree to the state of the General Fund budget enacted by the General Assembly—although it was some \$200 million smaller than his own original budget.

In one of his most recent political moves of the session, the Democratic legislators undercut Republican criticism by passing a budget only slightly bigger than the one offered by the GOP.

And the governor was reportedly willing to go along with a 5.5 per cent sales tax—supplemented by other tax increases which were not in the legislative leaders' package.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of State William P. Rogers said today that the United States and South Vietnamese forces to take over more combat—and release American troops—along a rapid pace.

**Jet Crash Kills 79, Tennis Champ Dead**

MONTREY, Mexico (AP) — Seventy-nine persons, including Mexico's hope for the Davis Cup and a former president of the nation's ruling party, were believed to have died in the crash of a Mexican jetliner on a mountain.

A helicopter pilot who flew over the wreckage of the Mexican de Avionacion plane, said the debris was scattered across the side of the mountain 30 miles west of Monterrey and was still burning hours after the crash today.

He said there was no chance anyone survived and no signs of life in the cloud-covered mountain.

Rescue workers were within eight miles of the crash site today, but bad weather and rugged terrain halted them Wednesday night.

Military authorities said soldiers, police and volunteers would try to climb the mountain today and recover the bodies.

**Blasts Level DuPont Buildings**

**Biafra Set To Release 18 Oilmen**

Portugal, one of the secessionist state's most important allies, protested the death sentences Tuesday in what a government spokesman described as "the strongest possible language."

The oilmen were captured by the Biafrans last month in the month of November. They were working on a drilling job for AGIP, an oil exploration firm run by the Italian state petroleum company and Phillips Petroleum Co. of Bartlesville, Okla.

LOS ANGELES — Sometimes when Elizabeth Evans brushes her hair she forgets, and the brittle smile roughly across the Z-shaped scar at her hairline. The pain is fierce, but brief.

Sometimes she pushes back her bangs and stares at it in her mirror. That way, the Z looks like an 8, and then she thinks of the man who put it there.

It's Goldenberg's recurring pain in his left leg, and it goes numb if he walks far. Ducting is out, of course, and even the pain to work causes it to dilate and he limps a few minutes after getting out of his car. As he limps along, he thinks of the man who did this to him.

Irwin Stroll has a bum left leg, too. It trembles up on him sometimes when he's walking and he has to stomp it to restore feeling and movement. Once he nearly fell downstairs when went numb.

"I can tell you now when it's going to rain," he offers cheerfully. Whenever a rain is brewing, he thinks about the man who turned his leg into a barometer.

William Weisel has a near a foot long across his stomach. Every time he takes his clothes off, the scar reminds him of the stranger who inflicted it.

**CRPA Study \$403 Million 50-Year Need For Utilities**

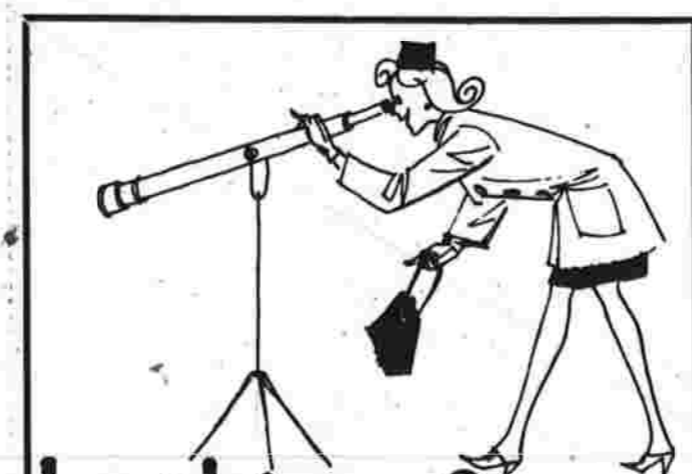

# They Fought a Dam and Won, The Valley Is Theirs Again

COVLEIGH, Calif. — They won their battle and life is returning to normal for the residents of Round Valley, an agricultural and lumber community 180 miles north of San Francisco.

# Thieu Courting Flexibility For Meeting, Aides Say

Behind this expressed attitude is the fear that Thieu's regime couldn't win a confrontation with the Communists at the political base of his own, and the country's political parties are splintered. The Communists are closely disciplined and could be expected to vote as a block, larger than any of the government factions can command.

In an attempt to remedy this potentially dangerous situation, Thieu launched May 25 his "National Social Democrat Front", which he hopes to build into an effective party. But the front is only in the spade-work stage. Operating regulations and an "action program" have yet to be worked out.

"We are moving but it is a slow process and we need more time," said one high official. "Grazing work has really not begun."

Thieu also is dubious about Nixon's proposal that an "inter-national body" supervise the elections he called for. The proposal requires more precision before the Thieu government can buy it, aides said.

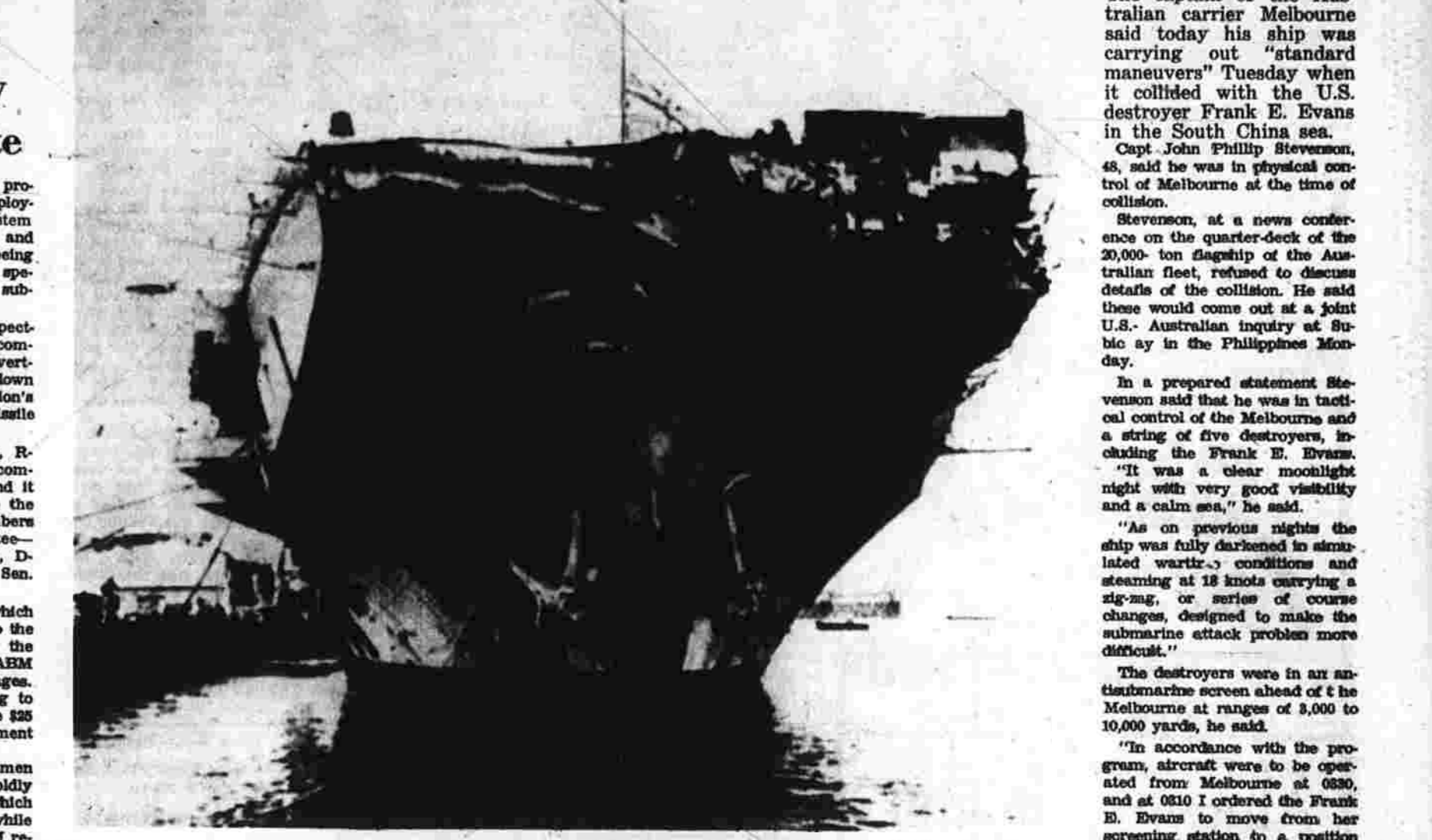
