Alleged Victim Of Kidnap Held In Fatal Shooting

WHITE PLAINS, N.Y. (AP)—A kidnapping charge against a Stamford, Conn. man has been dropped after his alleged victim, a New York state trooper, was arrested for murder. The Stamford resident, Charles G. DeVeaux, had already been tried on the charge, but when the jury failed to agree a mistrial was declared in January. Trooper William Hilliard had identified DeVeaux as one of two men who kidnaped him at gunpoint last August. He testified the trunk of his own car and used the car to commit a \$22,000 bank robbery before abandoning the car with Hilliard still in the trunk. Papers filed in Westchester County Court by the prosecutor asked Judge George Belsheim to dismiss all charges against DeVeaux "in light of an interpretative opinion as to the reliability of the people's witness." The judge dismissed the charges Wednesday. Hilliard was put under arrest March 17 in the fatal shooting of a 10-year-old boy whose nude body was found in a pool of water occupied by Hilliard, police said.
