Vernon Society Misleads the Young On Drug Danger, Court Told

Society itself misleads the young by not taking a definite stand on marijuana, asserted an attorney defending a youthful offender in Superior Court yesterday.

Atty. Joseph E. Fazzano of Hartford said that instead of a family's rejecting over a son's college graduation and marriage which took place a few weeks ago these occasions were ruined by a tragic day in court, and all because John J. LaBreaque, 20, had smoked marijuana.

Fazzano called the drug "insidious" and said that young people have the attitude "It's illegal but it's nothing." He blamed this on news media, the government and on all who suggested that the drug might be harmless.

For LaBreaque, 20-year-old, the penalty is three months in jail. The rest of his sentence of one year on each of three counts of possession of controlled drugs, to run concurrently, was suspended and he will be on probation for two years.

Another youth, 20-year-old Frank B. Yoo of East Hartford, was found to be seriously drug dependent. He was committed to the care of the Commissioner of Mental Health.

Three Vernon 18-year-olds who made a temporary escape from deputy sheriffs cover a year ago now face this charge in Superior Court.

## All About Haiti

PORT AU PRINCE, Haiti (AP) — The car wheeling through crowded Desallines Avenue bore a sign in the rear window: "For sale, need the money to buy gasoline."

This was a humorous jab at government taxes and the price of gasoline. Including a 15-cent tax, it sells for 60 cents a gallon. That amount is almost a day's wage in the city; most peasants never see 50 cents cash in a lifetime.

It was also a risky thing of some significance. The price of open criticism of the Haitian regime often is more exacting: exile, imprisonment or death. But this driver, sign and all, was still about Port au Prince trying to sell the car several days later.

Some frequent visitors to this beautiful but turbulent nation regard the episode as one of various hints of a softening of the iron hand with which François "Papa Doc" Duvalier has ruled Haiti since 1957. They're asking why.

After eight small invasions at sea, three air attacks and countless conspiracies, Papa Doc, some believe, may have worn out his enemies at home and abroad. The terror and bloody repression that marked Haiti's "first decade of political consolidation" seem abated. Port au Prince is one of the few hemispheric capitals without armed military patrols in its main streets. Diplomats and world travelers say this mountain-ringed city, at once shabby and breathtakingly attractive, is the safest anywhere, night and day, even in its worst slums.

Yet an overpowering sense of implacable authority pervades the atmosphere like the blanket of steam that settles over the city's lower levels on a muggy summer afternoon. Dictatorial authority is invested in Papa Doc, a 5-foot-4 medical doctor, now 62 years old, whose activities have been curtailed since May 8 by what associates describe as a mild heart attack, his second in a decade.

"He is determined to live out his term of office," wryly observed one official. Papa Doc had himself proclaimed president for life in 1964. Duvalier went on radio June 5 to criticize the latest exile effort against him, a bungled fire-bombing air attack that destroyed a dozen peasant shacks and drew scorn from even die-hard anti-Duvalierists.

Duvalier is the third chief of state to govern Haiti, which in 1804 became the second Western Hemisphere country to overthrow its European masters. Prior to Papa Doc, 23 chiefs of state were overthrown and 30 constitutions adopted and discarded.

Haiti shares the island of Hispaniola with the Dominican Republic, which occupies the less mountainous, potentially more prosperous two-thirds. Some folks say: "Haiti is rich in Haiti." With 415 persons per square mile, this is the most densely populated country in the hemisphere.

Ninety per cent of the people are farmers, most of them owners of a patch of land on which they somehow manage to scrape up a bleak existence growing coffee, the main export crop, or cacao, corn or sugarcane. The little farmer averages one bag of coffee a season. He gets about \$15 for that.

There is evidence of the political and economic quarantine of Haiti is being lifted quietly, not because Duvalier has become more palatable, but because isolation pushes the population toward famine.

Assistance in substantial amounts is being channeled through the United Nations, the Organization of American States and international relief agencies. It's visible in the rural aid programs under way and in the number of foreign technicians who have taken up residence in Port au Prince.

Molise Kones, an Israeli agronomist working for the Pan American Union, helps peasants improve their farming methods. "We don't tell the peasant that what he's doing is wrong," says Kones. "He's been doing it his way for centuries. So, we try to improve on what he does and when he sees the difference in results, he enthusiastically adopts our methods."

Kones has been in Haiti six months among what he calls "the gentlest, finest people on earth."

Once a week, hundreds of peasants, as many as 5,000 in a single day, walk or ride donkeys and mules to the village of Petion Riviere for tetanus shots. A sponsored program rallies the people in the central plaza and, emotionally prepared the crowd, mostly women, for the session with the "jeu" Creole name for the needle.

Every dawn, Monday through Friday, bus fleets of Oceanide, N.Y., jeeps over badly rutted roads into the dusty rural areas to help with the tetanus campaign. She is a research associate with Columbia University's International Institute for the Study of Human Reproduction.

There are also "God is good," Faith survives, even in Haiti.

And after their protest conditions and express a desire to leave the country. "We would like this information to reach the Black Panther party in the United States so the party will know the revolutionary way we are being treated," he said. "We want them to protest at Cuban missions everywhere."

The only Cuban mission in the United States is at the United Nations. Johnson said he was jailed for 21 days after he hijacked a National Airlines jet from New Orleans to Havana on Nov. 4, 1968. "We think there's racial discrimination in Cuba," he said. "It's a peculiar kind of racial discrimination. In some ways it's comparable to attitudes in the United States. White Cubans have a subconscious conspiracy to maintain control of the island."

## Moscow Reported Ready To Offer Mid-East Plan

By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS, CAIRO (AP) — A close confidant of President Gamal Abdel Nasser said today the Soviet Union seems with present cooperation to be ready to offer a 13-point U.S. peace plan for the Middle East.

Moscow's offer, said Nasser's confidant, was in response to a Soviet peace plan for the Middle East which Nasser said he had discussed with Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei A. Gromyko during his four-day visit to Cairo last week.

He said the Soviet Union was ready to offer a "gentlemen's agreement" between the Arab and Soviet governments, which would guarantee Israel's security. He also said the Soviet Union had agreed to a "just and final peace."

The U.S. peace plan was presented to Soviet officials May 28 in Washington. It is believed to contain a call for Israel withdrawal from the Sinai peninsula it occupied during the 1957 war in return for some sort of contractual agreement with the Arabs that guarantees Israel's security.

Earlier this week in Washington, it was reported the Soviet Union had replied to the U.S. plan but whether the Soviet role contained the counterproposal mentioned by Nasser was not clear.

In Jerusalem Premier Golda Meir reflected the skepticism Israel shows to peace efforts by the big powers. She said Israel would reject "empty formulas" as no alternative for a "just and final peace."
