

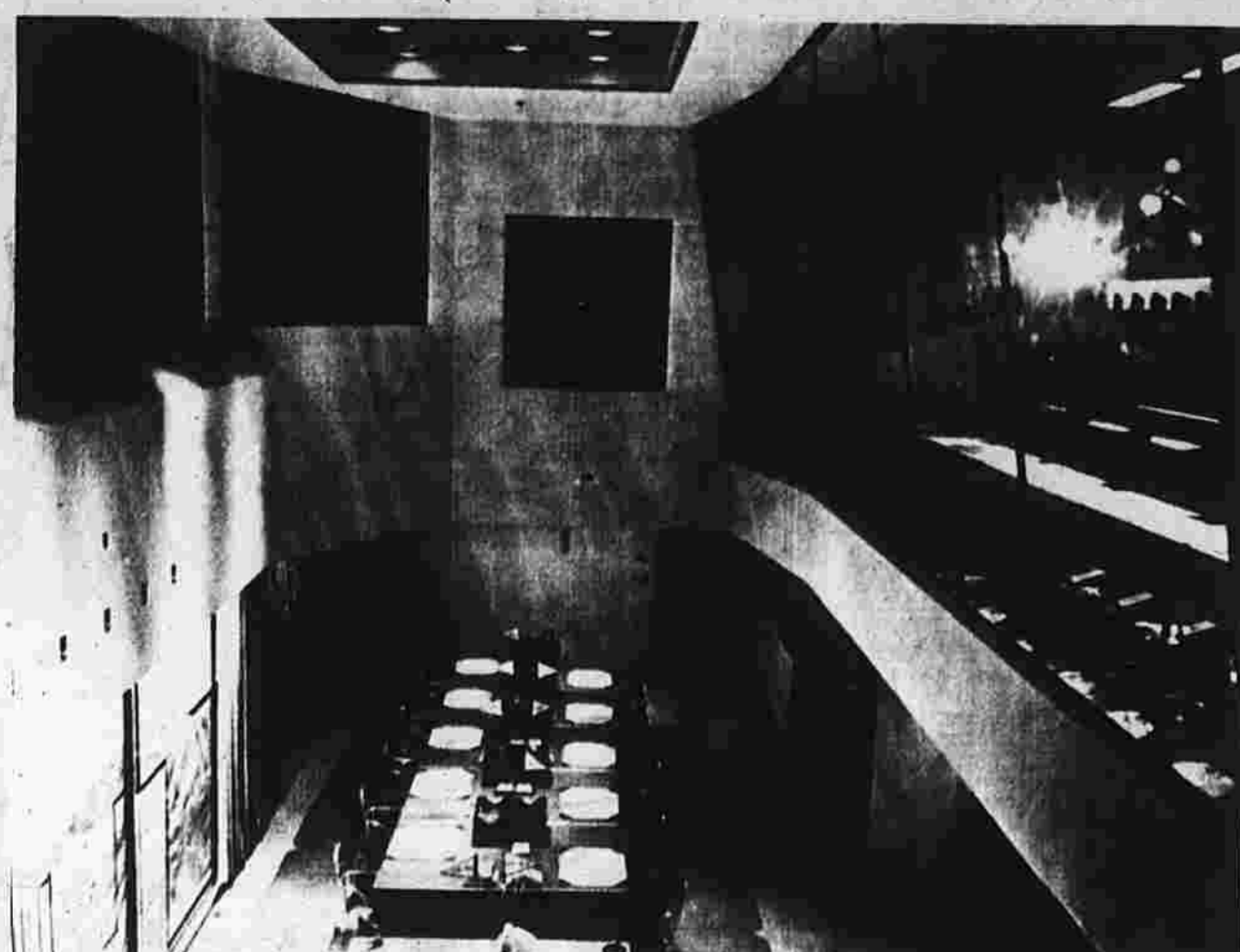

Simpson Home Frames Collections

"This is where we put all the collections we don't have any other place for," said Adele Simpson's son Jeffrey, waving toward the walls of the recreation room. "Go a collection of Indian tomahawks? Put them there," he pointed to a group of tomahawks hanging beside a cluster of puppets from Indonesia.

Her mother is not only one of the world's leading fashion designers, but one of the world's most indefatigable travelers. She also has the knack of combining business with pleasure; the government of India once decorated her for the attention she had brought to Indian fabrics. Even more than ordinary fashions, Adele Simpson buys things, but unlike most, she knows how to display them when she gets home.

Home is Greenwich, Conn., where Mrs. Simpson and her husband, textile manufacturer Wesley Simpson, entertained the fashion editors who had gathered to see the New York styles for fall and winter. Turning into the private driveway, one drives for a distance among woods, besides a lake, and then a terrace comes into view. At one Simpson party, an accordionist stood on that terrace making music for arriving guests. This time, a pair of India dolls loomed over a table there. The style of the house in Georgian, and the front entrance is formal, but the overall effect is one of ease and grace, with a palette of terraces and glass doors overlooking one of the loveliest woodland scenes in the world.

Even more interesting was the opportunity for glimpses into life at the Simpsons. For instance, they have breakfast looking at the lake, for in their glass-walled breakfast room just off the dining room, the long curved table is turned imaginatively so that the long curve faces the view. One room is given over to study and another to a picture screen permanently in place and the recording equipment ready for use.

As for Adele Simpson's bedroom, the guests could only wonder what it must be like to awaken and look over a balcony hung with baskets of geraniums into one's own woodland retreat. The adjoining bathroom is all in an eighteen century toilet-pink of blue and white, the crowning touch being a terrycloth robe hanging behind the door, just the size for Mrs. Simpson who is 4 feet 11 inches tall, and this is in the same toilet design of blue and white.

One question that troubled the editors during the course of their visit to designer's homes was this: What is more important, money or imagination? The decision was that no matter how much money, it does no good without the imagination.

Baker Faces Fraud Suit

CHICAGO (AP) — Bobby Baker, once a protégé of Lyndon B. Johnson and secretary to the Democratic majority in the Senate, will be named next week with violations of civil fraud and anti-trust statutes, says an assistant attorney general.

William D. Ruckelshaus, head of the Department of Justice civil division, said Baker was never indicted "under any anti-kickback statutes. When the Nixon administration entered office we decided to review the case."

Ruckelshaus added Wednesday that the government will ask for triple damages. "We are trying to recover some of the money," he said, declining further comment until the suit "is reviewed in its final version by the attorney general and filed early next week."

Baker, now 39, is free on bond pending his arraignment on the 1967 conviction on seven counts of bribery, income tax evasion and conspiracy. At last report he was deep into several successful business ventures.

Baker was accused of stealing \$1 million from the U.S. Treasury in 1967. He was convicted of stealing \$1 million from California Savings and Loan executives who thought they were making political contributions, evading \$25,000 in income taxes, and conspiring to write off some of this money on the tax returns of a Washington lobbyist.

Ruckelshaus talked about the suit while in Chicago Wednesday for a speech at the national convention of the Young Republicans. A Justice Department spokesman asked for comment on Ruckelshaus' remarks declined, indicating that too much might have been said already. "There's no precedent for this sort of thing here."

South Windsor Capital Goals Report Gets Mixed Reception

The Capital Goals Committee has recommended in its five-year plan that \$75,000 be spent in 1967 for the construction of a new town garage, as well as \$25,000 to do preliminary planning and research for a new town garage.

Coventry Proposed Airport in North End Meets with Dismay, Confusion

Residents of Coventry's north end are a little uneasy these days. The wheels of progress are grinding in their direction and they feel certain nothing can be done to put them in reverse gear.

The cause of concern is a proposed Bolton-Coventry Airport which is part of a long-range airport facilities program by the state.

While the available printed information refers to the facility as "Bolton-Coventry" it would, according to the proposal, be located entirely in Coventry.

The proposed call for acquisition of land between Cedar Swamp Rd. and Broad and Milk St. (Rt. 31), with the airport to consist of a 5,000 ft. primary runway, and a 3,000 foot crosswind runway.

When the news first came out several weeks ago, a state of near-panic ensued, especially by those in the area involved and also by various town officials who felt the airport was being "rammed down our throats."

Now, pollution, air pollution, loss of rural atmosphere, all the considerations, and some residents expected the men from the state to be knocking on their doors at any time, asking to buy land.

But while the Bolton-Coventry facility is indeed part of a proposal, it appears that the land being taken off is still several years in the future.

During the 1967 session of the Connecticut General Assembly, the Connecticut Interregional Planning Program was directed to undertake a study of a long-range and comprehensive airport plan, including a study of feasibility and impact of a new airport.

CITIP selected Frederic F. Harris Associates, consulting engineers of Stamford to conduct the study and submit a report to the governor and the General Assembly. The study, now known locally as the Harris Report, was available for a few days in the office of the State Auditor.

The Harris Report was sponsored and distributed by the CIPP, but is not of itself a piece of legislation. It is a proposal, based on the work of the Harris organization, and at this point little more than a proposal.

The basic steps in the study consisted of an inventory of existing airport conditions and facilities, a forecast of future demand, taking into account the potential effects of new technology and transportation policies, and the recommendation of a state-wide system of airports to meet the forecast demand.

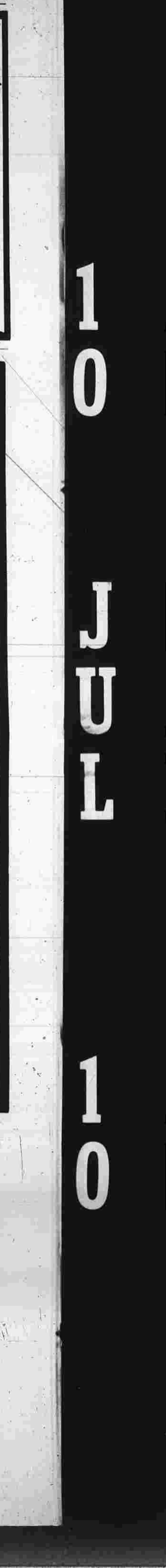

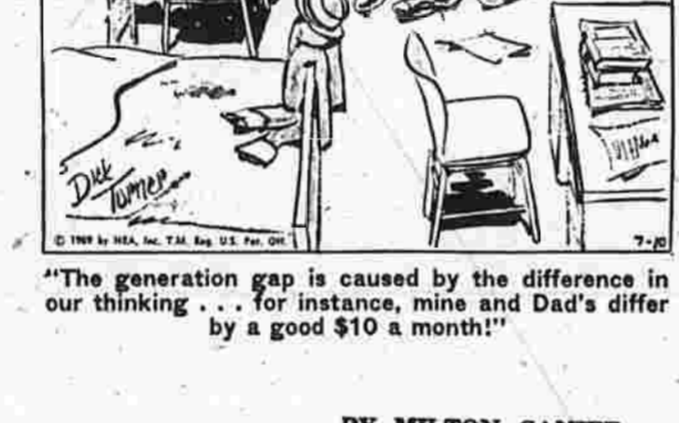
