To concede all this is not, however, to be able to follow the Commission in its recommendations, or even to be sure it is good. The Commission has issued such dramatic public warnings. Merger Plan Announced By Airlines

NEW YORK (AP) — Northwest Airlines, the nation's most profitable airline in 1968, plans to merge with ailing Northeast Airlines, officials of both companies announced Tuesday.

Northeast stockholders would receive one share of Northwest stock for every five shares of Northeast they own under the tentative merger agreement.

The plan is subject to approval of the Civil Aeronautics Board and directors and stockholders of both airlines.

Northeast turned a profit of \$50 million last year, while Northwest compiled a \$2.4 million deficit. Northeast's deficit for the first nine months of 1969 was reported as \$3.7 million. It has lost money in 12 of the last 14 years.

Donald W. Nyrop, president of Northwest, and George E. Storer, chairman of Northeast, announced the tentative agreement. Storer is also chairman of Storer Broadcasting Co., which owns about 88 per cent of the Northeast stock.

Northeast operates routes to Florida from New York, Boston and Philadelphia and short runs between New England cities. It recently opened a Miami-to-Los Angeles flight.

Northwest holds a number of important long-range routes, including links from the Northwest states to the East Coast and Midwest. It also flies to the Far East via Seattle and Alaska, shorter and cheaper-to-operate than competing routes via Hawaii, with the same fares as competitors.

Northwest stock closed at 35 Tuesday on the New York Stock Exchange, while Northeast registered 19 1/2.

Parents Question Identity of Body Army Calls Son

RICHWOOD, Ohio (AP) — The Army insists the body in the funeral home is that of Sgt. John Warren, 26, killed in action in Vietnam.

The sergeant's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Roy Warren, say it can't be. Their son was two inches shorter, 30 pounds lighter and had a big scar on his left arm which does not appear on the body.

Lloyd Kerns, a lawyer representing the family, said the body would be taken to Madison today and x-rayed for comparison with x-rays made three years ago of Warren's spine. He had a spinal abnormality.

"I talk to tempt the family into thinking there's a live boy over there in Vietnam when next week there may be another body here," said Kerns, citing the possibility that the sergeant's body might have been confused with that of a fellow dead soldier.

"The Army says they can't be in error at all, this has got to be the right man. But they can't explain about the missing scar."

When the body arrived here earlier this week the soldier's parents and wife Sharon, said immediately it was not Warren, who was due to be discharged next Wednesday.

Kerns said the Army insists that Warren, in Vietnam since last February, was killed in recent action near the Cambodian border and that the body was identified definitely by fingerprints.

Kerns said he thought "there's a remote possibility" of a foal in Warren's fingerprint records.

He also speculated that if alive Warren, being due for a discharge, could be on his way home.

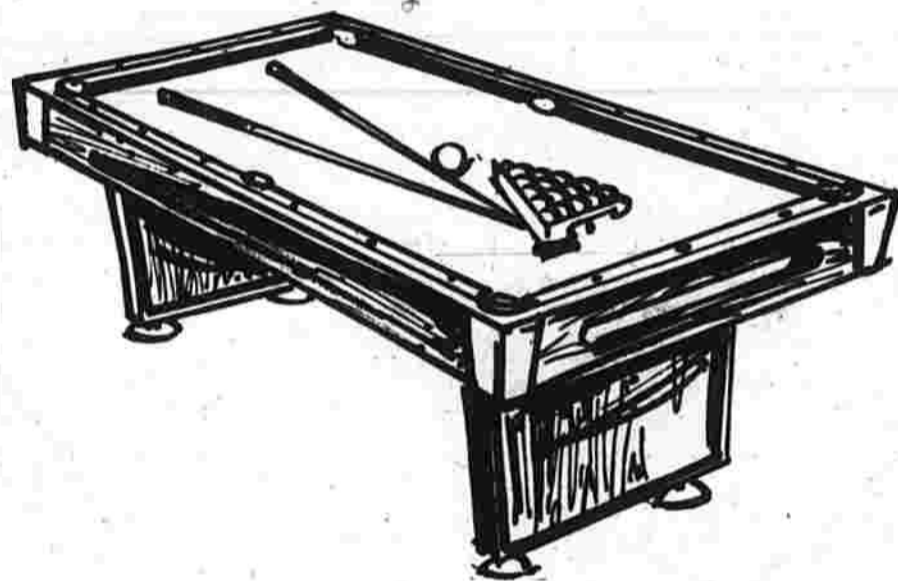

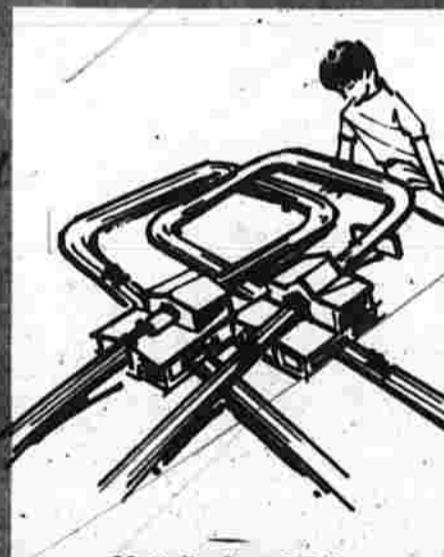

U.N. Bars Red Chinese 19th Time

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) — The U.N. General Assembly voted Tuesday night to keep Communist China out for the 19th time, but six more nations changed their votes.

The 120-nation assembly rejected the proposal by a vote of 56 to 48 with 21 abstentions. The vote last year was 58 to 44 and 21 abstentions. The outcome this year was never in doubt.

Although decisively defeated, Peking picked up four nations who swung from the abstention column to the yes column: Libya, Mauritius, Ghana and Nigeria.

Two other nations switched from no last year to abstention: Italy and Belgium. Both are negotiating to establish diplomatic relations with Peking.

The closest vote was in 1965 when the result was 47 to 47 with 26 abstentions. However, this was a defeat because the assembly has voted every year that the question of China's representation is a substantive issue requiring a two-thirds majority for assembly action rather than a procedural issue requiring only a simple majority.

This year the U.S.-backed resolution for the two-thirds rule received 71 votes in favor, 46 against and 4 abstentions.

Seventeen Communist or non-aligned nations sponsored the resolution to admit Peking. The Soviet Union was not a sponsor and for the first time did not even speak on behalf of Red China. India, a longtime supporter, also kept silent.

Since Moscow became embroiled in its bitter power struggle with Peking Soviet support has been growing more perfunctory each year.

It was the mildest debate since the question first came up in 1950. Most of the speakers opposing Peking omitted the usual polemics and drew mainly on the issue: How to admit without throwing out the other.

Blood Cells May Be Culprits In Heart Attack

DALLAS, Tex. (AP) — White blood cells—the body's shock troops against invading germs—might also be among the guilty causes of heart attack, a team of New York researchers said today.

The possibility is suggested by research on rabbits reported by Dr. Sanford C. Sprague and several colleagues of New York City's Veterans Administration Hospital and Downstate Medical Center.

In a report prepared for the annual meeting of the American Heart Association's Council on Arteriosclerosis, Dr. Sprague stressed that further work needs to be done before white blood cells could definitely be incriminated in human heart disease.

But he said the rabbit research adds up to this: Certain white blood cells have the ability to invade the inner wall of an artery, lodge there, become fat-filled cells called "foam cells," and apparently can contribute to the process of "atherosclerosis"—a technical term for a dangerous form of hardening of the arteries.

In the New York experiments, 3-month-old rabbits from the same litter were divided into two groups. Each group received diets rich in cholesterol, a chemical component of animal fats and oils.

After ten weeks, white blood cells were isolated from one group of rabbits and injected into the other animals. The blood cells were tagged with a radioactive material so they could be located later in the recipient's arterial tissue.

It was found that transplanted white blood cells invaded the arterial wall at the site of cholesterol deposits already formed there, and contributed to foam-cell formation.

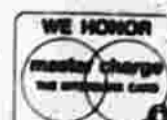

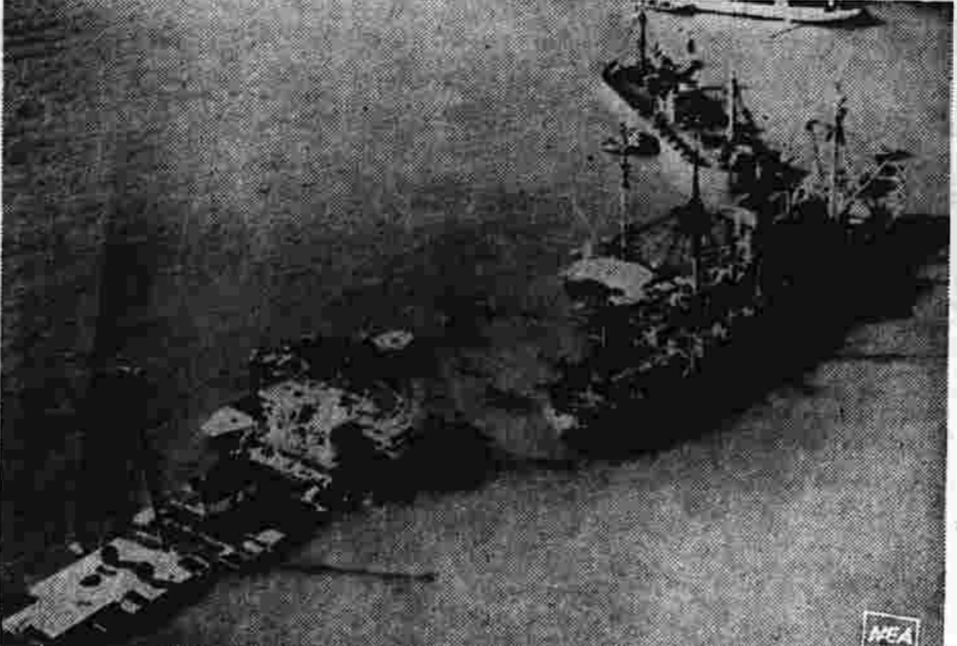
