Auditors Propose Changes In Town's Record-Keeping

Both the general government and the Board of Education received some criticism for certain accounting practices in this year's auditor's report issued by the accounting firm of Peat, Marwick, Mitchell and Co., Hartford.

While the report found "the general conduct of the respective offices of the Town of South Windsor appeared to be satisfactory" and "were conducted in accordance with sound business practices," it recommended several changes or procedures to strengthen the town's record-keeping.

The first such recommendation calls for the use of a general ledger for all major funds, including the Plant Fund, and an account for the system to be instituted at the beginning of the fiscal year in July 1970.

Another recommendation is that the town's accounting system consist primarily of a cash receipts ledger and a cash disbursements ledger for all funds.

According to the accountants, "The use of a general ledger will facilitate the overall control of the town records and is one of the basic elements in a sound system of internal control."

The only other item concerning the general town government is the system for handling the valuation of town land, buildings and equipment.

According to the auditors, "For financial reporting purposes, the assets should be either assessed, or estimated value."

The auditor's recommendation is that "plant asset accounts should be maintained on the basis of original cost or the estimated cost if the original cost is not available or, in the case of gifts, the appraised value at the time received."

Along with this recommendation, the auditors suggest that "lists of other detail in support of the total dollar amount of fixed assets should be reconciled to the control figure periodically, and a physical inventory of fixed assets should be taken on an annual basis."

The only recommendation for the Board of Education was that in addition to matching invoices with approved purchase orders prior to payment, as is presently done, someone should prepare initially invoices to show approval for payment.

Changed For Liquor Outlets

The Planning and Zoning Commission revised last night the definition of the word "premises" in the zoning regulations as it applies to package stores.

The new definition measures the distance between stores from building to building, rather than from property line to property line.

The redefining of the term was the only matter to come up for public hearings and only one attorney, Paul Sullivan, was present representing the Manchester Package Store Owners Association.

The commission passed the definition with minor wording. The definition as passed reads:

Article IV Section 8. "For the purpose of this section, 'premises' shall mean only that fractional part of the building used for alcoholic liquor sales, and shall not mean attached and or adjacent."

Hebron Nursing Unit Plans a Cut In Services

A new Medicare policy will end federal reimbursement for home care for some of the elderly served by the Columbia-Hebron-Andover Public Health Nursing Association.

Under the new policy, some patients will have to be dropped because they do not meet the new physician certification requirement for payment of home health benefits by the Medicare program.

Previously, a patient just had to be homebound in order to be eligible to receive nursing care, physiotherapy and home health aide services.

Now, if their condition is considered "stable," they would not be considered eligible for home health benefits under the new law.

This new interpretation of Medicare coverage was designed to cut mounting costs of the federal program.

However, it is felt by many health agencies that the new policy will cost more in the long run because many patients will have to be hospitalized where, as previously, public health nurses could attend to their needs adequately.

Public health nursing agencies throughout the state are writing letters to their congressmen protesting the new restrictions.
