Helen Fitzpatrick Dead, Involved in School Issue

Mrs. Helen Fitzpatrick, 62, who served one term as a town director during the stormy community battle over construction of the Keeney St. School, died yesterday at a South Windsor convalescent home after a long illness.

Mrs. Fitzpatrick was elected to the Board of Directors in 1922 and formed a political alliance in a five-member bipartisan group of directors who came to be called the Brown bloc after Republican Sherwood Brown who led it.

Mrs. Fitzpatrick ran for reelection in 1954, but was defeated in a vote most observers regarded as a repudiation of the political bloc, the decision of which she regarded as a personal defeat.

Mrs. Fitzpatrick remained active in town politics after a period of absence serving as director of the Board of Directors at meetings of the board and at public hearings, apparently as the result of illness.

Her first bid for office was on the state level. She ran for the State House of Representatives in 1948 and lost by about 500 votes. John D. LaBelle, Democrat, and Sherwood Brown, Republican, were defeated.

Mrs. Fitzpatrick was defeated in 1954 in a bid for election as a director of the 8th District.

Active for years in Democratic party affairs, she served her town tonight from 7 to 9 p.m.

Dissent Isn't Education's Fruit: Agnew

BALTIMORE, Md. (AP) — Vice President Spiro T. Agnew says the practice of holding campus and street demonstrations "is not America and is not the fruit of education."

Addressing a Theodore S. Agnew scholarship fund dinner honoring his late father, the vice president said a demonstration is a dissenter's device to rally the uncommitted behind him so that by the sheer weight of numbers an assurance of conviction is projected in his behalf.

"I'm not against dissent," he added, "but I'm totally dedicated to the concept that it's impossible to reach an accord where instead of attempting dialogue, one merely shouts and attempts to come together through an exchange of ideas."

Agnew and the 600 guests who paid \$20 a plate were hosted as they entered the building by 250 demonstrators demanding the vice president and the Vietnam war.

"I reserve the right to speak out against the purposes that the dissenters may advocate," he said, "because I reserve the right of dissent in a free society that includes the vice president of the United States."

Sirhan Tells Mother He'll End Fast

SAN QUENTIN, Calif. (AP) — Sirhan Sirhan, the assassin of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., told his mother today that he would end his hunger strike today after 18 days of subsisting on coffee and coffee.

Mayor Acquitted In Ripping Of Viet Cong Flag

SANTA CRUZ, Calif. (AP) — This seaside community's 72-year-old mayor, who ripped down a Viet Cong flag on Veterans Day, has been acquitted of a malicious mischief charge.

The verdict, returned Wednesday by a jury of eight women and four men, proves that "12 good Americans can tell the difference between right and wrong," Mayor Richard Werner said.

The jury foreman, Theodore Chownace, had been chosen a juror despite his admission in court he had sent a congratulatory telegram to Werner after the incident.

"I was guilty of destroying property but not guilty of malicious mischief," Werner said.

The mayor was an Army colonel in both world wars. One of his grandsons returned recently from Vietnam and another is to be sent there.

Larry Bell, 25, a Navy veteran and substitute school teacher in this town of 30,000, put up the flag. He testified Werner also threatened to kill him if he put it up again. Werner denied making the threat. The flag was attached to the front of Bell's house.

"I'd had six telephone complaints from citizens," said Werner. "I could hardly believe my eyes when I saw that flag. I tore it down. Under similar circumstances, I might do it again."

The jury deliberated 40 minutes.

"The mayor had the courage to stick his neck out," said defense attorney Raymond Goodrich.

"I was taking an unpopular position and this is what I had to expect," Dist. Atty. Peter Chang said.

New Chief Named Finch Prescribes Overhaul, Upgrading for Ailing HEW

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary Robert H. Finch of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare has prescribed a treatment of ouster, upgrading and overhaul for his ailing Food and Drug Administration.

For starters, the agency beset from all sides by critics will have a new chief: Dr. Charles C. Edwards, a one-time Iowa surgeon turned American Medical Association official and management expert.

Dr. Herbert Ley Jr., the present FDA commissioner, and two of his top associates, Winston B. Hankin and J. Kenneth Kirk, got the gate Wednesday.

Spock Advises Show Majority War's Injustice

SPRINGFIELD, Mass. (AP) — "You're damn right you've got to dissent," the gray-haired, bespectacled Dr. Benjamin Spock said emphatically.

His audience—1,000 young people from the area's colleges and high schools—rose to its feet in a standing ovation.

The author-pediatrician was one of the featured speakers at a symposium on subjects ranging from the Vietnam war to the rift between the races at Springfield College Wednesday.

Spock touched on a wide range of subjects, including his 1968 conviction of conspiring to counsel young men to avoid the draft and the reversal of that conviction earlier this year.

"My government had the nerve to say I'm the criminal," Spock said. He charged that the government is the criminal for pursuing the war in Vietnam.

"My wife says it's only a matter of time before I get in trouble again," he added.

Spock said the Vietnam war will last another two or three years unless dissenters make President Nixon believe that his popularity is so low that he has to end the war.

On dissent, Spock said: "I don't advocate revolution. I don't think we've tried hard enough with our current methods."

"Most of us proceed ourselves from being enlightened of justice," he continued. "What we've got to do is grab the majority by the lapels and say, 'Look at this injustice!'"

Edwards look poins to erase the impression left at a news conference that he would be soft. He said then: "I feel we have to move more in the direction of working with industry."

His emphasis on "hard-pressed" management fits with a common complaint of HEW top brass that Ley was "indecisive on such sensitive issues as the safety of the artificial sweetener cyclamate."

Edwards' biggest task will be to reconcile the conflicting demands of industry for relaxed regulation and quicker product approval and of consumer advocates for tougher safety standards on such things as food additives and ineffective drugs.

Edwards, a life-long Republican, former Des Moines, Iowa, surgeon and avid squash player, spent five years in positions with the American Medical Association and, in 1967, joined the industrial management firm of Booz, Allen and Hamilton of Chicago.

Edwards is trim, handsome and impeccably dressed. He confides that he would play squash and tennis "all the time" if he had the chance.

Another interest in art, picked up from his wife, the former Mrs. Cowles Kraiderer of the Des Moines-based Cowles publishing family, Edwards gave up private practicing in Des Moines eight years ago.

"There are an awful lot of good surgeons but not as many very good physician-administrators," he said.

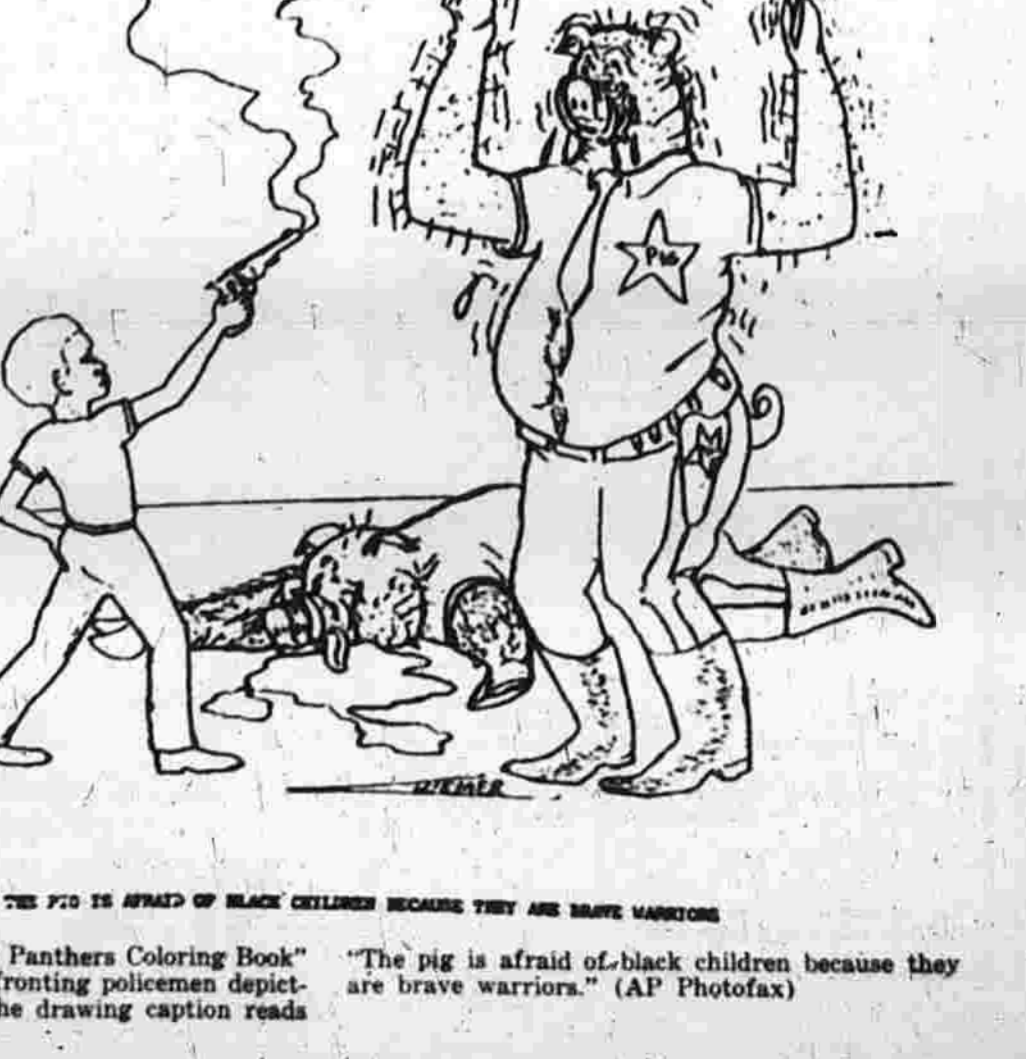
