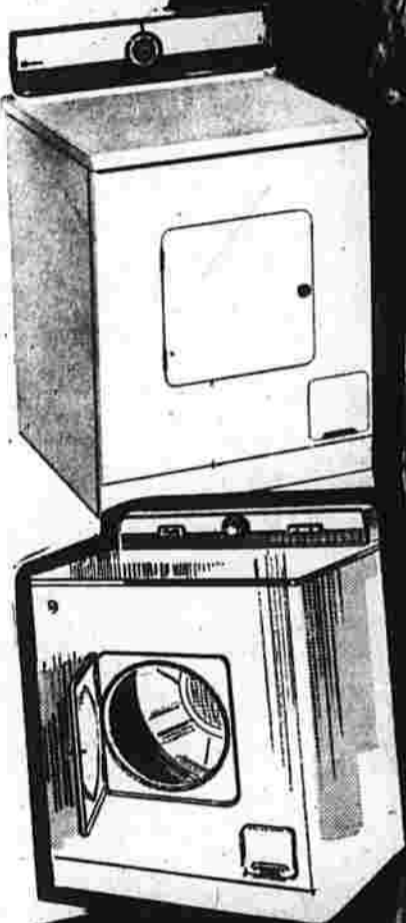

# Things Looked Good for Joe Until His Mind Declared War

WATTS, Calif. — His name isn't really Joe Durant, but he isn't so sure about that. He is 22 and has lived all those years in Watts, except for brief excursions to a higher education and a future.

He is a high school student, he was "chief of police" during Bay Day in Los Angeles and sat at a luncheon with the Los Angeles police chief. But the scrapbook doesn't include the record he has compiled since his world was turned on its head — a series of arrests and charges ranging from disturbing the peace to assault on police officers and periods in mental institutions and hospital psychiatric wards.

Young Durant (the name he offered whimsically on one of his earlier years) was ordered to undergo psychiatric observation in an hour-long session resulting from his most recent battle with officers while in jail on another charge. As a condition of that probation, he attends weekly group therapy sessions with police officers who are not his friends. As Joe remembers it, the deputies got out of their car and he said, "We want to talk to you." He was answered, "Well, I don't want to talk to you," and kept walking.

The deputies said the brother became belligerent when he was told to get out of the car and challenged the officers to a fight. When a crowd of "about 100" gathered, the officers radioed for assistance. Both the deputies and the brother agreed that four more cars containing eight officers arrived within about two minutes and that a battle ensued in which both brothers were committed to one of the covered state hospitals, they point out. He is on the street and vulnerable to any "mad" man who may trigger his own violent reaction. Unlike those in adjacent areas with similar incidents, he cannot afford private psychiatric care.

"There is no place for a boy like this to get help," says attorney Joseph H. Miller Jr., who obtained Durant's release from the state hospital. Durant attends his weekly therapy sessions, observes: "This is a good thing for my neighborhood. There's never anyone around to turn to. A lot of them are people who were once well-behaved, somewhat quiet. They tend to be passive dependent personalities. They have developed defense mechanisms to cope with the environment, acting as they're not afraid when actually they're scared to death."

Dr. James L. Jones, medical director of the hospital, says Durant attends his weekly therapy sessions, observes: "This is a good thing for my neighborhood. There's never anyone around to turn to. A lot of them are people who were once well-behaved, somewhat quiet. They tend to be passive dependent personalities. They have developed defense mechanisms to cope with the environment, acting as they're not afraid when actually they're scared to death."

Dr. Jones, usually gets good grades because he doesn't cause trouble in school. "But then comes a confrontation with the police or with the gang on the corner and he's suddenly precipitated into a psychotic situation."

This young man is viewed by lawyers and psychiatrists as one of thousands caught up in the "black rage" of the ghetto. His mother sees him simply as her son — the youngest of eight children — who at any time may run into his final trouble.

She was divorced from Joe's father when Joe was 3. Her second husband subsequently died. Until February, 1967, Joe had never caused her any worry. Since then, she has spent money buying him out of various jails and trying to find psychiatric help for him. Joe was "able to determine right from wrong" in 1968, after getting into the Berkeley scrap, and doing something with his life. He was offered a job as a superintendent who helped arrange the Morehouse College scholarship.

Malchow, 40, told him he had killed Valerie Percy. Mome said that while the polygraph test indicated Evans was telling the truth about Malchow's conversation, it didn't mean that Malchow was truthful. Detective Robert Lamb of the Illinois State Police said, "We have 1,281 leads under investigation, and data supplied by Evans is one of them."

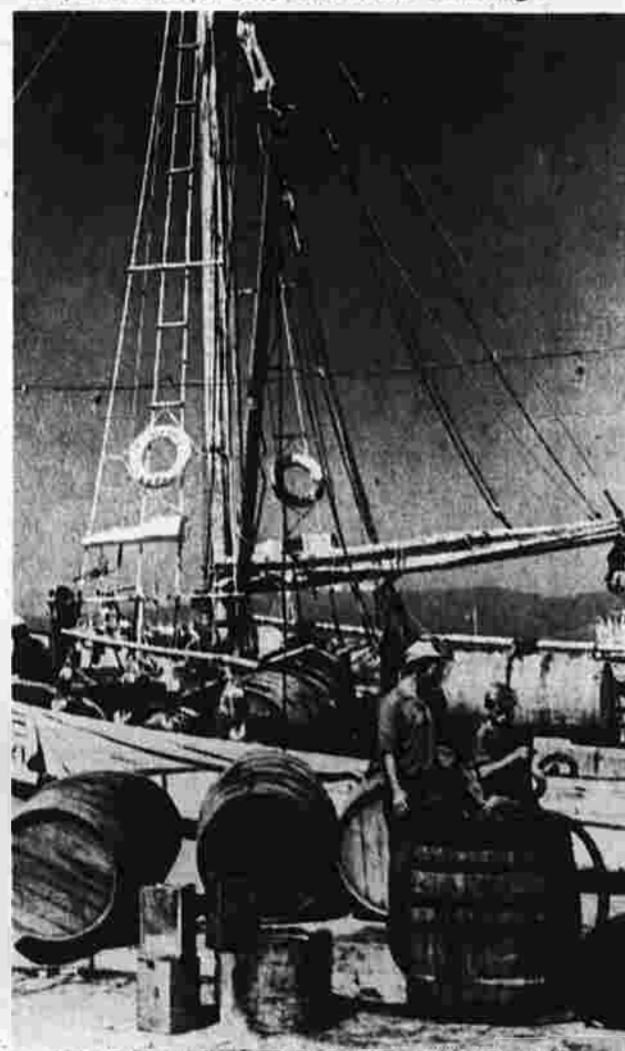

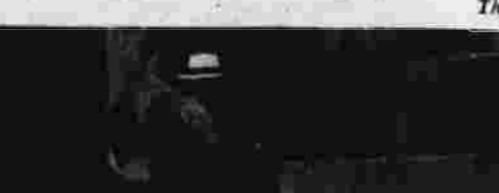
