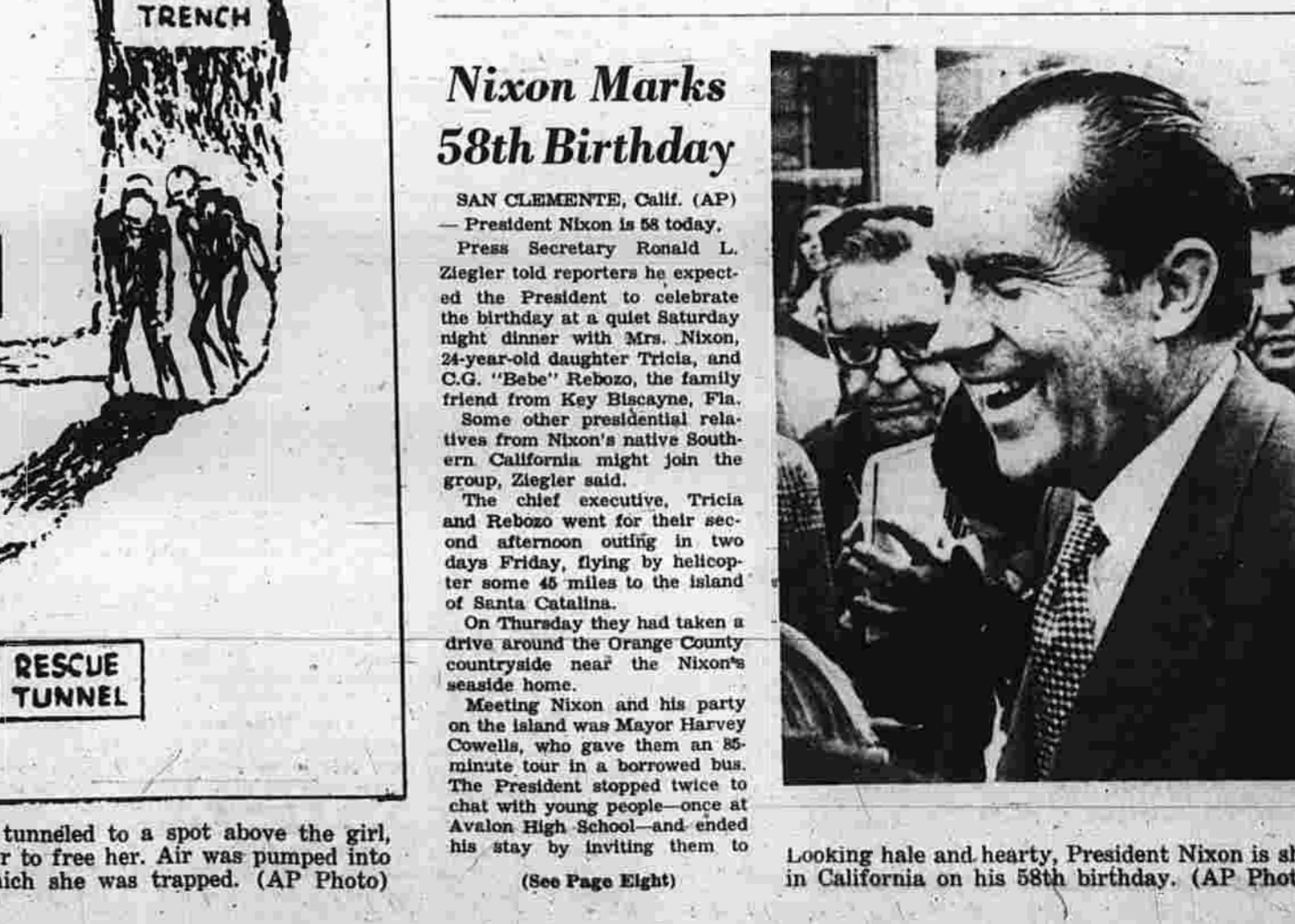

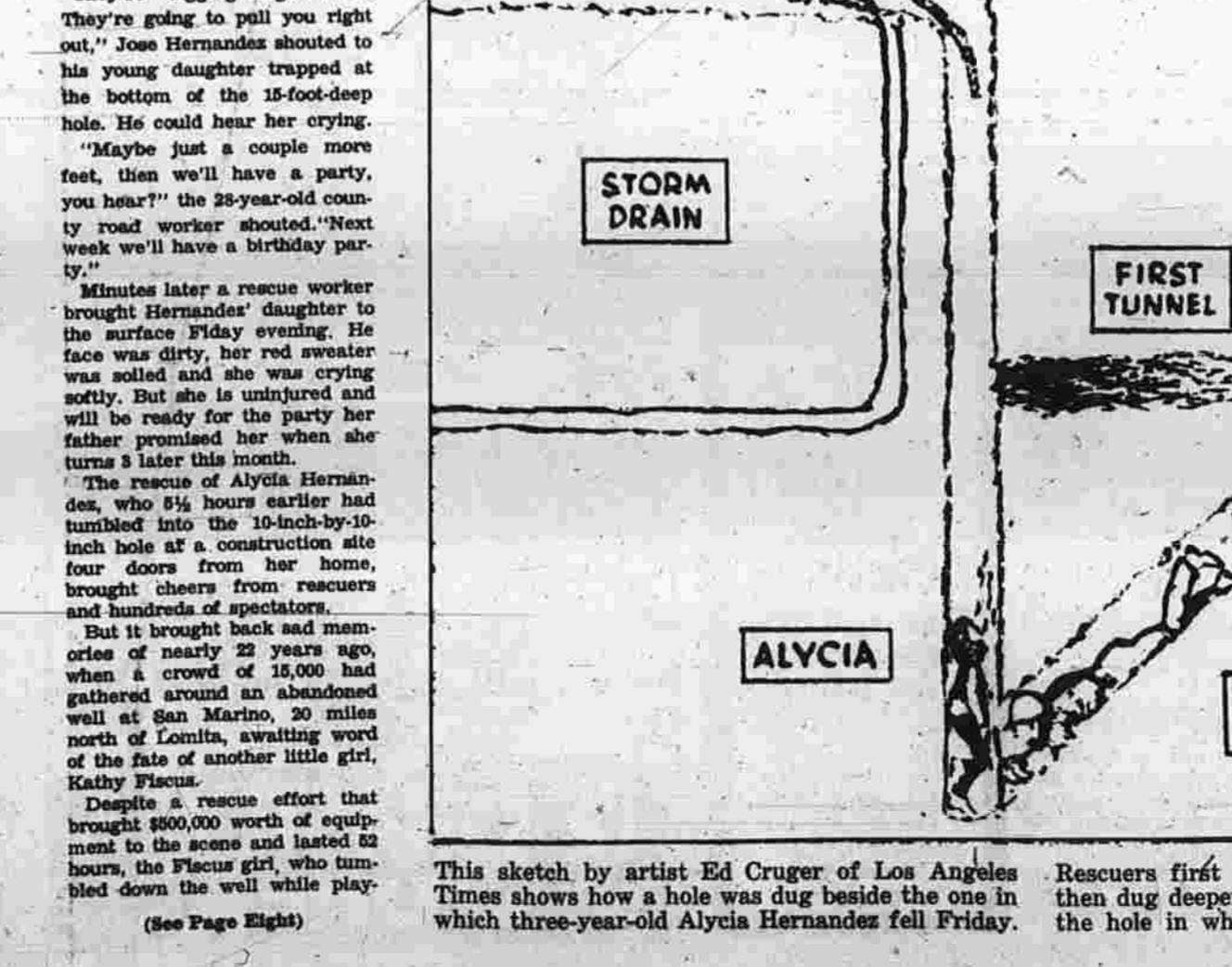

Gambling Into Solvency

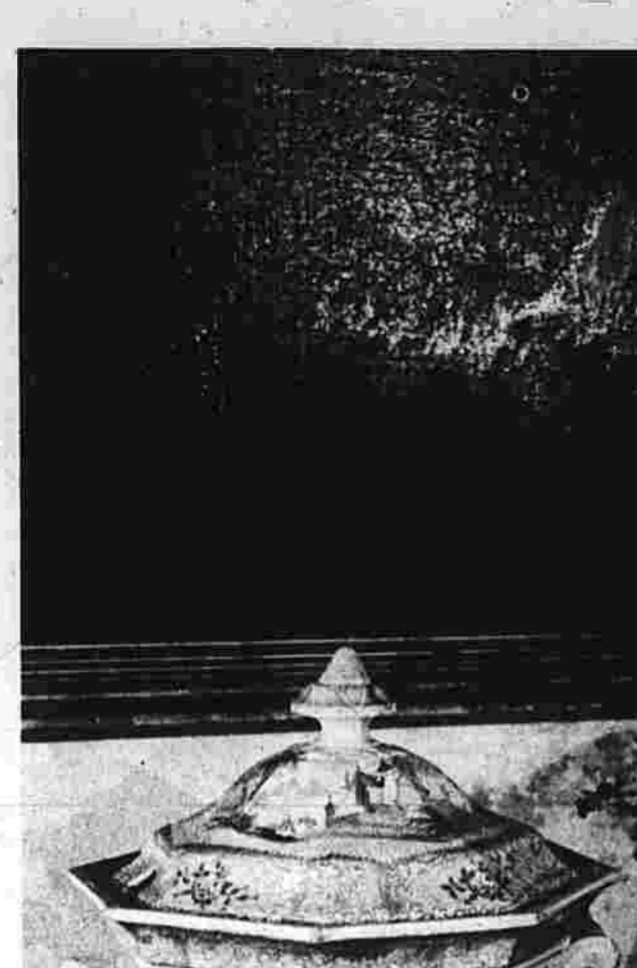
It is entirely logical that, even before New York City can manage to get its system of off-track betting parlor in operation, the New York State Legislature should begin consideration of a proposition to set up legalized gambling casinos all over the state.

The completely tenable, if still rather sordidly practical, idea is that having gone so far toward accepting the legalization of gambling as a means of trying to rescue the state and city governments from their financial troubles, why stop anywhere? Why not legalize all forms of gambling everywhere? If, by some not impossible chance, New York State does proceed to turn itself into a second but much wealthier Nevada, but with its own residents instead of the major customers of its own gambling establishments, there will be evolving a new definition of what constitutes good citizenship for the people of the state.

Just as, in our economy of planned obsolescence, it has frequently been considered patriotic good citizenship to buy new automobiles and appliances even when we don't really need them, just in order to keep the economy spinning merrily, so in the citizenship of the future it may be considered the first responsibility of the individual to do his proper amount of gambling, and therefore his proper amount of voluntary contribution to his state's financial needs, every day.

Perhaps the ultimate benefit to the state from such a system may be something less than so estimated. It may be that part of the thrill of gambling is feeling that one is doing something that is illegal, or something that is against the law, or something that is against the good will of the community. When such temptation to the disloyalty is turned into a command from respectability, the actual business of gambling itself may lose its appeal.

Whatever the trend, the suggestion here is that Connecticut should very well consider itself for the next few years, with watching, without being in any hurry to emulate, the effort of New York State to gamble itself into solvency.

Coventry Bus Schedules Revised For School System

School bus schedules will undergo some revisions starting Monday. Starting with morning runs, and on a system-wide basis, all buses will leave five minutes earlier than previously.

Exceptions to this policy follow:

At Robertson School, there is only one other bus revision. In the afternoon Bus 12 will reverse its high school run and will then go into Robertson School to take children previously assigned to Bus 10A.

At Coventry Grammar on the morning run, children who used to ride Bus 6 will now ride Bus 7B, which will make its run 10 minutes later than Bus 6. This is the only bus that will be running later.

At Capt. Nathan Hale School in the morning Buses 10 and 12 are reversing runs, each starting 10 minutes earlier. In other words, youngsters who previously rode Bus 10 in the morning will now ride Bus 12 and vice versa. Bus 6 for CNHS will start its run at 8:15 a.m., 15 minutes earlier than previously.

In the afternoon, CNHS Bus 8 will take the children previously assigned to Bus 12A and will then return for a second run, taking the children assigned to the Bus 8 run. Youngsters previously assigned to Bus 12B in the afternoon at CNHS will now ride Bus 8 and this will no longer be a double trip.

Purpose of all the revision is to assure an on-time 9 a.m. opening at CNHS, where buses have been arriving during a tight scheduling. Parents are being reminded by bus manager William Robbins that they need not wait for children who are not at the specified stops at the specified times.

Another reminder from Mrs. Robbins concerns high school students taking driver education. These students are being told that they are to wait at the high school for their afternoon bus trip and are under no circumstances to wait at CNHS.

Rate Cuts Reach Consumer Level

HARTFORD (AP)—Reductions up to 20 per cent in small consumer loans were announced Friday by Hartford National Bank and Trust Co.

The new loan rate of 12 per cent applies to small loans for personal use, including checking credit lines and the purchase of automobiles, boats, campers, appliances, furniture and other small to medium size consumer goods. This reduction is also in line with the bank's home improvement loan rates which were reduced from 15 per cent to 12 per cent in mid-1970.

New automobile loans carry the lowest interest which are currently at around 11 per cent.

The reduction comes in the wake of a series of cuts in the prime rate in recent months. It totals 2.75 per cent, which is the rate banks charge their largest, and most credit-worthy customers.

Pioneer Gets Subcontract For Floating Oil Barrier

Pioneer Parachute, a subsidiary of Pioneer Systems, Inc. of Manchester, has been awarded a \$240,000 subcontract to develop an aerial-deployed system for floating oil barrier designed to contain spills in coastal waters.

The project for the U.S. Coast Guard is a follow-up to an air-drop oil pollution control system developed and tested in 1967. The system, air-dropped by two 100-foot-diameter parachutes, contained a hydraulic pump, diesel engine and expandable bladder capable to remove up to 140,000 gallons of oil from a tanker in trouble at sea.

HARTFORD (AP)—"I really don't know anything about the state Welfare Department," the proposed new state welfare commissioner said Friday.

Henry C. White, 39, of Bloomfield, member of a well-to-do family and a former banker and business executive, had just accepted the new governor's offer of one of the most hands-on jobs in state government.

When asked why he took the job, White dwelt upon the experiences of his wife, Elaine, as a volunteer worker with the Hartford Welfare Department.

"She had inspired me perhaps more than she realized," White told newsmen.

He said Mrs. White's reaction to the news which she heard on the radio Friday was: "When did you last see your psychiatrist?"

White, who served as Gov. Thomas J. Meskill's campaign chairman last year, listed some of his own qualifications as "I like messes... I'm good at dealing with people. I have a certain amount of financial acumen... I feel I can get people to work together."

White said he had no immediate plans for changes in the Welfare Department and wanted to hear the suggestions of the employees. "I'm going to do a lot of listening," he said.

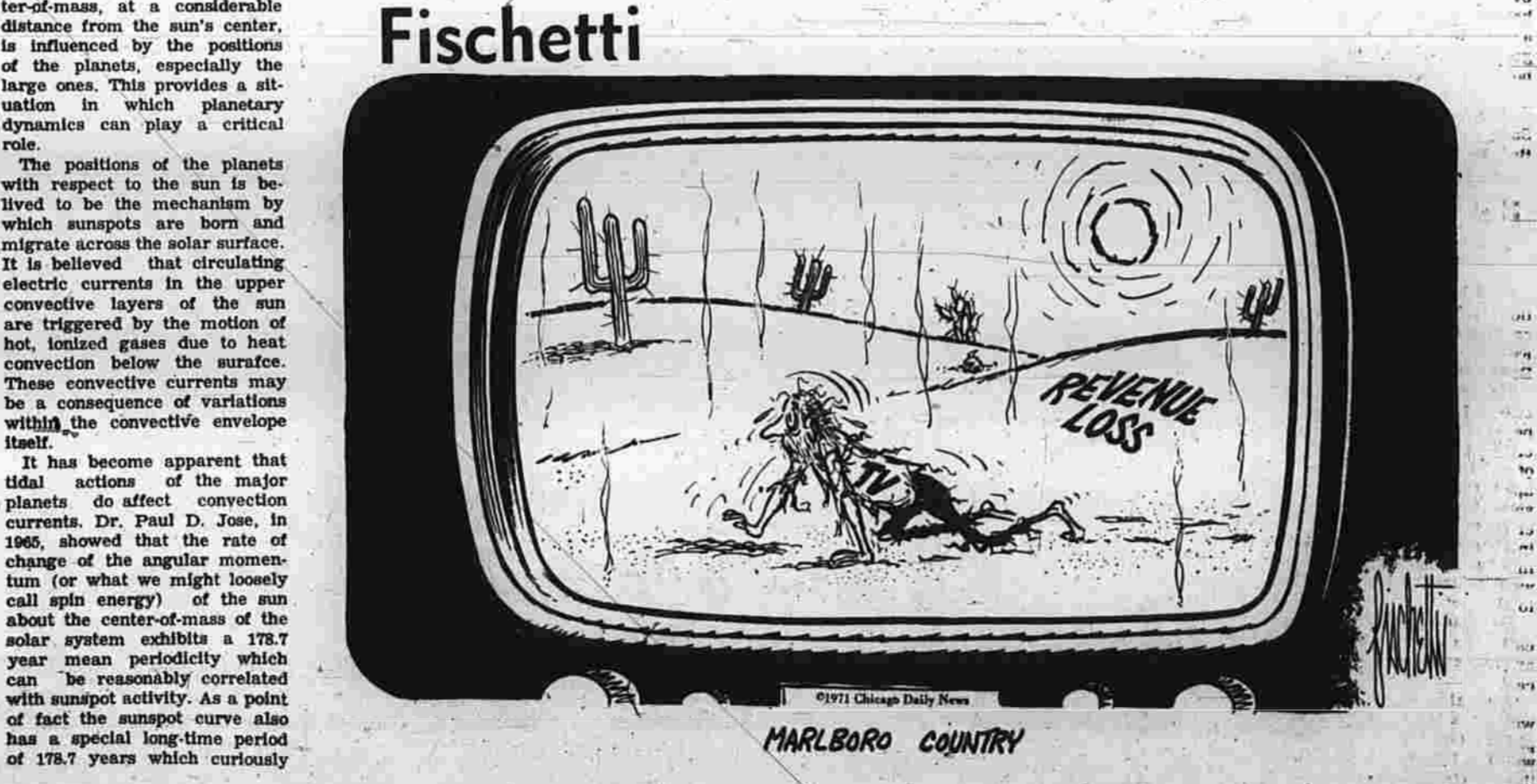
