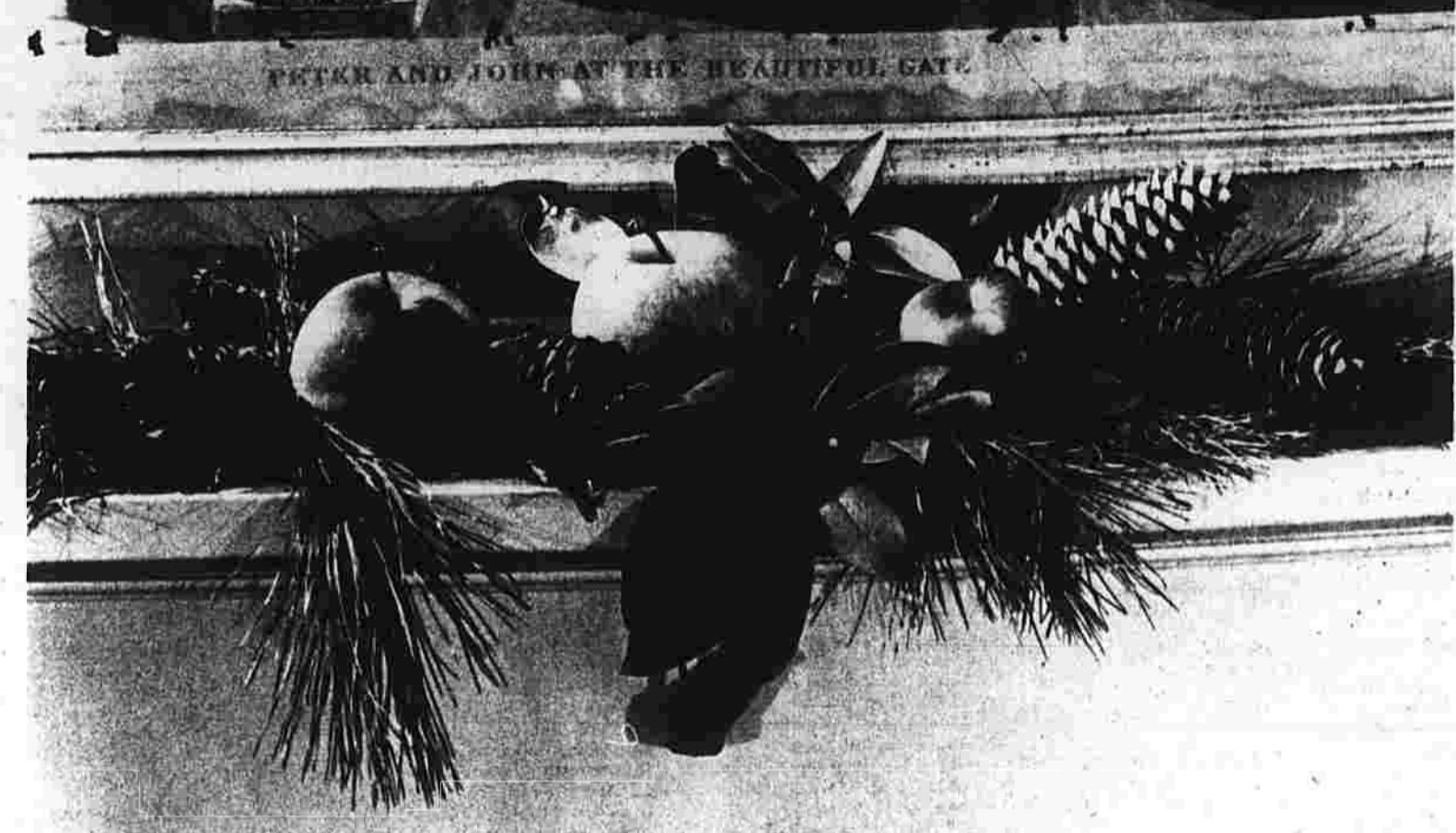

The solar flare phenomenon is the most powerful of the sun's activities. When a flare erupts on the sun, it emits an intense stream of high-energy hydrogen nuclei.

As the solar flare erupts, it sends out a stream of high-energy particles. These particles travel at the speed of light and can reach Earth in a matter of minutes.

One special approach, which is beginning to look practical, is the use of a magnetic field to turn away, or deflect, charged particles.
