Vernon Town Council Authorizes Sewer Bonds

By adopting a resolution last night the Town Council authorized Vernon Treasurer John Dalgio to proceed with an issue of sewer bonds amounting to \$1.5 million.

Dalgio explained that the town would have to go to bonding in September anyway, and he and the bank officials felt that the market was good for doing so.

Appropriations for three phases of the proposed town-wide sewer installation project, which includes the Box Mountain contract, the north-south line, and the new sewage pumping station, were approved by the council.

On May 15, 1967, an increase of \$800,000 in the sewer revenue bonds was approved by the council. The then Board of Representatives approved the repayment of about 10 cents what the average family will have to pay for sewer construction.

The resolution adopted last night authorized Dalgio to restore \$600,000 to the special account. The occasion was the \$200,000 in sewer bonds approved by the council.
