You May Owe Uncle Sam
More Than Was Withheld

The Washington Post says that the federal government gave every paycheck last year in not going to cover their 1970 tax bill.

Withholding—the amount taken out of every paycheck—is determined by a percentage deduction from the taxpayer's income minus his exemptions with allowance for the standard deduction.

Actual tax liability is computed against "taxable income"—total income minus deductible items and the 602 percent exemption for each member of the household.

There are six different withholding brackets, but more than two dozen tax brackets, IRS officials said. Because of problems with current data processing equipment, six withholding rates are all most employers can handle.

Withholding rates should mirror tax rates and usually have, an IRS official said, except for high income individuals.

But when Congress enacted the 1969 act and imposed a special break for poor people—the low income allowance—it unwittingly caused many poor families with both husband and wife working to face an "under-withholding" problem, and exaggerated the problems of the high income individuals as well.

But the law specifies that a family is entitled to only one low income allowance. As a result, IRS officials said, many poor couples, some who used to get two allowances, are in some cases as much as \$600.

The problem facing the wealthy taxpayer is a spinoff from the low income allowance. It is an alternative type of standard deduction, according to the IRS.

A single taxpayer in 1971, for example, will pay no taxes next year if he makes \$1,700 or less. Of that figure, \$750 is a low income allowance portion that will prevent more serious deductions from open space funds (if available).

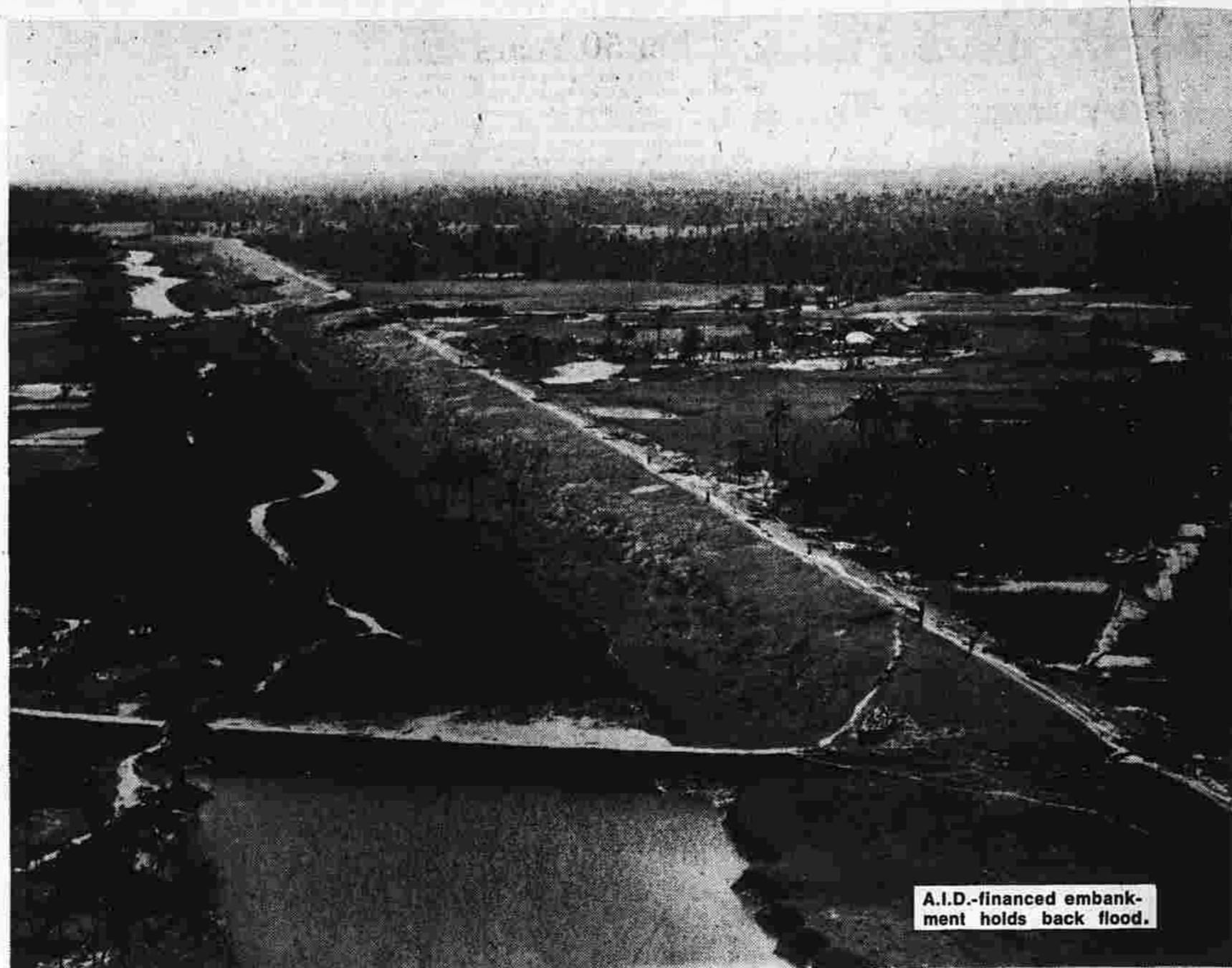

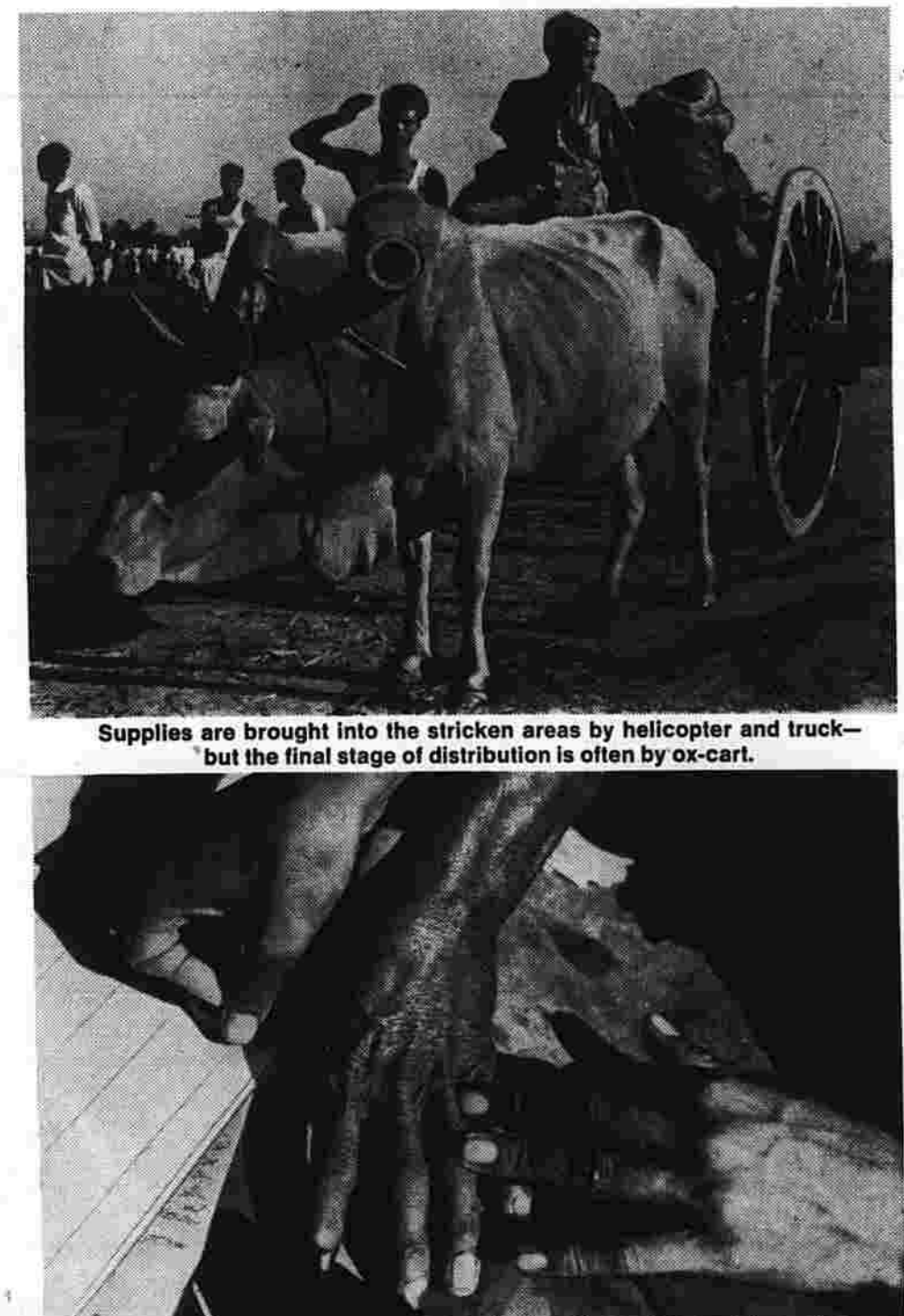


Pakistani farmer and his ruined rice.

AID FOR PAKISTAN



Supplies are brought into the stricken areas by helicopter and truck—but the final stage of distribution is often by ox-cart.

The cyclone which struck East Pakistan on the night of Nov. 12-13, 1970, caused one of the greatest disasters in recorded history. Fifty countries responded with emergency help, the U.N. Secretary-General has called for further help and the World Bank has planned extensive reconstruction.

U.S. assistance has played a major role in relief work. The Agency for International Development (A.I.D.) had already been at work in the area, and A.I.D.-financed coastal embankments and cyclone shelters, for example, saved thousands of lives. After the disaster, A.I.D. provided emergency relief, including the use of ten helicopters which in 25 days flew more than 1,250 sorties and delivered more than a million pounds of supplies to the helpless survivors.

The emergency relief phase is now over. Looking ahead, to help Pakistani farmers to recover from the loss of rice crops, the U.S. has allocated 200,000 tons of wheat and rice. A.I.D. airlifted 21,000 pounds of fast-growing vegetable seeds to the area in time for January planting, and A.I.D. financing is expected to help with some of the major works of the Pakistan government's rehabilitation plans. Altogether, A.I.D. has allocated \$28 million in U.S. dollars and food to help the people of East Pakistan in their recovery from the cyclone.



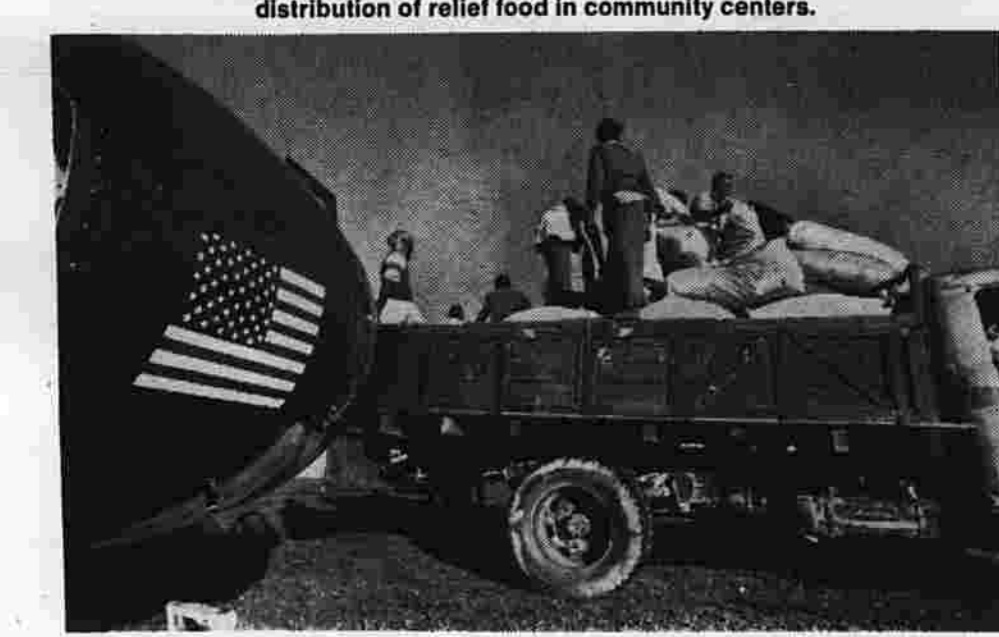

The Red Cross—It's Close to Home

Andover chairman for the Red Cross fund drive, Mrs. Cynthia Clark, reports that donations are coming in well mid-way in the month-long campaign. This year's quota for the local chapter, which includes Andover, Hebron and Columbia, is under the chairmanship of Mrs. James T. Hahmann of Andover, is \$3,100, an increase over last year's goal. Of all the monies collected, 37 1/2% is forwarded to the National Red Cross for administrative expenses and work on the national and international level. The remainder is left to support the work of the local chapter in the three-town area. The Columbia chapter is the smallest in the state of Connecticut; nevertheless, its range of Red Cross services to the community is considerable. The Red Cross sponsors so many activities and services in the town, that after a while become familiar to townpeople, who then tend to forget the organization behind the effort.

This small chapter conducts four Bloodmobile drives each year, with the locations alternating from town to town. In 1970, there were 206 pints of blood donated through this chapter, which has a total tri-town population of 8,900. This year's blood drives have already netted a total of 170 pints of blood, with two more bloodmobiles still to be scheduled during the remainder of the year.

Members of the local chapter act as volunteer aides and workers in assisting with the collection of blood; they also provide necessary services, such as record-keeping, screening of donors, contacting potential donors, serving coffee, refreshments and lunches to donors and workers, as well as the professional technicians and nurses. Without the extensive use of such volunteer labor, the chapter could not conduct four such successful drives each year. The Red Cross each year sponsors numerous courses in First Aid. Having taught a number of instructors, the Red Cross conducts classes both in basic and advanced first aid for girl scouts, boy scouts, fire department members, and for the general populace. The first aid classes are a requirement for the drivers of Andover's ambulance, and are required in many other towns also. They are a source of comfort to the average parent who, completing the course, feel that they can cope with any emergency measures until professional help is available.

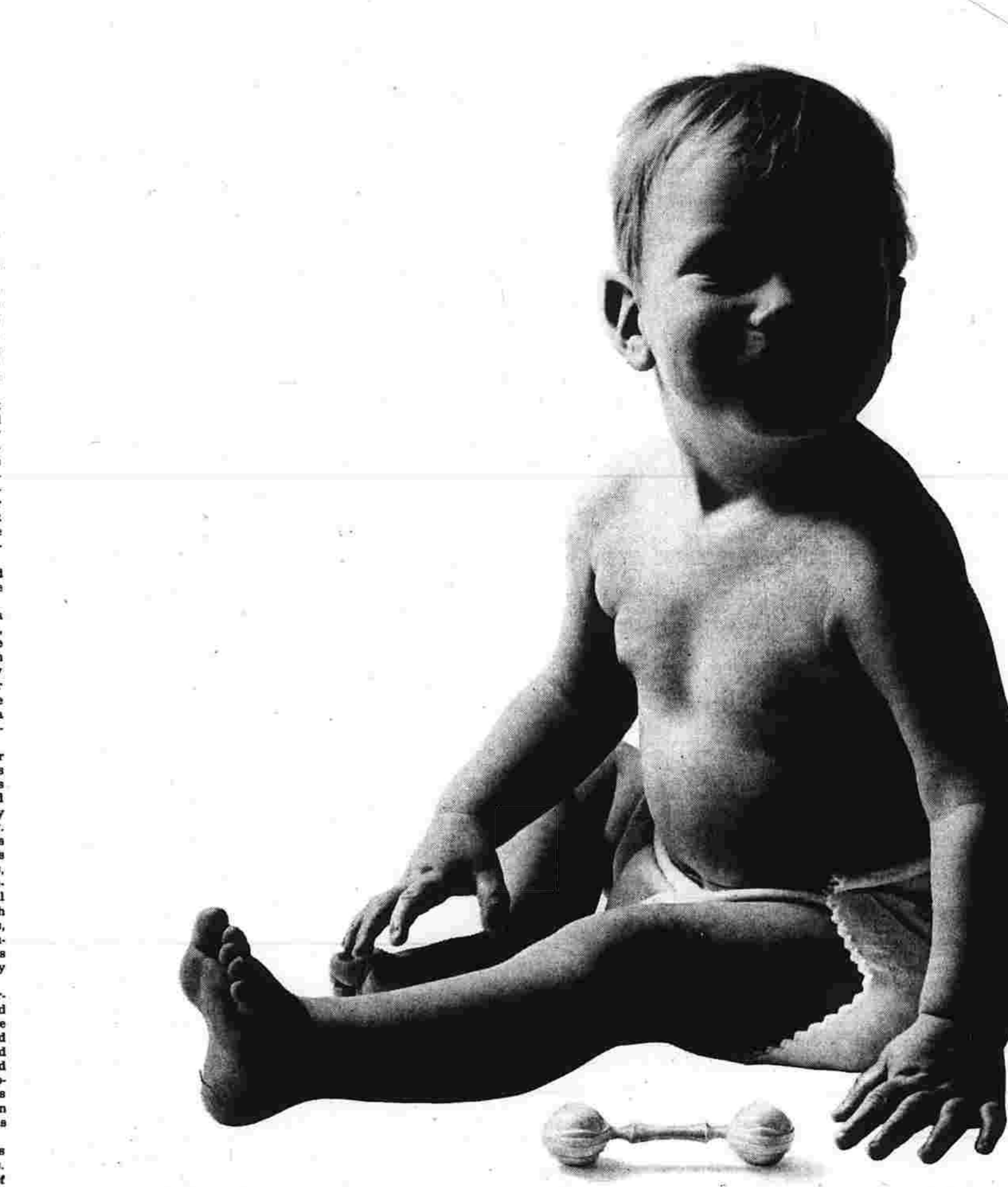
First aid knowledge is invaluable training for the girl and boy scouts, whose aims are partially those of self-sufficiency, preparedness and service to others. Through the Red Cross, hundreds of youngsters in the Columbia chapter have attained this basic knowledge. One of the big Red Cross projects in the area was to undertake a swimming program to teach every child how to swim and survive in the water. In 1948, the local Andover Parents and Teachers Association began sponsoring a swimming program for children, which they continued through parental volunteers for three years. In 1948, as the population of the town involved began to grow, the Red Cross began to concern itself with the problem of water safety, and a chairman was appointed to study the problem and make recommendations.

As a result the Columbia chapter made plans for 1949 for its first official program of swimming classes to be conducted in the three towns, with three trained instructors who would be paid by the Red Cross. That year, some 500 children from these towns participated in the water safety program. The number of children seventh grade participating has increased each year, with 776 members enrolled in the swimming program in 1970. Last year alone, it is reported there were 283 Red Cross certificates issued to qualified Democratic party and five candidates from splinter parties.

Local chapter officials include Edwin Johnston, Jr., of Columbia chapter chairman; Rodney Mooney of Andover, chairman ex-officio; J. 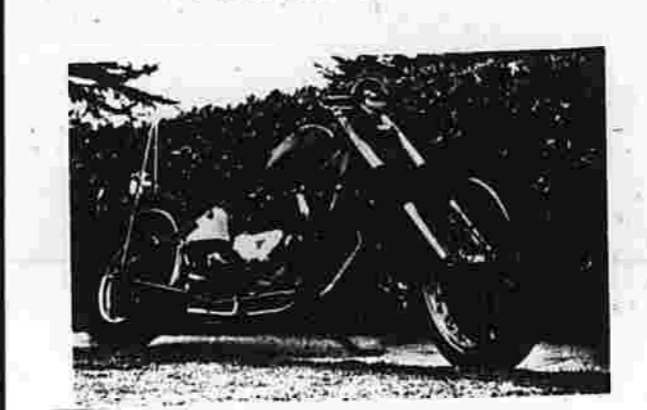

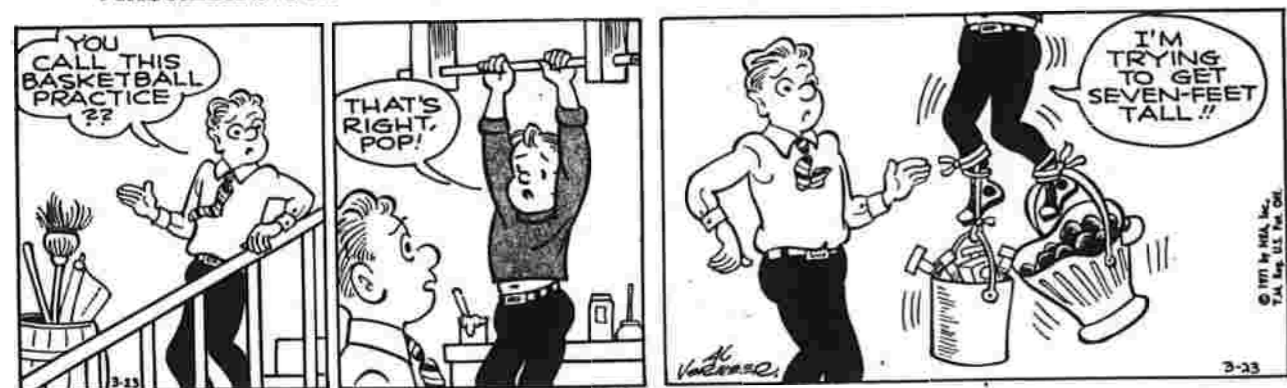

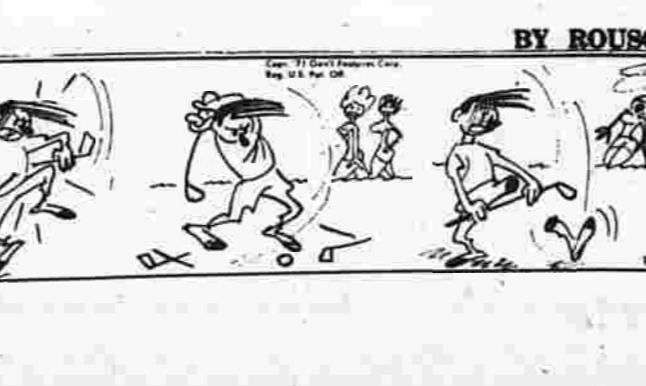
