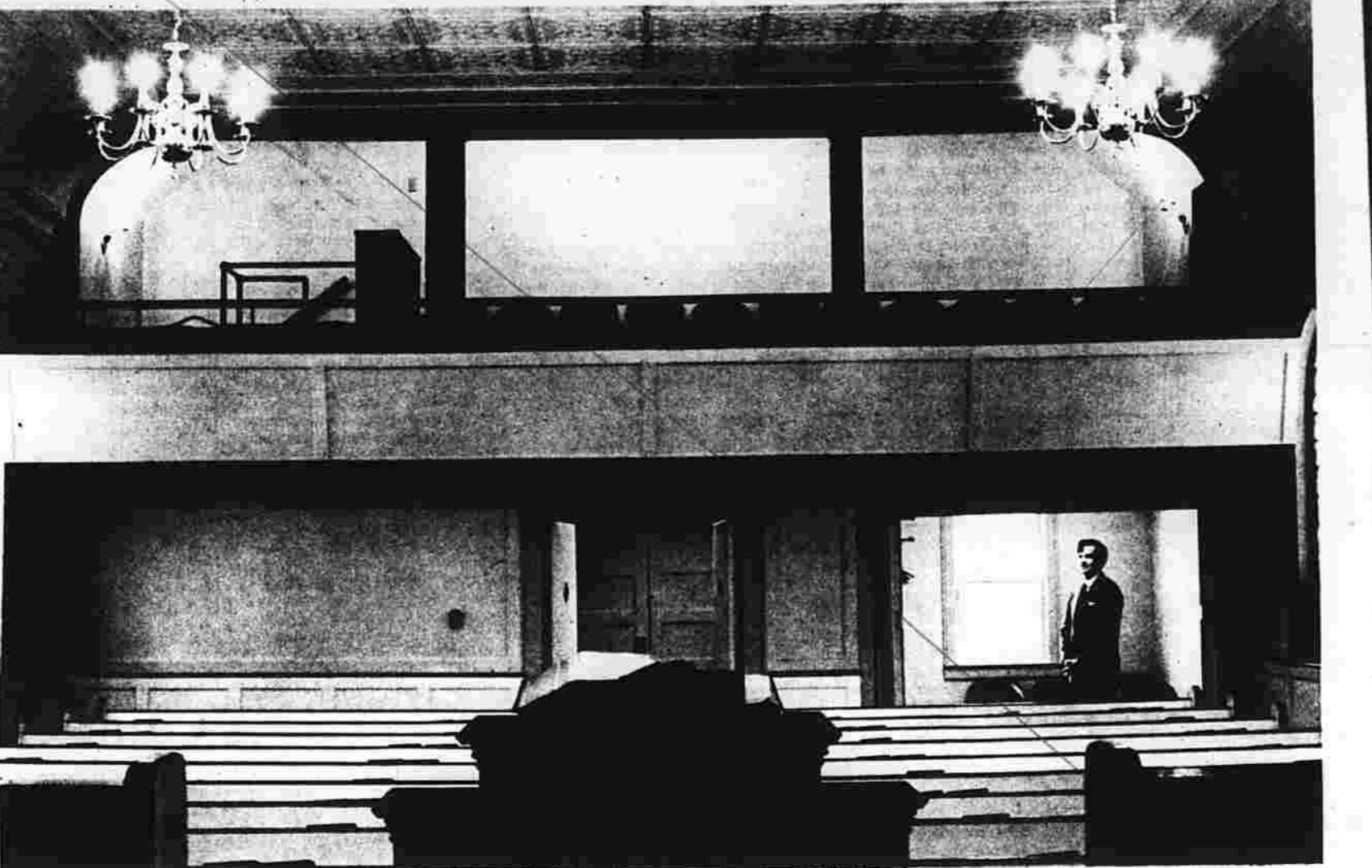

'Improving' UN General Assembly

One could easily laugh, if one did not suffer from some strong feeling that one really ought to go into mourning, over the various proposals that have been advanced for "improving" the work of the United Nations General Assembly.

Free Enterprise An Anachronism

It is time to face the reality that our "free-enterprise" system is not serving us well as we originally intended. In fact, our so-called free-enterprise system is not serving us at all.

The Nation of Liberia, for its part, is also interested in shorter sessions, because "due to the soaring cost of living in New York the cost of maintaining delegations in New York is fast becoming prohibitive."

The Philippines are suggesting, in one respect, a reform even more stringent than any of ours. Where we would try to help rescue the General Assembly by limiting speeches to 20 minutes, the Philippines would limit actual speeches to 10 minutes each, with a compensatory privilege of having more extended remarks in the published record.

Italy, no less concerned with the future health of the world organization than other nations, is proposing that the General Assembly make itself an iron clad rule about having its meetings start right on time, whether or not a quorum is present.

As against all such recommendations for an improvement in the functioning and status of the United Nations General Assembly, there are certain memories from the past and certain hopes for the future.

One can remember, for instance, from the fall of the year 1968, when the General Assembly was in unlimited session, and listening intently to long speeches all night long, and never in any danger of lacking a quorum, and never in any want of important foreign ministers in attendance. That was when the General Assembly was assuming, and exercising, jurisdiction in a matter of world peace or war and employing both its diplomacy and its half-formulated law to impose peace on a war which had already started.

The General Assembly needed no special procedural rules or limitations to enhance its prestige and improve its operation then.

And the reason was simple: the General Assembly was, then, performing the work the United Nations was created to do.

Free Enterprise An Anachronism

For the future, one has to hope, if one hopes for the survival of civilization itself, that the General Assembly will move some day again become something more than a debating society.

For this to happen, there must come a "renewed, and more permanent, act of submission from those great powers which first cooperated in the aggrandizement of the General Assembly in the 1940's, and then retreated from it, to gather power back toward their own security Council votes, when they became aware of their own growing in-bership of the General Assembly.

The act of submission required from the great powers must acknowledge, again, the need for the acceptance and entering of a world law against war, no matter whose war it happens to be.

The United States memorandum on possible improvement of the General Assembly does include the notation that "the United States believes that the General Assembly can be more productive if we talk less, talk more to the point, and do not insist on a point that includes a willingness to subject our own wars to the free debate and judgment and jurisdiction of the General Assembly, it is not so hopeful as it might sound. It almost seems as if the battle to create a meaningful, effective United Nations must somehow be waged all over again.

In the memorandum explaining some of its recommendations, the United States observed that general debate held every year "has tended to become routine and repetitious and to have led to a waste of very other," while "such a debate held every other year and at the level of heads of state or ministers for foreign affairs might constitute a more notable event attracting significantly greater world interest."
