WASHINGTON (AP)— A leadership-backed attempt to resurrect the superconductor port plans headed for a House vote today and no one was backing the idea.

House members agreed there was a chance the House would approve enough money to continue development of the SST through June 30.

"My guess is that we're going to have one helluva job," said Rep. Edward P. Boland, D-Mass., an SST backer.

The vote was on an amendment to turn an \$8.3-billion SST contract into a multi-year appropriation bill into continuation of the 1,800-mile SST development.

### Meskill Firm On Tax Penalty
