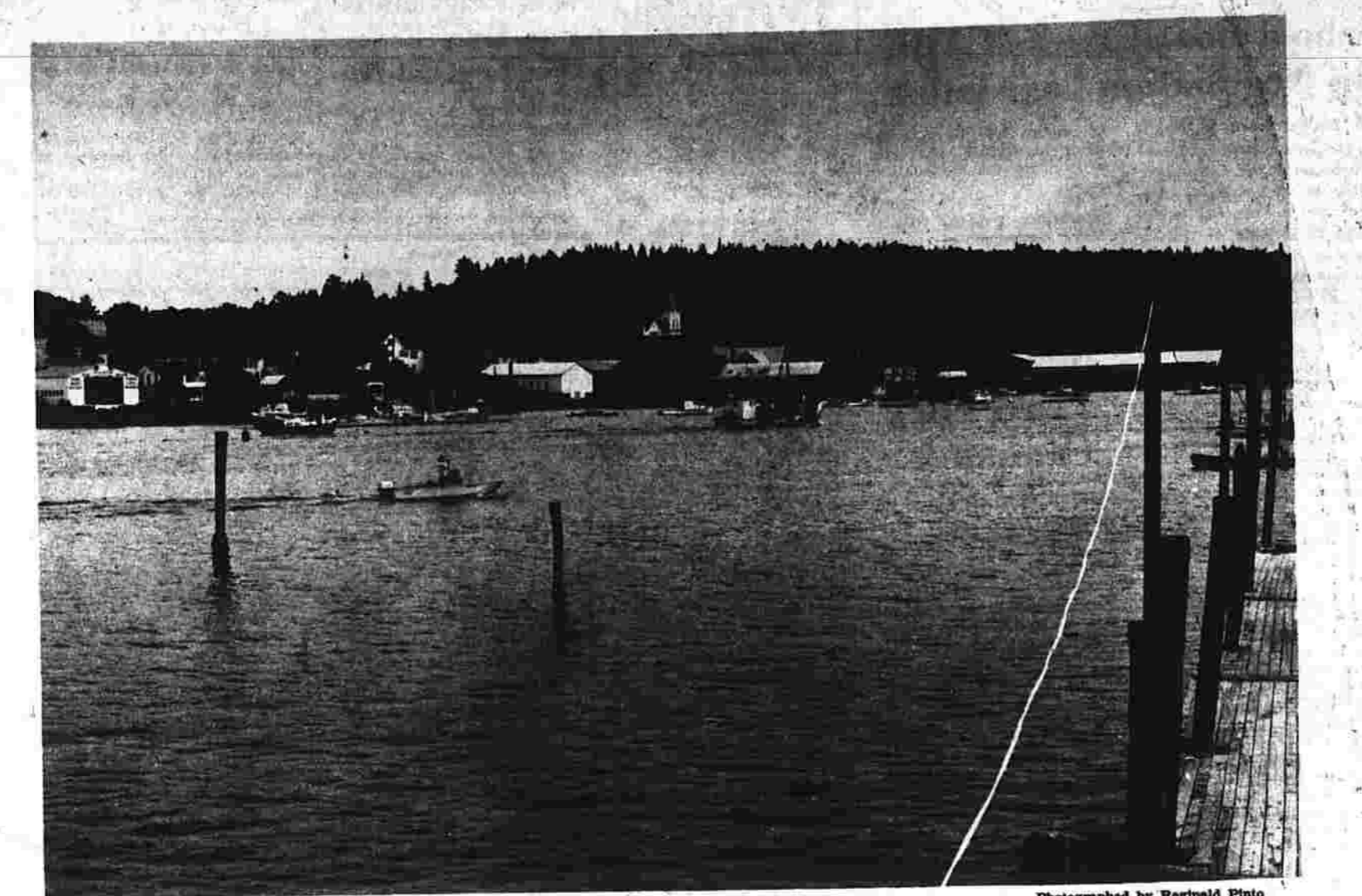

## Debate Continues Among Senators On Troop Cut Bid

WASHINGTON (AP) — Two Foreign Relations Committee members considered undecided on a Senate move to halve the U.S. troop commitment in Europe have lashed out at White House refusal to discuss a compromise.

And Sen. John Sherman Cooper, R-Ky., an opponent of Democratic Leader Mike Mansfield's troop-cut proposal scheduled for a Wednesday vote, told Rogers: "The administration has to realize that we have to make some judgments of our own."

The White House is conducting one of the most strenuous lobbying efforts of the Nixon administration in its bid to defeat the Mansfield amendment.

"Everybody in the administration is calling everybody up here," one Democrat said.

The outcome is considered close—with a large block of undecided senators apparently holding the balance.

Case, who favors the thrust but possibly not the specifics of Mansfield's amendment, lashed his attack on comments made a day earlier by White House press secretary Ronald L. Ziegler, who said the President would not settle for a compromise in the fight.

"This is intolerable," the usually mild-mannered Case said. "It think it was also most undiplomatic of Mr. Ziegler unless it was part of a plan under which 'it was intended that Congress be humiliated.'"

Pell, an advocate of compromise, attacked former Secretary of State Dean Acheson's comment that it was unwise to cut U.S. troop strength without a reciprocal Soviet cut.

Acheson was one of a group of former U.S. diplomats and generals who met with President Nixon Thursday to map strategy against the Mansfield amendment.

Acheson's use of "aimless," Pell told Rogers, "turns us off."

## Mail Rates Increase Tonight

WASHINGTON (AP) — The new Postal Service's first rate increase will go into effect tonight unless the Supreme Court intervenes.

The U.S. Court of Appeals unanimously upheld Friday a ruling by Dist. Court Judge William B. Bryant denying a temporary injunction against the rate increase.

There has been no indication the Supreme Court will be asked to intervene.

The rate boost, effective at midnight tonight, comes under what the Postal Service claims is its authority to make temporary increases pending a recommendation by the Postal Rate Commission.

The members sought the injunction to halt the increases until the rate commission, which begins hearings next Monday on a permanent, \$1.45-billion-a-year revenue proposal, has time to act.

The Postal Service already has printed billions of eight-cent Eisenhower stamps to replace the six-cent version, a record best-seller, and of eight-cent American flag stamps, also popular at six cents.

## Bonn Sees Cut Affecting Moscow Bid

BONN, Germany (AP) — Chancellor Willy Brandt's government fears that a unilateral withdrawal of American troops from Europe would threaten West Germany's efforts to improve its ties with Communist Eastern Europe.

The West German feel that as long as the United States maintains a heavy military presence in Europe, the Soviet Union will remain interested in trying to come to an agreement with Bonn.

If the more than 200,000 U.S. troops in Germany were cut to half that number, as proposed in half that number, as proposed in a letter to the Soviet Union, Communist forces in Eastern Europe would lose interest in coming to terms with Bonn.

This is what Brandt's government meant when it said in a comment on the Senate move: "In the present state of relations between East and West, reduction in U.S. armed forces in Europe would have extremely serious effects on stability in Europe, on the chances for a detente and on the possibility of balanced measures to control armaments."

Brandt's government would have no objections at all to a U.S. withdrawal if it were matched by an equal reduction in Communist forces.

## Underground Nuclear Test Set for June

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (AP) — After the longest halt in almost 10 years, the Atomic Energy Commission says it is ready to resume underground nuclear testing with new ground rules to prevent radiation leaks.

The AEC said Friday it will detonate a nuclear device in early June at the Nevada Test Site 66 miles northwest of here.

The device, designed to free natural gas trapped in rock for a share program to develop petroleum, is a part of the Flowful uses for nuclear explosives, the AEC said.

The shot will be the first U.S. nuclear test in almost half a year, the longest halt in testing since the three-year Eisenhower moratorium ended in 1962.

Testing was suspended by the AEC after a test explosion named Baneberry went awry on Dec. 18, the seventh test since June 1970.

A low-yield shot with an explosive force of less than 20,000 tons of TNT blasted a 300-foot crack in the surface of the Yucca Flat area of the test site.

A plume of radioactive dust, dirt and water vapor shot 7,000 feet into the air, and radioactive fallout was later detected over 18 Western states.

The AEC reported Friday that the Baneberry accident resulted from a geologic fluke and said new procedures would "substantially reduce the probability of a similar future occurrence."

The chief cause of the Baneberry accident was an unanticipated amount of water in the clay and rock 910 feet underground where the shot was fired, the AEC said.

The water increased energy release through the rock, the AEC said. It produced ground motion of a shot three to five times Baneberry's size, said one AEC official.

Radiation contaminated 152 test site workers and 40 of 600 cars checked, and was detectable on the ground at several desert hamlets near the test site, the report said.

However, it added that no one on or off the site was exposed to more than a fraction of the fed-

## Major Mine Blast Claims

SAIGON (AP) — Five Americans were killed when a mine ripped through an armored personnel carrier traveling on a secondary road 17 miles south of Da Nang, the U.S. Command said today.

The incident Friday was the second major mine or booby trap explosion recently. Seven U.S. soldiers were killed and 12 wounded three weeks ago in the explosion of an artillery shell rigged as a booby trap along 90 miles south of Da Nang. Both incidents involved troops of the American Division.

The command reported no ground fighting involving U.S. forces.

South Vietnamese said 60 North Vietnamese and Viet Cong troops have been killed in a new South Vietnamese drive along a 25-mile stretch of eastern Cambodia.

A communique said the bodies of 46 enemy soldiers were found Friday in an area eight miles northwest of the Cambodian town of Kompong Trach. U.S. and South Vietnamese strike aircraft had pounded the region earlier.

Fourteen other North Vietnamese and Viet Cong soldiers were reported killed in clashes involving company-sized units. South Vietnamese casualties for the five-day operation were put at one killed and eight wounded.

## Sadat Meets Reins on

President Anwar Sadat of Egypt moved to strengthen control over his new government today after winning a fierce power struggle with a clique of ministers who he said conspired to overthrow him.

Thousands of Egyptians took to the streets of Cairo chanting full support for Sadat's purge of political foes and shouting slogans denouncing the six ousted ministers.

Trucks loaded with workers and students converged on the presidential palace as crowds marched through the downtown area urging Sadat to "crush all centers of power."

The Egyptian press also supported the government changes.

The mass circulation Al Akhbar wrote: "We support you—Sadat—because we care for the national unity of the country."

Radio Cairo broadcast what it called "avalanches of cables" supporting Sadat, who has threatened to turn "into miscreants" anyone endangering his regime.

The semi-official newspaper Al-Ahram reported that the six ministers were placed under house arrest along with three high officials of the Arab Socialist Union—ASU—Egypt's only political party.
