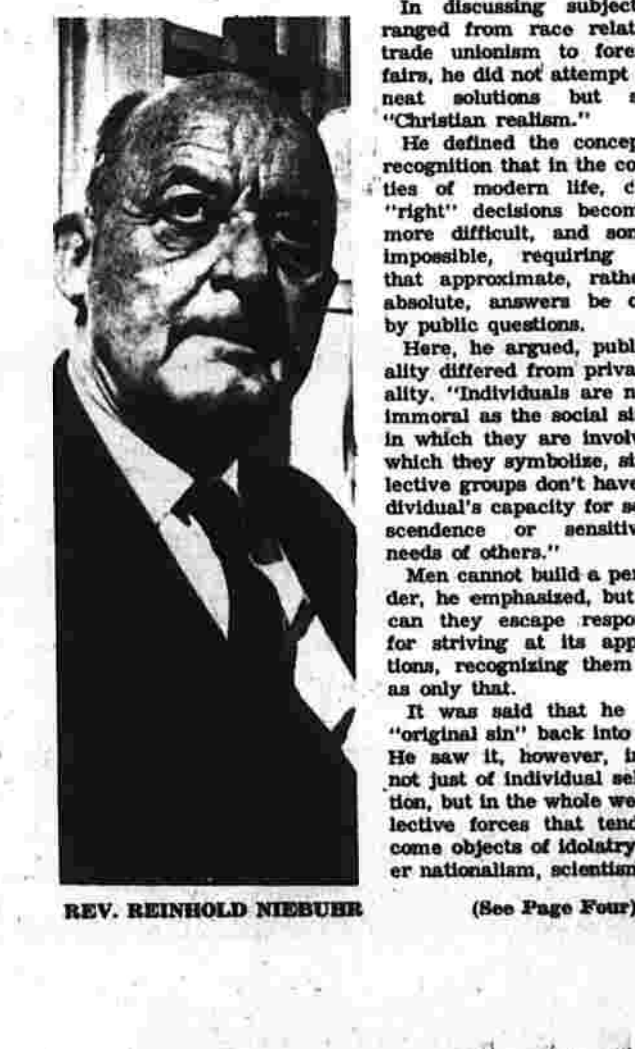

Tolland Three Budget Alternatives Face Residents Tomorrow

Voters participating in tomorrow's budget referendum have three alternatives to choose from, although only two questions are on the voting machines.

The first question to appear on the voting machines will be seeking a \$30,000 cut in the Board of Education budget.

The question is worded "To adopt a budget of income and expenses for the period beginning July 1, 1971 and ending June 30, 1972, by reducing the amount of the Board of Education's budget by \$30,000 and an additional \$90,000 cut in the Board of Education budget."

The second question appearing on the voting machines concerns approval for the Board of Finance budget, already cut 13 mills over original administration requests.

This question is worded "To adopt the town budget of \$3,043,226 as recommended by the Board of Finance to the annual adjourned meeting on May 17, 1971."

The third alternative facing voters is the proposed budget which would reduce the amount of the Board of Finance's budget by \$30,000 and an additional \$90,000 cut in the Board of Education budget.

The question is worded "To adopt a budget of income and expenses for the period beginning July 1, 1971 and ending June 30, 1972, by reducing the amount of the Board of Education's budget by \$30,000 and an additional \$90,000 cut in the Board of Education budget."

According to Town Clerk Gloria Meurant, all five voting machines will be open at noon and will remain open until 8 p.m. at which time the town clerk will close the machines.

Arnold Shorge of Robin Circle, an attorney who will serve as moderator of the referendum, said he was elected moderator of the annual town meeting and has been filling the role throughout the complex series of meetings which have been held on the budget to date.

Although a referendum would usually cost the town about \$600, many of those working at the polls have volunteered their services for the day in the spirit of economy for the town. There are no funds remaining in the Elections Account of this year's budget, already laid hard by last year's primaries and state elections.

Mrs. Meurant said that any bills submitted by workers at the polls will be honored however. Robert Billings will be at the polls on tomorrow noon.

No absentee ballots will be permitted in the referendum, according to the town clerk.

The referendum is the result of the circulating of two petitions throughout the town. Over 200 signatures were obtained on each petition seeking a referendum.

The receipt of two diametrically opposed petitions regarding a budget is highly unusual, according to Town Clerk Robert King, who ruled they could both be placed on the voting machines at the same time.

First Petition
The first petition to be received in the town clerk's office was the one seeking the additional four-mill budget cut, included in a motion made at the annual town meeting by Donald Morgenson, a former chairman of the Board of Finance and president of the local bank.

Circulators of this petition claim they initiated the action in anticipation of another petition to place the Board of Education budget on the referendum.

This petition was dropped somewhere along the way.

The second question on the voting machines was initiated after it was learned that one calling for the additional budget cut was filed with the town clerk.

Tolland Citizens To Study Schools

A group of local residents particularly interested in the town's educational system, organized a fledgling Citizens' Committee for the Public Schools.

The group will serve primarily as a research group, which will make recommendations to the Board of Education regarding the local schools.

Among the areas which may be examined by the group are several suggested last night by Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Kenneth MacKenzie, including an examination and development of actual goals and objectives of the school system.

A statistical study of the town's population and growth factors as they affect the public schools will also be undertaken to determine where the greatest influx of new pupils will occur.

Also to be included in this area is an in-depth study of the 12-month school year.

Although Dr. MacKenzie fastened the 12-month operation of the schools in a relative sense would not save the town much money in operational costs once started, it could postpone the expenses of constructing new schools for some time. It also could, however, create difficulties in the way of disruption of vacation schedules.

Another committee may investigate various state and federal grants under a public school financing study which could be undertaken by business or industry.

The research group will work on a subcommittee basis, with each committee charged with a specific area of study.

The subcommittee will develop its report which will be brought to a full meeting of the Citizens' Committee. Once adopted by the organization the report would be presented to the Board of Education for action.

Abortion Law Survives Test In Bay State

BOSTON (AP)—The Massachusetts House Tuesday quashed an attempt to repeal the state's 1967-old abortion act, a law that was declared unconstitutional last July by the U.S. Court of Appeals.

The House voted 116 to 108 against repeal of the law, which makes it illegal to distribute birth control devices or information to unmarried persons.

The repeal effort was backed largely by Republicans and liberal Democrats.

Rep. Charles W. Long, R-Westwood, a sponsor of the repeal measure, said the law discriminated against the poor, because "the more affluent" whether married or unmarried, already have access to birth control devices.

"For the more affluent 50 per cent of the population in general, this bill might as well already be in effect," said Long. One of the opponents of repeal, Rep. William A. Carney, D-Boston, said ready availability of birth control devices would lead to more "sexual gratification."

Rep. William F. Hogan, D-Everett, said repeal would worsen the "epidemic" of venereal disease in Massachusetts.

The House also passed a resolution to support the U.S. Supreme Court's decision in Roe v. Wade, which struck down the constitutionality of the federal abortion law.

Pair Shares Love Affair With Mines

HEMIGUTH, Colo. (AP) — Irvin and Violet Smith courted in a mine. They reared five children in a mine.

Nearly 50 years later, the spy pick and shovel team is still taking tons of coal from a 1,000-foot shaft here in Hay Gulch. But new federal mine regulations may soon end their lifelong love affair with the dark world underground.

"We days in all I ever knew him and we got married," said Mrs. Smith, whose dark brown hair and firm grip hide her 62 years. "But before we were married, I went with him 8,000 feet underground in an Arizona mine."

"I liked it," she said. "It just fascinated me." Over the next few years the Smiths moved from Arizona to Colorado to New Mexico and back to Colorado where, Mrs. Smith said, "I swore I'd never leave." They were traveling from mine to mine.

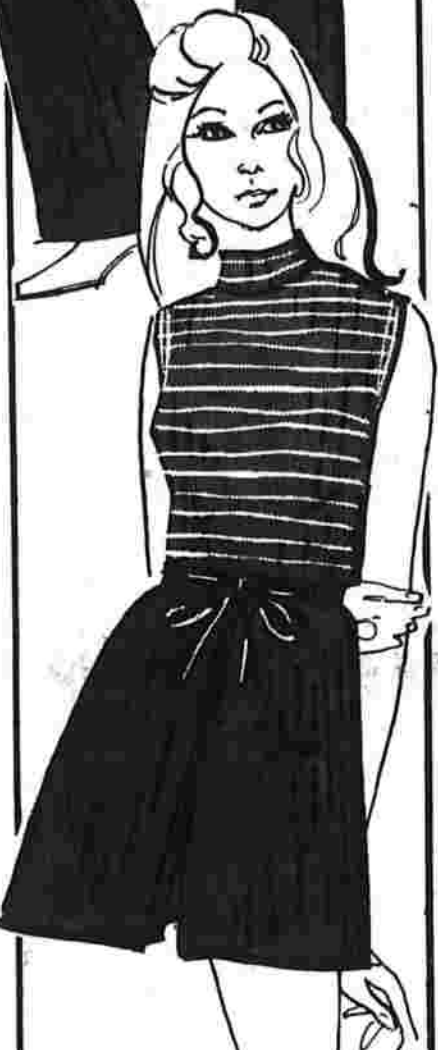
"One thing we never did," she said, "was leave our children." So, when the babies began arriving, they too went into the mines.

"We'd take these children and go into the mine at night and work until we were played out," she said. "We had our kids bedded down in a coal car."

When the Smiths came here to Hay Gulch 30 years ago, coal mining for them was still just a husband-wife venture. But now, most of the mining is mechanized and four hired men work the face of the mine.

The changes also have brought tighter federal control of the industry, including new regulations under the Coal Mine Health and Safety Act of 1969.

They include requirements for gas and dust monitoring equipment and new facilities, such as a toilet down in the mine. The Smiths view the changes as a government attempt to drive out the little man and they've reacted strongly.

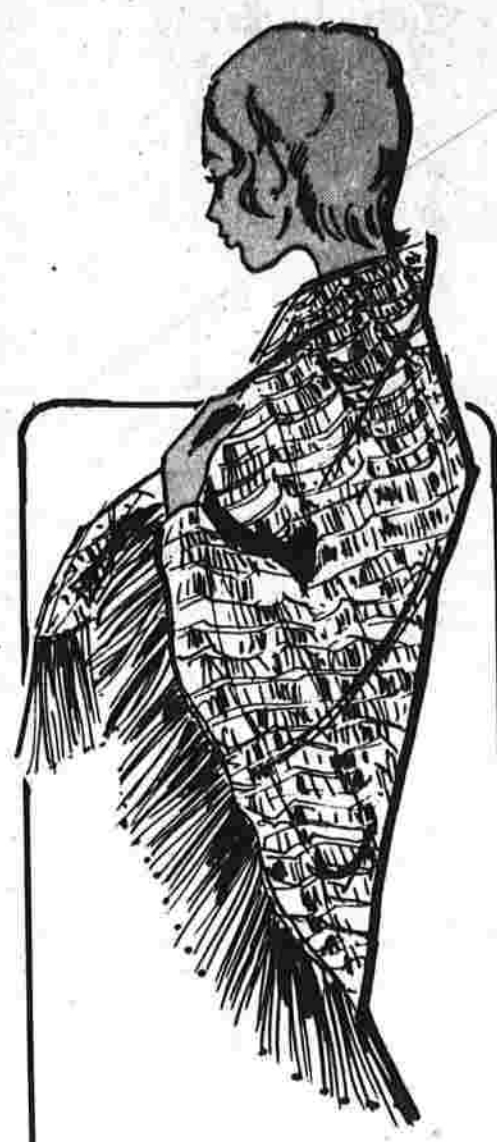
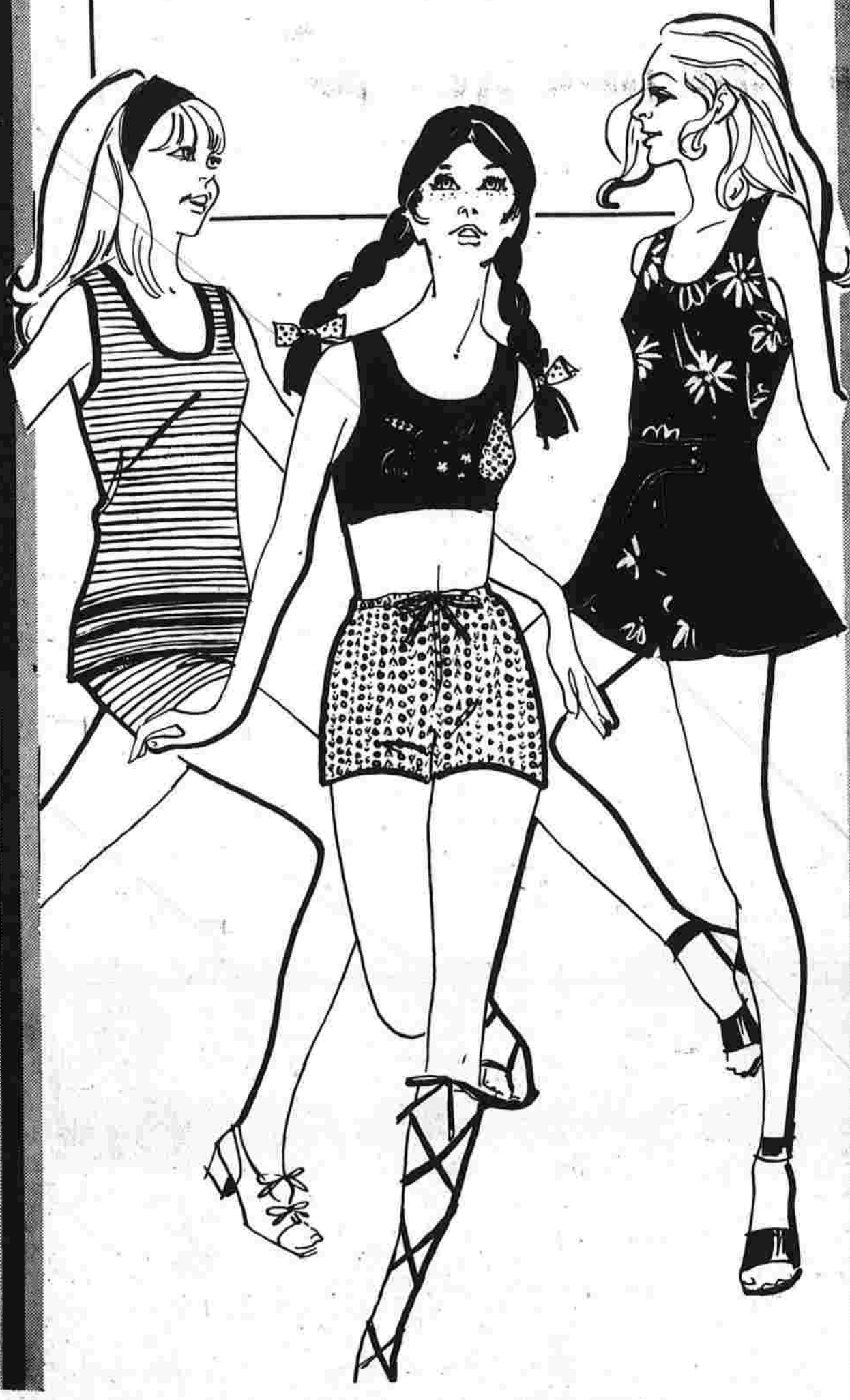

Again, Prisoners As Pawns

Perhaps twisted motivations deserve twisted results, which might mean there is something logical, after all, in the business of the wounded prisoners Saigon was willing to release to Hanoi.

Whatever the source of all the complications and contradictions in the situation, however, we doubt that the human beings more directly involved, the prisoners themselves, are getting very much of a break out of it, whatever their final destination.

The twisted motivation seems to have begun with the United States encouragement to Saigon toward this proposed act of human generosity. We hoped, apparently, that if Saigon would hand over these incarcerated prisoners to Hanoi, then Hanoi might be touched or shamed into releasing some of our American prisoners it holds.

The next twist of motivation seems to have been on the part of Hanoi, which when it accepted the Saigon offer, proceeded to stipulate conditions apparently calculated to make Saigon draw back its offer.

We then apparently persuaded Saigon it must stick to its offer, whereupon it came time to consult the North Vietnamese themselves.

Apparently they themselves have been experienced some twisted and twisted motivations, for the International Red Cross found that only 13 of the 570 North Vietnamese prisoners included in the group Saigon was willing to release wished to be released to North Vietnam after all.

There are two possible explanations why the prisoners may have decided this way. First, they may hate the North Vietnamese, Communist way of life so much they do not want to return to it. You would think that the discovery of such a possible attitude would delight both Saigon and Washington, as a fine propaganda victory.

Strangely enough, Washington, at least, isn't happy the way it might be, and, instead of welcoming such proof that nobody chooses Communism, even when one has fought for it, has been suggesting that perhaps the prisoners have been receiving orders from Hanoi directing them to refuse repatriation.

By this theory, Hanoi would be ordering its people to pretend not to want to go home in order to break up and frustrate the whole scheme for delivery of the prisoners. In that case, Hanoi, instead of feeling itself under pressure to reciprocate by releasing some American prisoners, would be busy attacking Saigon and Washington for their trickery in not delivering the North Vietnamese prisoners they had originally agreed to deliver.

With this theory, we have now arrived at the point at which we apparently prefer to believe the North Vietnamese still really believe their system superior to ours, but are pretending differently for wicked reasons.

Perhaps there is one simple thing that seems clear through all the contradictions. Once again, prisoners are being used as pawns, by both sides.

More Gray In The Hoer? Reports are to the effect that former Senator Eugene McCarthy is proving himself less of an Olympian and more of a mortal by deciding that he wants to

mix into 1972 politics as a presidential candidate again. The McCarthy career, with the climactic exploit in 1968, and then with his subsequent calm turn away from continued political office, has been on the way to becoming a classic.

It would be a classic if a central figure who developed as much surprise power and influence, in one bold exploit should prove able to be content with that one exploit and not try for endless repetitions of it.

And for a time it has seemed that McCarthy might be just the person who could establish, and hold, to such a classic kind of performance.

He is now mounting the public platform, however, with a call for real "end-the-war" candidates in both parties for 1972, and with the further appeal: "If we cannot get such candidates then let us have a new party and a new policy and a true America."

This sounds as if the crusader were getting ready to put on his armor once more, and trot out that white horse once again, and seek to rally, once again, all that wonderful young America which followed him into the campaigning of 1968.

After what McCarthy did to all the political pundits in 1968, there is no one who dares to try to pronounce any flat verdict on what might come of his efforts for 1972.

But it would be par for such a resumption of crusade, on the experience of his life, if there should now appear more checks in the armor, more gray in the hair, and considerable less spontaneity in the following.

The Holiday Drizzle. It rains to fall just on weekends, it would be more just for it to fall in at least beneficial amounts.

For Manchester, Memorial Day Sunday and Monday were days drenched of the calendar, so far as pleasurable or accomplished outdoor pursuits were concerned.

There would have been some positive dividend from such unpleasantness if, after it was over, the meteorologist in garden soil had been replenished.

But when it had plodded for the killing part of two whole days, the net result was a temporary moistening of the surface while, down an inch or two, the dry that which had accumulated through the last half of May was still undisturbed.

The rain which seems like a lot, because it comes on the wrong day, but which ends up doing little more than laying the dust is more an enemy to the gardener than it is his friend. If it patters him into a sense of security he is likely to find, later on, that he has lost important growth impetus no amount of natural rain or emergency watering will ever quite regain for him.

The sensible way of looking at such a rain as spotted the Memorial Day weekend for everybody, including even those who thought they were getting rain they needed, is that of the professional farmer who irrigates his crop, and who might have been observed, before, immediately after, and perhaps even, in some instances, during this holiday drizzle, running his irrigation rigs full tilt.

Warblers To The Rescue. We saw our first warbler of the season the other day, olive-backed with a black V on his chest, and we were reminded of the usefulness of those birds as insect eaters.

Warblers customarily come north in mid-May, flying largely by night, and with the help of their wings, they can cover long distances. Substantial flocks of them appear quite literally over night.

There are many species of warblers, to their delight, and sometimes to the confusion of bird watchers. But they are all insect eaters, and in that capacity have a substantial economic value.

The unseasonable cold weather of this spring has delayed the warbler migration slightly. We suspect, however, that this same chill has also retarded the emergence of insect pests, just as it has retarded the leafing of trees and shrubs. Nature has its own way of synchronizing the complex web of life.

Birds don't get every insect, of course, and that is a good thing too, ecologically speaking. But even chemical insecticides, which are non-selective and kill indiscriminately, do not kill every insect. Some insects, in fact, develop a resistance to chemicals, so that more potent chemicals must be developed. This consequent escalation of insecticides is a vicious cycle, and it is a good thing that the warblers have arrived, as the gypsy moth population will be diminished by nature's own experienced insect killers. — MERIDEN RECORD.

No one knows how much strength they can muster when the show-down comes, but it is a fact that half the Democratic members of Ways and Means come from the major metropolitan areas of New York, Chicago, Los Angeles, Philadelphia, Detroit, Cleveland and Boston.

Perhaps those urban members will go along with Mills, even knowing that they have the votes to decide whether their cities can tap the federal income tax machine. But perhaps they will think twice before they take the responsibility for denying the source of revenue to their constituents.

Some important Democrats clearly are having qualms over Mills' dogmatic opposition to revenue-sharing. It is not sheer confidence, for example, that Mills begins his hearings, Sen. Edmund S. Muskie (D-Maine) will open up a secrete subcommittee for three days of argument on behalf of revenue sharing, an idea whose popularity, he says, settles it to "careful consideration" from Congress.

Two months ago, Muskie caught unbridled hell from the Democrats when they thought he was backing away from his long-held support of revenue-sharing. To remedy that impression, he has come up with his own variant on the Nixon plan, which may be superior to it in some important respects.

There is plenty of time to determine that. For now, the important thing, Muskie says, is that "those of us on both sides of the aisle who support the concept of the revenue-sharing plan, let us work for its passage."

Vernon Residents Ask Effect Of I-86 Expansion

Uppermost in the minds of those attending an informal hearing last night on proposed plans for expansion of I-86, was how it will affect their property and when.

The hearing was called by Mayor Frank McCoy and the Town Council in an effort to allay fears and answer questions of those property owners who may be affected by the proposed widening of the highway to ten lanes.

The same 50 or 60 property owners attending the hearing were mostly from the Rt. 30, Vernon Circle area.

William Ginter of the Department of Design of the State Department of Transportation and Frank Perkins of the Rights of Way Department, were present.

Ginter outlined some changes made in the proposed plan since the hearing in Manchester last September. Part way through the hearing some questions were asked and answered which he promised to do.

Mayor McCoy reminded those attending that the hearing was not a formal one and therefore was not required that he be taped. He noted, however, that Richard Horden, director of administration was writing down the suggestions made and they would be considered.

The proposed plan calls for an improvement and expansion of the existing highway, to meet interstate standards. Plans are to make five lanes of travel in each direction, separated by a median.

Another property owner complained he had been waiting for the hearing to be held and questioned the state's plan for the expansion of the highway. He stated that the state plan would eliminate three businesses in that area.

These are the Donkey Donut Shop, McDonald's Drive-In and a Suncoco Service Station.

The Mayor expressed concern about losing three parcels of taxable property from the grand list and requested that some alternate plans be made concerning that area.

Last night Ginter said that it would not be necessary to put the three businesses on the grand list if they were to be removed.

Since the September hearing when an attorney representing Donkey Donuts argued in favor of the state's plan, the state has noted that the donut establishment was in the process of being completed at that time, the business has opened and closed.

On the other hand, Max Javitz, developer of the Tri-City Shopping Plaza at Vernon Circle, argued the other way, noting that he felt for the sake of property that the three parcels of property should be taken noting that the donut area needs an alternative plan. He cited the already congested area and urged that the state proceed with its original plan to relieve the situation.

Councilman Thomas Wolff sharply criticized the state for keeping property owners up in the air as to what will happen to their particular piece of property.

Reassignment of Rt. 30 Plans call for the realigning of Rt. 30 through to Dobson Rd. Originally property on both sides of Rt. 30 would have been affected by the expansion. Last night, Ginter said this plan had been changed and new proposals will not require that any property on the northerly side be taken, however it will affect some parcels on the southerly side.

Several homeowners asked questions about their particular parcel of land and Ginter, with the aid of a large map was able to tell them whether or not they would be involved. How much advance notice on such action was a question asked several times.

It was explained that the state has a set procedure to follow concerning the acquisition of property. In general the procedure goes as follows: The property is inspected by an appraiser to determine the fair market value, the property owner is contacted and is made

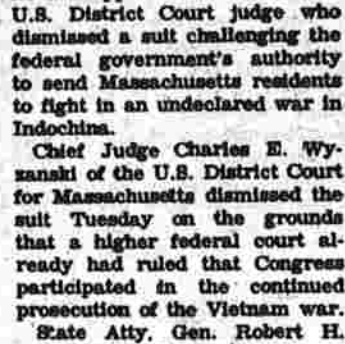
BOSTON (AP) — The Massachusetts attorney general says he will appeal the decision of a U.S. District Court judge who dismissed a suit challenging the federal government's authority to send Massachusetts residents to fight in an undeclared war in Indochina.

Chief Judge Charles E. Wyman of the U.S. District Court for Massachusetts dismissed the suit Tuesday on the grounds that a higher federal court already had ruled that Congress participated in the continued prosecution of the Vietnam war.

Says Atty. Gen. Robert H. Quinn filed the suit last year after the Massachusetts Legislature passed a law stating that no Massachusetts resident could be required to serve in any overseas hostilities without a congressional declaration of war except in an emergency.

Judge Wyman ruled that the 2nd U.S. District Court of Appeals held that both Congress and the President collaborated in the decision to send troops to Southeast Asia and "neither would long maintain such a war without the concurrence and cooperation of the other."

The set will consist of four stamps, each with a different design. The designs feature a stylized silhouette of winter sports activities. Each stamp will bear the Olympic 5-ring emblem. A souvenir sheet also will be issued.

But officials now realize that there is little need for each hospital solving the same general area of the same expensive equipment.

Another blatant example of poor planning involves automobile registrations. While one government agency is issuing road permits for vehicles, another is writing parking tickets. Permits and tickets have a positive correlation.

There is no mystery as to why this should be so, simply stated, there aren't enough legal parking spaces in some city neighborhoods to accommodate all

In U.S. Goals Seen Needed

NEW YORK (AP) — We are told by authorities of various economic and philosophic leanings that what this country needs is a clear set of priorities, a list of goals rated according to the need.

One result, however, is to make clerks of policemen whose duties are needed in the areas for which they are trained, such as crime prevention and emergency assistance. Another is to crowd the courts needlessly, and distort the judicial process.

A common practice, for example, is to permit the offender to plead guilty by simple mailing a check. A plea of not guilty from work and a long wait "out" is another.

And what about the complaints of mayors who say they are trying everything in their power to rejuvenate the city of their cities? Great efforts are being made, but some of the good is diminished by odd tax logic.

In some cities, for instance, the incentive is to maintain the property in its most elemental, least attractive and least profitable state. The parking lot is taxed least, the building that makes the greatest aesthetic and financial contribution, the most.

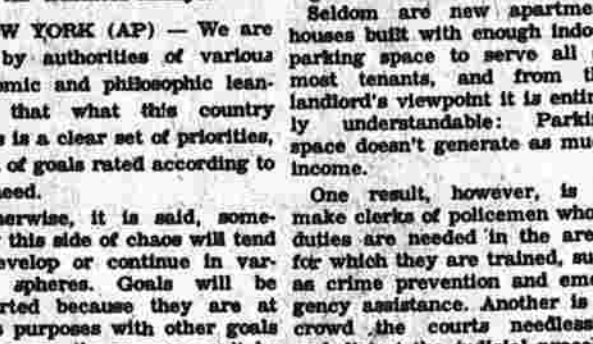
The goal, it would appear, is to have more parking lots, fewer revenue-producing properties and a generally seedy appearance.

City problems are worsened also by a population that is attracted and driven away—a curiously convoluted system of incentives.

The migration from farms to city, for example, is not solely the result of some primal force, similar to that which every often drives the lemmings to the sea. The city brings about "opportunity" and also offers better welfare.

The opportunity often is a myth. The last-paying base of the city diminishes. The city becomes not only poorer but hampered with myriad problems that aren't enough legal parking spaces in some city neighborhoods to accommodate all

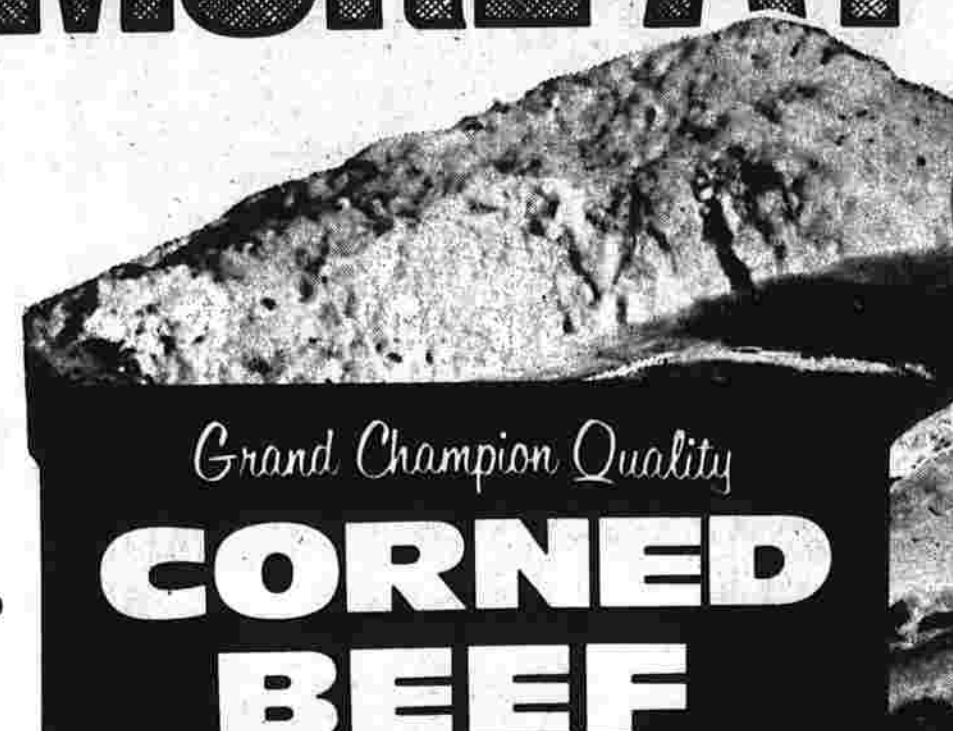

Kelly called for help from fire departments throughout Hartford County and at least 11 towns sent men.

The first big fire broke out Wednesday about 10:30 p.m. at the New Britain Lumber Yard Co. and roared out of control for five hours.

The fire left most of the lumber yard in ruins. Then, with the lumber yard blaze barely under control, firemen were called to an abandoned factory once used by the Emhart Manufacturing Co. a block away.

(According to a spokesman from the Eighth District fire department in Manchester eight men with pumps were sent about 9:30 this morning to relieve weary crews in mopping up operations at the Emhart building. The final stages of the fire were expected to keep them busy for several hours into the afternoon.)

The building, several stories high and a half square mile, was heavily damaged and firemen were still pouring water on the ruins at mid-morning. Flames had been visible as late as 9:15 a.m.

At its height, the blaze had sent embers flying high into a misty, rainy sky and several of the factory walls had collapsed. Firemen also said that at least three nearby houses and its glow could be seen as far away as Meriden and Hartford.
