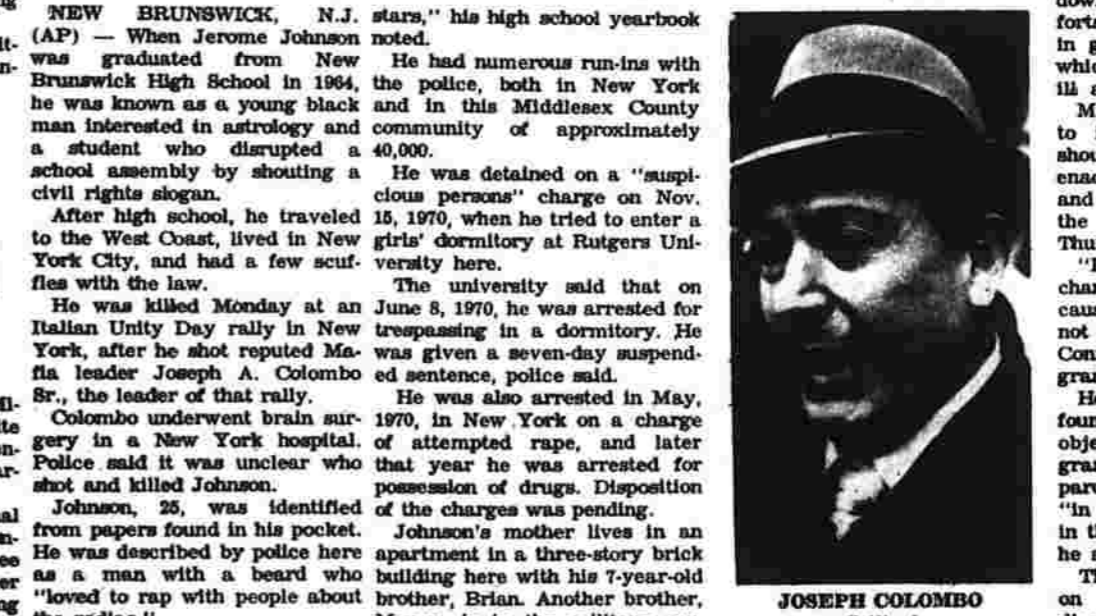

We are not as subtly sure as we used to be that our system of politics is bound to work, or that we can get what we vote for.

We consider, occasionally, the possibility that there may be some kind of war we cannot win.

We suspect that we may have, in our race problem, a crisis we cannot solve.

We are not even sure we can out-guess our out-produce, out-sell, everybody else.

And this growing list of possible instances in what no longer have the unquestioned supremacy, based on superior ingenuity, superior goodness, superior energy, and superior ideas...

Many of us can recognize such possibilities in the present national atmosphere, without finding ourselves able to predict how such a crisis in confidence may work itself out.

But there does seem to be one interim appraisal we might make of ourselves. It is that a little self-doubt, a slight shaking of our sense of all-mastery, a tentative concession that we might not help from some source in solving some of the problems confronting us, might all become us well, and make us seem even more wonderful people than before because now we might seem human too.

The Court And Casus

The bothersome question lurking inside the visceral and emotional feelings of so many Americans have had about the case of Casius Clay during the past few years has been this:

Would we feel the same way about this case of refusal to step forward for the draft if the color of the skin had been different and the identity of the religious affiliation been more familiar?

Or, to phrase it again, would we have considered Casius Clay guilty and would that Education jury have found him guilty if he had been a white conscientious objector?

Most of us would be likely to answer these hypothetical questions in the af-

firmative. There is a thing about heavy-weight champions, who live by violence, developing an aversion to committing violence for their country. Many of us would claim that we would have experienced the same feelings and thought the same thoughts about a white champion.

The Supreme Court, however, has told us different.

It has ruled that what we failed to do in the court handling of Casius Clay, and therefore also, we might admit, in the way we felt about his case, was to give proper credence and respect to the actuality and the sincerity of the religious belief he professed. Add what the Court says that if we think we would have leveled similar court and thought judgment at a white champion, we would have been wrong in this too.

The Court has, in effect, ruled on the circumstances of the Clay case as if it itself had succeeded in conducting its deliberations in another kind of world free of both prejudice and cynicism. The atmosphere in which it discussed and reached its verdict seems something of a rebuke to the super-righteousness of which most of us have been guilty, preferring to disbelieve and condemn a loud mouth rather than concede its possible sincerity.

Well, then, we admit it. There are some things we are supposed to be, which the Court is better than we the people are.

A Disgraceful Session
