Misterogers Neighborhood Headed for Cape Kennedy

A children's special brings space travel down to earth when "Misterogers Meets an Astronaut" July 23 at 7 p.m. on Connecticut Public Television, channel 24 in Hartford.

Fred Rogers, host of public television's Misterogers Neighborhood, visits astronaut Major Alfred M. Worden in the launch room at Cape Kennedy during preparations for the Apollo 15 flight to the moon, scheduled for July 26.

Major Worden, command module pilot of the space ship "Endeavor," is responsible for monitoring communications for the two other astronauts as they explore the moon's surface on a four-wheel, electric vehicle. He answers a variety of questions including how the moon looks close up, what his feelings are about making the flight, how the space suit feels, and how the astronauts eat and drink with their space suits on.

On the half-hour color program, Mr. Rogers supplements a child's natural awe of space travel with the assurance that man can and will return from exploration into the unknown. He concentrates on man's control over the machinery that makes the flight possible, and the astronauts' close contact and cooperation with technicians on earth.
