

Miller noted that in 1969 NASA's Mariner probes indicated Mars had primarily a carbon dioxide atmosphere. The current experiments, along with the information gathered in 1969 and data received from the Apollo 15 instrument, are expected to provide a more complete picture of the Martian atmosphere.

Road Blocked By Carlson Second Time

A man claiming to own a "private island" in the Line and S. Main Sts. intersection was arrested for the second time last night for trying to block Line St.

But after observing the cause with two instruments when the Apollo 15 seismometer was erected, Latham discovered the location of activity deep in the earth and discarded the title. 

House Backs Cotter Stand On Overseas Plant Grants

Democratic Cong. William Cotter of Hartford, who has been fighting to prevent the loss of U.S. jobs to co-production plants set up overseas with federal grants and credits, achieved a measure of success in Congress this week. The House of Representatives approved his amendment to the Foreign Assistance Act. The Cotter amendment, which still must be considered by the Senate, would require the Secretary of State, who controls the Foreign Military Sales Program, to provide full information to Congress before any decision is made to fund overseas co-production plants. The amendment, further, would require the State and Defense Departments to analyze the effects of any such decision on U.S. employment

and to report the analysis to Congress. Cotter's interest in overseas co-production plants arose earlier this year, when he learned that Colt's Firearms was establishing a South Korea co-production plant for M-16 rifles. The plant is being funded by \$42 million of Defense Department Military Sales credits. The First District Congressman was vociferous in his objections to the arrangement, pointing out that he was "less than successful" in securing full information about the Colt's-South Korea deal.

Boise Continues Phase-Out Of Town's Case Bros. Plant

Starting Monday, Boise Cascade Corporation's Case Bros. Division on Glen Rd. will have only 15 hourly employees in the production work force, and the number will slowly decline over a three-month period in preparation for the plant's final shutdown at the end of the year.

Paper laminating and finishing operations will continue on a limited basis until November, when all of the firm's operations will be transferred to the Brattleboro, Vt., plant. The division's general offices, employing about 25 salaried persons, will also be transferred to the Brattleboro facility.

The company announced last December that the 110-year-old Case Bros. operation would be gradually shut down over a period of several months, affecting 75 hourly employees. The company has offered to relocate all the employees to the Vermont plant, but so far only three or four have indicated a desire to go there, according to Division Manager John Wasserlein. Most of the workers laid off

in connection with the shutdown went on voluntary retirement, or found other jobs before separation from the company.

All who are separated receive severance pay (including those going to Vermont) on a sliding scale based on service. Those who decide to move will receive a relocation allowance from the company.

Virtually all of the salaried employees will make the move to Brattleboro, Wasserlein said. The accounting department will transfer during the next two months, and the sales department will stay on a little longer.

George Maloekie, mill superintendent in the local plant, has been promoted to finishing superintendent in the Brattleboro plant, and his transfer will be effective next week. Mike Zawistowski will take over as acting superintendent in Manchester, and he will be responsible for the final phase-out of the mill.

All of the company's local property will be disposed of, including the main plant, several outbuildings, and the 33-acre site. The facility is up for sale, with real estate brokers Dow

and Condon of Hartford representing the company. Much of the plant machinery is being moved to other Boise Cascade plants, some of it is being sold, and some is being junked. Other equipment, some dating back to the 19th century, is being given to the Smithsonian Institute in Washington, D. C., and to another private museum in Georgia.

Case Bros., one of Manchester's oldest continuously operated companies, was founded in 1861 by twin brothers Alfred Wells Case and Albert Willard Case. With an original investment of \$135, the firm at first washed cotton waste for the manufacture of gun cotton during the Civil War.

After the war, the company became a leader in the production of pressed paper board, album board, and binder board. The company was run as a family-owned business until 1967, when it was sold to Boise Cascade, an international forest products firm.

The Case division began to feel the pinch of a business decline last fall, and continued operations in Manchester were no longer economical. With prospects looking bleak for improved business, Boise Cascade decided to transfer the local plant's manufacturing lines to the modern Brattleboro facility, built in 1961 by Case Bros.



## 'Teddy Bears' Challenges TV's Ethnic Censorship

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Dean Jones, unscarred veteran of two sorties into televisionland, is eager for a third. "The Chicago Teddy Bears," a CBS situation comedy, will have the tall, soft-voiced actor playing a Prohibition Era speakeasy operator in conflict with the mob—a lovable band of incompetents.

Chicago history during the 1920s, with its bloody gang warfare, was not exactly a barrel of laughs, but Jones says that his version of history will have the mob looking like "a bunch of pussycats."

The series comes at a time when organized ethnic groups are on the alert for slurs and stereotypes, so a fantasy about Chicago mob activity in the period could be on dangerously thin ice.

"We're deliberately trying to avoid offense," Jones reported. "We don't kill anybody, although in one episode the plot hangs on a contract for a killing, but it is all based on a misunderstanding."

Jones' character is called Linc McCray, a bland enough handle. "Big Nick Marr," played by standup comic Art Mitrano, is the head of the "Chicago Mob"—originally the name was Marco but it was anglicized before filming started.

Jones has a special interest in the series—his Dean Jones Production Co. has a piece of the show—but since he has firm commitments for three theatrical motion pictures including

another family-siye Disney film (he has already starred in seven) he is not worried about keeping busy or solvent.

His first series, "Ensign O'Toole," started on NBC eight seasons back and succumbed after one season in the ratings race. ABC picked it up and reran it the next season in prime time "just when the competition, 'Perry Mason' and 'Dr. Kildare,' were peaking off," and the show unexpectedly turned into a modest hit.

"They wanted to make more," Jones said, "but I wouldn't do it unless we could get the original cast—and that was impossible."

Then came "What's It All About, World?" for ABC which lasted 17 shows.

"We had a good smart satirical show," he said, "but it came just when the Smothers Brothers were having their troubles. The panicky network people said—two weeks before we started—we couldn't hurt anybody's feelings. So there we were, with the shell of a show that had lost all its bite."

Jones, an Alabama native, started out to be a singer and turned actor almost by a casting accident. He has appeared as star in a couple of hit Broadway shows, most recently the New York production of "Company."
