Judge Urges Legal Heroin

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — A municipal judge has proposed legalizing the sale of heroin to reduce illegal drug traffic and crimes related to drug addiction. He starts to treat the addict as a sick man and not as a criminal, most of the drug problems would disappear. Judge Paul A. Dandridge said Thursday at a Temple University seminar on gangs. He proposed selling heroin at community centers at a minimum fee of 10 cents a bag. In contrast, the average heroin addict now pays \$10 to \$15 a bag for illegal heroin.

Huge Profit Expected In Dollar Sale

WASHINGTON (AP) — The government hopes to earn more than \$100 million from sale of the Eisenhower silver dollar, making it the most profitable U.S. coin ever minted. It also may be the last made of silver. The profit will be stretched out over several years as the U.S. Mint disperses of some 150 million the silver dollars to collectors and others interested in buying it at a premium. Harry T. Brooks, director of the mint, says she hopes the sale will net the Treasury well in excess of \$100 million. "It goes to the taxpayer, right into the Treasury," she said. "I don't want to try to make any money."

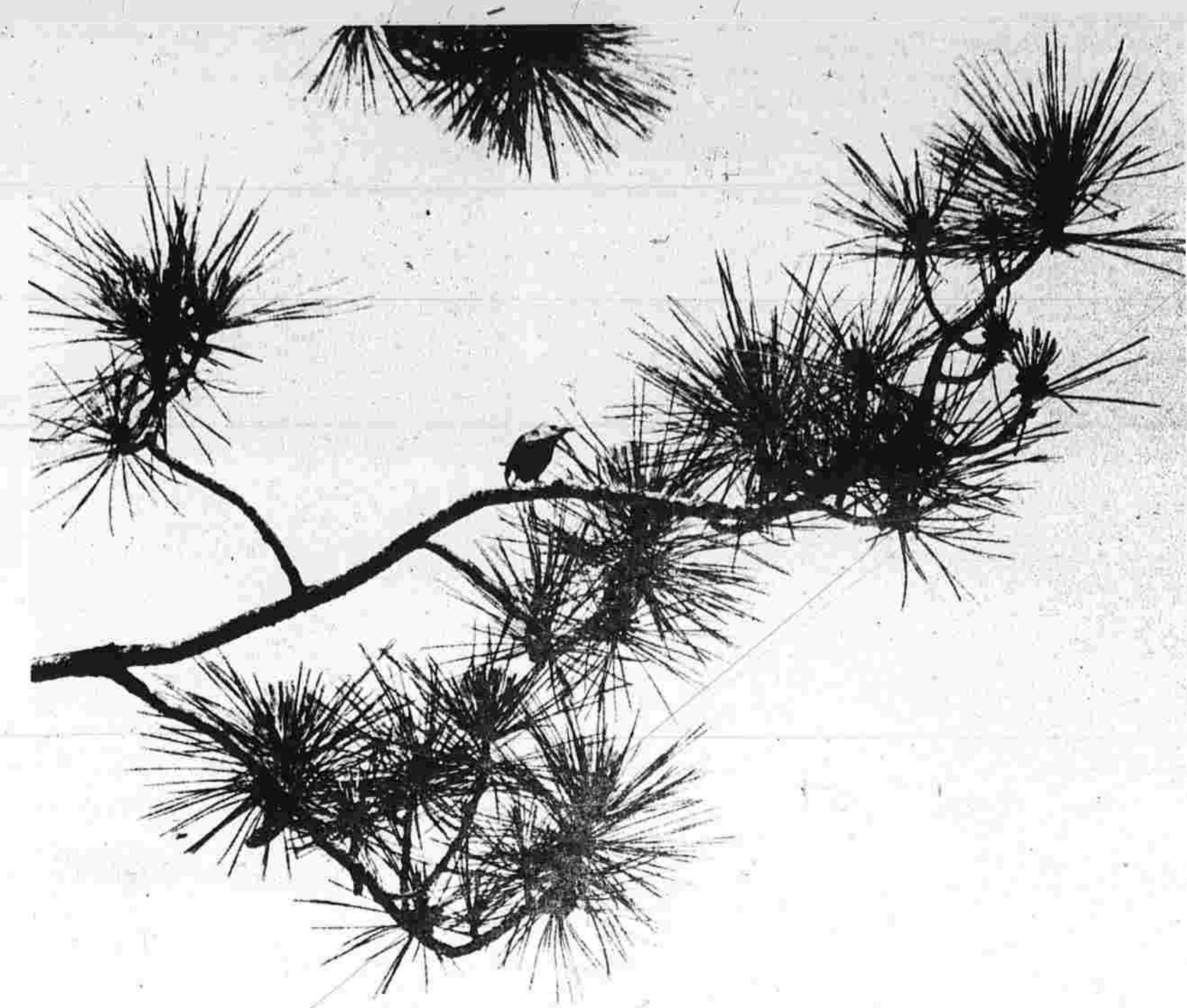

The Governor On The Spot

The Democratic majority in the General Assembly, finally cohesive and united on the one objective of embourgeois a Republican Governor, no matter how desperate and callous the gamble with the state's fiscal welfare, have indeed succeeded in putting Governor Meskill on the spot.

They have, on the one hand, sent him a report of the state income tax, a report he himself has said he wanted.

They have, on the other hand, sent him an almost unbelievable proposition with regard to the \$280,000,000 state deficit which was, last fall, and last January, and which remains still now, the state's most urgent financial problem.

Governor Meskill, actually proposed paying this deficit off in one year, the Democrats suggested five years; both sides, in one compromise package or another, agreed to begin by paying off one-third of it in the new budget.

But just what, the Democrats' methods demand a bit which, by all accounts, has not been achieved. The party's penny toward saving the beginning of paying off the state debt.

This meant that no effort at all was being made to meet and solve the number one state problem the General Assembly has had before it since it met in January, but that, quite to the contrary, it was taking action to add to that problem, and actually starting off the new fiscal year by increasing, rather than diminishing, the old debt.

If Governor Meskill has ever seemed to mean anything, if he has seemed to consider any one thing more important than anything else, it has been his continued insistence, up to now, that the state make, this year, at least a creditable beginning to paying off the debt.

We sympathize with him now, as he ponders the question of how in the world he can accept such a callously irresponsible proposal.

Long Road Out Of The Jungle

Eventually, one has to hope, mankind will become so civilized that all men, everywhere, will refuse to engage in the business of killing one another even for the most just of causes.

We are now a long way from any such point.

But we have, now in our time, moved a new distance forward, toward that point.

We have, within the democracy of the United States, come to a new permissiveness and tolerance for those of our own citizens who question the justice and legitimacy and righteousness of a particular war their country is waging.

Even when such citizens carry their questioning and their protest to the point of refusing to serve in such a war, we do not punish them, we do not ostracize them, as we would have done in former wars.

Such a condition is more likely to develop in a democracy than under some more authoritarian form of government, and it is obviously because federal is a democracy that there can be, from Lansing, such a small but significant item in the news as that in which, the other day, four citizens of that country announced they were returning their draft notices because they did not wish to serve as members of an armed force which, in their personal opinions, was "occupying" territory which did not properly belong to it.

As one salutes the development of such tender sentiments in one or two democracies, one has to give some thought to the apprehensions of those students of history who see, in such softness, the beginning of the end for the democracies, in favor of the conclusive rise of societies which are made of rougher, tougher stuff. One has to hope that, in their progress toward civilization, the democracies do not merely make themselves defenseless. So one has to go on to hope, then, that the softening process spreads out into more societies and more nations, until a majority of them are ready, at last, to cede to the United Nations and to international law their right to wage any kind of war.

Along what still may be the very long road toward such a day, there will have to be the demonstration of what is sometimes the greatest courage of all — the courage not to fight — on the part of more individuals, and finally, on the part of proud nations.

Our jungle phase has lasted long enough. We have to believe that human nature, and law, can some day complete a joint journey to a softer style of existence.

Jackson's Young Socialists

WASHINGTON — Leaders of the youth arm of the Socialist party of the U.S. paid a secret visit last week to Sen. Henry M. Jackson of Washington, ridiculed by the Democratic party's current takers as a "conservative" and a "hawk," and came away unimpressed.

The nine-member delegation from the Young People's Socialist League (YPSL) made no commitment to Jackson. Indeed, they are also favorable to Sen. Hubert Humphrey of Minnesota (whom they visited the next morning) and, less surely, to Sen. Edmund Muskie of Maine. But, unofficially, the heart of the Young Socialist now belongs to Scoop Jackson.

Each backing from a relative obscure left-of-center youth group puts a new perspective on the candidacy of dark-horse Jackson. Support from a young socialist group suggests he is scarcely the reactionary he is currently portrayed.

Moreover, YPSL typifies the voters the Democrats need to win to defeat President Nixon. Unlike the New Left campus organizations, YPSL consists of working class, predominantly Roman Catholic students, whose parents are labor union members, and who have been an effective counterweight against New Left campus excesses.

As such, they have been attracted by Jackson's assault on the New Left, his traditional broad-and-better liberalism, support for organized labor and anti-Communism. They are doubtful about his hawkishness on Vietnam and his devotion to civil liberties. To help resolve those doubts, a meeting of the YPSL leaders was arranged by Ben J. Wattenberg, a key Jackson political adviser, in Jackson's Capitol hideaway.

Jackson began by telling his young visitors (whose "socialism" is akin to the British Labor party and the German Social Democrats) that he is no Socialist. He next noted that both McCarthy, Joe and Gene, had come into Washington to try to defeat him — Joe in 1960 because he was Communist and Gene in 1966 because he was too hard on Communism.

The Social Democrats in Norway (home of his ancestors), said Jackson, neglected national defense and in World War II fell victim to "the hobnob boot." Thus, he rejected as a "test of liberalism" how soft on defense a politician can be. "Despite the fiasco in Southeast Asia," said Jackson, "the great majority of Americans will not turn tail on our obligations to the world."

Asked about Vietnam, Jackson replied he had always opposed protracted conflict on the Asian mainland. But he also opposed a deadline on troop withdrawal (advocated by the Democrats
