This Private School Offers Training in Cold War Tactics

CULPEPER, Va. — In an era of Vietnam phantoms and a heralded Presidential visit to Red China, the "Cold War College" has continued its struggle to instill in the hearts and minds of the American people the will to resist the internal Communist conspiracy.

The college, formally known as the Freedom Student Center, was founded in 1966, the college is located on a magnificent 683-acre estate just west of Culpeper and 75 miles from Washington, D.C. There are plans for a large complex of buildings but lack of funds has limited the school to the splendid fields and a manor house that came with the \$200,000 estate.

Some day, it is hoped, there will be a resident faculty and long-term program for exposure of students to the depth of education in the scope and ramifications of the "impossible life-and-death struggle between communism and democracy."

Three-day Seminars
For the time being, the school conducts monthly three-day seminars for students and Congressional staffers along with other persons actively interested in the \$150 fee.

Overseeing it all is John M. Fisher, 49, former FBI, former executive of Sears, Roebuck & Co., and presently of the Institute for American Strategy and the American Security Council. He said they were very active in the field of anti-communism in public schools, have drawn high praise from persons of power such as President Nixon and FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover.

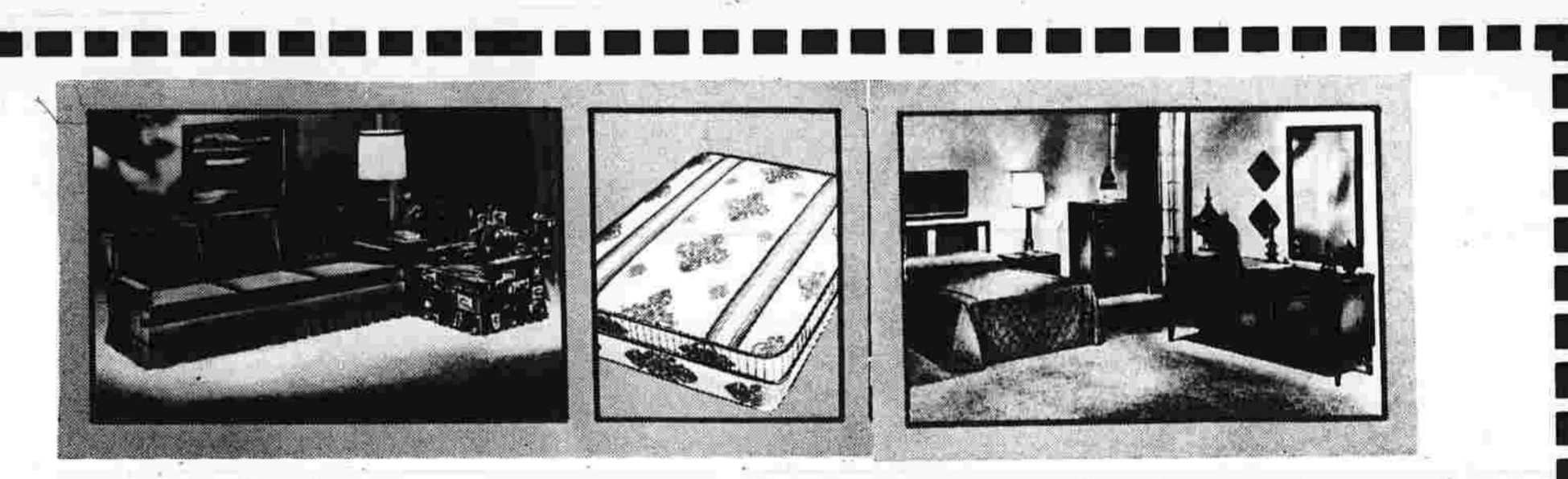

Navajos Plant, Tend Seeds of Education

TASILE LAKE, Ariz. (AP) — Yante Eggy cupped his weathered red hands and raised it slowly. "Our college is like corn," he said in Navajo. "Corn takes care and will grow."

Eggy's old eyes squinted beneath a battered cavalry hat as he watched the quick detection of a permanent site for Navajo Community College, the first college ever created on a reservation.

Eggy and many of the tribe's elders contend the future of the Navajo hinges on the education of the tribe's youth, and they are planting seeds in that direction.

Eggy, about 70, speaks no English and he's never attended school. But he's a member of the 10-man board of regents for Navajo Community College, a two-year, state-funded institution.

He sits alongside 26-year-old Raymond Brown, president of the traditional Navajo hogans in the traditional Navajo hogan in the traditional Navajo hogan in the traditional Navajo hogan.

Most of the students ready to begin their education at Navajo Community College because "it's on the reservation."

Henry Ed Riley, 24, of St. Louis, Mo., is an exception. Riley is a Navajo, and he is in the land of the Navajo.

"I personally feel that NCC is what we have always needed," said Brown. "The school which teaches our young people to become leaders among our own."

Brown said other colleges and universities had "barriers" with the white and black people, their social life, and their environments, but NCC teaches what we, the American Indian, want to learn."

Eggy is a farmer in Navajo Indian studies, said students are represented at every level of the college's government.

Ned Hattahli, 47-year-old school president said, "Everybody is on an equal basis here."

Brown is the many of his classmates. He plans to transfer to a four-year institution to complete a degree, then return home to help his people on the reservation.

Three School Questions Go on Fall Referendum

After a long, but unusually tame, public hearing, the Board of Directors last night authorized three school referendum questions for a vote this fall.

In the three questions, Manchester Voters will be asked to approve appropriation of:

- 1. \$2.7 million for a North-east Elementary School;
 - 2. \$8.57 million for a South-west Junior High School;
 - 3. \$300,000 for a pool at the proposed new junior high school.
- The Board of Education had recommended that the questions be put to the voters at a referendum to be held in October.
- The directors included 17,000 for a man who pays over \$200,000 a year in taxes, a project which will be located in the area of the new school building.
- The directors also voted to support a \$2 million referendum for a new school building.
- The directors also voted to support a \$8.57 million referendum for a new school building.

Gasless on the Thruway? N.Y. Clips Service Charge

ALBANY, N.Y. (AP) — Oil cuts for fuel delivered, plus 10 companies must promise to per cent of the gross sales on drop service charges to motorists on the New York State Thruway if collected \$4.4 million from them to complete a contract to operate service stations on the superhighway, the Thruway Authority said today.

The condition was listed in the announcement that the authority will accept competitive bids Oct. 4 for five-year contracts to operate all 31 service stations on the superhighway. Current contracts expire Dec. 31.

Stations now may charge \$3 by or \$4 at night to patrons whose vehicles run out of gas, plus the cost of fuel. New contracts would retain only the charge for the cost of the fuel.

Chairman R. Burtley Blythe said the bidders must submit a plan to operate 31 service stations and to provide for the cost of the fuel.

The authority said it would allow a single oil company to bid for operation of all 31 service stations or for any smaller group of stations.

Clergyman with Handicap Spreads Cheer in Hospital

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn. (AP) — Father Paschal Kelly, pastor of St. Ann's Catholic Church in a suburb of Minneapolis, spreads cheer in the hospital lobby and occasionally says Mass in the chapel.

It's no man's land you'd expect of any hospital chapel.

But Father Kelly spends most of his time in the chapel, helping except for a little finger movement, turning his hands in prayer, and talking with friends.

In the 67-year-old Roman Catholic priest, it's the spirit that shines through. He is a man of quiet faith and a profound respect for life.

Although a victim of multiple sclerosis more than 30 years, he cannot move, stand or walk. "People have been no kind to come my way," he tells a visitor. "I'm so grateful for all the things that come my way."

Father Kelly regards himself as a man of prayer. He is a self-appointed special chaplain at St. Mary's Hospital, where he has been confined nearly 15 years. And you can tell there's something unusual about the man who has spent his life in prayer.

Planted in the hall at an angle just outside the room is a six-foot wooden stand anchored by a cement block. Except for the mirror, it's all painted hospital white.

The reflection shows an image into a mirror propped on a chest near the foot of the priest's bed. This is aimed at another mirror suspended from the ceiling. So Father Kelly can see what's going on in the hall.

He has other props. A second mirror on the chest angles out over the window. He has a charging battery or other traffic on the winding Mississippi River in his prism-shaped glasses are fastened a curved mouthpiece and a small hearing aid. He has a telephone on the phone when he needs it. He has a hearing aid.

Another switch, mounted on a board just to the right of his bed, controls a television set from one station to another. The television rests on the dresser alongside two mirrors that open the doors to his world in the hallway and the river.

Father Kelly enjoys all the equipment, most of which is rigged up by hospital electricians. He's almost always smiling.

"Somebody said to me one day, 'Why do you have all these things?' I said, 'I have them because they help me see the world that's there.'"

He said he had no shortage of compassion.

"Once I had visitors from five continents within the space of two hours," he smiled. "They were there, as always have been, these folks about the globe, and I'm glad to see them."

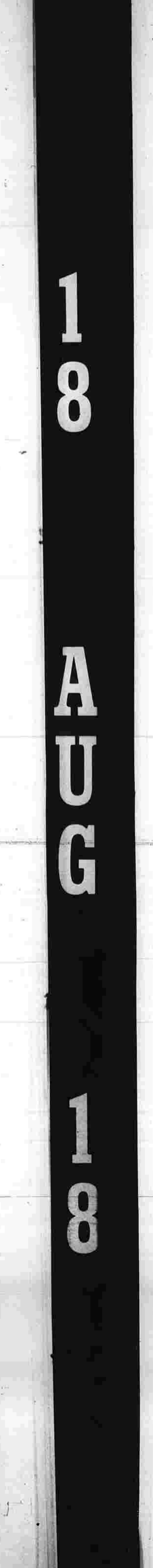

Where The Wheel Stops

Americans who experienced very slight twinges over the possibility that the new Nixon economic game plan might work some peculiar magic in its application to those who do business with us on the international level are having a great deal more trouble, as is quite natural, accepting the possibility that it involves some unpleasantness for themselves at home.

When you stop the wheel of inflationary fortune, even for a 90 day period, it is impossible to stop the wheel at the precise position which favors everyone. The moment selected is bound to be better for some than for others. And it has taken only a relatively few hours for everybody to start figuring out his own position, and begin to protest, or resist, or even violate the President's attempt to impose a freeze he may not be able to enforce.

It has to be hoped that, in the shake-down, our real performance in response to the President will be better than our first instincts.

It is not possible to focus our attention clearly on what the success of the President's new game might bring, and on the alternatives we may still be facing should we help cause it to fail, the popular response should be, in our opinion, all one way.

The positive possibility we can reach for is an end to a mad inflationary scramble which hardly makes sense in an economy which is also plagued by unemployment.

The negative alternative is to let that scramble go on, when we know, in actuality, even though we are never able instinctually to behave as if we did know, that nobody ever wins that scramble, nobody ever gets ahead to stay ahead.

Even those who may have been caught, by the President's 90 day order, in a particular position which makes it seem a special and unrepeatable injustice to them would, we believe, still be better off in the long run to absorb the present injustice and sacrifice in order to help produce a new condition in which everybody will be better off.

The President's new attack on the problems of the economy is big enough and sweeping enough so that it ought to be able to appeal to all of us, not as something the President is trying to pull over in the interests of his own political career, but an opportunity for all of us to play some part in the long necessary business of restraining ourselves in our own best interests.

How About A Rover?

The outstanding product of World War II might easily have become a certain four-wheel-drive vehicle with a four letter name.

But after the war itself was over, we learned to improve the vehicle and change its design and increase its cost so that it soon lost its chance of becoming man's all-around simplest form of transportation vehicle, and became, instead, a special form of luxury.

Now we have another potential div-

dent from our great national expenditure for our journeying into space, and it is to be hoped we do not missmange this new transportation opportunity.

We refer to the "Rover," a four wheel vehicle with a five letter name which, like its World War II predecessor, has some chance of becoming that universal vehicle we have all been waiting for ever since the decline of the military.

Does it cost too many billions of dollars to design, engineer, and produce the first "Rover." But it may not have been much more than it cost to bring out the first of those World War II vehicles.

The calculation some one should make now would be this: Suppose the manufacture of that World War II four wheel drive vehicle had continued, at the same succeeding as years, without any change in design. What would be the cost of producing one such vehicle today?

Perhaps, such are the ingenious ways of inflation, it would still emerge as a luxury item rather than the lowest common transportation denominator.

In such case, there's no use trying to make something permanently useful out of the "Rover."

But what the American people have had a standing order for, ever since the last Model T, has been some standardized basic transportation vehicle which would cost less, not more, or at least the same, from year to year. And we resent the idea that only somebody in some other country can approach doing that for us.

AMERICANS AT HOME: From the Colonials to the late Victorians. By Harriet L. Peters. Serfboer, \$14.95.

Stamps In the News

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico—The oldest, complete, still-lived-in city under the American flag—will be feted on a new U.S. 8-cent stamp. It will honor the 400th anniversary of the city's founding.

First day ceremonies in San Juan will take place on Sept. 12 coinciding with the opening of the 1971 National Governor's Conference in that city.

Founded in 1521, San Juan is on the western end of an island bordered on the north by the Atlantic Ocean and on the south and west by a vast bay. It is a city with a proud and rich heritage.

The new U.S. stamp will depict a detail in San Juan's famed El Morro Castle. It is a woodcut which attempts to reveal the 16th century atmosphere. The background has a wood-grained effect. The castle's sentry box and fortress walls are in tones of brown. The dates "1521-1971" appear at the bottom.

Collections desiring first day cancellations may send addressed envelopes containing postage to cover the cost of the stamps to: "San Juan Stamp, Postmaster, San Juan, P.R. 00986." No personal checks will be accepted. Requests must be postmarked no later than Sept. 12.

Scott's Standard Postage Stamp Catalogue for 1972 will be published in three volumes instead of the usual two which have appeared annually for nearly 80 years. Each retail at \$2.

Volume I will contain the listings of the stamps of the U.S. and its possessions, United Nations, British Commonwealth, Central America and Latin America. Volumes II and III will have all the other countries of the world in alphabetical order.

"There will be no 'combined' edition in a single volume.

The **Minkus** two-volume World Wide Stamp Catalogue 1971 was awarded the "Best in Class" trophy at the International Stamp Exhibition held in London. The silver trophy was accepted by publisher Jacques Minkus.

Austria pays tribute to the International Choir Festival held in Vienna by issuing a new 4 schilling stamp. The design features an ancient type player.

Other stamps on the Austrian agenda for 1971 will honor: The 20th anniversary of the Vienna Stock Exchange, Austrian railways, inauguration of the Brenner Highway, 500 anniversary of the Vienna International Fair, and several other commemoratives—ending up with a special stamp dedicated to "Christmas 1971" which will be released in November.

The next two U.S. stamps on the commemorative schedule are the 8-cent issue honoring CARL for release on Oct. 27 in New York City and the four "Historic Preservation" stamps (on one sheet, each 8 cents) Oct. 28 in San Diego.

Man Taking First Swipes At Sea's Mineral Wealth

NEW YORK (AP) — Like a cat peering into a political bush, man long has viewed the riches of the sea with a mixture of fascination and greed. Now he has started making his first tentative swipes at this mineral wealth, with modest success.

At present, about \$7.1 billion is mined from the sea each year. But the real feast has yet to begin.

Mineral rich suggests he expanded on the deep ocean floor. At the bottom of the Red Sea, covered by a blanket of heavy-than-normal water, are sands containing copper, zinc, gold and silver. Vast quantities of metals are trapped in deep rock layers beneath the sea floor.

"The major restraint on undersea mining today is not so much technology as economics," says one government scientist. With few exceptions, it is cheaper to locate and recover minerals from land than from the ocean.

"One of the fiercest competitive struggles likely to develop within the next few years will center on the effort to mine manganese nodules," said a spokesman for a large U.S. mining company. These egg-shaped deposits—formed by natural chemical processes—rich in nickel, copper, cobalt, and manganese. So far, they have been retrieved in at least two separate pilot projects.

Deep Ventures Inc., a subsidiary of Tronco Inc., has spent \$20 million developing a system to recover and process these nodules, says president John Filipe. It currently is trying to raise \$200 million more to start full-scale commercial production by 1974, he adds.

"One of our problems is the fact that nobody knows who has the right to lease the areas we've discovered," Filipe says. "There is no legal protection against claim jumping by American or foreign firms."

... may prove too costly

It may ultimately prove too costly to extract the metals from the nodules, says one government scientist. "But, so far, we think we're going to make a go of it," he says.

John L. Merz, a California mining engineer, contends it is two to five times cheaper to get these metals from the ocean than from land.

"Within 10 years of the start-up of the first deep sea mining of nodules, we'll be shutting down nickel mines on land, and in 20 years shutting down the bulk of the copper mines," he says.

If this occurs, the huge open pit copper mines, with their cleared out hillsides and the technology of giant cranes and heavy trucks, will be replaced by mining ships, which will work an area and then move on without leaving a trace.

The mineral rich mine found in a 50-square mile area of the Red Sea, holds another alluring possibility. These mud-coated nodules contain some \$2.5 billion worth of copper, zinc, silver, and gold—rarely found together in one place. In addition, in sea floor pockets by heavy, salt-saturated water called brines.

Various companies have expressed interest in the deposits and one foreign firm has leased rights to the area from the Sudanese government, says David A. Rose, an oceanographer with the Oceanographic Institution at Woods Hole, Mass.

unexplored opportunity, says Merz. Areas of the ocean with abnormally high amounts of gold have been found, he declares. Even using conventional extraction techniques, "these could be considered a high grade gold mine if that body of water were of sufficient size."

Industry sources point out, however, that gold prices today are not much higher than in the mid-1950s, so the economics of developing such a floating gold mine are questionable.

"The most potentially valuable element in seawater—"concept-

ably worth hundreds of millions of dollars a year"—is deuterium or heavy hydrogen, says William McIlvenny, a scientist at Dow Chemical Co. Deuterium is used in nuclear fusion reactions which, though still in the experimental stage, should supply most of man's energy needs in the decades ahead, McIlvenny declares.

"The oceans have enough deuterium to last man for centuries and centuries," long as petroleum and other energy supplies run out, he adds.

The 1968 Geneva Convention says a country's sovereign rights to sea resources on the shallower portion of the ocean floor extend out to water depths of about 600 feet or to any depth that can be exploited. There is a sharp disagreement over whether this boundary moves outward as exploration techniques improve. An international conference on this problem is scheduled for 1970 under United Nations auspices.

Some scientists view seawater as a potential treasure chest in its own right, since it contains just about every known chemical element. At present, about 8000 million in minerals is taken from seawater each year—about 50 per cent of the world's salt, 60 per cent of its magnesium, and 70 per cent of its bromine, which is used as an anti-knock compound for gasoline.

Wholesale mining of seawater is not too likely, says University of Washington marine geologist Edward Wentz Jr., a participant in the Geneva Convention.

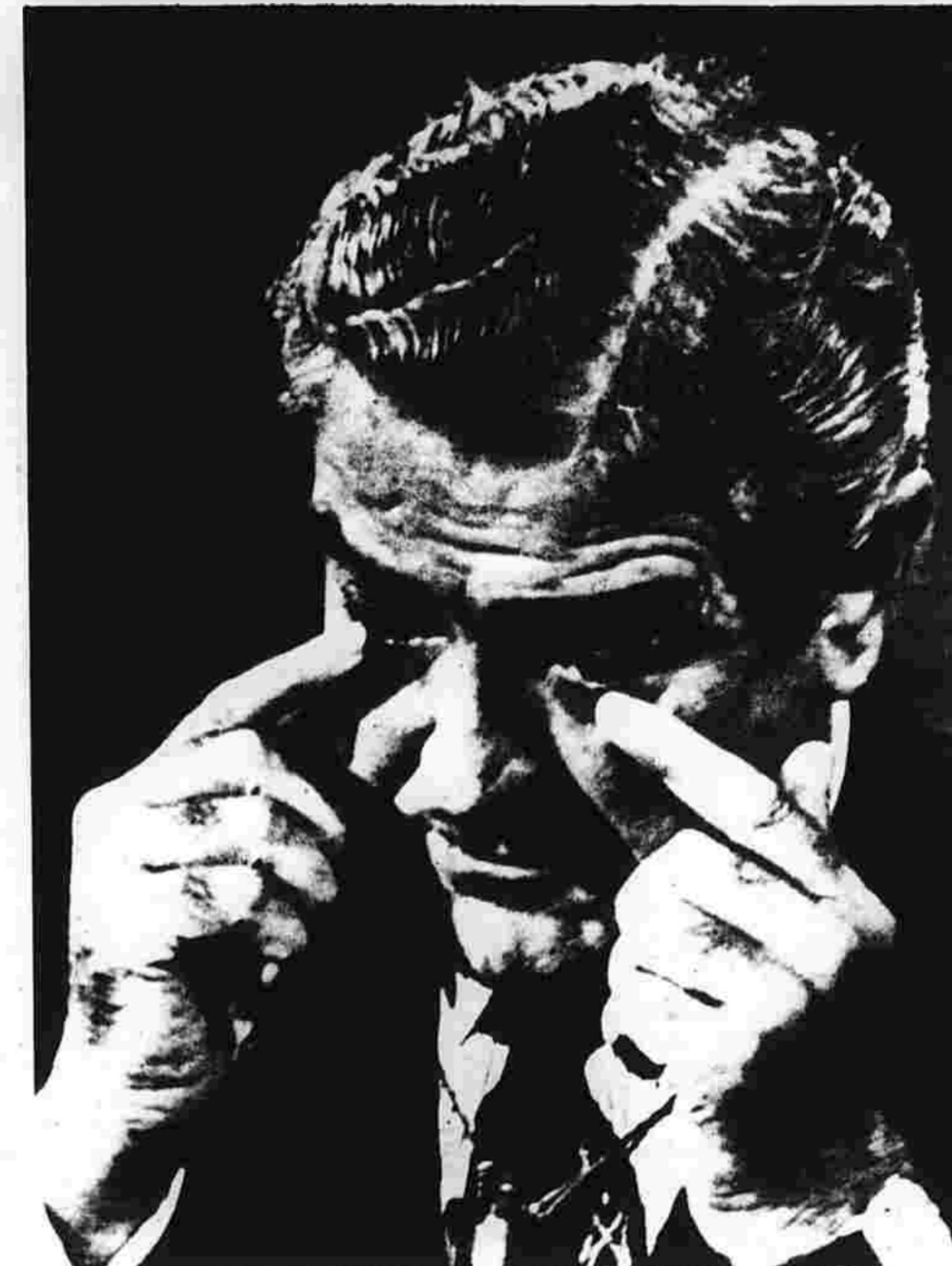
