



Those Economic Laws Those who profess to be shocked by the way President Nixon, in his new ecoomic game plan, has deserted what seemed to be the old reliable principles and laws of traditional conservative economics might well be invited, instead, to contemplate how the old reliable principles and laws had themselves deserted politicians and economists who once swore by them.

The big monstrous inconsistency, by all old laws at any rate, has been the fact that inflation and unemployment could both grow together, in the same economic conditions.

But this major, general inconsistency has been accompanied by a host of subsidiary contradictions of known eco-

This has been, as a pussled analyst in the Wall Street Journal noted the other day, a period in which thrift institutions have been swamped with savings and have, at the same time, raised their nortage interest rates.

The steel industry, in a time of recession, reached a pay boost of over 10 per cent without a strike and the steel 8 per cent, at a time when it seemed the desperate need of the economy to get new construction started and to get the sale of automobiles to increase.

It used to be assumed that labor, when threatened with unemployment, would at least moderate its demands temporarily. That theory has gone, along with the theory that a time of commercial slowdown would bring cuts in prices.

The supposedly natural law of supply and demand now seems to operate only Whether this is something that some-

body has rigged, or something that reflects some new law which hasn't yet been put into the books on economics, the result is that the "system of free enterprise" to which so many of us give a wistfully defiant allegiance doesn't really seem to exist any more. Perhaps there is no such thing. Perhaps, for that matter, there never was any such thing. And it is, perhaps, the fact that most of us sense this and can feel it, even though we hesitate to admit it, which has been responsible for the really slight degree of shock with which this nation has greeted President Nixon's 100 per cent reversal of the principles he had consistently espoused through a whole lifetime of public politics, until just the other Sunday evening.

Top state welfare officials were caught with their credibility gaps showing last weekend when they had to retreat and admit to inaccuracies in charges which they had previously made about welfare

Deputy Commissioner Nicholas Norton acting for Commissioner Hency C. The announced policy changes in-volved (1) No more welfare checks to be mailed out-of-state, (2) Slightly higher checks to be provided, out of which welfare clients must save for appliances and (3) Hospital required to apply for permission to keep recipients more than 1

There is no doubt but that there are cases of welfare abuses and frauds-and it is the job of the Welfare Departmen to investigate and dig them out. In our book, as in the book of the social workers, it's a low blow against helpless, lawabiding welfare clients for welfare officials to use their own immunity from disclosure to hurl charges which discredit the welfare system and those who must depend on it.

As for the "reform" two of then should not have been necessary if the department were doing its job of investi gating and allotting properly in the first place. Out-of-state payments and lengthy nospital stays both should be under constant department surveillance to prevent abuse. We don't have much hope for the success of the plan to provide higher checks that the recipients must save for stoves, iceboxes and the like-somehow, the kids are going to need something an the piggy bank is going to turn up empty

The best way for the State Welfare Department to prevent abuses would have been for its officials to work with, not against the welfare workers who are in direct contact with clients. An attemp at positive cooperation, to use available funds to the best advantage of those who qualify and need them most would have gotten a lot farther than Norton's cheap grandstand play involving unprovable figures and charges. - MERIDEN
