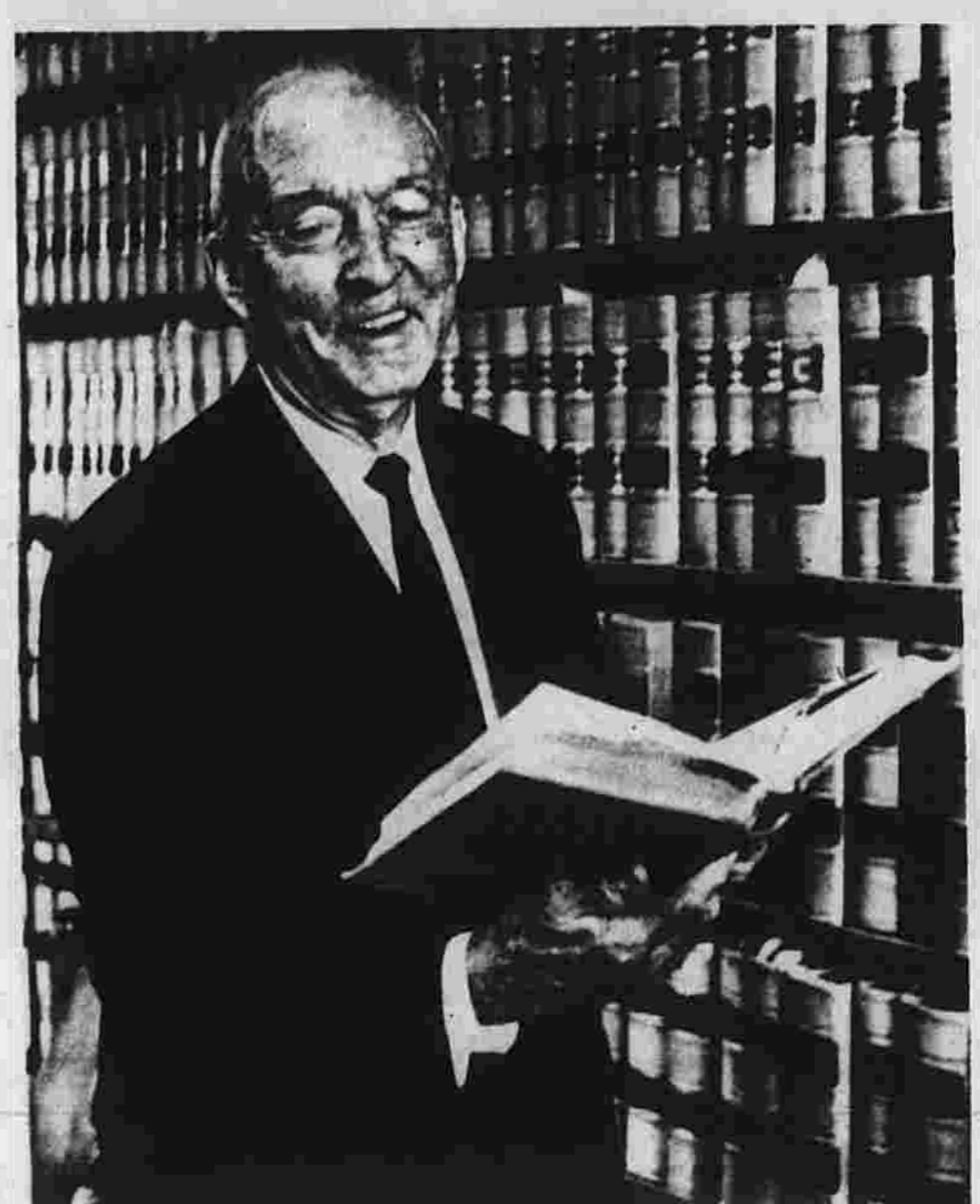

Declarer cashes the king and ace of diamonds and leads dummy's last spade. East must follow suit, and South takes his 10th trick by ruffing.

Even if East were out of spades he would be unable to ruff down and would make his last trump later.

Two Criticize Delays Over Master Plan

Impatience with delays in getting a low master plan was expressed yesterday by two members of the Chamber of Commerce Urban Development Committee...

Using the old adage, "There's nothing sure except death and taxes," Mr. Philip Day commented that the PZC could be per household, the Economic and Joseph Swenson, chairman of the Planning and Zoning Commission...

After a discussion of proposed revisions in the town's subdivision and zoning regulations, Arnold Lawrence, an architect and Rodney Dolin pressed Potter on when a master plan would be available.

Lawrence noted the difficulties involved in working with the patchwork subdivision and zoning regulations which exist now; Lawrence claimed that the town's zoning and subdivision regulations are no better now than they were in 1967. In that year, there was the first meeting about the recently opened 1-84 in the south end of town. He claimed that road has split the town and thrown a cog in town planning.

That was also the year a master plan was adopted, Lawrence noted. Dolin appeared to still be smug about the controversy. He lives near the 270 acre tract off Keeney St. which two developers wanted developed as a CUD zone. The CUD application triggered a long and bitter controversy which ended when the application was withdrawn.

Dolin was anxious for a master plan so that homeowners could buy homes and be protected by homes and be protected by the plan. Potter told the two men that the completion of the plan is going to be a long and messy job. Even if the plan were ready tomorrow, hearings would probably take two years, Potter said.

Earlier Potter outlined the need for four types of maps which he said would give prospective homebuyers a better picture of what might occur in various areas of town, and which are essential to the town's health. The second map would outline the committed land uses in town; the third would show existing zones; and the fourth would indicate future recommended land uses.

Anticipating Dolin's remarks, Potter said, "Many people in rural residences and some feel they are protected by miles and miles of RR zoning. They should be protected, but there are limits."

He said that during the recent CUD controversy, people seriously suggested to him that their homes should be three miles from multiple dwelling units. Using another measure, the same people said homes in their area would not cost less than \$50,000, Potter claimed.

"We have a rather unrealistic public to consider," Potter commented. "You can't expect to live in a town with a curbside of its land zoned rural residence forever," he added.

About group dwellings and single family homes, Potter said, "Perhaps we should keep the two apart."

To Lawrence, Potter said he believes the subdivision and zoning regulation revisions he is working on will greatly improve some of the difficulties Lawrence mentioned.

The Oslo Odegard is 6 foot 4 and slender. He is married "to a beauty," he says, and has a four-year-old daughter and a three-year-old son.

The Manchester Odegard is 5 foot 11 and stocky. He, too, has three children - girls 11 and 9, and a boy 7. Jan Odegard is considered an up-and-coming figure in the Norwegian political and business circles and has been in the U.S. State Department as secretary of state in the Ministry of Defense. Supreme Court Adjusts Agenda

WASHINGTON (AP) - Expecting that two new justices will not be named in time for its new term opening next month, the Supreme Court has revamped its calendar.

Major cases originally to be heard between Oct. 12 and Oct. 20 were shifted Friday to the winter months. The biggest were four appeals testing the constitutionality of capital punishment.

New justices may vote only if they are on the bench when the cases are argued, since successors to John M. Harlan and the late Hugo Black have not yet been named, there probably would be only a seven-man court to vote on the death penalty had it been argued Oct. 12 as planned.

Other major rulings expected include whether criminal convictions can be returned by less-than-unanimous juries; on a case involving the pollution of Lake Michigan, and in a major civil rights case for open housing concerning job advancements for blacks and by the government can add them.

Out of one of Connecticut's earliest housing developments—the old Talcott mill homes in Talcottville—have come a group of homes as individual as their owners. Well over a hundred years ago, someone designed multiple houses which looked like they had dropped off of a production line and landed in a neat row on Main St. These homes, owned by Talcott Brothers Co., were provided at nominal rents for the employees of the Talcott woolen mills until 1946 when, due to economic changes, the houses were offered for sale.

When the Chapdelaines bought their "Talcott" home, which had already undergone considerable renovation, they personalized it still more. Not caring for the generous use of costly pine paneling throughout much of the downstairs area, the Chapdelaines painted it over as can be seen in the photo of the dining room. A soft colonial blue was selected which, with white painted walls above, creates a perfect setting for the several gilt-framed paintings and blue and red print drapes and slip covers. A Persian type rug with vivid reds and blues completes the background setting for some interesting light wood furnishings.

What looks like a small settee in front of the fireplace is a reproduction of a settee from the 18th century.

The Rise Of The Academic Trustee

The other day I was strolling around the campus of a nearby university. Of course things have changed since the old days at college, and it took a while to get acclimated. It being a crisp, sunny afternoon, I wandered about until I saw young Frank Howard, a freshman from Manchester, Conn., as Second Class Mail Matter.

"What's going on in that building?" I asked.

"Oh, that's the junior year abroad simulation lab," Frank explained. "We used to send people to Europe until the Trustees decided it wasn't necessary. Now the participants go to the lab instead. You know, studying old buildings, seeing pictures of art exhibits, hearing tapes in foreign languages. They even drink imported wine, when the instructor isn't looking."

"I see."

Just then a tall, important looking student approached us and gave a very condescending greeting to Frank, who responded with considerable deference.

"He's a World-Have-Been-Woodrow Wilson Fellow," Frank explained. "They used to give fellowships to seniors for graduate study, but some foundation has decided to discontinue the program. But the faculty members think he might have received one, so they voted him a Fellow. We call them 'World-Have-Been-Wilson' on campus. They get signed wall plaques too."

"Very interesting. Good heavens, what's going on over there?"

"Oh, that's just a Rescue League rally. It's part of the academic's unpopularity of invading Laos and Cambodia, early with the intention of reaping the benefits when they counted. His economic policies indicate that he would like to get it all together for next summer."

And Nixon always has a game plan, geared toward winning. The name of his game is election, and he is a good tactician. He has no recognizable absolutes and shows enormous flexibility. And he loves to put the opposition off guard. We suspect that nothing gives Richard Milhous Nixon greater pleasure than confounding the opposition. He's been busy at it lately.

So why not appoint a woman to the Supreme Court? It's going to happen sooner or later, so why not go down in history as the first President to break the ridiculous barrier that has made this an all-male preserve? Neither the President nor his administration have endeavored themselves to women's organizations. In fact, they've suffered the unpopularity of women's liberation groups when the Secretary of State and the President jokingly dismissed Gloria Steinem as "One of Henry Kissinger's old girl friends."

Nor has the President been making headway with women voters by his showmanship. Instead conversations about favorite teams with beauty queens and naming another woman as Treasurer of the United States is not what it's all about.

We should recognize that the President has been well challenged. Democratic Senators Bayh, Harris, and McGovern are among those who urged Nixon to name a woman to replace Associate Justice Hugo L. Black. With the retirement of Associate Justice John M. Harlan the logic is more than before as strong. Not only is the opposition proposing a sound idea—there is plenty of thunder to steal.

There are all kinds of more noble arguments for a woman on the Supreme Court, but we're not absolutely convinced that they would carry any weight in the White House. So in the President's style of game plan politics, why not put the opposition off its guard, and as it makes it his own accomplishment, and put up any opposition on the defensive. It would be as difficult to find fault with the first qualified female appointee as it was with Thurgood Marshall, the first black to sit on the Court. Few Republicans could seriously complain, many Democrats would be defused, and he would protect himself against the strident charges of male chauvinism as well as the commanding logic of having a woman on the Supreme Court.

All our favorite newspaper columnists who take vacations invariably come back and report the same discovery. They can't report, get away from it all and get absolutely no attention to what might be going on in that sector of the world's business they normally watch, and then come back and find that nothing has really happened and nothing has really changed.

What was going on when they left is still going on as they return. The same sad realities and strong, cynical vituperations and tortured, irrelevant strivings are still mixing themselves into disillusioning results which drive any observer's sanity into the refuge of a cynical brand of hopeful despair.

That's what newspapermen usually report when they take the supreme risk of leaving their own work to their devices for a couple of weeks. To their great relief, they discover that nothing has really happened and nothing has really changed.

## Disney Image Survives In Busy, Lucrative Year

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — When Walt Disney died, the film industry wondered openly if the entertainment empire he built and ruled so successfully would change, if not deteriorate. Now it is obvious that Disney was not only a creative man but a good executive and foresighted planner.

In the television area alone, his "Wonderful World of Disney" soon will start its 18th consecutive season, the oldest program in network primetime, and a Sunday night family institution.

"Even we at the studio wondered how the public would react," said Ron Miller, the Disney son-in-law who is in charge of television production. "But he had thought ahead. We are a team here but we constantly ask ourselves how Walt Disney would handle this or that."

The NBC program consists of dependably wholesome entertainment, inevitably a retation of handsome nature studies, youth-oriented adventure films and some short animated features. It has been that way from its beginnings on ABC when the program was launched, partly as a subtle promotion scheme for Disney's then-new California amusement park.

Because of its huge audience of children, the series is able to function in a thrifty way impossible for the other producers of weekly series.

"Our philosophy is that it would be foolish to throw our theatrical films onto the television market for one season when we develop a new au-

dience every seven years," Miller said.

The Disney method is to take a motion picture that has made the theater rounds, cut it into TV-length segments and run it as two or three programs. After the usual summer rerun, it goes back into the Disney vault to wait four or five years for a new audience of kids—then it is run again.

At the moment the Disney hour is in the midst of showing a 1958 theatrical film, originally broadcast in 1962 and again in 1968. Almost one third of each season's programs is out of the vault.

"We never use our long animated features on television," Miller said. "We just hold them for a few years and send them out to the theaters again—for that new audience. We'll be using 'Pinocchio' again soon, and 'Mary Poppins' will be reissued in 1973."

Miller says that, over-all, the program's nature studies, most made specifically for television use, are the most popular. While the series is usually up high in the ratings, it frequently jumps up to the top of the list, as its two-part "Snow Bear" did this past season.

With plans complete for the coming season the Disney organization is concentrating on whipping up a special program about the opening of its new Florida amusement park.
