



### Teen Waits on Death Row In Prison in Arkansas

The right side of the head was crushed. The left side bore a round hole and was crushed by a shotgun fired at point-blank range. The torso was battered. Officers testified that circular marks on the back might have been caused by gouging with a piece of pipe or a gun barrel.

State police Trooper Travis South said that West, 17-year-old Teddy Kitterer of De Witt, who was arrested Nov. 8, said Kageben "jumped up and down" on Wampler's stomach after the farmer was dead.

"They were all laughing about it," Nash testified.

He read in court what he said was a statement Kageben had signed. The statement said the four boys held the shotgun and Wampler yelled at them not to shoot him.

Nash said the boys knuckled Wampler down in the road, then, quoting the statement, "They were all laughing about it and shot him as he lay on the ground."

Kageben testified that he and four youths were drinking beer and riding around in the car south of De Witt. He said he and Kageben, but awoke once and heard his companions discussing how to perform "acts" on them. He slept again.

Kageben testified that he and Wampler were in a room in the prison's maximum security building, a post card arrived at his grandmother's home.

"Love, from Mom and Tony's sister," the card said. Postmarked Silver Lake, Ore., it bore no return address.

Although Joey is under a death sentence for first-degree murder, the chance that he will get the electric chair is remote.

Already Gov. Dale Bumpers has stayed his execution to permit time for an appeal and Bumpers has indicated he will commute the sentence if this becomes necessary.

Arkansas has not had an execution since 1964, and the 58-year-old electric chair has been dismantled and stored.

Joey testified that he was present when Wampler died but the youth denied any part in the slaying.

Wampler, according to the defense, made homosexual advances to the four teenagers.

The rice farmer was killed last Nov. 7. Authorities learned of his death when Kageben, Benny West, 16, and Larry Mamma, 17, drove into town in a borrowed car about 11 p.m. and met Police Chief James Mason.

Mason said Mamma showed him a shotgun with a broken stock and a spent shell in the chamber. Mamma testified, chief said, and Mamma and Kageben were taken to a hospital.

West led officers into a field beside a rural road with miles south of De Witt where the body of Wampler was found. It was nude, except for cowboy boots and a pair of pink panties around the left thigh. A blue nightgown partly covered the head.

South dealer.

Opening lead — Two of Spades.

Minimum Wage in State To Increase Tomorrow

Connecticut's minimum fair wage will increase from \$1.61 per hour to \$1.85 per hour, effective tomorrow. State law has also raised the minimum hourly rate for learners, beginners and minors under age 18 from \$1.25 to \$1.50 per hour for the first 200 hours of employment and to \$1.85 after 200 hours.

WASHINGTON (AP) — The number of robberies committed in Springfield, Mass., during the first half of 1971 increased nearly ninefold over the comparable period of 1970, the Justice Department says.

Statistics released Wednesday showed Springfield robberies jumped from 16 in the 1970 period to 144 in the first half of 1971, an increase of 799 per cent.

Cambridge, Mass., also experienced a spectacular leap in robberies, the department said. It reported 85 robberies in the university city in the 1970 first half and 229 in the comparable 1971 period, a jump of 145 per cent.

Nationwide, serious crime increased but at a lesser rate—increasing 7 per cent this year compared with 11 per cent the year before.

Several cities in the Northeast were among 53 communities with populations over 100,000 that recorded net reductions in crime.

Nationally, robberies rose 14 per cent during the first six months of 1971, murder and aggravated assault both rose 10 per cent and forcible rape 7 per cent, Boston's robbery figure rose 31 per cent. For New Haven, Conn., the figure was up 62 per cent.

The number of murders increased 44 per cent in Boston, 100 per cent in Hartford, Conn., 67 per cent in New Haven and 50 per cent in Springfield.

On the contrary, Providence, R.I., had half as many murders during the 1971 period as in the 1970 first half. Decreases also were recorded in Bridgeport, Conn., and Worcester, Mass.

The Justice Department said many Northeastern cities followed the national trend of reductions or little change in the seven categories of the Uniform Crime Reports—murder or non-negligible manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny of \$50 or more and automobile theft.

The breakdown by city and crime category, showing the numerical change:

Boston—murder, 32-46; rape, 246; assault, 1,418-1,569; aggravated assault, 807-867; burglary, 4,839-5,748; larceny, 3,568-3,238; auto theft, 7,212-7,536.

Bridgeport, Conn.—murder, 4-gravitated assault both rose 10 per cent and forcible rape 7 per cent.

Boston's robbery figure rose 31 per cent. For New Haven, Conn., the figure was up 62 per cent.

In the future, parents of students who begin to "stray from the normal" school procedures will be contacted.

Pushee and Day stress the fact that "all young people have something positive to offer society and their school." However, they add that "this does not imply that we try to counsel disciplinary problems. We will deal with these problems fairly, swiftly and rightly."

They also stress that with respect to discipline "much of this must start at home. The home and school must work hand in hand to achieve the type of school we all want for our children."

"There is a need to begin looking for positives," they said, "and Rham High has many, and build upon these."

WASHINGTON (AP) — A baby girl, born only about 12 hours earlier but in good health, was found at the side of a road by two girls Wednesday evening, police said.

## Violent Crime Up 11 Per Cent

WASHINGTON (AP) — Led by a 20 per cent increase in the number of policemen killed in the last eight months, violent crime increased by 11 per cent across the nation in the first year of 1971, the FBI has reported.

The jump in violent crimes exceeds the 10 per cent hike nationwide in 1970, but an overall 7 per cent rise in serious crimes compares with an 11 per cent rise last year, said the report issued Wednesday.

"The continuing upward trend illustrates that crime is still one of our foremost problems," Atty. Gen. John N. Mitchell said, "but the decelerating rate of increase provides a basis for cautious optimism."

The report noted that 80 law enforcement officers have been murdered since January through August. One hundred were murdered during all of 1970, 67 of whom were killed in the same eight-month period. Of the 80 murdered this year, the report said 56 per cent were shot.

A 14 per cent hike in robberies, 10 per cent rise in murder and assault and a 7 per cent increase in rape made up the average 11 per cent boost in violent crime.

National percentage increases in crimes during the same six-month period for the four years prior to 1971 were 11 in 1970, 9 in 1969, 21 in 1968 and 17 in 1967.

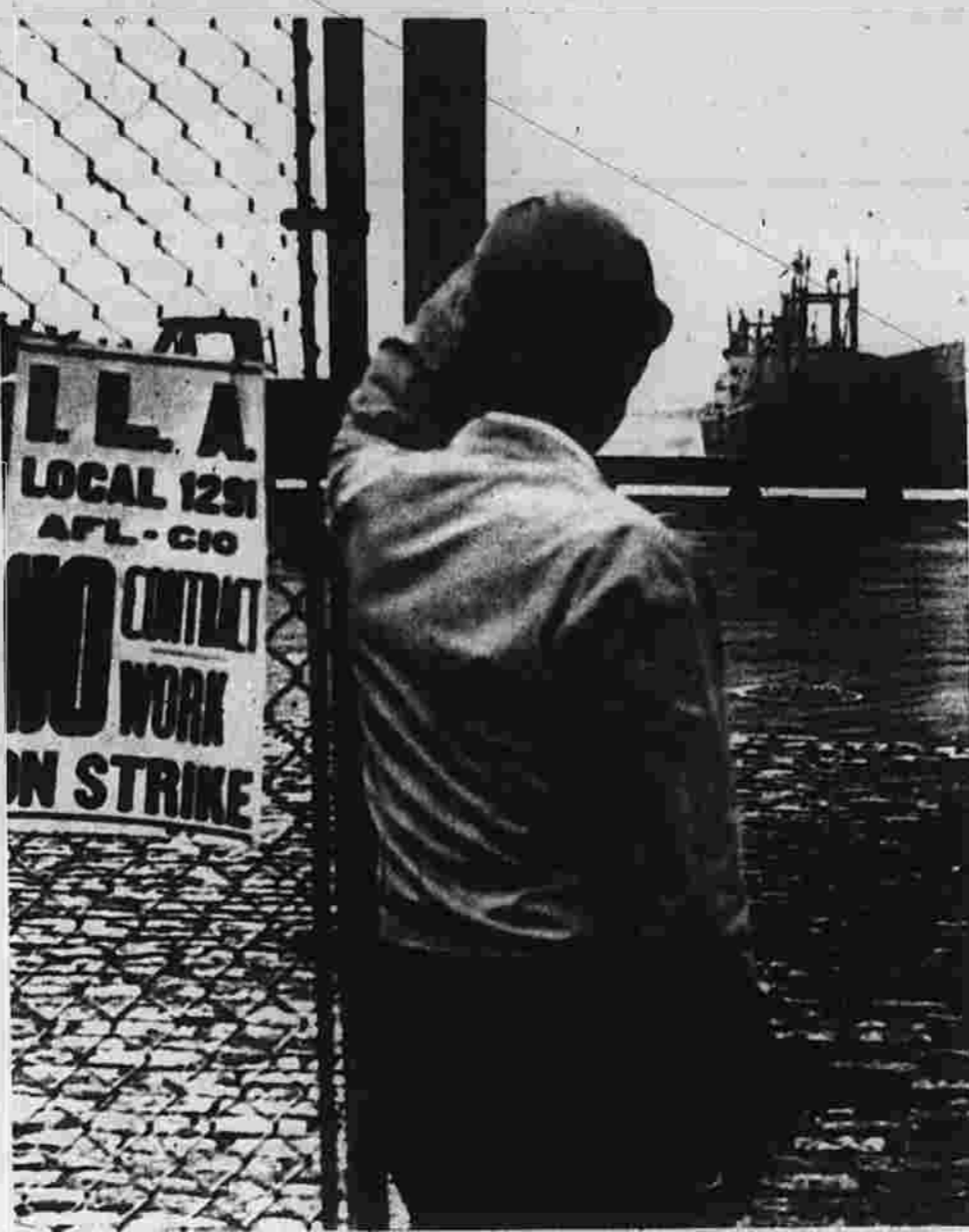
