Rockville High Renovation



Above is one of the four "houses" into which the school will be divided. A student will identify with one house throughout his four years of high school. The house plan was designed in an effort to avoid having the individual students lose identity in the enlarged school. Each house will accommodate 750 students with the student taking most of his academic subjects within his own house. The specialized subjects will be taken in the core area of the school complex. In addition to the teaching spaces each house will be provided with its own principal, guidance director and secretary. Below is a stretch of the science lab which will accommodate 450 students. This wing will include lecture rooms and will be made so it may be closed off into smaller areas when necessary.

Preliminary plans for the proposed \$10.6 million renovation and addition to Rockville High School were approved unanimously by the Board of Education last night. The rendering above shows the facility as it will look after its expansion from its present 1,500-pupil capacity to its capacity to accommodate 3,000 students. The plans call for expansion of the classroom areas and all of the specialized areas. The facility as it now stands will be expanded to house these specialized areas such as a resource center with expanded library facilities, biology labs, lecture rooms and greatly expanded physical education facilities including a large indoor swimming pool. The school was planned with an eye toward developing a community-oriented project.

Several other board members emphasized the community-oriented aspect also and asked that this point be put across to the public before the referendum.

Vernon Board of Education Okays School Expansion Plans

Ending some three years of discussion and planning, the Board of Education last night approved preliminary plans for the renovation and expansion of Rockville High School, a project which will cost some \$10.6 million to accomplish.

The plans will now go to the State Board of Education for its comments. Simultaneously they will be presented to the Town Council for its action. If the council approves, it will then put machinery in place to call a public hearing and set a date for a referendum asking approval of the appropriation.

Before giving its approval last night, the Board of Education again reviewed the plans with David Ewelath of McHugh Associates, the architectural firm planning the school.

Board member John Kendall, referring to past criticism of the board concerning high costs of education, said it should be emphasized that only about \$7.8 million of the total cost was classified for education. He said some \$2.8 million is going toward the portion of the building which will be community-oriented.

Vernon Expanded School 'Will Offer More'

"One large school will offer much more in extra than two schools" was the decision of the Board of Education after many months of study and weighing the pros and cons of a one-school concept vs. two schools. Plans call for expansion of the present Rockville High School from its 1,500-pupil capacity to accommodate 3,000 students and to make the facility as community-oriented as possible.

Besides being able to offer more in one large school, it was felt that housing the students in two separate schools would seriously divide the students and the town.

The proposed facility will be divided into four "houses," each containing its own classrooms for the students and projects, its own housemaster or principal, a guidance department and secretary. Each house will identify with the same house throughout his four years of high school.

One major problem created by expansion of the school was that of student transportation. The creation of an 18-foot-wide corridor running through the center of the area where the special facilities will be housed. In between the "houses" will be a library resource center. The library, cafeteria and proposed swimming pool, were all designed with an eye toward use by the community.

The new school will provide flexible spaces for more advanced teaching methods. It will be possible to divide rooms for classes and enlarge them for large group instruction. The architects explain that these new spaces can be combined with the existing rigid classrooms to advantage.

The existing school stands on 4.7 acres of land on Loveland Hill. The town has already purchased an additional 17 acres for the expansion.

Noting that a shifting emphasis has been made in the direction of physical education, plans are to expand both inside and outside physical education facilities. A gymnasium has been designed to accommodate 1,000 spectators but the architects explain that the basic reason for the expanded area is to accommodate three teaching studios at one time.

This existing auditorium has remained unused most of the time and was termed by the architects as "a rigid single-purpose building of limited educational value."

The proposal calls for refurbishing this area, equipping it with movable partitions and some tablet-type seating.

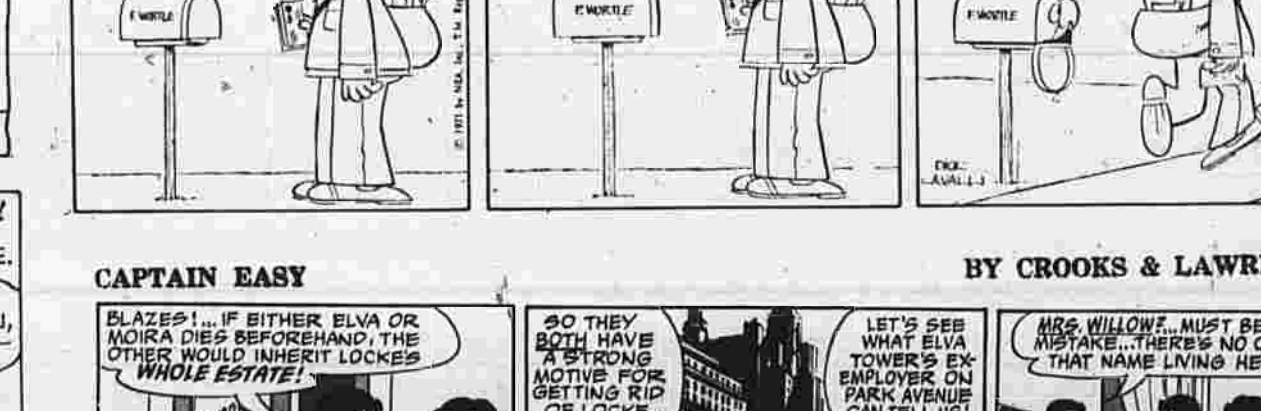
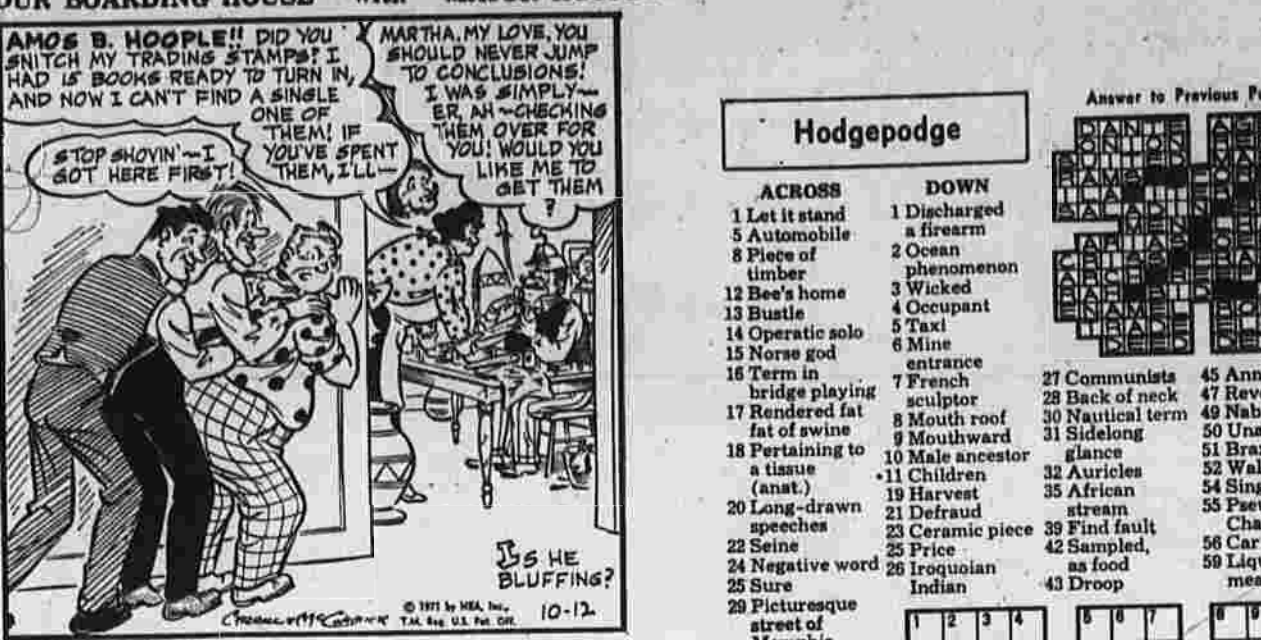

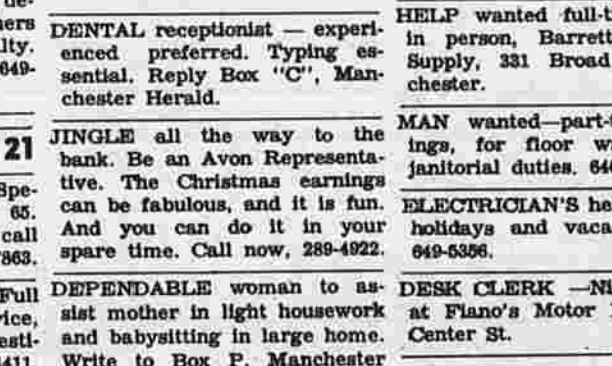
