Wildcat Strike Cools Bakery

NATICK, Mass. (AP)—Bakery workers at one of the country's largest baking plants began returning to work Thursday night after a federal court ordered an end to a two-day wildcat strike.
The strike ended the plant Tuesday morning. The company obtained an injunction Thursday morning and began notifying workers by telegram to return to their jobs.
The bakery produces daily some 300,000 loaves of bread and some \$78,000 in bakery product sales for outlets throughout New England, New York and New Jersey.
The company makes Wonderbread, Hostess cupcakes and numerous private label baked goods.
The plant employs more than 700 persons. Most belong to Local 20A of the Bakery and Confectionery Workers, AFL-CIO.
The wildcat strike was organized by persons dissatisfied with personnel policies recently handed down regarding late-ness, absenteeism, dress, safety and horseplay, according to one of the strikers.
The company said it had suspended 33 men Thursday night whom it charged with being active in organizing the wildcat strike.

181,821 Women Get Abortions Under New Law
ALBANY, N.Y. (AP)—A total of 181,821 women—most of them well under the age of 20—had received 46,497 abortions obtained in New York during the first year of the state's first abortion law.
Three out of four of these abortions were performed during the woman's first three months of pregnancy.
And it appeared that more unmarried than married women had abortions, although complete data could not be provided, the state Health Department reported Thursday in its annual report.
The department said 30,866 of the abortions were performed on women who live outside the state. They came from 14 states, the Health Department said. The largest number, 15,170, came from Pennsylvania. Others came from New Mexico, Oklahoma, Nebraska, Kansas, Missouri, Wisconsin, Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, West Virginia, Texas, and Kentucky.

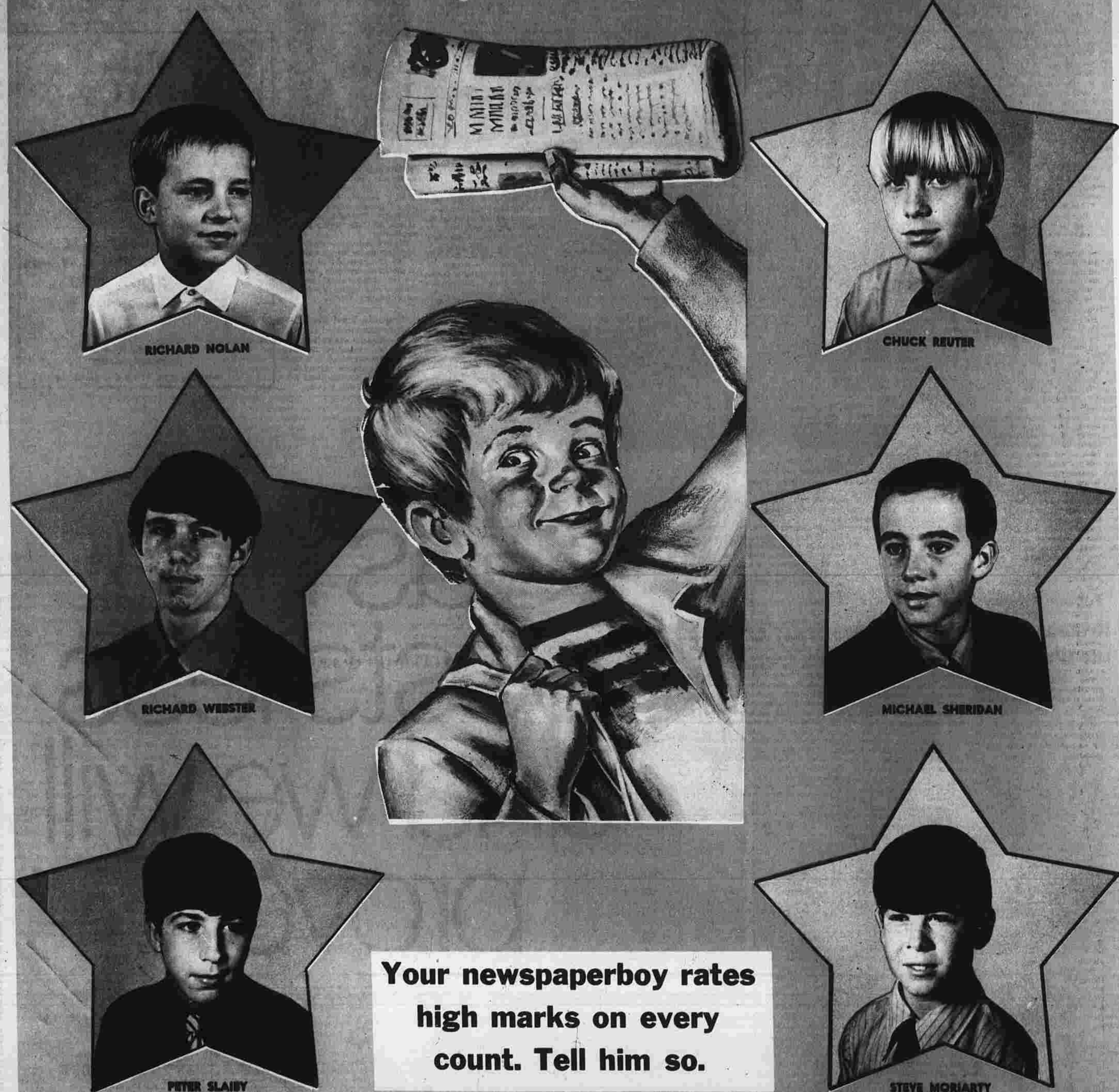

'Organized Shortages' Plaguing Algerians

By MICHAEL GOLDSMITH

ALGIERS (AP) — "No, I don't have any tomatoes," the grocer on Rue Bab Azoun exclaimed, his mustache bristling and his dark eyes glinting angrily under his faded turban.

"And do you want to know why I don't have any tomatoes? Because there is nothing our Socialist system really means while farmers are sowing underfertilized land."

Algeria has made great strides since President Houari Boumedienne seized power more than six years ago. But it will be a long time before the billion-dollar-a-year expenditure on industrial development trickles down to affect the individual citizen.

While the government prides itself on steel plants, petrochemical combines, power plants and processing industries going up all over the country, the grumbling is greater than ever.

There is no meaningful political opposition to Boumedienne inside Algeria. The press and radio are under total government control and never challenge government policy.

But increasingly the man in the street's complaints about inefficiency, bureaucratic red tape and inexplicable shortages are finding their way into the usually subservient newspapers and magazines.

Complaints about inefficiency are permitted but complaints about the policies that cause the inefficiency are not.

One highly placed official said the government is unconcerned over the grumbling because the benefits of the industrialization program are expected to make themselves felt long before the grumbling reaches a level of "political significance."

"We had to start from practically nothing," he said, "and the present generation has to make sacrifices for the sake of the nation's future."

With substantial economic aid from the Soviet Union, France and other Western countries, the crash program of industrial development should eventually put Algeria among the three most industrialized nations in Africa.

Boumedienne's main problem is the national character: Algerians do not lend themselves easily to regimentation and many believe that "scientific socialism," the official ideology, violates the Koran. For this reason, Boumedienne's land reform program to bring thousands of small landowners into state cooperatives has failed to get off the ground.

A spokesman for Lt. Gov. Ed Reinecke announced the bill signing Thursday. Reinecke is chief executive during Gov. Ronald Reagan's two-week tour of the Far East.

The new law also orders funeral directors to provide customers with complete price lists and tables of fees before asking them to sign contracts. The act goes into effect early next year.

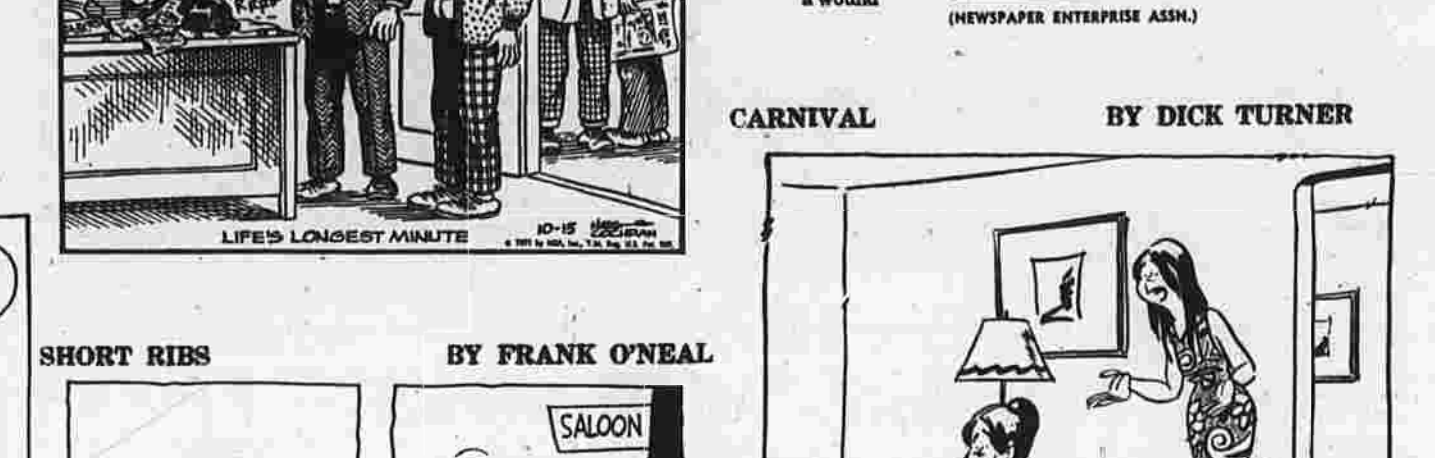
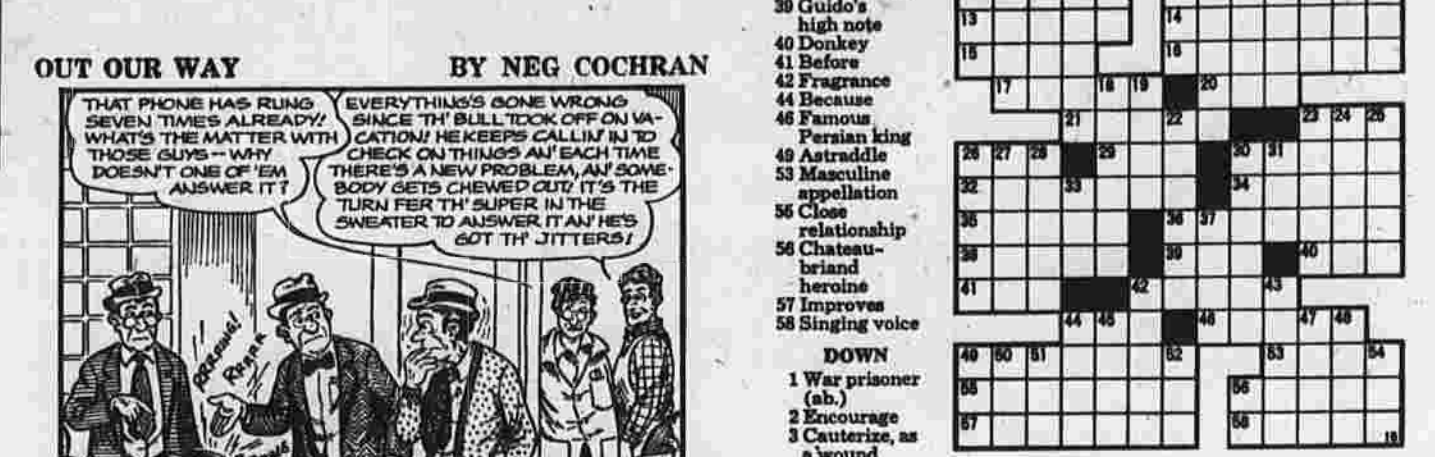
