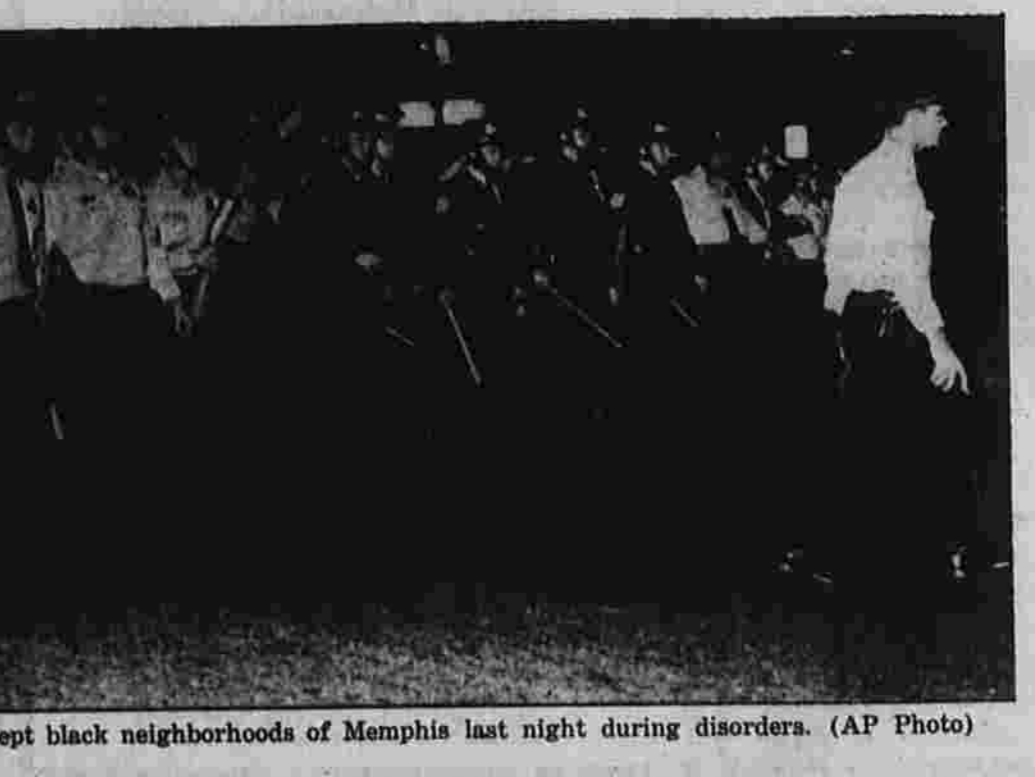

The Case For Formosa

The United Nations has scores of members with a population less than that of the island of Formosa. The population of the island of Formosa, under any principle of self-determination for peoples, would be eligible to claim its right to govern itself.

Even if it didn't already have a presence of some kind in the United Nations, then, the island and people of Formosa would be entitled to membership there.

That is the circumstance which throws the unavoidable monkey wrench into any scheme to get Communist China into the United Nations where it rightfully belongs, by a process of throwing Nationalist China out.

The unhappy complication is that this Formosa presence in the United Nations, under the title of Nationalist China, is not a true Formosa presence, and that it really isn't Formosa which, under present conditions, is being represented there.

What is being represented at the United Nations is a remnant of a Chinese mainland government, which secured itself a survival base by what amounted to a military seizure of the island of Formosa.

There has to be some theoretical difficulty in establishing Chiang Kai-shek as the legitimate ruler of Formosa. It would, of course, be more convenient all around if Formosa were under a native government of its own, democratically elected.

The fact that the dilemma does not resolve itself easily does not mean, however, that it can't be faced. And although it may be possible to reach the opinion that it would be just enough to throw Chiang Kai-shek out of the United Nations, as a remnant of a ruler of China or any part of China, it is also impossible to find any just reason for throwing the 14,000,000 people of Formosa out of the world organization.

This is why the hope that something approaching a two China policy, which would not really be a two China policy but a China plus a Formosa policy has to be persisted in against the heavy odds facing it.

Tomorrow's Yesterday? There is a part of every one of us which finds it very difficult to resist that magnificent renaissance of ancient virtues which the platform meeting of President Nixon and the Rev. Billy Graham offered us down in Charlotte, North Carolina, the other day.

There was, in one breath, the President, reading the long-range history of civilization and preaching that the danger signals for a people came when they felt themselves weak and poor, but after they had grown wealthy and soft, and highly educated and therefore, apparently in consequence, "with-out principle."

comparatively healthy climate in which he himself was a boy.

"We also wrestled with poverty," said the Rev. Billy, "if you go by today's standards, except we did not know that we were poor. We did not have sociologists, educators and newscasters constantly reminding us of how poor we were."

"We also had the problem of rats. The only difference between then and now is we did not call upon the Government to kill them. We killed our own."

Thus we have the preacher illustrating for the President how too much education softens a people, by convincing them they are poor when they otherwise wouldn't know it, by taking away from them that self-reliance by which they might be killing their own rats.

There is that part of every one of us which flinches from admitting that we are poor, which remembers when indeed we did trap our own rats and which cannot help but remember with nostalgia a much simpler world in which complicated problems were not high-pressed into our daily living against our will.

And that part of us all would certainly like to join President Dick and Evangelist Billy in some reconstruction of the kind of life that used to be. When they have extended their area beyond that of the narrow platform they shared for a few minutes last Friday, we hope they will let us know, so we can join them, in that tomorrow's yesterday.

The protectionist virus is steadily spreading — through the government, through the country through the world at large. Unless some means are found to check it, its toll could be enormous.

Peter G. Peterson, the White House top foreign economic policy aide, professes to be so worried about the trend that he's afraid to push the other way. That view, moreover, isn't as odd as it may at first sound.

The administration, for instance, is well aware that its 10 per cent import surcharge is hitting painfully at poorer countries in Latin America and elsewhere, even though the move was designed primarily to pressure Japan and other major nations into agreeing to more realistic currency exchange rates.

For some time, the administration has favored trade measures that would give the developing countries greater access to markets in the U.S. and other industrial nations. So far such proposals have gotten nowhere, and for the present it is up to the administration to do the best it can to push them.

Why? Well, Mr. Peterson said the other day, the mood of Congress and of the U.S. generally is "so protectionist" that any administration bill to increase trade preferences or enlarge aid to poor countries would probably be transformed by the lawmakers into "permanent, fixed quotas" against imports. Considering some of the legislators recent performance, the prediction isn't all at unrealistic.

Thus the House Labor Committee elected to attach a protectionist rider to, of all things, a bill to increase the federal minimum wage. The rider seeks to have the federal government from giving contracts of more than \$10,000 to foreign suppliers who pay their workers "substantially less" than whatever the U.S. minimum wage happens to be at the moment.

"Substantially" is not defined, and the provision's proponents seem to think that's a plus. The vagueness, they say, will give the administration "a lot of latitude" in deciding whether or not to give business to foreign suppliers. It will also give the protectionist Congressmen, as well as lobbyists for special interests, a lot of latitude to put pressure on the administration.

Meanwhile, the 10 per cent surcharge continues to embitter some major countries that, until recently, the U.S. saw as friends. Unemployment in Canada rose to 7.1 per cent of the labor force in September, a 10-year high and well above the U.S. rate. Canadian officials are quick to note that September was the first full month after imposition of the surcharge; while the levy probably is not the only reason for the jobless upsurge, it may be hard to convince Canadians of that.

The manager reported that at the end of the fiscal year, if the Directors did not make an appropriation from the unallocated surplus, there would be a deficit as a result of the error in the comptroller's office. After a potential debate, which became known as "The Battle of the Budget," the directors approved funds to cover the extra week's payroll and there was, in fact, no budget deficit.

At the time, the Republicans attempted to embarrass the Democratic administration by refusing to make the appropriation, despite the fact that the administration had advised them that to conclude the year with a deficit would result in damage to the credit rating of the Town (there has never been a deficit in Manchester's history). It was only after I personally led a battle, both in the newspapers and at the director's meetings, that the Republican Directors voted for the appropriation and prevented the deficit. The mathematical error had been made in the comptroller's office and was properly corrected. As a matter of fact, in this last year's budget, the Republicans had to borrow against anticipated taxes to avoid a deficit. The Democrats supported the resolution for the loan so the town's credit rating would not be damaged, although we felt better management would have prevented the necessity for borrowing.

This is a reply to a statement made by Republican Director Carl Zinsner last week. That statement contained two basic points. Coventry Willnauer Is Tackling Paper Work

John Willnauer, Coventry's building inspector for the past two months, reports that he finds the job "even more of a challenge" than he anticipated, but that the recent hiring of a deputy assistant has relieved the workload somewhat.

One of the first tasks the 36-year-old town resident took upon himself was to try and cut through the mountains of paper work accompanying the post of building inspector. He presented a proposal for a new type of application and permit, which, he says, "will simplify all aspects related to permits."

The Town Council reacted favorably to Willnauer's presentation on the subject at its meeting earlier this week, and he feels that the resulting efficiency will both make it easier for the prospective builder to fill out the forms, and cut down on the amount of clerical help needed in the office.

Willnauer told the council this week that under the present

system of permits "everything is in a different place," and that he and his secretary have sometimes taken up to an hour to search out a complete set of permits for one job. In explaining the new system, Willnauer said, "It is easier for the builder to fill out, takes up only one-half the file space, does not require my clerk to make so many additional copies, has more information on it than the existing forms, standardizes the building, plumbing, heating, electric, septic tank and well permits, and lends itself to other methods I am adopting for filing plots and building drawings."

Willnauer added that the new system can also eventually be converted to street numbering, so that when the town adopts street numbering the system will automatically fit in.

Under the new system, all permits and other pertinent application and permit, which, he says, "will simplify all aspects related to permits."

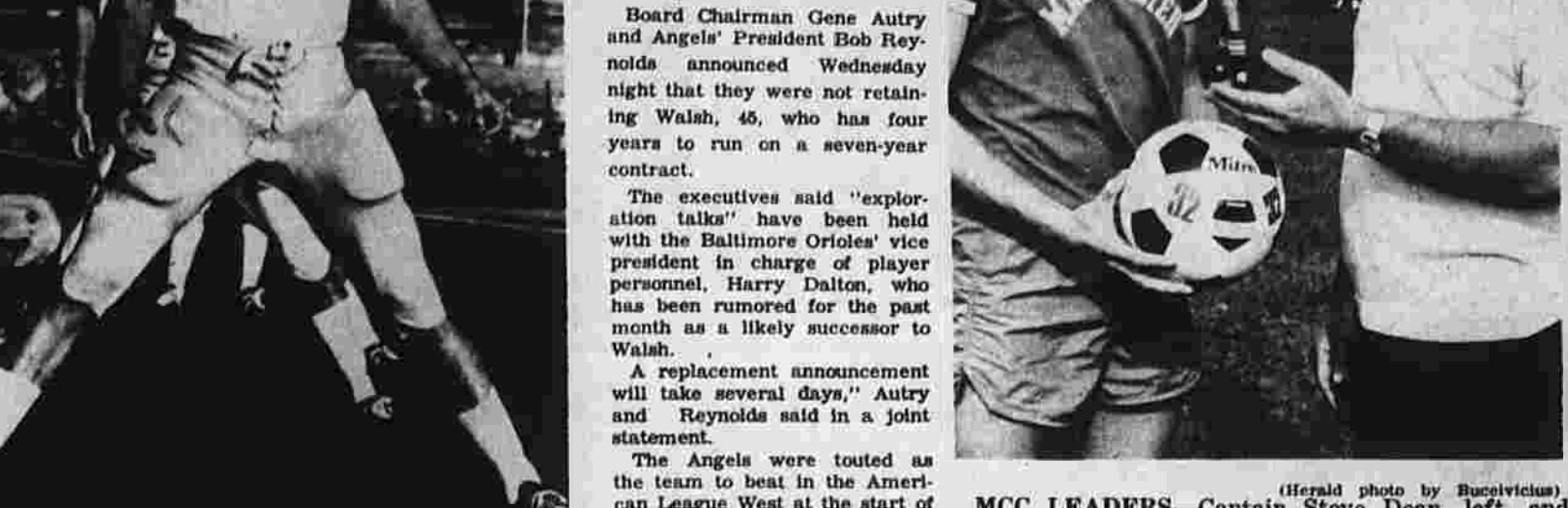

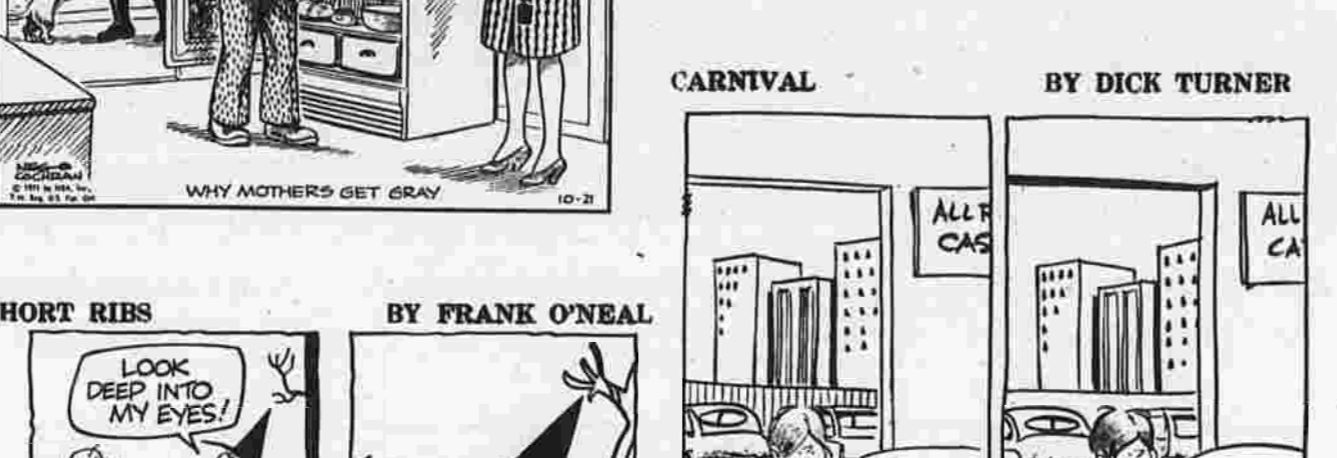
