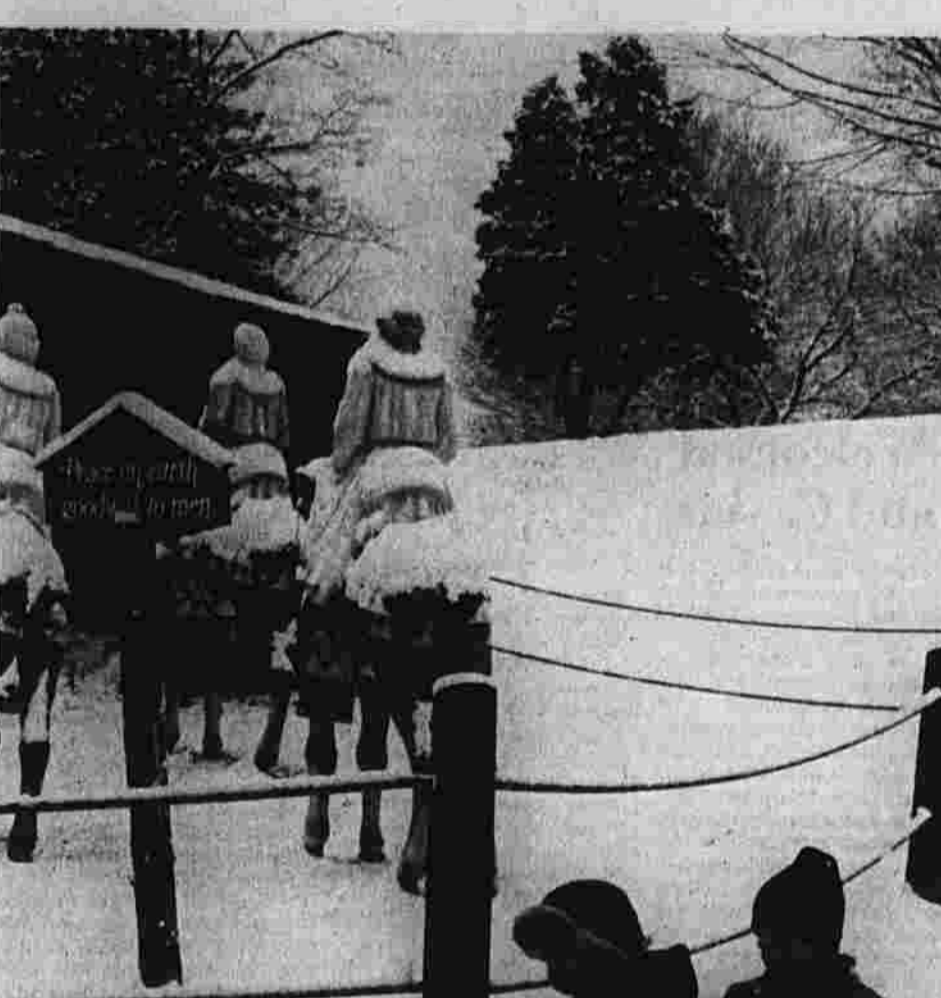

The Well-Rounded Hip

It is proverbial that a woman has, as a special indignation, the right to change her mind.

There is an appealing kind of logic in the change of mind which is now being reported in the fashion center.

One explanation is that, this year, the fashion world had abandoned its attempt to shove mids as at everybody, so that, this year, buying a mid became a matter of freedom of choice.

But there may be an even more logical reason why midsty has changed her mind.

Anybody who watched her shiver and pretend to be mini-happy on a winter day had to suspect that, sooner or later, she would find some round hair to getting something warm around her at least down to her knee.

To double-cross the fashion arbiters, to dismay the experts, and to get warm, all in one stroke of mind, seems to be proving an irresistible temptation.

For those self-satisfied ladies who can't find mids in the stores, which didn't know what demand was coming, but who can turn seamstress on occasion, the formula for the latest mid, cutting off the bottom eighteen inches, and sitting the remainder up to the well-rounded hip.

Why Free Hoffa? In March of 1967, as Jimmy Hoffa was entering the federal penitentiary at Lewisburg, Pennsylvania, to begin his many-year sentence for jury-tampering, the newspaper said:

James R. Hoffa fought with all the power of money and the skill of barrister of shrewd lawyers to avoid prison for 10 long years after the Justice Department began efforts to bring him to book.

No doubt many another American was puzzled this past weekend when President Nixon freed Mr. Hoffa. Granted Mr. Hoffa was given a commendation.

Was there anything improper in the means used by Robert Kennedy, when legal counsel in Congress or as attorney general, to bring Mr. Hoffa to trial?

The term "vendetta" is often raised in this connection. But gives the character of the teamsters unions in the days when the truckers were hammering out their fiftieth and the ultimate findings about Mr. Hoffa as well as his imprisonment, predecessor David Beck, the determined pursuit of him may well have been justified.

Were illegal methods used against him — such as the secret search of corporate records, which New Hampshire publisher William Loeb claims were made of his Manchester newspaper?

If the conviction of Mr. Hoffa was not improper either because of his innocence or of the means used to convict him, for what other reason would he have been released from prison? Because his wife was ill? Surely many another prisoner may have deserved clemency earlier for such a reason.

Because of the potential politics involved? It is widely said the White House very much wanted to make some gesture to organized labor, with next November in mind, and this was a convenient way to do it. If so, how will labor take the Hoffa release? Despite Mr. Hoffa's continuing away over the teamsters through his appointed heir Frank Fitzsimons, we doubt that he has more than scant sympathy among workers generally. Many of whom resent the teamsters' pesty tactics. Will favor with Mr. Hoffa be played off against the rank-and-file?

The public is deeply perplexed by the Hoffa release. They felt he had been fairly convicted in the public courts of law. His release seems out of step with the general image of law-and-order Republicanism held up in the present White House. Earlier this year a Hoffa request to parole authorities was so deftly refused to parole authorities was so deftly refused to parole authorities.

WASHINGTON — William D. Ruckelshaus, the dynamic enforcer of environmental legislation, has just turned out to be 40 years old.

The case involves Reserve Mining Co. of Silver Bay, Minn., dumping some 67,000 tons of iron mining wastes into Lake Superior over two decades.

Clearly, President Nixon did not calculate the cost to the Republic of the conviction. Yet, his release carries with it either an implied questioning of his jury-tampering and pension fraud convictions, or several other possibilities which likewise beg further explanation from the White House.

PEAR SALAD FANCY
First Layer: 1 (1 lb.) can Bartlett pear halves
1 (3 oz.) package lime-flavor gelatin
Second Layer: 1 (3 oz.) package lemon-flavor gelatin
1 cup boiling water
1 cup mayonnaise
1/3 cup diced celery
1 tablespoon chopped parsley
1/4 cup chopped onion
1-1/2 cups diced, cooked turkey
Third Layer: 1 (3 oz.) package strawberry-flavor gelatin
1-1/2 cups water
1 cup cranberry-orange relish

For first layer, drain pear halves and add enough water to pear syrup to make 1-3/4 cups. Heat 1 cup pear syrup mixture to boiling. Stir in lime gelatin until dissolved. Add remaining 3/4 cup pear syrup mixture. Chill until syrupy. Arrange pear halves in bottom of 2-quart mold. Pour in lime gelatin. Chill until almost set.

PEAR CREAM SALAD
1 (1 lb. 13 oz.) can Bartlett pear halves
1 envelope unflavored gelatin
1/2 cup pear syrup
1 cup cold water
1/4 cup lemon juice
1/4 cup sugar
1 (3 oz.) package cream cheese
1/2 cup heavy cream, whipped
1/3 cup chopped nuts

Drain pears reserving 1/2 cup syrup to dissolve gelatin. Use remaining syrup to make Cinnamon or Mint Pears, as directed below. Soften gelatin in reserved 1/2 cup pear syrup. Heat until dissolved. 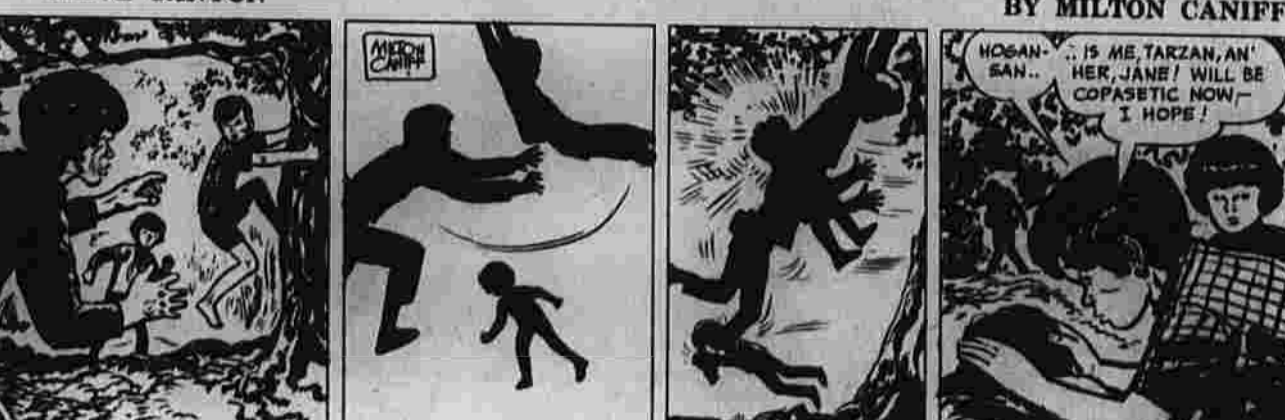

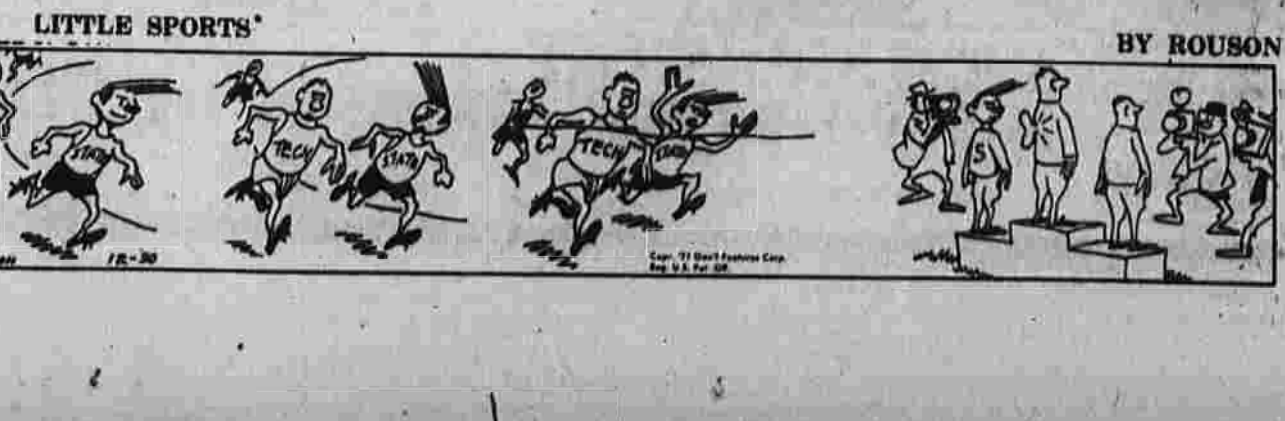

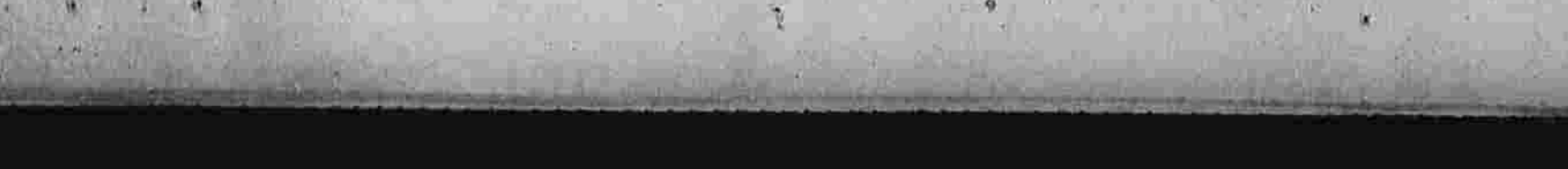
