SAIGON (AP)—U.S. and South Vietnamese forces joined the Viet Cong today in a New Year cease-fire across South Vietnam, but American air forces followed their five-day attack on Laos with more than 100 B-52 bombers.

The South Vietnamese command reported only one violation during the first hours of the cease-fire, an attack on a village in the Central Highlands.

We Reach For Hope

There is almost too much burden ahead in this new year, for human effort to try to accomplish, or human philosophy even to contemplate.

How can there be, except for miracles, anything like a good year in such a world? What ground do we have for believing that it will be any better than the year we are just concluding...

We reach for the hope that keeps us putting one foot ahead of another when we doubt we have the energy for it.

Once we make and take our automatic, desperate reach for hope, however, once we join ourselves to the continuation of our struggle, we can use it to climb out of the doldrums and toward a better level of effort and thinking and feeling.

We are going to go on; we might as well do our best with it. If we try to do our best with it, we find our own adrenalin reacting to opportunity and to challenge.

We discover new capacities within ourselves. We begin to get visions of progress—not pell mell into the complete realization of the ideal—but toward the right to claim that we belong to a generation which finally, after much torture, has succeeded in doing at least a few things better than any other has ever done.

We rediscover how much there is that is unquenchably beautiful in our world, and in the design of the life, human and otherwise, that is in it.

We don't know how many times we have, in our journalistic capacity or another, sat down at the beginning of a new calendar year and composed a set of resolutions for other people to follow.

The ideal such list is supposed to contain just the right proportion of wit, either pleasant or unpleasant, with a certain amount of seriousness.

Obviously, the way we make it seem, one of the greatest resolutions of all time would be one in which the self-fancied minor pundits of the world would promise never again to draw up and publish any such thing as a New Year's list of resolutions for others to adopt and follow.

We hereby propose a set of resolutions any journalistic ego might do well to adopt and try to follow, next year, and any year.

1. To be sure one is trying to illuminate the world one is covering, as it is, rather than trying to display the cleverness or boldness of the commentator.

2. To remember that the kind word can always be shaded, if necessary, but that the unkind one can never be called all the way back.

3. To try to write as if one realized that the privilege of comment on public affairs and public figures was also a kind of public trust, not to be cheapened, and not to be used without a sense of responsibility.

4. To try and resist the temptation to slide and evade the discovery of error which should be admitted openly and repaired, as far as it can be, generously.

5. Never to attack in his adversary any public figure who hesitated to attack at the height of his power.

6. To try to make it a rule not to take the reader down the road of one's own personal choosing without making it clear that there is another road open, also likely to have its honest advocates and defenders.

Political Parade

WASHINGTON—At a man of it may be well to remind ourselves how little we are able to anticipate of the turns and twists of our national life.

The conventional wisdom is that 1972 will see a series of diplomatic spectacles by President Nixon, a further winding-down of the Vietnam war, an expansionary economy (market, somewhat, by a sticky unemployment rate) and a generally placid domestic and international scene.

The conventional wisdom is that the Democrats will sooner or later settle on Sen. Edmund S. Muskie as their nominee and then run a good but losing campaign in the fall, splitting the vote (with help from George Wallace) closely enough to enable them to retain control of Congress again, even while Mr. Nixon returns to the White House.

If this scenario holds, then the end of 1972 would not look very different from today—and that is why the conventional wisdom is very likely to be proven wrong again.

There are too many big "ifs" in that formula; too many uncontrolled and uncontrollable factors for it to work out quite that smoothly or blandly. The history of this country and this attack of manufacturing ritual that leaves them feeling a little shortchanged.

Well for one thing, New Year's Eve has for its ancient purpose, That special time when end and beginning was once heavy with meaning. What happens on New Year's Day for instance, used to be taken as an omen for the entire year.

And all that noise-making. Originally it was intended to drive away evil spirits. Now we make the welkin ring only to rattle the welkin—and early-retiring neighbors.

Perhaps the best attitude to assume for those New Year's Eve parties is one of small expectations. And if we are equally restrained in our prognostics for the New Year, we may be better able to serve of them, and we know them better.

We know, for instance, that America and the men trying to lead it, off stride. Ultimately, the test is likely to be which man can best display the strength to rally the nation in those moments.

American are not naive. They are profoundly skeptical of anyone who offers them an easy answer or a glib assurance that the years ahead will be easy. But they are looking for strength in their leadership, and when they find the man they can trust, that man will make 1972 his year.
