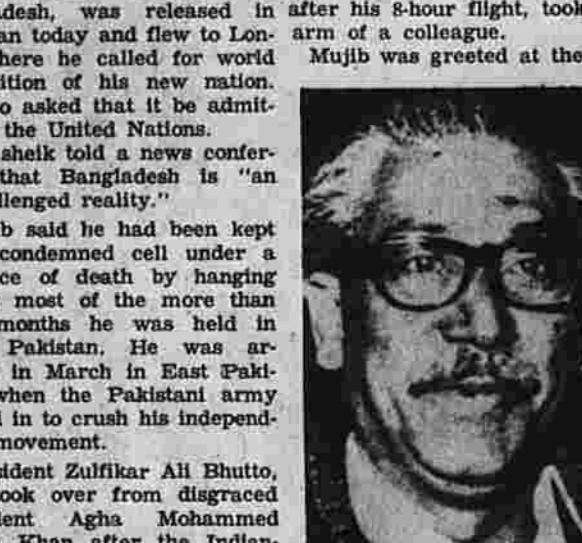

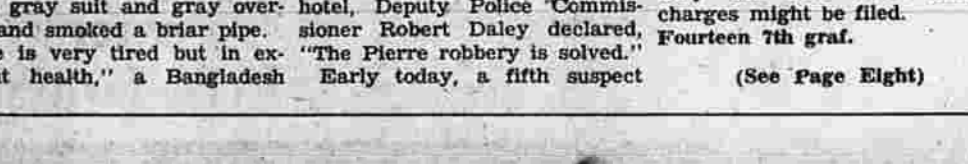

It is swalled around but broken by the great sea of north-westerly wind that still stands after the sea retreat, leaving the sand scoured and rippled and white with the sea. Sermon At The Center
If, over the last day or two, a stranger had happened to pass through the Center, and be impressed by the ease and convenience of the traffic system there, he would not have known, at all, that it was being thought of a break-down, rather than the proper performance of a system.

We who live or work in Manchester, and who pass through the Center perhaps several times a day, know that when the sudden efficiency of continual blinker lights, rather than intricate alternations of red and green, goes into operation at the Center, it is because of some electronic failure, not, as one might hope, by sensible design.

But every now and then it does happen, that the light sequences break down, and the system has to go on blinker. In that case, motorists find their own way so easily and conveniently that there is hardly ever anything like the traffic tie-up which so normally conditions at the Center, when the traffic lights are working as they are supposed to.

This may be, of course, a false kind of test and demonstration. We motorists arrive at the Center expecting the normal headache and confusion of misdirected and cross-purposed traffic, and we are so pleased to find the system out of order that we instinctively and generously behave ourselves like perfect ladies and gentlemen.

But let us get used to the blessings and the efficiencies of freedom for more than a day or two at a time, and we would probably begin abusing them, start fighting for the slightly quicker start or less penalty, less concession, forgetting how much more patience was needed when the lights did work their sequences, and proceed to push so much selfish risk-taking into the Center situation it would seem necessary to revive our own capacity to the nonsensical efficiency of the lights.

Still, when it does happen for a few hours at a time, we do have a glimpse at what a master traffic planner, with some influence on human nature, might try to set up, as the ideal system for control and regulation of traffic or any other human activity - shared, responsible freedom.

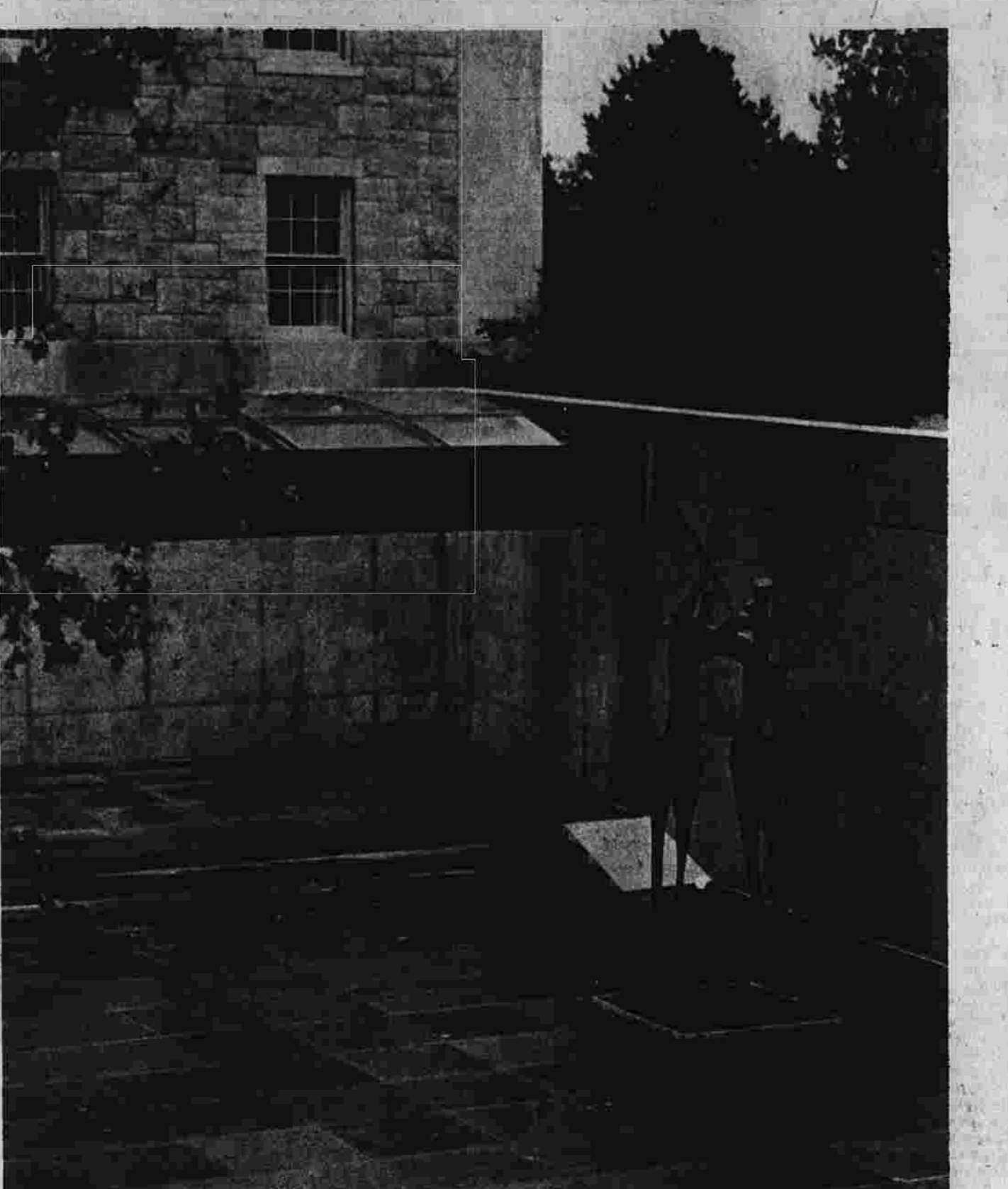
The Paulsen Entry

Inside Report Hanoi's 1972 Offensive

WASHINGTON—Within a few weeks, invading North Vietnamese regulars probably will fight their way into the provincial capital of Kontum in the South Vietnam's central highlands and may well hold several days an event of massive military importance but a potentially portentous development in the endless war, whether or not Communist troops briefly occupy Kontum may have no relationship to Vietnam's overall military situation. Instead, the annual dry season Communist offensive in the hilly, mountainous, and forested regions of South Vietnam.

Connecticut Yankee

There's no question about it, we in the area profession have an unerring preference for the negative over the positive.

Now are we alone in our handling of two separate sets of statistics prepared and issued by the Connecticut Public Expenditure Council the other day we were given some sense of direction and emphasis by the very way that respected organization presented its own findings.

The set of its own headlines was twice as big as the other. The chart presenting the set of statistics was twice as big as the other. In other words, we of the fourth estate were more or less invited to consider only the more important than the other.

The big headlines, in the Public Expenditure Council release, and in the subsequent news coverage, went to the fact that the payroll of the General Assembly for its own staff had increased 78 per cent in the last decade, from \$18 to \$45, with the total payroll increasing from \$45,477 to \$142,453.

This showed the wicked, spendthrift politicians in a vilified light. It was a blow to the public good, and pointed to proper and realistic legislation. It was a blow to the public good, and pointed to proper and realistic legislation.

It told how, in the space of 12 years, the administration of Governor Meskill had, by a process of not filling vacancies which he had accomplished a reduction of 8.6 per cent, or 3,855 employees, in the state payroll representing an economy for the state of at least \$9,600,000 a year.

This is the unvarnished truth. It is something that has often been promised, but never previously delivered by a state administration. If man ever bites dog, this is it. It has to stand as a monument to the reform of man in politics.

The number who signed up in the same predicament is estimated at more than 14,000 in the other, and the amount of money involved \$9,600,000 as against \$9,600,000.

In spite of such factual analysis, everybody still tends to react in the negative. It is no exception here. In other words, we of the fourth estate were more or less invited to consider only the more important than the other.
