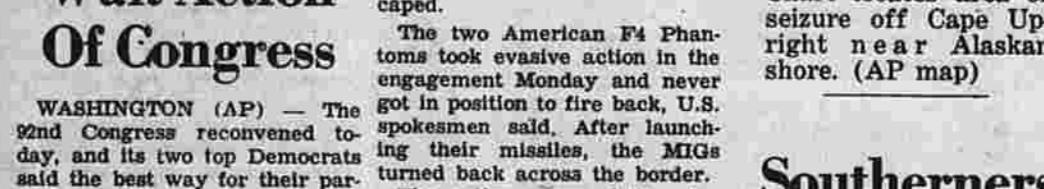

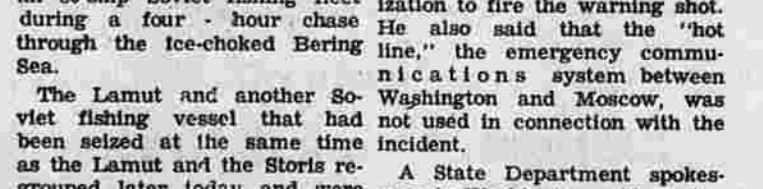

helps a good many people, including not only Europeans but also Americans themselves, have been selling us short. Anyway, as Chancellor Brandt encountered us and experienced us, we are full not only of "helpfulness and friendliness" but of something even more precious.

Chancellor Brandt, "how much inner strength there is in these United States, how much down-to-earth helpfulness and friendliness there is among the Americans themselves and toward strangers."

Another remarkable thing our German guest noticed was "how much more considerate Americans are in highway traffic, how considerate they are of others altogether."

Chancellor Brandt was also pleased and surprised by the informal way hospitality was offered to him and his family, and by the easy, natural, almost "naive" way in which we seemed to maintain a positive outlook toward life and people.

For us, too, it is perhaps something of a pleasant surprise to be meeting such people and then to be told it is ourselves we are looking at. We may suspect that, underneath it, there is some quite human quirk of behavior which makes it easier for us to be friendly and considerate to a stranger than we are to ourselves.

But the greater cheer of gratitude to Chancellor Brandt must go up, anyway. Here, at last, is a visitor from abroad who came and took a look at us and went home to give us full, warm-hearted praise instead of condemning criticism. Come to think of it, we have never really been quite so bad as some of our foreign, or domestic, critics have intimated. We really ought to see more of one another.

### In The Dressing Room

And then, after the game itself had been decided, out on the field there was the equally unequal battle in the dressing room, where an almost totally defenseless character carrying a microphone was ordered into action against such strange samples of the independent, perhaps intelligent, mind as Duane Thomas and Roger Staubauch.

Thomas threw the microphone for a loss merely by keeping his silence long enough for the question he had been asked to establish itself beyond any need for an answer.

And Staubauch, wearing the smile of a victor in which every play had been sent in to him from the bench, nevertheless replied, when the microphone was held still before him in a quaver, that he still believed in having a quarterback call his own game.

There was still, now and then, with some people, some sneaky victory, money, prestige, or even Mike right can't buy.

### A Raise For Legislators?

There was a time when service in the Connecticut General Assembly was anything but rewarding, in financial terms, but a career as a lawmaker begins to look more and more inviting.

Commenting on the session which begins next month House Speaker William W. Ratchford said he had received a letter from a member of the House who asked him to remain as Director (1) as long as he wants to and (2) as long as he is physically and mentally capable, adding hastily that both conditions now are something.

His private opinion is something else. They concede that the FBI has gone downhill as a law enforcement agency and squarely blame Hoover. Only a new Director can reform the bureau, they believe.

Although right-wing groups staunchly defend Hoover from all attacks and letists regularly demand his dismissal, the question is not basically ideological. Thus, the leading advocate of Hoover's dismissal inside the Administration is one of the Justice Department's most militant anti-Communists and law-abidingest.

### Country Scene

With Reginald Pinto in Portugal

### Connecticut Yankee

Way way back in the ages bright, the Connecticut House of Representatives quite frequently conceded the same individual more than one term as Speaker of the House.

Under such conditions, there were 10 distinguished individuals who served for two terms in succession, and three who served as many as three separate terms in the office.

After the advent of biennial sessions, however, there have been only three instances in which a Speaker of the House has held that office for more than one term.

How's the Connecticut tradition for allowing Speakers of the House to become Governor? One Chauncey P. Cleveland served as Speaker in 1835 and 1836 and then as Governor from 1842 to 1844, and then came back as Speaker again in 1863.

After him the tradition closed back around the office until, in the reappointment snafu of the last decade, the courts ordered the 1963 Legislature held over, which led to a second term for Speaker J. Tyler Fator.

Finally, and this is what brings us to the issue of the moment, the current House Speaker, Rep. William R. Ratchford of Danbury, won himself a second term and now serving it. He won it, in spite of the tradition against repetition, by a deft exertion of his own political muscle and by constructing the necessary alliances.

There was, in the past, one contributory reason why an up and coming ambition would regard the Speaker's post as a one-term option. People of Speaker caliber could hardly afford to give so much time for so little salary. Connecticut's next legislative salary adjustment might at least make long-term service a little more bearable, financially.

### Cable TV: A Free-For-All

WASHINGTON — Local government in the United States is about to become the scene of a frantic financial struggle — whose outcome may well determine the future of television.

In the large cities and their populous suburbs, county supervisors and city aldermen are going to be deluged with applications for cable television systems.

The Federal Communications Commission is entering the last stage of new regulations that are expected to stimulate cable channels as a condition for awarding the franchises.

But the Federal requirements will mean that the new FCC rules will mean that cable television may do to television what the radio did to radio: Make it a new battleground.

A typical cable system can now bring 40 or more channels into the home, allowing it not only to rebroadcast existing television programs (a k a n from the air by master antennas) but also originate new programs, or import a limited number of programs from other stations.

Planning the cable systems of the future is a task of great complexity calling for highly sophisticated technical, financial, legal and administrative skills. Unfortunately, this expertise is in short supply.

The decisions made by local officials will have an immense and lasting impact. Because any large cable system will require millions of dollars in investment — to lay cable in underground conduits or strung along existing television poles — franchise awards will probably run for at least 10 to 20 years.

Some of the key questions: What kind of free services (such as an open channel for educational purposes) should localities demand of cable systems? How should rates be set (most cable systems charge homeowners a monthly subscription charge of about \$5 dollars)? How many rival cable TV proposals. The channels should a cable system FCC has already proposed—and should special taxes (franchise fees) be levied on cable operators to no more than 5 per cent.

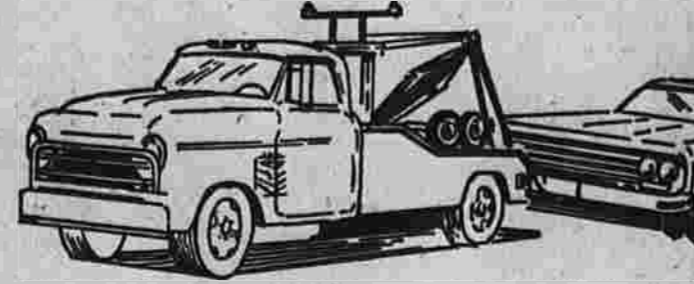
