What has happened so far, however, has been not only confusing, but interesting. Although Hanoi did not take the American peace proposals when they were secret, it has apparently halted short of outright rejection of them now they have been made public.

And instead of departing from the negotiation scene in a big trumped-up huff, Hanoi has followed up the publication of the American proposals with the presentation of an amended version of its own list of peace demands.

Nobody dares stop holding his breath. But for the moment, wide open public diplomacy, with every move subject to immediate and sometimes rough public judgment, and subject as well to immediate political controversy, as witness the speech by Senator Muskie and the resolute denunciation of Senator Muskie by Secretary of State Roberts, is keeping itself alive and apparently making small adjustments of position which might even lead into some progress.

Networks Pool Resources To Cover Nixon in China

During the last two weeks, more than a thousand cases of television equipment weighing over 40 tons arrived at a loading facility in Fairview, N. J. The equipment, which will be used by the three networks for extensive pool coverage of President Nixon's forthcoming visit to China, left last Saturday (Jan. 29) for Peking from John F. Kennedy International Airport in New York.

The flight plan called for 22 hours of actual flying time. The special 707 jet — carrying the equipment and approximately 61 technicians from the three networks — flew to Los Angeles, then to Honolulu, refueled at Wake Island, flew to Guam, and then on to Shanghai, where it picked up Chinese navigators for the final approach to Peking Airport.

All satellite transmission from China will be done on a pool basis, with tape and film facilities for processing stories located at a special transmission center.

Jointly Manned

The Chinese have prepared a broadcast transmission center to contain television and radio studios with control rooms; film processing and projection rooms; video tape and related support facilities. It will be jointly manned by Chinese personnel and U. S. pool broadcast engineers serving as technical advisors.

In addition, two mobile vans will be deployed to transmit

Broadcast Plaza Inc. of Hartford has introduced its new radar weather system to television audiences over WTIC-TV (Channel 3).

The new radar equipment, the most sophisticated and complex weather radar installation in the country, will enable the Travelers Weather Service to bring the best weather information available to viewers in the WTIC area.

The radar will be seen on "Channel 3 Weather," Monday through Saturday at 6 p.m. and 11:15 p.m., and at 11 p.m. Sunday.

The radar is used to detect location of rain or snow — a transmitter sends out short bursts of radio energy, which are reflected off masses of raindrops or other precipitation. As the transmitter antenna rotates, these "targets" are displayed on a screen.
