The Governor Holds The Line

The spending and taxing proposal Governor Meskill submitted to the General Assembly yesterday seems, at first glance, something of a miracle.

And its own inner weakness may be that it does depend, for its own ultimate justification, on some kind of fiscal miracle.

Committee, was that of violating the rules of pure amateurism. No one can deny that there have been other violations of those rules which still go unchallenged and unpunished.

But the mildness of his offense, and the possibly comparative injustice of the treatment accorded him, are not any full justification for the reverse kind of honor being paid him.

He is being cast—against his own lack of real qualification—into the role of the bad man who gets perverse admiration because he has done something wicked or against the rules.

And it is something of a neat index to the quality of the hero-dome, or anti-hero status, which is being created for him that the thriving industry in Austria, at the moment, is the printing and selling of false Schriani autographs.

This is, obviously, some degree of perversion of whatever sympathy may have risen for Karl Schriani as an injured man.

Once we might have had a different kind of perversion—one in which people went off in support of the super-righteousness, the executive purity, of that old defender of real amateurism, Avery Brundage.

But there is little danger of that kind of over emphasis today. We are more likely to pedestal our offenders than our saints. There might be a market for Brundage effigies, but not autographs. But there is no need for heavy production. He is indeed odd, and inevitably does to pass his life, along with some virtues and standards he has fought, fiercely but often vainly, to preserve.

Underwork As A Danger

Now that we read of it, we wonder if it doesn't happen more often than the other kind.

We refer to the nervous breakdown suffered by a gentleman over in France because he found himself compelled to exist in a condition of underwork.

Until now, it has been the commonplace that it was overwork which held in its danger of nervous breakdown. Now that we think it over, it seems to us that old commonplace may have to be re-examined and re-examined and perhaps amended.

Granted that the ideal situation would be just the right amount of work, neither too much nor too little, which direction of departure from that ideal would we consider the lesser, therefore preferable one? It seems the less well adjusted, the fellow who has a little too much to do, or the one who has to slow down a bit if he doesn't want to have time on his hands? While it is healthier, the additional small flow of adrenalin necessary to keep pace with a deadline or a quota, or the touch of demoralized dlaying, the extra cigarette, or even plain diversionary mischief, which may become the release of the fellow who finds himself with more time than duty?

Once these New England rocks had a conclusive answer nobody dared dispute. Work, they said, never hurt anybody.

Of White Elks and Black Sheep

Talk about legislative checks—the one a Supreme Court justice warned us we have to base from year to year.

And Governor Meskill happens to be a governor who has a very special right to ask the state to go along with his hold the line gamble.

His special claim is that he is the first Governor in modern Connecticut history who has ever succeeded in achieving a visible reduction in state spending.

Governor Meskill has accomplished this by his across the board percentage limitation on spending, by his executive implementation of some portions of the Etherington report, and most conspicuously and convincingly of all by somehow managing to make the past year an era of substantial decline in the actual number of employees on the state payroll.

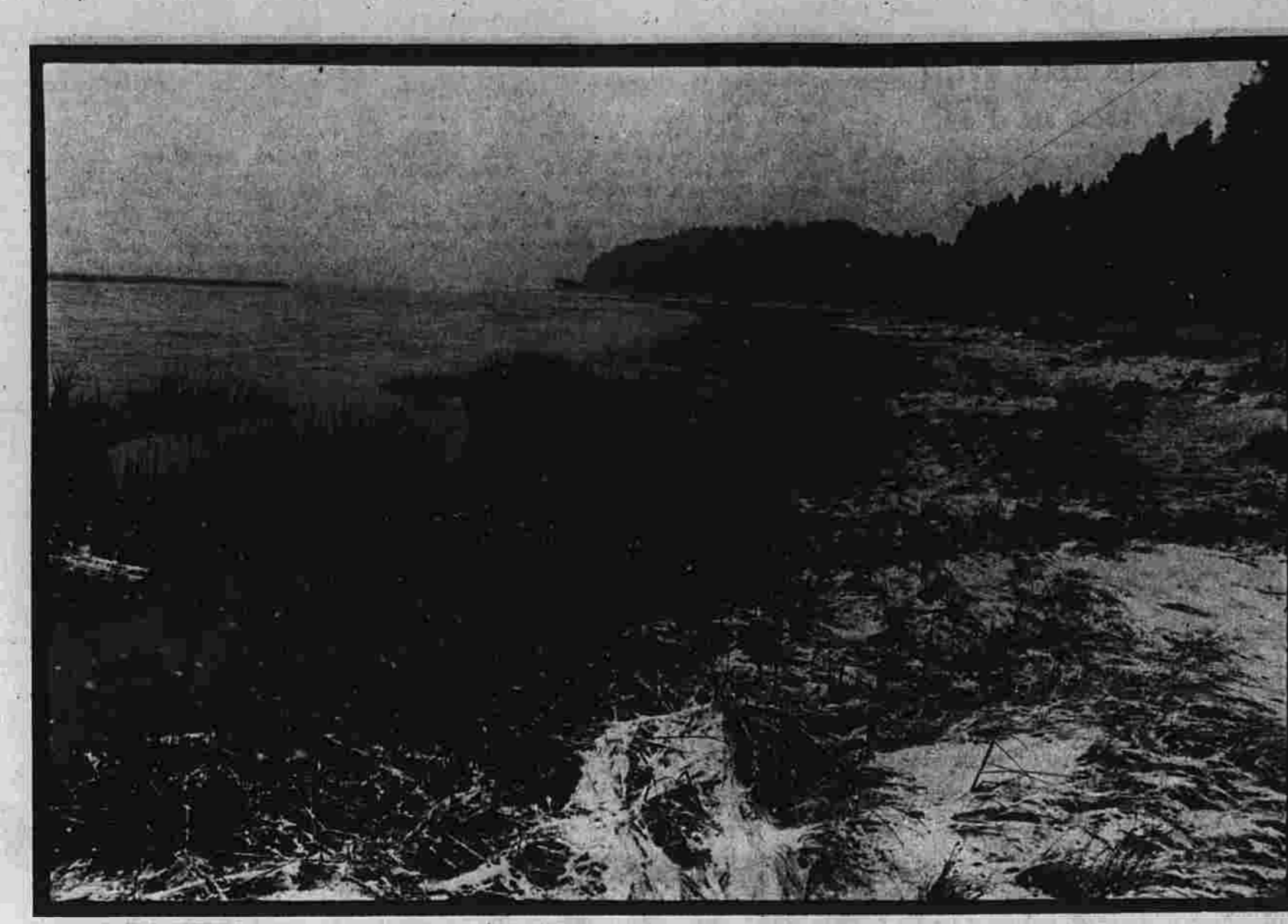
His attempt to make-do for another fiscal year without any reach for new or higher taxes has to be based, in good part, on the possibility that such savings can be held and even expanded to some degree, and this is a possibility that should engage a support that crosses party lines.

Perhaps the miracle the Governor seems to depend upon can be given enough reality to carry the state through. It seems to us that the General Assembly will find itself bound to suppress some of its own spending instincts and give the hold-the-line proposal a chance.

WASHINGTON—America can never seem to figure out what to do about its poor and its black citizens. It forces them into concentrations, whether through economic, commercial manipulation or outright segregation. And then it announces that it would be possible to deal with their problems if only the people weren't so concentrated.

As provocative as Judge Meskill's Richmond decree was, I would have preferred a ruling that said not that pupils must be bused without regard to city boundary lines but that school money and resources must no longer stop at those boundaries.

It may still come to that. If the current trend continues, there will likely be an end to property taxes as the chief means of financing schools. And one result will be that all the schools within a state will be on equal footing, no matter whether they are in rich neighborhoods or poor.

When the white and the rich discover that they cannot finance good public schools for their own children and loony ones for the rest, we will see the beginning of equality in public education or we will see the end of public education.

From Your Neighbor's Kitchen

By VIVIAN F. FERRESON Larousse gives credit to the Gauls for first salting and smoking pork. At one time, large herds of pigs wandered through the extensive forests of France. The Gauls became so adept at curing that they supplied ham to Rome and all of what's now Italy.

There are many ways to ham. Instead of a few cubes of ham, I alternate the layers of potatoes with generous pieces of ham. Sometimes I add chopped onion. If you want to get the casserole going quickly in the oven, heat the butter, flour and milk in a saucepan. Then, pour the hot liquid over the potatoes, etc. If you have this heating while you're finishing the casserole, you can cut 15 minutes off the cooking time.

With the ham some ham rendering), I make soup. Peas and lentils soups are two winter favorites. Better for the kids if you use chicken or turkey. A soup tureen is a good investment. Heat the bowl first with hot water from the tap. Then, the container doesn't take the warmth away from the soup. When you pour the soup into the table and it will stay hot for some time.

The other night our children wanted to eat early so Dad and I decided we would just have an omelette later on. I chopped an onion finely, sauteed it in butter until soft, poured some white wine over, until the alcohol had cooked off. Added some mushrooms, some of the leftover ham cut in small pieces, enough medium cream to bind it all together. For seasoning, I used omelette herbs (a commercial product), some fresh parsley, chopped and a small sprig of rosemary.

When I make the omelette, I place the filling on half of it before folding. Then, I put more filling over the top and garnish with fresh parsley. If you wish a thicker filling, you can make a roux with butter and flour. By the way, have your butter on a low heat. If it's too hot, the roux will turn into a sauce without making a roux. Use a spoon and tap the handle with the opposite hand over so lightly as you sprinkle lightly over whatever you are cooking.

I used to make a ham and apple which I haven't made in years. You may wish to add more ham than the recipe states. You can tell after you add to the eggs. For catsup goes well with this.

Ham and Egg Pie
 1/2 lb. cooked ham
 6 eggs
 pastry for two-crust pie seasonings
 Remove fat from ham and cut meat into small cubes or pieces. Beat eggs slightly with salt and pepper. Season as desired with few drops Worcestershire sauce or onion juice or both. Line 8-inch pie plate with pastry, pour in ham and egg mixture. Put on top crust, prick with fork and bake at 450 for 10 minutes, then reduce to 350 and bake 10 minutes more. Serves six.

The flavor of a ham is greatly affected by the diet of the pig. Curing is another factor in flavor. The genuine Virginia ham is fed on peanuts and hickory peaches. The curing process is supposed to be a secret. The smoking of a Virginia ham is done over apple and hickory wood fires.

The Kentucky ham, taken on from Hampshire hogs, feeds wild acorns, beans and clover. Toward the end of their lives they are fed on straw in pens. The hams are dry-cured, then smoked over apple and hickory.

If you will go back now to my omelette recipe, you will see that the two recipes are similar. Basically, it is the same thing only you are using a slice of ham instead of pieces. The only difference is that she browns the ham first.

To simplify Julia's recipe, you can eliminate the mustard and tomato paste and follow the omelette recipe, except to fry the ham at the beginning. You can eliminate the oil and just use butter or margarine. The oil just makes it brown quicker.

You will saute the shallots or onion in the butter, add the wine and canned beef bouillon and the cream. Now, you just leave it plain. Try a package of dark brown seasoning and broth if the ham is not too salty.

GLAZE WHILE WARM
 Have had phone calls on last week's lemon glaze for the lemon spice cake. The ladies have not been able to spread it on the cake. The recipe is correct but the instructions for the glaze were not clear. They read, "spread on top of cooled cake." It probably should read, "spread on top of slightly cooled but still warm cake." The consistency of the glaze will be like thick paste which melts as it touches the warm cake. If the cake is too wet, it will melt but not glaze. Wait about 10 to 15 minutes. The ladies all love the cake. I then tried the other recipe and it was not as good. I will continue moving up from current supermarket prices, at least in the near future, according to one USDA spokesman. Tolland School Budget Lacks Funds To Accept \$9,200 in Grants

The Board of Education has run up against a familiar problem—the need to have money in order to make money.

The state has agreed to pay the grants before the close of the fiscal year, in what would result in a wipe-out budgetary operation.

The finance board approved a similar \$3,000 appropriation which will be covered by reimbursement grants about two weeks ago, for which a town meeting will be scheduled shortly.

The school board wants these new items included in the same meeting, and First Selectman Erwin Stoetzer has agreed to try to cut through the red tape for them.

The finance board is limited to approval of a maximum of \$2,000 without going to a town meeting for approval. Approval of the latest request is expected in view of the board's reaction to the previous request.

The state is now in a position to purchase the equipment for the town, placing Dr. MacKenzie in what he terms a "frustrating dilemma."

ZBA To Air Requests For 3 Gas Stations

Requests for three new gas stations are among the items scheduled for public hearing by the Manchester Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) Monday at 7 p.m. in the Municipal Building hearing room.

The applications will be considered just one day before the town's new Business 5 zoning regulation goes into effect. This measure was adopted by the Planning and Zoning Commission last month in an effort to restrict new gas stations.

The three proposed stations would not be affected by the new regulation, however, as the applications were filed early in January.

The applications seek gas stations on Hartford Rd. W. Middle Tpke., and Tolland Tpke. Evio Agostinelli is asking for a special exception for a station at 501 Hartford Rd., zoned Business 2, and is requesting a variance which would allow the facility to be less than 500 feet from a residential dwelling, the required distance.

Mobil Oil Corp. is seeking a special exception to sell gasoline and motor vehicle products at 344 W. Middle Tpke., zoned Business 5. A car wash now is on the site.

Arville Hale has requested a special exception for a station at 384 Tolland Tpke., zoned Business 5. A variance is also sought to reduce the frontage from the required 180 feet to a requested 100 feet at the location.

The new zoning regulation will allow new gas stations only in the Business 5 zone. The regulation does not "outlaw" gas stations, according to town planner J. Eric Potter, but requires a developer to apply for a zone change before proceeding.

Even with the new requirements, gas station developers must still seek special exceptions from the ZBA.

Guidelines for Business 5 zones indicate that new gas stations will be permitted only if they service motorists on restricted access highways, such as the recently opened I-84.

The town planning department has learned that the Business 5 regulation will be appealed in court, but that the legal papers have yet to be filed. Appeals must be filed within 15 days of the date the regulation was adopted, and the deadline for filing is next Tuesday.

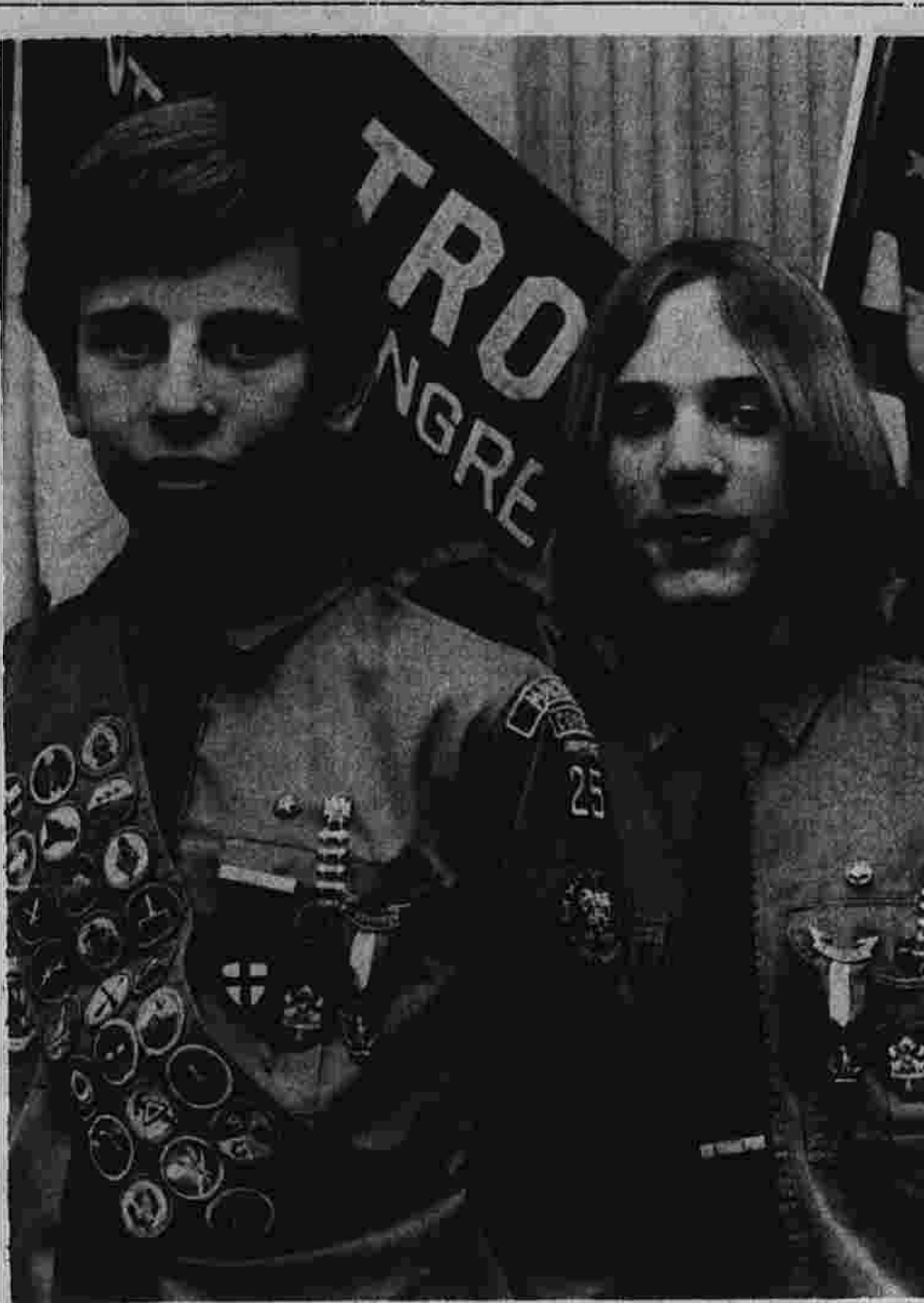

Private Trust Favored For Conservation Lands

The Conservation Commission last night voted unanimously to support the creation of a Manchester Land Conservation Trust, a private, non-stock corporation.

Dr. Frederick Spaulding, commission chairman, brought to the meeting information of several land trusts that are operating successfully in the state. The trusts are tax-free and accept donations of land and money. Some are town-wide and some are for a specific purpose.

Dr. Spaulding and Atty. John Papa explained land trusts to commission members. They have been meeting with Dr. Douglas Smith, of the City Beautiful Committee of the Chamber of Commerce, and town.

Harry Malmont, chairman of the Manchester River Coordinating Committee, studying existing trusts. The four men will draw up proposed by-laws to present to the commission for approval at its March 8 meeting.

Atty. Papa said many people prefer to leave land to a trust instead of to a town. He finds the idea of a town land trust exciting, he said, and has offered legal assistance for its organization.

Essences can be given to trusts, Dr. Spaulding said. The Hockanum River Linear Park Coordinating Committee hopes to get easements from owners of river property for walkways. Land trust can be flexible in dealing with property owners and can accept land with conditions made by the donors.

The land trust, as proposed by Dr. Spaulding, would consist of founders and a board of directors for administration. It would have representation from the whole community so it would be responsive and responsible to all people interested in preserving the outdoor beauty and the health of the town.

"It will be an organization with guts," Dr. Spaulding said, "and dedicated to the wise use of the environment to serve the people of Manchester now and future generations."

Also at the meeting the commission voted to write a letter to Town Manager Robert Weiss requesting that action be taken to eliminate the gypsy moths from Camp Merrie-Wood, a girl scout day camp on Fern St. The vote was taken after Mr. and Mrs. Norman Larson, representing the Girl Scouts Council, asked for help so the scouts can use the area this summer. Caterpillars last year hindered camp activities.

Dr. Spaulding said the results of a survey of gypsy moths in town by the state show that a 40 to 60 per cent defoliation this year is possible. He said the infestation is lightest in the northeastern part of town, greater in the southern section particularly in the Birch Mt. area. He said a spokesman from the state will speak to a small group of town officials explaining the survey on a date to be set.

Commission members will get copies of a bill proposing the elimination of the state highway fund and discuss the bill with legislators before the next meeting. The commission previously has taken a stand against the construction of highways through town and for the further investigation of mass transit systems. The conservation of the Hillary Pond area will also be discussed at the next meeting.

If such a film is made, the winter scenes will be part of the production. The scenes will probably include snow on trees and rocks, townspeople skiing, sledding and playing in the snow, and bird watching.

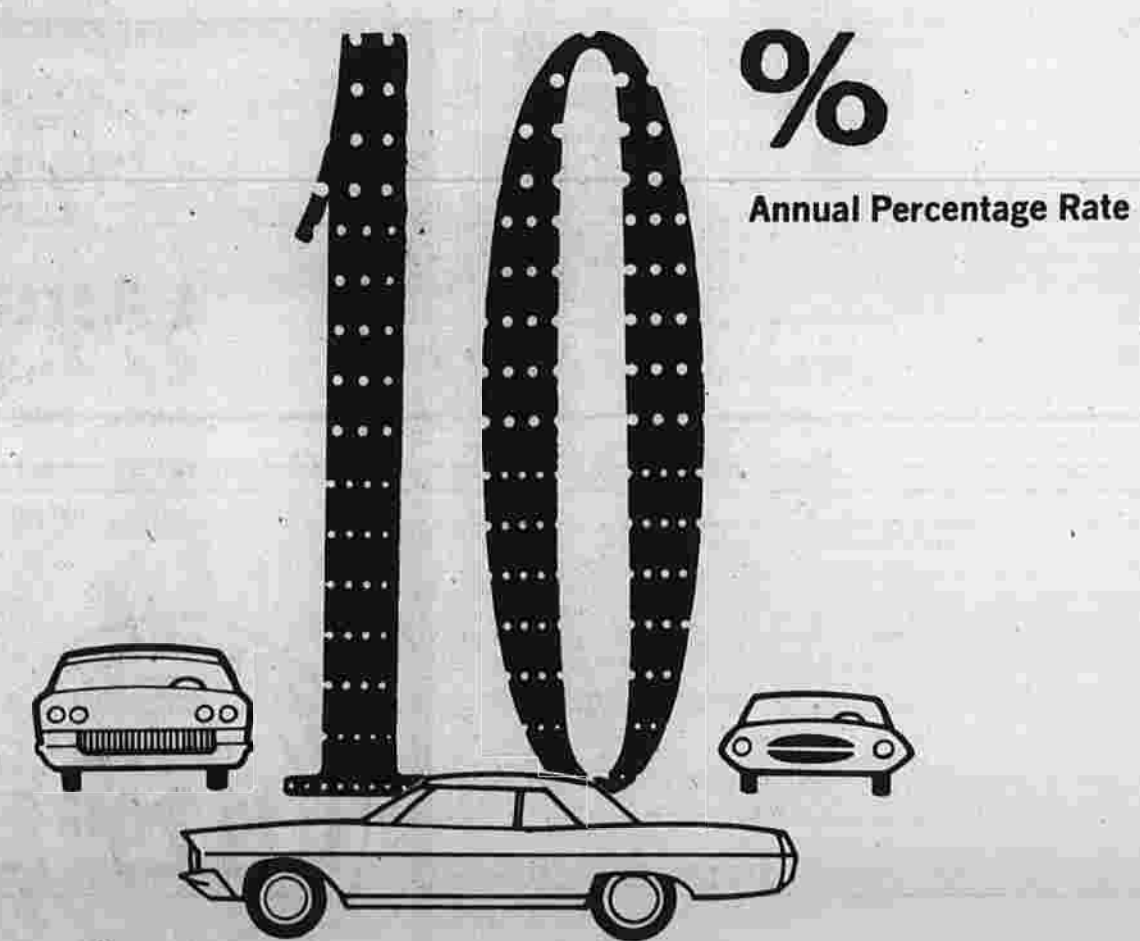
