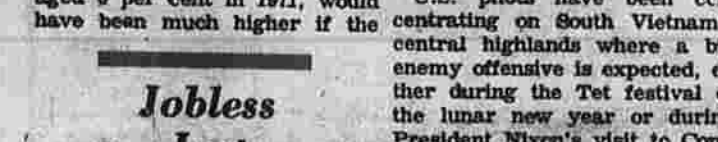

Sadat told a special meeting of the national congress of the ruling Arab Socialist Union that Egypt must be prepared to accept big losses and inflict even greater losses on Israel.

He gave no hint of how Egypt could develop sophisticated weapons, but presumably they would be supplied by the Soviet Union.

### Dockmen Vote On Contract

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—Longshore leaders have recommended ratification of a tentative contract to end the crippling 11-day West Coast dock strike, raising hopes workers will be back on the job by Sunday.

The 110 delegates to a union caucus voted Tuesday to submit the agreement to the 13,000 rank and file members at the 24 strike-bound ports from Seattle to San Diego.

"The vote is favorable we will try to arrange for an immediate return to work by Sunday," said Sidney Roger, information officer for the International Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's Union.

## Britain's Jobless Grow In Shadow of Blackout

LONDON (AP)—Britain's power famine sent the jobless total soaring above 2.5 million today and added an extra three-hour blackout period to the nation's misery.

Electricity boards warned the situation is likely to be still worse by Friday, raising fears of industrial paralysis, food shortages and the threat of river pollution.

Bones already backed out for nine hours a day were warned to expect an additional three-hour power cutoff. The cuts are for rationing fuel in coal-fired electric power stations, nearly starved of supplies.

## Nixon Staff Busy As Takeoff Nears

WASHINGTON (AP)—The staffs handling the logistics of the presidential plane's departure from Washington are busy as the takeoff time nears.

The advance team is arranging for the plane's departure from the White House, including the Chinese-built automobiles which will be used during the week.

While in China, Nixon also will be reading the presidential press secretary's books containing classified material on China and its leaders.

His big, black arm-plate limousine is being left at home—another departure from the past.

## Full Attack Hinted As Journey Starts

SAIGON (AP)—Allied intelligence projections indicate 70 per cent more North Vietnamese troops will move into South Vietnam or into the areas just across its western borders during the first five months of this year than did so in the same period last year. U.S. military sources said today.

The sources also indicated that American air forces would keep up their heavy strikes across Indochina during President Nixon's visit to R4d China next week.

### Bulletin

SAIGON (AP)—American warplanes launched substantial air strikes inside North Vietnam today, U.S. military sources said.

They are sending to details of presidential security and well-being. From seeing that the scores of Soviet agents are outfitted with warm clothing for Peking's wintry blasts.

They also are tending to details of news coverage. Assuring installation of 15 soundproof telephone booths in the Peking press center, making certain the reasons of paper which will be furnished the 87 correspondents accredited for the trip actually reach China.

## Pope Accepts Ashes

VATICAN CITY (AP)—Pope Paul VI knelt and bowed to take a smudge of ashes on his head today in a ceremony marking the beginning of Lent.

The 74-year-old pontiff said this reminded him of the "extremely transient fragility of present life."

After Pope Cardinal Marella, president of the Roman Curia, spread the ashes in a humbly, awareness of sin, crusade-shape on the Pope's head, prayers and listening to the details of the Pope's head.

Pope Paul radically revamped fasting regulations in 1968 making it compulsory for Roman Catholics to fast on only two days a year, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting rules call for just one full meal a day.

## National Test Area Coventry, Columbia Stirred

The New Rural Societies Project which will involve the 10 towns of Windham Region, Coventry and Columbia has been awarded \$200,000 and is now in effect, following signing of the prime contract yesterday.

The contract, issued by the Health, Education and Welfare Department, went to Fairfield University with work on the one-year pilot program being coordinated by Dr. Peter Goldmark.

Goldmark, long-time head of CBE Laboratories in Stamford, is now head of his own communications firm, founded last year with the New Rural Societies Project in mind.

Under the project, which will be receiving nationwide attention with the Windham Region as the only pilot site, Goldmark envisions making rural areas as attractive and convenient to live and work in as the big cities, but without some of the major woes that plague large urban areas.

Using all available communications technology, Goldmark hopes within the pilot year to establish the feasibility of one or more large corporations establishing offices in the area.

Through the use of communications technology, Goldmark can keep in touch with a main office in the big city. One office was located in the same building.

The Windham Region was chosen for the pilot program for several reasons, not the least of which is that Windham Regional Planning Agency Director Robert Young expressed an enthusiastic interest in the project.

At a meeting of officials of the 10 towns last month, Goldmark explained that the 300 square miles of the region hold an average of 200 people per square mile, or one third of the state average, and Young had noted that the region was interested in an orderly growth pattern. It is also an attractive location, with reasonable proximity to large urban areas.

All these factors tended to make the Windham Region an ideal location for the pilot program.

By planning the "new society" almost from scratch, all aspects of modern technology can be taken into account, something that was lacking in the layout of today's big cities.

Goldmark has said, "The project will take such things as medical facilities and modern communications technology as part of the overall picture, and today's meeting was to discuss the existing medical and clinic facilities with area doctors, as a beginning to see how modern communications technology could be put to work to best this up."

As to what other aspects of the study will begin, Young said "The clock is running, and we've geared up the personnel will be hired, and the WRPA itself will be heavily involved in local studies of regional impact and coordination with Goldmark's workers. Young said the agency will be making a subcontractor, receiving about \$20,000 for its share of work."

Young commented on the signing of the prime contract yesterday, noting that meetings with regional officials and Goldmark's workers, since the town will have complete autonomy in terms of planning and zoning, Goldmark, in his January appearance, stressed this, noting that should a corporation relocate, the towns themselves must decide, through the regional planning process, just where it would be located.

It is not expected that such an actual relocation process would be accomplished within this pilot year, but Goldmark did say he expected the groundwork would be all laid, and from there the Regional Planning Agency would take over working with the 10 towns.

The towns in the Windham Region are Ashford, Cheshire, Columbia, Coventry, Hampton, Lebanon, Mansfield, Scotland, Willington and Windham.
