"Not Fundamentally Religious"

So much evil has been done in the world in the name of religion that it has become an easy routine to identify the tragedy in Northern Ireland as a struggle between the two religions represented in the population.

More and more frequently, however, analysis from the scene is likely to include some recognition of other factors at least equally important, and perhaps, when the possibility of any solution is considered, even more important.

Noting the high incidence of unemployment in one area of Belfast, a correspondent to the Wall Street Journal the other day wrote this: "As Mr. Reynolds expounds on unemployment, it becomes even more apparent that the troubles in Northern Ireland are not fundamentally religious in nature."

The possibility that there is, in the Irish situation, something even more basic than religious differences, and something even more important than the question of political unity or separatism for the two parts of Ireland, is of course, a ground for hope.

But the provision of jobs, of better housing, of better schools, of more playgrounds can all come within the scope of human capability, and do not have to be preceded by religious or political uniformity.

Inside Report Nixon's China Challenge

WASHINGTON — Far more than President Nixon has acknowledged even to intimates, his spectacular journey to Peking faces trials unique for a Western statesman and dangers over which he himself was only a minimal control.

Thus, Richard Nixon, who in his autobiographical "Six Crises" defined for posterity the agonizing self-discipline of preparing for a crisis, today confronts potentially the most difficult trials of all: Negotiations with Communist China's prime minister, Chou En-lai, and the party's founder and chairman, Mao Tse-tung.

What first threatens Mr. Nixon's bold reach for detente with China's present leadership is the immense cultural and philosophical gap separating Washington and Peking. When he sits down Monday for his first session with Chou, the President will find that the customary rules of dialogue between Western heads of government have no meaning in the Forbidden City.

Instead of moving quickly toward his goals — such as the Formosa question — Mr. Nixon will find himself entangled in hours of philosophical discourse. He is sure to be asked about his convictions on the nature of man, the meaning of mystery, and the meaning of heaven.
