The action taken during Wednesday night's meeting will give the board time to obtain details of the one-year contract offers received from existing bus contractor Floyd Munroe and from a Chicopee, Mass., bus firm.

Bid contract forms will be prepared for presentation to the board probably at next Wednesday night's meeting.

Dr. Kenneth Mackenzie, superintendent of schools, said some reservations about purchasing and running a town-owned school bus system, as questioned some of the figures included in the detailed study, made by board member Charles Mayer, particularly regarding maintenance costs.

"I'm not trying to talk you out of it," the superintendent explained, raising several questions including the possibility of late delivery of the buses, which would leave the town without any bus transportation.

He cited instances where buses had been ordered in April and not delivered until October, a situation agreed to by Mayer.

Dr. Mackenzie also questioned the proposal of starting a full-time mechanic with the town.

"On a snowy day, which vehicle gets repaired, the school bus or the snow plow?" he asked.

Noting that Munroe employs a full-time mechanic for maintaining Tolland's buses and often calls in the Coventry mechanic as well, the superintendent claimed Tolland's proposal is particularly hard on the school buses.

The two contract offers for one year came as a surprise to the board, which had been operating under a "now or never" philosophy toward the purchase of buses. Most bus companies require three- or five-year contracts with school systems.

Other items tabled by the board until next week's meeting include a parental attitude survey regarding student smoking at the high school, and a decision on the possible merging of the morning and afternoon kindergarten sessions next fall.

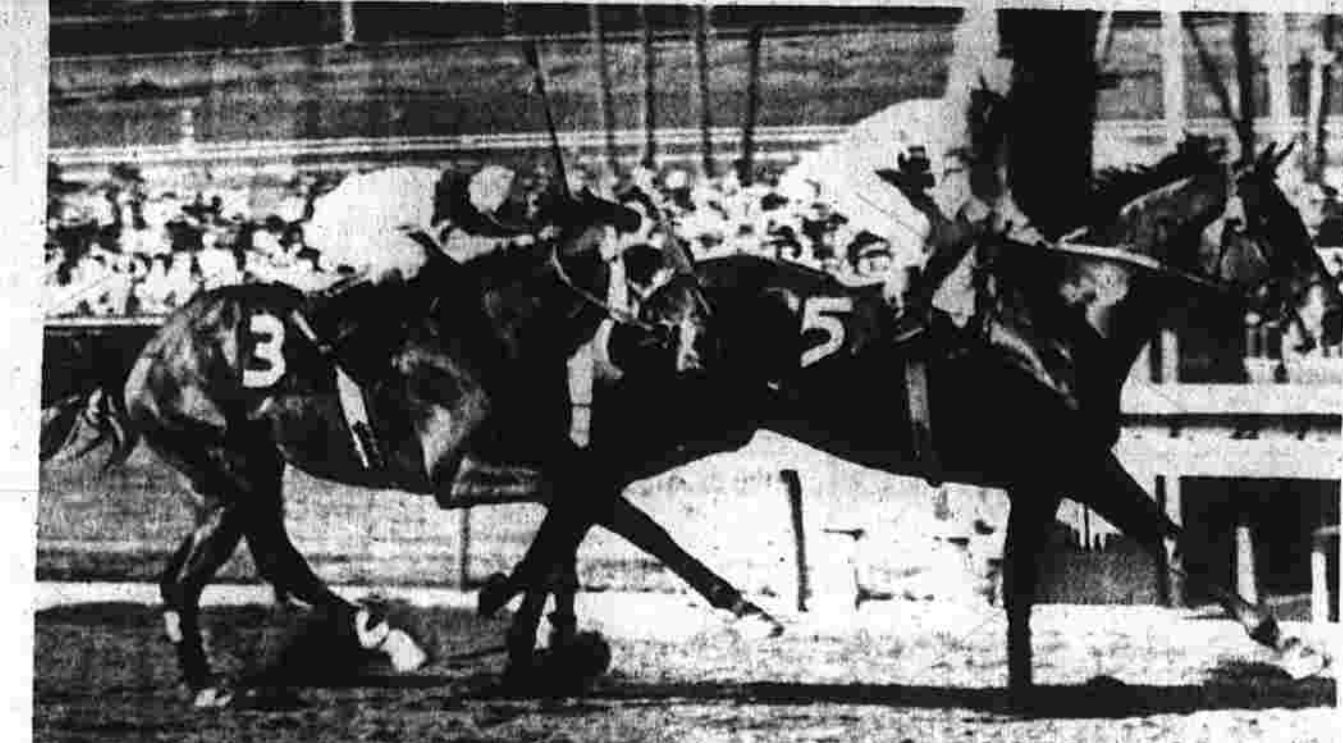
