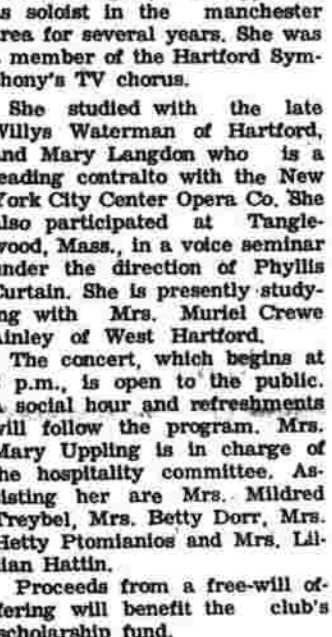

**Animals Rarely Infect Humans**  
**We're Our Own Worst Enemy**

Dear Dr. Lamb—We all read your column and find it very helpful. I would appreciate your view on the following: We have small cats and three dogs that are in the house day and night. I would like to know if so many animals are injurious to one's health. My eyes trouble me and I think it is the animals. Some say it is not. What is your opinion?

Now, it is also true that a person can be allergic to some animals which, unfortunately, can include the family pet. It also can include animal materials (hair or feathers, for example) used to make pillows, rugs, mattresses and other common household items. In your case, if what you mean by your eyes troubling you is an allergic problem, I think it would be wise to see an allergist and find out for certain if you are allergic to dogs and cats before you go through the headache of giving up your pets.

Incidentally, doctors as a group are not the most healthy segment of our population. This isn't too surprising. A good many of them, like other middle-class Americans, eat entirely too much of the wrong foods. Their profession, as such, does not permit them to enjoy a lot of physical activity and their daily practice involves long, hard hours, many of which are often stressful. Most doctors take care of their patients, but they do themselves, choosing to ignore the diet. One thing is regular checkups and I might add that doctors aren't always too good about this in referring to their own families. Many a doctor's wife has complained to me that she needed to make an appointment at the office to find out what her own medical status was.

On Baby-Sitting A Rolls The automobile is the only machine with which I have never been able to cope. I had trouble starting my first car, a 1933 Plymouth roadster, until someone suggested I might try gasoline. A few years ago, I acquired around seven British Humbers, faded ladies of uncertain vintage but of royal inclinations — red leather seats, but without dashboard, sea trays in the back seat. The first committed suicide in my driveway (a wheel fell off, the result of driving it 50 miles with a shattered bearing). The second was a suicide too; her fan blade flew off and imbedded itself in the radiator.

# Striking Ball Players, Club Owners Remain at Odds on Baseball Front

NEW YORK (AP)—Any chance that the baseball season could open as scheduled Wednesday seemed gone today as more charges and accusations flew back and forth between striking players and club owners following the owners' rejection of a proposed settlement by the players' association.

Meanwhile, the heads of the 24 major league teams scheduled a strategy session in Chicago tonight. But even if the pension dispute were settled, it was unlikely that Wednesday's traditional Cincinnati opener between the Reds and Houston Astros could be played.

Sixteen other teams are slated to open Thursday, the rest on Friday, and the Minnesota Twins. "We're staying on our original offer," the owners rejected Monday night a proposal by the Major League Baseball Players Association, whose members have been on strike since Saturday, to fund the proposed 17 percent increase in retirement benefits mostly from increased interest which the pension plan is earning.

The plan is designed to earn 12 percent annually from its investments but in recent years the rate has gone up to 18 1/2 percent, figuring out to an overall average of 6 per cent.

### Research: The key to plentiful, clean electric power.

Controlled Thermonuclear Fusion - Unlike nuclear power reactors in use today - which split the atom - fusion plants would create energy by combining atoms at tremendously high temperatures. If scientists learn how to control the process of fusion it could mean a new and practically unlimited source of electric power. For example, enough electricity to heat and light a home for a year could be produced by an electric company fusion plant from the energy in a pitcher of water.

### Major Northeast Utilities Research Projects

Summarized briefly, here are some of the most important projects we are involved with at this time:  
The Fuel Cell - This is probably best known as the power system aboard the Apollo spacecraft. By taking oxygen and hydrogen and putting them through a catalyst, an electric current is produced. Compact, quiet and non-polluting, fuel cells are needed during peak demand hours at shopping centers or industrial parks, reducing requirements for new transmission lines. We have joined a group of companies working with Pratt & Whitney Aircraft in exploring potential applications.  
Underground Transmission Lines - With our present technology, the cost of putting high-voltage transmission lines underground can be many, many times greater than building them overhead. Hoping to reduce this cost, we have directed our biggest single research investment toward the study of a new system in which high-voltage lines would be enclosed in a conduit, insulated with compressed gas - and buried underground, below water, or mounted on low, ground-hugging supports.  
Magneto-hydrodynamic (MHD) Electric Generation - This system, with the forbidding name, eliminates the conventional rotating generator and produces electricity directly from a stream of hot, electrically conducting gases passed through a magnetic field.  
Nuclear Breeder Reactors - Reactors of this type, in producing electricity from uranium, actually create, or breed, more fuel than they use by converting uranium isotopes into fissionable fuels. The widespread use of "fast breeders" could extend the life of known uranium reserves from mere decades to perhaps thousands of years.  
Fusion - The exploring three promising types of breeder reactors: Liquid Metal, Gas Cooled, and Molten Salt. It is the goal of government and industry to have a breeder reactor in commercial operation sometime in the 1980s.

### High-Energy Electric Storage Batteries


Our companies are sponsoring promising research into storage batteries of a new type through one independent project, and through a second, group effort. If research is successful, batteries that are noiseless, economical and pollution-free might be located in substations near centers of high electric demand, to store energy at night (when charging power from base load units is available) for use in peak periods during peak demand hours.

### Environmental Studies

In 1972 we will continue to spend a substantial portion of our research budget on projects dealing with environmental sciences. These projects range from studies of the effects of warm water on marine life to radiological surveys. They help us design our generating plants to minimize environmental impact.  
A Vision For The Future  
Last summer, the Northeast Utilities system made a proposal which has been receiving serious study both within and outside the electrical industry. Called "A Project For Prometheus," the proposal envisions a long-range electric industry research and development effort aimed at delivering abundant, cheap, virtually pollution-free energy from a system that would be essentially waste-free. The program would require an investment of \$4 billion which would cost a estimated \$40 billion and span 30 years, would be funded principally by the electric industry.

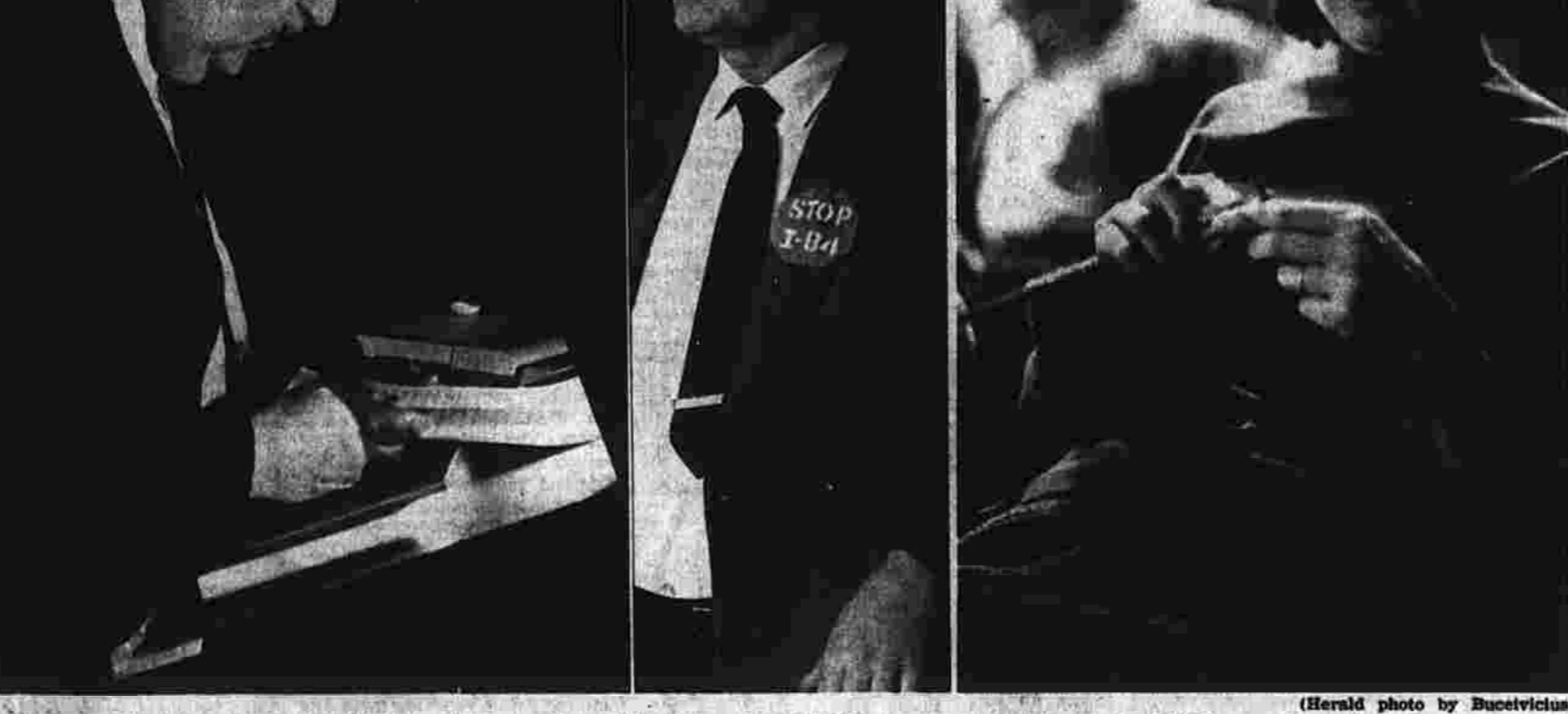
