Explosions, Fire Rip South Windsor Plant

A fire, believed to have started in a paint spraying area, swept through the central portion of the Industronics Inc. plant at 48 Sullivan Ave. in South Windsor yesterday afternoon.

The blaze, fed by chemicals and paint supplies, touched off a series of explosions of oxygen, acetylene, and gas tanks in the building, and left the center of the building gutted.

Remarkably, no injuries were reported among either employees or the firemen from the four fire departments called in to battle the flames.

At 11:45, Industronics president, and William Lanning, South Windsor fire marshal, say they expect the damage to the building, equipment and supplies to run well over \$300,000.

The company records indicate it under control in a little over an hour.

One employee narrowly escaped serious injury when flames barred his exit from the building. The man was able to run through the flames. His pants caught on fire, but he quickly snuffed the flames.

Lanning and Philip Cromble, South Windsor fire chief, reported that when firemen arrived, the building was in flames. There was some delay in approaching the building because of the explosions.

"It was all blowing up," Lanning said. Cromble said shrugging from the exploding tanks was flying through the roof during the early stages of the fire.

The explosion, a unique piece of South Windsor equipment which works much like a "cherry picker," was raised over the roof of the building to pour water on the flames.

Employees of the firm were unwilling to talk about the fire until the building was ordered. Insurance investigators arrived shortly after the blaze was brought under control.

One woman, a secretary, said, "I was taking dictation when somebody said, 'everybody out of the building — fire' and I just grabbed my pocketbook and ran."

Cafyn said the building was "amply covered by insurance."

He said yesterday that the warehouse to the rear of the building, the area least damaged by the fire, would be converted to a production area and the firm would resume operations immediately. Plans are also being made, Cafyn said, to rent trailers and other space for office quarters for about a month while the company has the area rebuilt.

The office area was heavily damaged by smoke, but Cafyn said "our records are intact."

He predicted no delays in filling orders to his customers.

Firemen remained at the scene until they were certain the fire was "dead out," according to Lanning. South Windsor policemen were stationed at the building overnight to guard against looting.

Investigation of the cause of the blaze was continuing today, according to Lanning.

Apollo Nearing Landing

SPACE CENTER, Houston (AP) — The Apollo 16 astronaut, their spacecraft turned up and running soundly, swept into the grasp of lunar gravity early today and sped on toward an afternoon orbit of the moon.

The problems of making paint, a locked guidance system, a stuck antenna, a faulty radio antenna were behind them as John W. Young, Charles M. Duke Jr. and Thomas K. Mattingly II neared their lunar landing.

They slipped through a so-called "twilight zone" in which the gravitational influence of the earth and moon is equal at 12,07 a.m. EST.

When Apollo 16 crossed this invisible line, the moon won the gravitational tug-of-war and the spacecraft looped behind the moon and after slowing from 24,800 to 1,600 miles an hour on the long outward journey from the earth.

The speed was to increase to about 5,760 m.p.h. as the astronauts loop behind the moon and of radio contact with earth, they were to fire the engine of the command ship Casper to whip into lunar orbit.

After a day of checkout, Young and Duke are to board the lunar ship Orion on Thursday and at 3:41 p.m. guide it to a landing on a mountain-ringed plateau in the moon's southern highlands.

The touchdown point is near the crater Descartes in the highest topographical area on the moon's surface, and is 15 miles from the lunar surface.

Young and Duke will be the first and last humans to explore the lunar surface.

They are to spend a record 72 hours in a scientific quest for evidence that volcanoes long ago seethed deep within the moon's interior.

During the seven-hour surface excursions they will drive a moon buggy a total of about 15 miles in search for volcanic evidence that would prove the moon had a hot interior like earth's.

The three explorations, parts of which will be telecast live on Thursday's entry to the moon, are to start Thursday at 7:15 p.m. Friday at 2:14 p.m. and Saturday at 5:15 p.m. Liftoff from the moon is scheduled for 4:28 p.m. Sunday after which the astronaut will spend two extra days in orbit to conduct experiments.

The 28-day mission is to end with splashdown in the Pacific April 22.

Young and Duke staged a dress rehearsal Tuesday night for Thursday's entry to the lunar module. They donned their moon-walking suits and attempted to land on a lunar module on the command ship Orion.

During the practice, Duke reported a little trouble fitting his 6-foot frame into his bulky space suit.

Young, acting as Duke's valiant, had trouble with a zipper.

"John had a difficult time getting the zipper closed," said Duke. "He slipped it up the zipper."

War Protests Erupt

Police Battle Students

Campus antiwar protests rekindled by the U.S. bombing of North Vietnam have erupted into violence at Harvard and led to scattered confrontations with police at the University of Maryland.

Demonstrations elsewhere Tuesday were generally peaceful and some drew little response but the reawakening antiwar movement called for student strikes on Friday.

At Harvard about 30 demonstrators split off from a peace march in Cambridge, Mass., to stage a 10-minute assault on the university's prestigious Center for International Affairs.

Police fired at least 15 rounds of tear gas over a two-hour period to disperse a crowd of 1,500 to 2,000 demonstrators who gathered outside the building.

Three persons were arrested.

The center, where presidential adviser Henry A. Kissinger formerly had an office, was littered with broken glass and overturned furniture. Slogans such as "Avenge Hanoi" and "NLP Wins" were sprayed on the walls.

A fire set with papers was confined to a second floor office.

The march began with a 4 p.m. rally on Boston Common where President Nixon was burned in effigy. Later the demonstrators marched five miles to Harvard Square in Cambridge where they broke windows in a few stores and a post office before going to the center.

Following demonstrations at the University of Maryland resulted in the arrest of 14 persons on charges of assault and carrying deadly weapons.

Windows were broken in a ROTC building during a rally and later about 500 students blocked U.S. Route 1 for an hour. About 100 riot-equipped state policemen used tear gas and clubs to break up the demonstration.

Police said one lieutenant suffered a broken elbow and several other officers received minor injuries in the clash. Two students were reported injured. There were scattered skirmishes into the evening.

No-Fault Bill Wins Approval

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP) — The no-fault auto insurance bill is on its way to Gov. Thomas J. Meskill after surviving attempts to tack on several amendments and finally winning overwhelming approval by both the Senate and the House.

Meskill has said he will sign the bill.

After hours of debate in the Senate and the House, the votes Tuesday turned out to be lopsided in favor of the bill. In the Senate the vote was 23-6, while the House vote was 125-24.

The bill, an amended, makes no-fault auto insurance mandatory in Connecticut. It guarantees that owners and occupants of their cars would receive up to \$5,000 from their own insurance companies within 15 days for medical costs and wage losses resulting from driving accidents.

Car damage and other property damage would not be covered.

Two new amendments were added to increase the mandatory cut in the cost of no-fault coverage from 7 to 10 per cent, and would limit the power of the insurance commissioner to give prior approval of premium changes only for no-fault auto insurance.

The entire bill appeared to be in serious trouble at one point when the House was debating the 10 per cent rate cut. But the Senate amendment was adopted on a close roll call vote of 77-7. If it had been defeated, the bill would have had to go to a conference committee and its fate would have been highly questionable.

The House had amended the bill six times before passing it initially last week. The Senate added the two other amendments.

Sen. Jay W. Jackson, a West Hartford Democrat, who co-chaired a special commission that drew up the no-fault plan.

So Sayeth Spiro.... Candidates Find 'Little Guy'

Vice President Spiro T. Agnew says Democratic presidential candidates have "discovered the little guy" and launched populist campaigns under pressure from Gov. George C. Wallace, but President Nixon is the real "new populist" of the 1972 campaign.

In a speech given at a Republican dinner in Tulsa, Okla., Agnew said Nixon's programs have demonstrated his populism, "and if the Democratic presidential candidates would get back to Washington for a few days and help us get some of these programs passed, their lot would improve immeasurably overnight."

The term "little guy," he added, is insulting and implies the need for a "big-brother" federal government.

Meanwhile, Sen. Edmund S. Muskie told about 1,200 people at a Democratic fund-raising dinner in New Castle, Pa., that eight giant corporations in the country paid no federal income taxes in one of the last two years.

"We seek to reform an economic system which pads the profits of huge corporations while millions of Americans suffer the pains of unemployment and inflation," the Maine senator said.

Muskie said the eight firms he referred to were Westvaco Paper Co., U.S. Steel Corp., Alcoa, Standard Oil of Ohio, Allied Chemical, Republic Steel, National Steel and Bethlehem Steel Corp.

U.S. Steel denied similar charges last month, saying it paid \$27.8 million in U.S. and foreign income taxes for its large U.S. refund—reportedly \$7.8 million—resulted from "extraordinary costs incurred in making investment tax credits and trim other tax measures

favoring industry. He charged that Nixon "overs too much to corporate America, which finances his election and forms the backbone of the Republican party."

Sen. George McGovern, campaigning in Massachusetts, told Muskie the commission the oil-import quota "takes \$800 million from New England home-

planned to fly from Pennsylvania to Massachusetts. The two senators are considered the major contenders in the Massachusetts contest next Tuesday, and McGovern admits the Pennsylvania race the same day is likely to go to either Muskie or Sen. Hubert H. Humphrey.

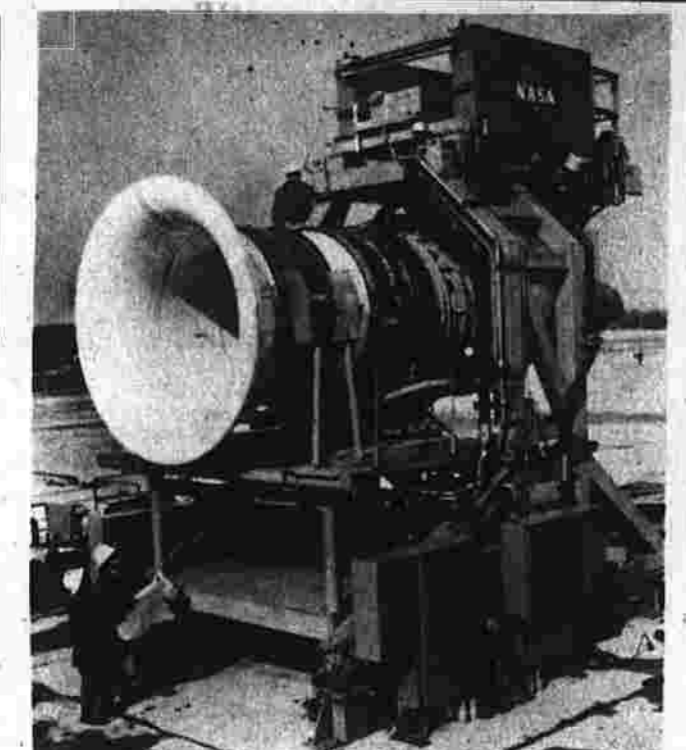

Stamps in the News

Israel will again mark its independence day with a series of four stamps depicting famous gates of the old city of Jerusalem.

Similar in concept to last year's set of four, the new stamps feature the four historic gates, according to the Israel Philatelic Agency in America.

The Lion's Gate stands alone in the city's eastern ramparts. It is also known as St. Stephen's Gate as it leads directly to the most significant street in Christianity, the Via Dolorosa. The portal also has been called the Jewish Gate, while the Crusaders termed it the Gate of Jehoshaphat.

The Golden Gate is sometimes referred to as the "Gate of Mercy." Standing at the site of the eastern wall of the Temple itself, Jewish tradition holds that through this gate the Messiah will re-enter the Temple.

The Zion Gate has been labeled "The Gate of the Prophet David." It is in the city's middle wall and was severely damaged in battles during 1948 and 1949.

The Dung Gate has several other names including the Gate of the Westerners, the Gate of the Moors and the Gate of the Lion.

All Israel stamps, such as this new set, may be purchased at your local stamp dealer.

Those who specialize in specific subjects on stamps will be interested in a new booklet on "Stamps on Stamps" by the American Topical Association.

The book notes there are some 11,000 stamps on stamps, and the world identifies more than 600 by name, date built and their covers.

Yankee Missile Still Has Punch

JACKSON, Miss. (AP) — Police have warned Jackson residents that a stolen 200-pound cannonball, made in 1863 in the North, is still capable of creating heavy damage and of killing persons.

The "live fuse" cannonball, filled with black powder, was stolen from its resting spot outside the home of C.O. Drummond of Jackson, police said. Drummond noticed it was missing Saturday.

Drummond said Sunday he had tried to get bomb experts to defuse it, but they had declined because they were not sure of how to disarm such a large explosive device safely.

Drummond said it was one of two cannonballs found on his property in Vicksburg in 1957, during construction of an addition to his home at the time. He said he gave one cannonball to a neighbor, a World War II veteran who said it was capable of blowing up a battleship.

Book Review

THE WIND FROM THE SUN. By Arthur C. Clarke. Harcourt, Brace, Jovanovich, Inc. \$5.95.

This fascinating collection of short stories is a fine example of why Arthur C. Clarke rates high among writers of science fiction.

He wrote these stories in the 1960s, an era of many scientific accomplishments that revealed some truth in what was the fantasy of science fiction.

Edel would have done well to avoid the practice of so many current biographers who follow modern psychology too zealously, reading homosexual thoughts into personalities who were not in fact deviates.

The author packs these little stories with thrilling details—explorations of the universe, young and promising men, but also was devoted to young women; for instance, his niece, Peggy, the daughter of his philosopher brother William James.

Another thriller is "The Cruel Sky." A scientist and his young assistant find a new way to get to the top of Mt. Everest, in a kind of Bible Study Course.

When the two are trapped by a mountain storm, the doctor recalls notes and it seems that he might never live to lecture on his theory.

Clarke also has a sense of humor. In "The Food of the Gods," a scientist becomes ill during a diastolic discussion of the cannibalistic appetites of early human beings.

The big paper doll is Steven Randall, a public relations man with problems. Problem one: Randall's wife wants a divorce.

Problem two: Randall's father is dying. Problem three: His tycoon father wants to add Randall's PR firm to his conglomerate.

Problem four: Some nut keeps phoning about a new Bible.

And so The Good Book gets mixed up in one that's not so good.

When Randall takes on the job of publishing the new Bible, he finds out what problems really are.

New problem one: a radical religious leader, Martin de Vroom, is bent on sabotaging the international, top-secret Bible publishing project.

New problem two: George L. Wheeler, mastermind of the project (which all call "Reunited"), is in a sticky situation when faced with certain crucial questions about the paper.

New problem three: Angela Monti, daughter of the elusive archaeologist who unearthed the lost gospel, new addition to Randall's bed (and bath) is a liar and a traitor.

New problem four... but a reviewer must give away the plot.

Irving Wallace is surely the jewel in the crown of the contemporary quasi-literary scene. This book's back jacket parades the titles of Wallace's eight novels and his seven nonfiction books.

When he wrote non-fiction, Wallace's sentences were like cunningly-constructed, well-oiled little aphorisms. But when he turned to fiction, people plunk, plots crack and words clink on the inner ear like counterfeit coins.

The late H. L. Mencken, whose tastes ran to the more direct and earthy, once called James "that delicate tuberose." Edel's long and patient study shows the superficiality of such a judgment. Once you have become used to James'
