Stock Market

NEW YORK (AP) — Stock market prices clung to a modest gain and were drifting today. The Dow Jones average of 30 industrial stocks was up 3.36 at 889.77, virtually the same as a half-hour earlier. Advances led declines on the New York Stock Exchange by 4.

Trading was dull. Brokers said investors had pulled off to the sidelines in the absence of any major news developments. Uncertainties over Vietnam and inflation were restraining buying interest, while higher first-quarter earnings reports were keeping the lid on selling.

Motor, mail order-retail, air-craft, metals, chemicals, and oil were lower, and steel, rubber, iron, utilities, and railroads were mixed. The Associated Press 60-stock average at noon was up 1.8 at 842.6.

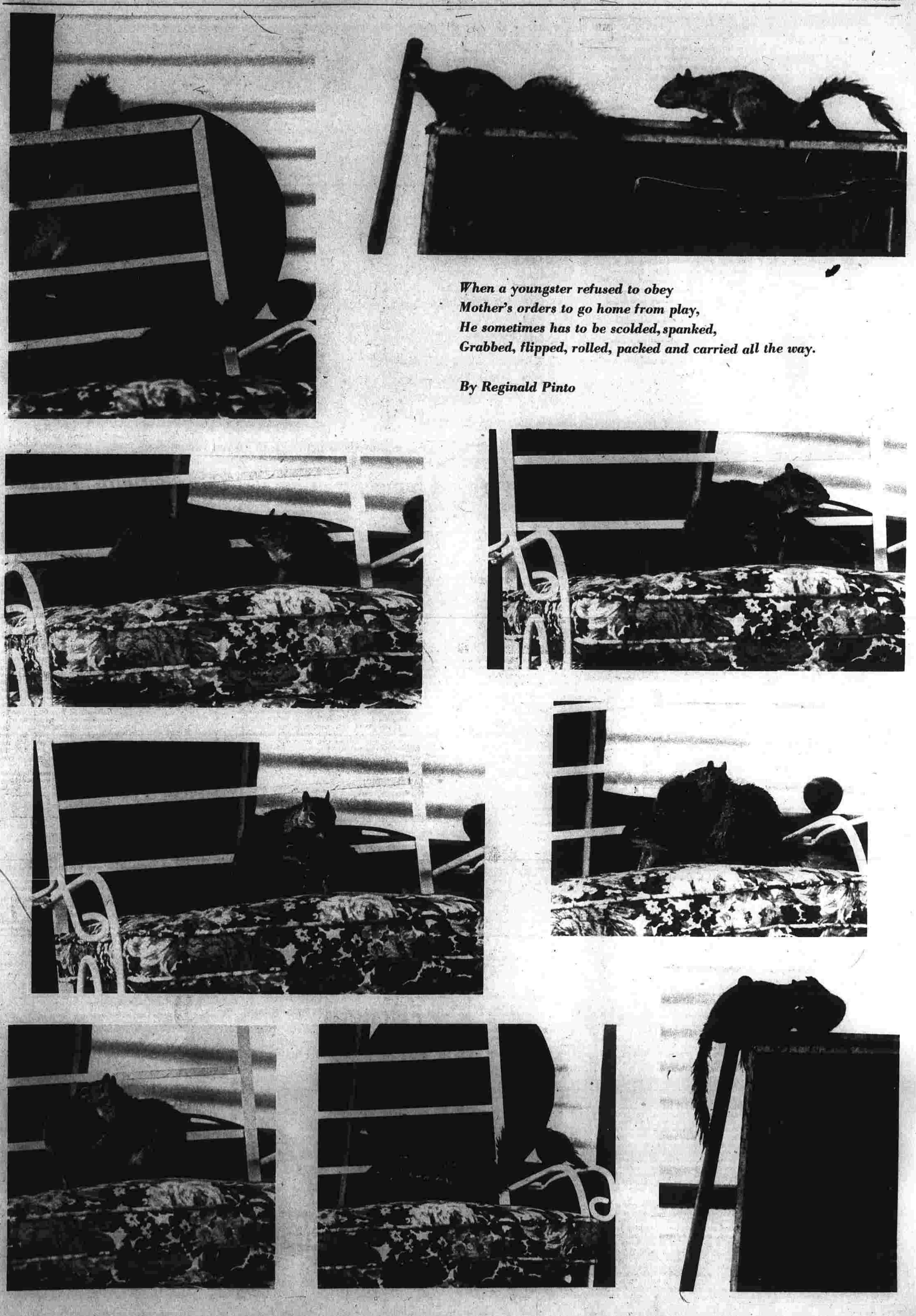

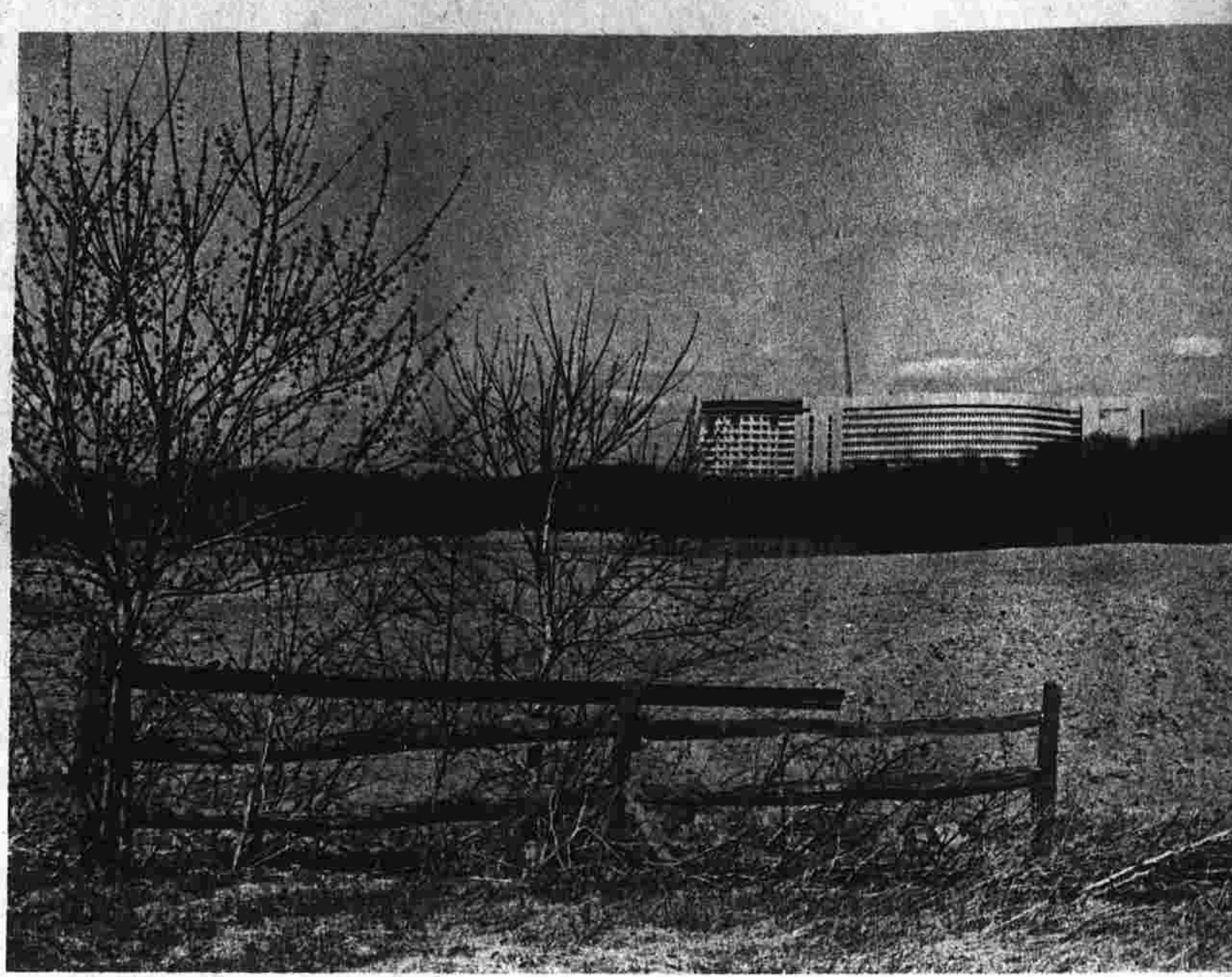

WASHINGTON (NEA) — McGovern's chances for winning the nomination of his party for the White House are good, according to a poll of 500 voters in 14 states.

Most recent canvases of the 50 states shows McGovern with a presently indicated delegate potential of 400 1/2 votes. That includes delegates he already has locked up, and many others which informed agencies say he is reasonably sure of, at a minimum.

One demonstrated gain from an Oregon triumph is its effect on a candidate's chances in the huge California primary shortly after that.

McGovern already is a rising prospect in that state. If he were to reach that big one on a fairly good winning tide, he might take it. The prize is immense: 271 votes to the winner on a take-all basis.

Again, let's say he does it. April 29 primary in favor of the New York primary with 278 votes at stake, all but 10 per cent in 29 separate congressional districts.

McGovern would speak to a total of at least six, embracing a great delegate haul and climactic near convention time in massive California and New York. Just might be enough to bowl over all opposition.
