## Primaries Cut To Dual Races

WASHINGTON (AP)—With Edmund S. Muskie retired from active campaigning George McGovern has picked up more endorsements for the Democratic presidential race that appears to have narrowed to a battle with Hubert H. Humphrey.

After Muskie won the primaries race Thursday, Sen. Fred Harris, himself a former candidate for the nomination, cast his lot with McGovern. Harris previously had been uncommitted.

Cliff Larson, Democratic chairman in Iowa and a backer of Muskie, announced he was switching support to McGovern.

Support of organized labor and the Democratic party leadership, despite the urging of some of his backers. He told The Washington Post in an interview: "I think I've got the skill and the common sense to quiet the fears of those people and bring them on board at some point."

"As we move along and time permits, I'll be calling on the party leaders in many states," McGovern said. "I think that's the best way I can answer their anxiety about whether I want to work with them."

Muskie and Humphrey have been sharing organized labor's support. Muskie has had a number of endorsements from state Democratic organizations. "Some of the more rigid purists in my camp don't even want me to talk to those people," McGovern said. "But... they've got to understand that I am a politician, and if I'm going to be the leader of this country, I've got to have communications with all segments of the country."

Before Muskie withdrew from the primaries Thursday, it appeared he, Humphrey and McGovern, meanwhile, said he plans to actively seek the

## Revamp In Final Struggle

HARTFORD (AP)—The old-fashioned, across-the-table bargaining between the Democratic and Republican state chairmen that was revived in a last-ditch effort to revamp Connecticut's six congressional districts may founder on the same old reef—the Bridgeport question.

GOP State Chairman J. Brian Gaffney is insisting that all or part of Bridgeport has to go from the Fourth District now represented by Republican Congressman Stewart B. McKinney of Fairfield.

It seems to be the intent of the GOP to give McKinney a safe district in which he will be able to survive the implications of future presidential and gubernatorial elections. With Bridgeport's large numbers of Democratic voters, the Park City represents a biennial threat to McKinney's congressional career.

The GOP has always regarded the Fourth District as its own, just as the Democrats have always regarded the First District (the Hartford area) as their own.

Extraordinary circumstances, such as the Eisenhower presidential landslide of 1956 (which elected a Republican, Edwin H. May, in the First District) and the Ribicoff gubernatorial landslide and the Johnson presidential landslide of 1964 (which elected Democrat Donald J. Rwin in the Fourth District) did not weaken the parties' feelings about those two districts.

The Democrats still have the First District, notwithstanding the usually close contest in 1970. And the GOP wants equal security in the Fourth District.

Democratic State Chairman John M. Bailey (the wise old fox from Hartford confronted by the burly, young New Britain brawler, Gaffney) is sounding out Bridgeport Democratic leaders one more time on the idea of bisecting the Park City between two congressional districts or amputating it entirely from the Fourth for transplant into another district. If state Senate Majority Leader J. Edward Caldwell, former Democratic Town Chairman of Bridgeport, is adamantly opposed to both kinds of surgery, then the legislative attempt to revamp the congressional districts may abort.

What the federal courts might do if the party chairmen, the governor and the General Assembly can't solve the problem, is a question in the minds of all participants in the negotiations. If precise mathematical equality is the only standard of the court, then Bridgeport might well be excised from the Fourth District. Or Bridgeport could wind up subdivided into not just two, but three congressional districts.

The court could run roughshod over any number of town and city boundaries. The court's plan might look like the dimpled monstrosity which the Democrats, for the sake of ap-

## Control of Outflow Frees ADM Cutback

HARTFORD (AP)—Gov. Thomas J. Meskill announced "good news for Connecticut cities and towns" Thursday in the form of \$5 million worth of state grants which he had previously cut.

"We are able to increase payments to the cities because we have been successful in controlling spending," Meskill said at a news conference. Also, state tax revenues are surpassing expectations, he added.

The restored allotments are in three grant programs—the Average Daily Membership (ADM) grants for public education, grants for special education, and a property tax relief grant based on the ADM formula.

In sum, the municipalities will be receiving \$47.5 million in the April quarterly payments in these three programs, instead of the \$42.5 million they received in January, Meskill said.

## Allies Reeling Under Red Tanks

SAIGON (AP)—Troops of four North Vietnamese divisions spearheaded by large columns of tanks smashed through South Vietnam's northernmost defense line today and sent assaults in the opening days of government forces reeling toward Quang Tri.

Dong Ha, eastern anchor of the defense line, was overrun in the eight-mile enemy advance. That is the distance between Dong Ha and Quang Tri, first major objective of the northern offensive. The enemy is now at its outskirts.

Two bases southwest of Quang Tri were abandoned under heavy North Vietnamese shell fire, amounting to 10,000 rounds in the past two days of the renewed enemy offensive.

The United States threw the bulk of its air and naval power into the battle in efforts to avert the fall of Quang Tri, 19 miles below the demilitarized zone.

AP correspondent Holger Jensen reported from Hue that U.S. planes and helicopter gunships bombed and rocketed North Vietnamese tanks on two sides of Quang Tri.

At least 11 tanks were reported knocked out and two U.S. aircraft were lost. In a dramatic air to ground battle with the tanks, two crewmen of a rocket-firing Cobra gunship died after knocking out three tanks.

About 150 air strikes were reported around Quang Tri. U.S. 7th Fleet destroyers poured 10,000 rounds of gunfire into the Dong Ha area alone, after South Vietnamese troops fell back.

The retreating South Vietnamese troops blew up a bridge on Highway 1 halfway between Dong Ha and Quang Tri in hopes of slowing the North Vietnamese advance.

The U.S. Commanders said seven 7th Fleet destroyers were attacked by shore batteries but none was damaged.

Brig. Gen. Thomas W. Bowen, senior U.S. adviser to the South Vietnamese, told Jensen that Quang Tri threatened by the equivalent of four North Vietnamese divisions, about 40,000 men, who outnumber government forces 3 to 1.

He said large enemy units were north and west of the provincial capital but smaller elements of up to 100 men were all around it.

Some U.S. and South Vietnamese officials have said that capture of Quang Tri is possibly a part of a grandiose plan to annex South Vietnam's two northernmost provinces of Quang Tri and Thua Thien, which includes Hue. The old imperial capital, Hue is 30 miles south of Quang Tri.

"The enemy's objective is to capture Hue," Bowen declared. "He's got people west of Hue and they're coming down from the north."

Most of the tanks have been sighted north of Quang Tri but several amphibious tanks were spotted in the rolling sand dunes southeast of the provincial capital.

The Quang Tri combat base 2 1/2 miles northwest of Quang Tri, came under heavy shelling for the second consecutive day as did Fire Base Anne and Pedro 8 and 10 miles southwest of Quang Tri.

The latter two were abandoned and the defenders pulled back to other undisclosed positions because of the heavy shell fire. Pedro 8 withstood several assaults in the opening days of the offensive.

Quang Tri itself was being subjected to sporadic shell fire. Enemy gunners also set up anti-aircraft machine-gun sites on either side of Highway 1 south of Quang Tri and all around it.

## Trio from Moon Off Hula Land

ABOARD USS TICONDEROGA (AP)—Apollo 16's moon heroes steamed toward Hawaii today after completing man's fifth moon-landing expedition, a journey that Commander John W. Young said pushed back "the last real frontier, the frontier of the unknown."

Young and fellow crewmen Charles M. Duke Jr. and Thomas K. Mattingly II, were deposited on the deck of this carrier Thursday after a pinpoint splashdown in the South Pacific.

During welcoming ceremonies, Young said the mission was one of discovery that had uncovered basic knowledge. Pushing back "the frontier of the unknown," he said, is "essential to the survival of humanity on this planet."

President Nixon telephoned congratulations, promoting Duke to the rank of Air Force colonel and Mattingly to commander in the Navy. Young, a Navy captain, was promoted after one of his three earlier space missions.

All three were in excellent health after their 11-day journey. The landing was 1,500 miles south of Hawaii, and the astronauts will stay aboard until the Ticonderoga moves early Saturday to within plane range of Hawaii.

They'll fly into Hickam Air Force Base at 2 p.m. EST and transfer to a C-141 jet transport for the 8 1/2-hour flight to Ellington Air Force Base near the Manned Spacecraft Center in Houston. They are to arrive at Ellington at 11 p.m. Saturday.

Scientists and geologists at the center's Lunar Receiving Laboratory eagerly await the 245 pounds of rock and soil samples gathered by Young in the moon's Descent Staircase. "Rarely, if ever, has so much information been made available in such a brief period," the statement continues. "As the work of evaluation goes forward, the impact of Apollo 16 will be felt for many years to come."

For their first meal back on earth, the astronauts had flit mignon, souffled spinach and stuffed potatoes.

## Blaze Destroys 150 Pigs, Ruins Two Farm Buildings

A fire yesterday afternoon leveled two structures, substantially damaged a third, and destroyed about 150 pigs trapped inside at the pig farm of Anthony Botticello, 595 Hillstown Rd.

The call was received at Town Fire Headquarters at about 2:30 p.m. One of Botticello's sons had discovered the fire and had run to the farmhouse where Botticello's wife called the fire department.

When firemen arrived, the buildings were engulfed in flames. A 2-2-2 call was sent out whereby all available off-duty firemen are called in. There were some 25 firemen at the scene and others manned fire stations for other fires which might have occurred. Normally only 12 men are on duty at a

time, according to Deputy Fire Chief Raymond Thompson. Another minor grass fire was, in fact, called in at 3:23 p.m. at 802 Hackmatack St. The backup crews quickly extinguished that.

The Botticello fire was brought under control in about an hour, according to Thompson.

Firemen began a shuttle operation shortly after they arrived with three pumper trucks. The three trucks brought with them 1,750 gallons of water. Two 500-gallon pumps were run back and forth to a hydrant in East Hartford for refills.

There was no water source nearby. The three structures were set back a considerable distance from Hillstown Rd. at the end of a narrow dirt road. In the later stages of fighting the fire, there were some delays

in getting water on what flames remained because firemen had to wait for water to be trucked in.

East Hartford, which had been notified that the hydrant was being used, sent a truck to the area, but it did not go to the site of the fire.

Firemen stayed at the scene until about 7:40 p.m. to guard against any flareup of the smoldering ruins.

There was no immediate estimate of damage nor any cause determined, Thompson says the fire is still under investigation. One of the structures, totally destroyed was a sawdust bin, roughly 15 by 21 feet, according to Thompson. Another building, where most of the pigs were, was about 100 by 25 feet. The third building was roughly 50 by 30 feet.

Chocolate Helps This Reader Sleep

By Lawrence Lamb, M.D. Dear Dr. Lamb—I am 70 years old and suffer severely from insomnia, sometimes only getting three hours of sleep a night, and that is broken sleep. But if I eat four to six ounces of chocolate candy before going to bed I can get five to six hours of uninterrupted sleep. I go out like a light, more so than if I took a sleeping medication. I have repeatedly seen and read references in articles that sugar is harmful to the heart, brain, liver, and one health magazine that even said that it has such a severe effect on the brain that it can make a person insane or criminal. What should be the normal intake of sugar for a day?

Dear Reader—Your chocolate candy is probably the safest sleeping pill that I have ever heard of. It is too good it wouldn't work for everybody. No doubt you were awed.

Now, don't worry about the sugar story. It is true that if you eat too much sugar in the form of desserts, in beverages or any other way it can increase your calories and lead to excess fat deposits. This, like obesity from all other types of excess eating, can lead to heart disease and a number of other disorders. The key is to watch their calories and are better off eating calories from all other types of essential vitamins and nutrients not found in refined sweets like sugar. Obviously, sugars

and sweets should not be taken to the exclusion of other needed items in the diet. Of course, individuals with certain medical disorders (diabetes, for example) need to control the amount of sugar they eat, and it is true that there are rare individuals who cannot handle ordinary sugar because they can't absorb it from the intestine. These rare individuals have an absent enzyme in the digestive tract. There have been a few scare reports recently on sugar, completely exaggerating the danger of it. Sugar exists in most fruits and vegetables and of course sugar beets and sugar cane. Almost all foods (including alcohol and fats) are processed to glucose (the refined sugar) by the body before they can be used for energy or cell functions. The idea that sugar causes insanity is pure hogwash.

Some people are attempting to link sugar intake to heart disease have not won general acceptance by reputable scientists. I don't think your liking for chocolate at bedtime is going to cause you to be insane or criminal unless you eat it in excess. If you are a diabetic, you should see your doctor. (NEWSPAPER EDITORS ASSN.)

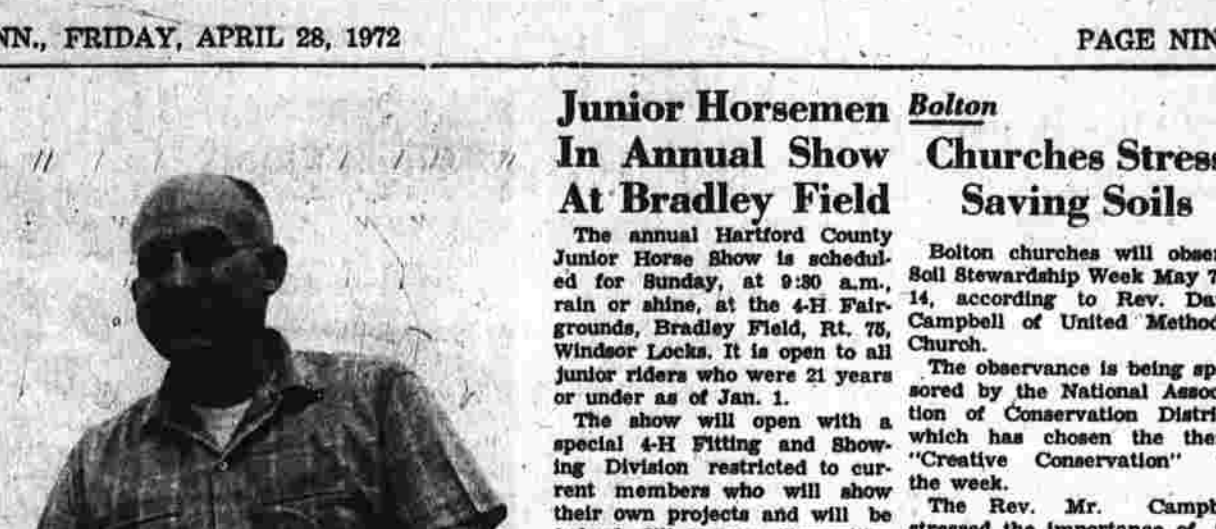

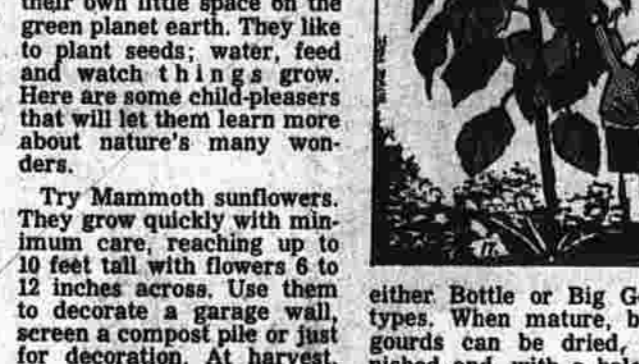

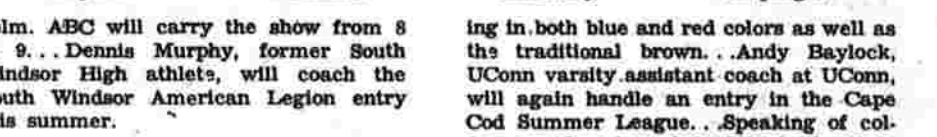

Arid Skies in the Midwest Withering of the Wheat ALBANY, Okla. Law Challenged HARTFORD (AP) — Gov. Thomas J.
