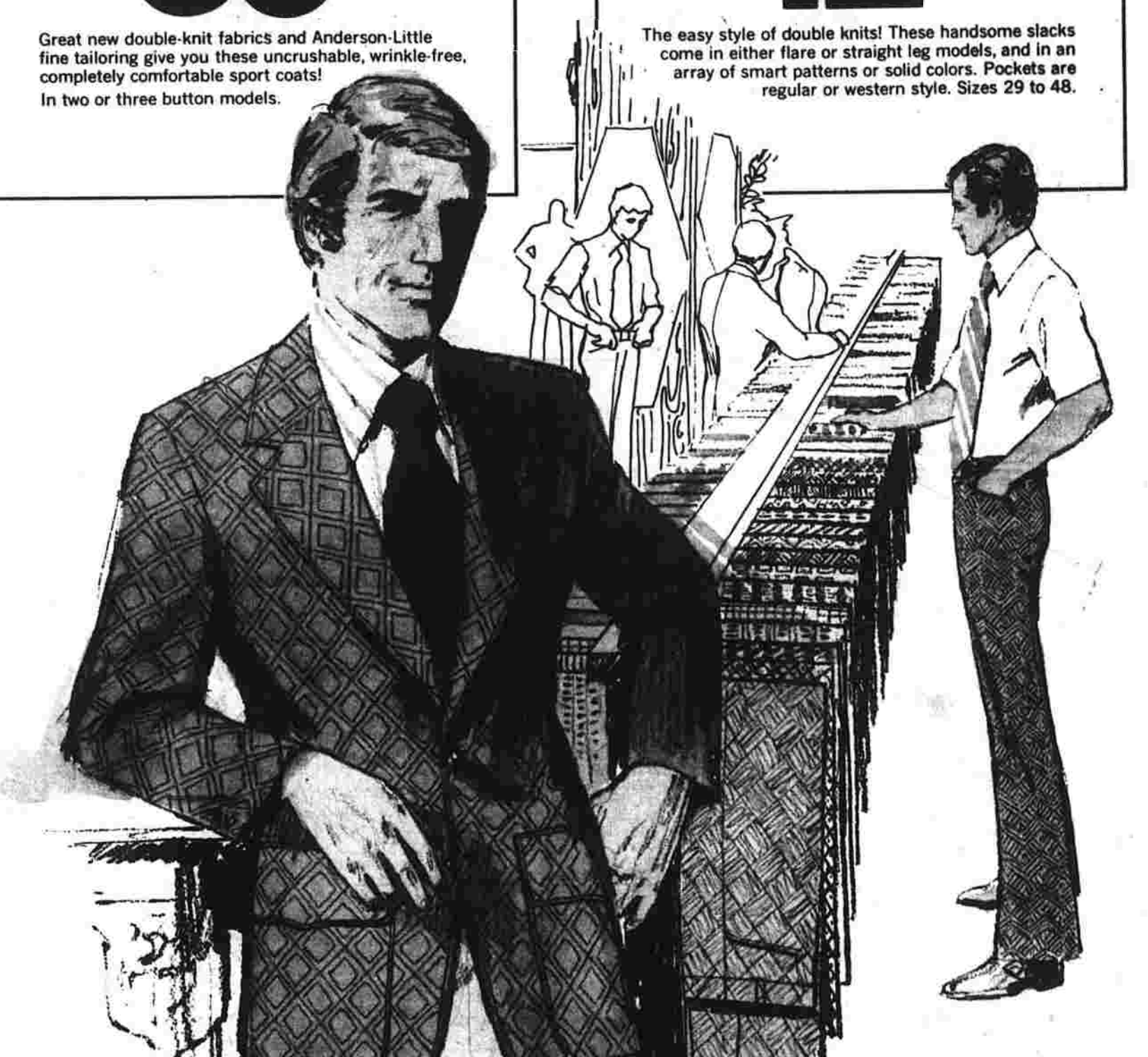

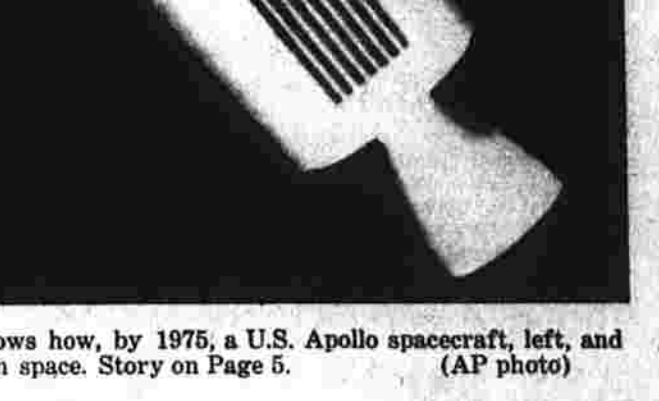

### DR. LAWRENCE E. LAMB High Cholesterol Increases Risk

Dear Dr. Lamb—With all the disagreement regarding cholesterol, I would like your opinion on treatment. Can cholesterol be handled by diet, or should one look at the heredity angle and ask if I have a count of over 400?

For your information, I have taken Altrol which caused continuous headaches and diarrhea. Then I have been on another medicine for four months. The reading was down to 380 but now I have a headache day and night. I usually feel peppy and seem well. Should I live with cholesterol, or is that possible? I am 70.

Dear Reader—Not everyone responds the same way to treatment for high cholesterol. I have been impressed that a very large percentage of people can decrease their level of cholesterol by a diet which is low in fat.

Weight loss is not so successful in people who need to lose 50 pounds and only lose 10 any more than the dietary management of diet. An overweight person who loses only a small part of their weight will benefit more from a diet which is low in fat.

### Space Rescue System Near After East-West Accord

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Aeronautics and Space Administration's new space rescue system is being developed in cooperation with the Soviet Union, according to a statement by a spokesman here.

Further, the newly designated "international rescue and docking mission" will give the U.S. aerospace industry a \$200-million boost in the arm-punch of the money going to the Apollo program.

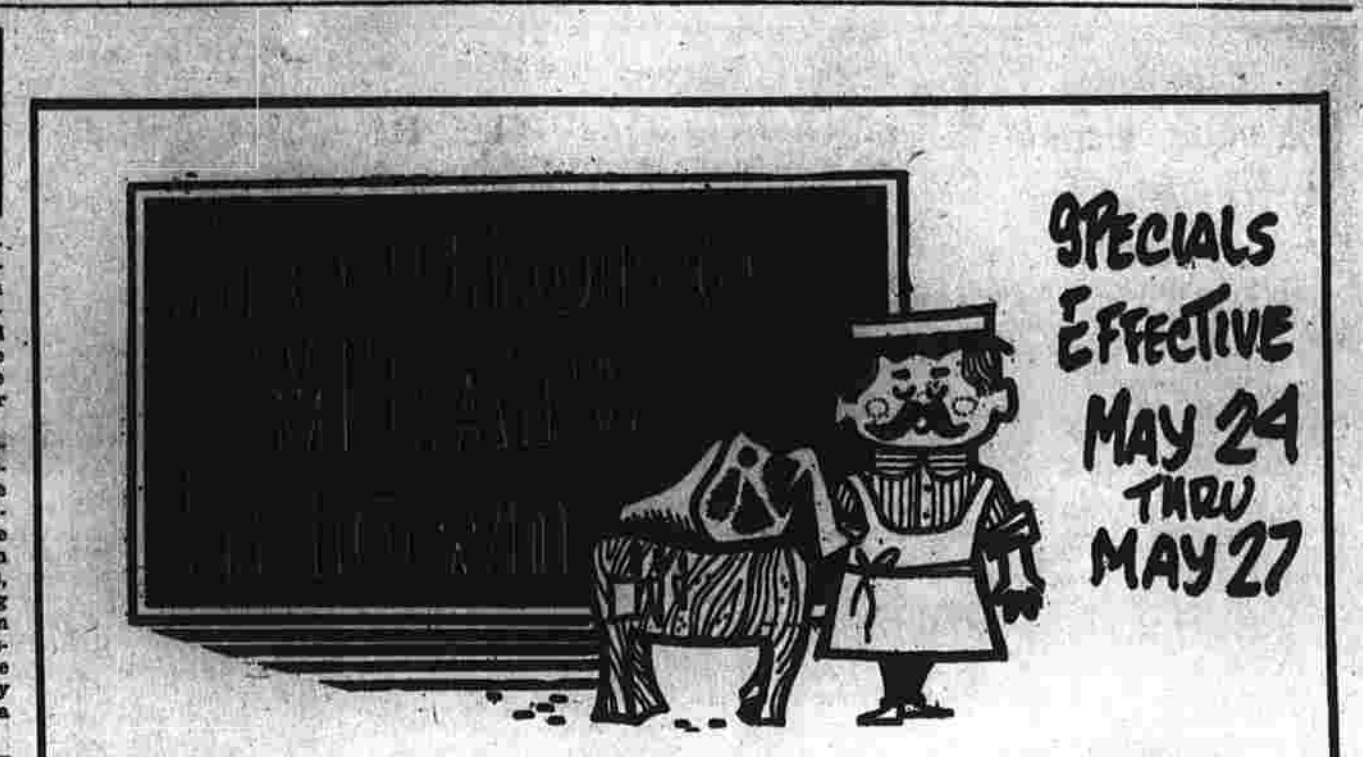

Argentina Press Bares Police Brutality Claim

BUENOS AIRES (AP) — Argentine newspapers and magazines are reporting increasingly that police prisoners have been beaten and tortured, frequently with an "electric needle" similar to a cattle prod. "The growing evidence and testimony show that an infrastructure of torture exists in Argentina," says the daily El Cronista Comercial.

Two women arrested in connection with a kidnapping said they were tortured by federal police with the electric needle. Emma Elida de Benedetti, who was four months pregnant, said a doctor was at her side during the torture checking her condition and advising the police. The police have denied the accusation.

Two alleged victims later kept coming as Gen. Lanusse's military government presses a campaign to break up guerrilla groups. Roman Catholic bishops, at a meeting this month, issued a statement condemning torture as illegal, even when applied to people accused of terrorism or other "political crimes."

CARACAS (AP) — Some 20,000 cheering supporters have greeted former dictator Marcos Perez Jimenez on his return to Venezuela from a self-imposed exile. Perez Jimenez, overthrown in a military-backed coup in 1958, said on his return Wednesday that he plans to run for president in 1973. He said his present trip to Venezuela will last only five days. After leaving the country in 1962, he was returned to Venezuela from the United States to face embezzlement charges. Sentenced to four years and 46 days in jail, he left Venezuela again after his release from prison.

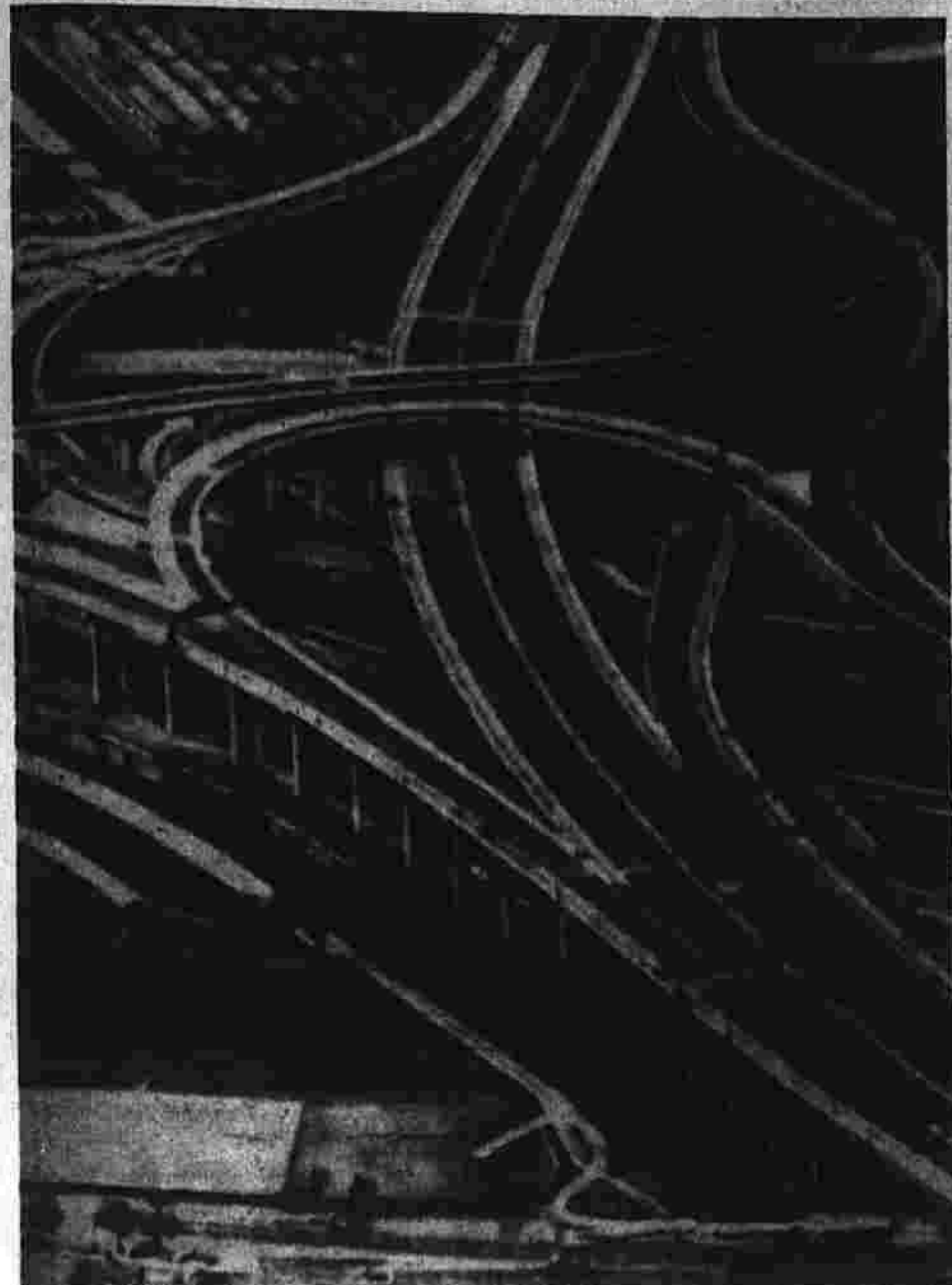

# Classroom Emptied by War, Pupils Following Exodus

 THU, Vietnam (AP) — More than a month ago, when they were together on their last day in school at An Loc, there were 250 of them.

This week there were 53, a bare remnant of the original class of 250. Most of the children were orphans.

Their schoolmates were scattered somewhere along the 40 miles of Highway 19 from the Due to the provincial capital of An Loc.

Some have wandered into refugee camps. Some were led away by the North Vietnamese. Some may be wandering through the jungle. Some he died in the ruins of An Loc, or along the roadside.

The 53, from 7 to 15 years old, are survivors of a remarkable school that survived the flight of a whole elementary school through bullet lines to safety. They who survived walked through shells from tanks and artillery, bombs dropped and vicious crossfire.

They were united by fear, the tending for each other and their own camaraderie.

A 15-year-old polio cripple, Lam, stumbled, set and held the same blue and white T-shirt he wore on the exodus, and held his thin bamboo crutches.

North Vietnamese artillery hit An Loc for seven days.

"We spent most of our time in the trenches we had dug in the garden of the school. With my legs twisted like this I could contribute little to the work, but I tried," he related.

"We were soon all alone with only two guardians because the teachers fled. There was no where for most of us to go because our parents lived in villages we had heard were already occupied by the North Vietnamese. On the seventh day the shells hit the school."

"That night we were already

attending in the trenches. We would see each other in the light of candles. Suddenly there was a big white flash. Someone said one bomb had fallen into a trench.

"Then the staircase of the school got hit and I know there were children under it."

"Next morning we found one dead boy and six injured. The school buses were burning, and some people took the wounded boys to the hospital and never saw them again."

"It is known that the hospital was leveled in the first days of the An Loc fighting. The few patients still alive are being taken to the hospital in Hanoi."

The exodus began April 15, when the North Vietnamese launched their first massive ground attack against An Loc.

Some of the children started just after sunrise," Lam recalls. "We were very frightened because they had hurt us just a few hours before. I saw tanks across the street and they were firing at us from the government."

"But then I saw our soldiers shooting at the tanks and running away from them. The tanks shot at the buildings, and some boys ran away from the school to the Protestant church—many people had been running to it all morning."

"The tanks drove to the church, and then there were shells falling around the school. I saw the tanks and also bombing the church. Then I saw the North Vietnamese running away from the school. Some children came back and said 20 of their schoolmates had been killed in the church."

By noon that day Lam and his schoolmates had been in-actively deciding about leaving. The first group of about 100 boys and girls moved southward because they had heard of a rubber plantation and toward Saigon. A larger group left a few minutes later carrying only a handful of clothing. None of the children thought of taking food and water, Lam says. They left their school books behind.

Lam, because of his legs, was soon at the tail end of the procession. Thousands of other people were fleeing, but few took notice of the children or the crippled Lam—maybe because all the children were from the same Montagnard tribes and were most people fleeing An Loc.

The North Vietnamese were shooting and shelling along the highway, and Lam feared for his life more than ever before.

He saw many dead and

on the horizon. There was the wreck of a tank across the road, and many burning trucks. A plane had crashed. The road was slippery with blood. There were many corpses. One had long hair and a white blouse. She was a woman.

The children presumably had run into a destroyed government relief column. As they got closer to Chon Thanh, the town where Lam lived on a small farm with his mother before he went to school in An Loc, the light of planes flared against the sky.

By morning they saw South Vietnamese soldiers in foliage. They were in this state when a West German welfare worker, Hemming Becker, learned of their odyssey and went searching for them. Lam and some of the children don't know where their parents are.

Becker has gathered 53 of the original 250. He hopes to find more in refugee camps.

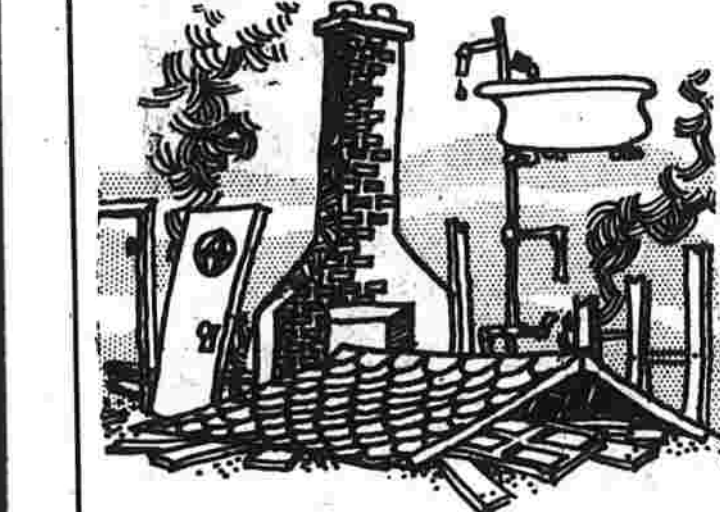

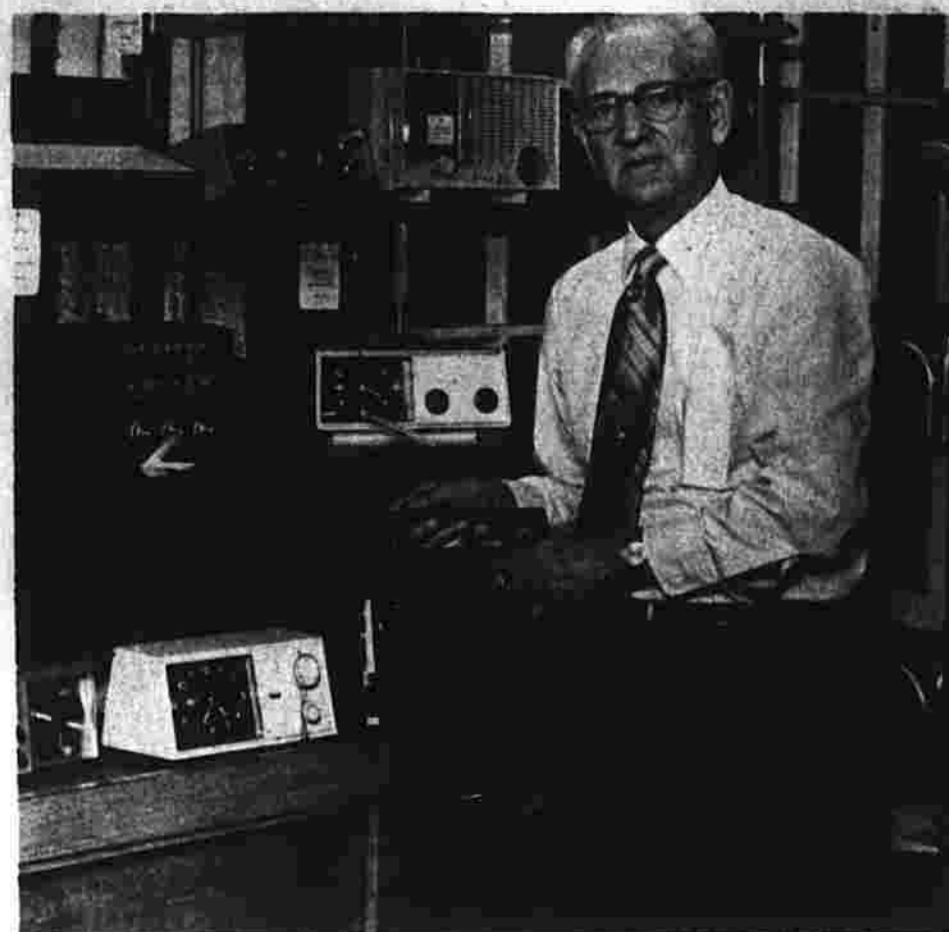

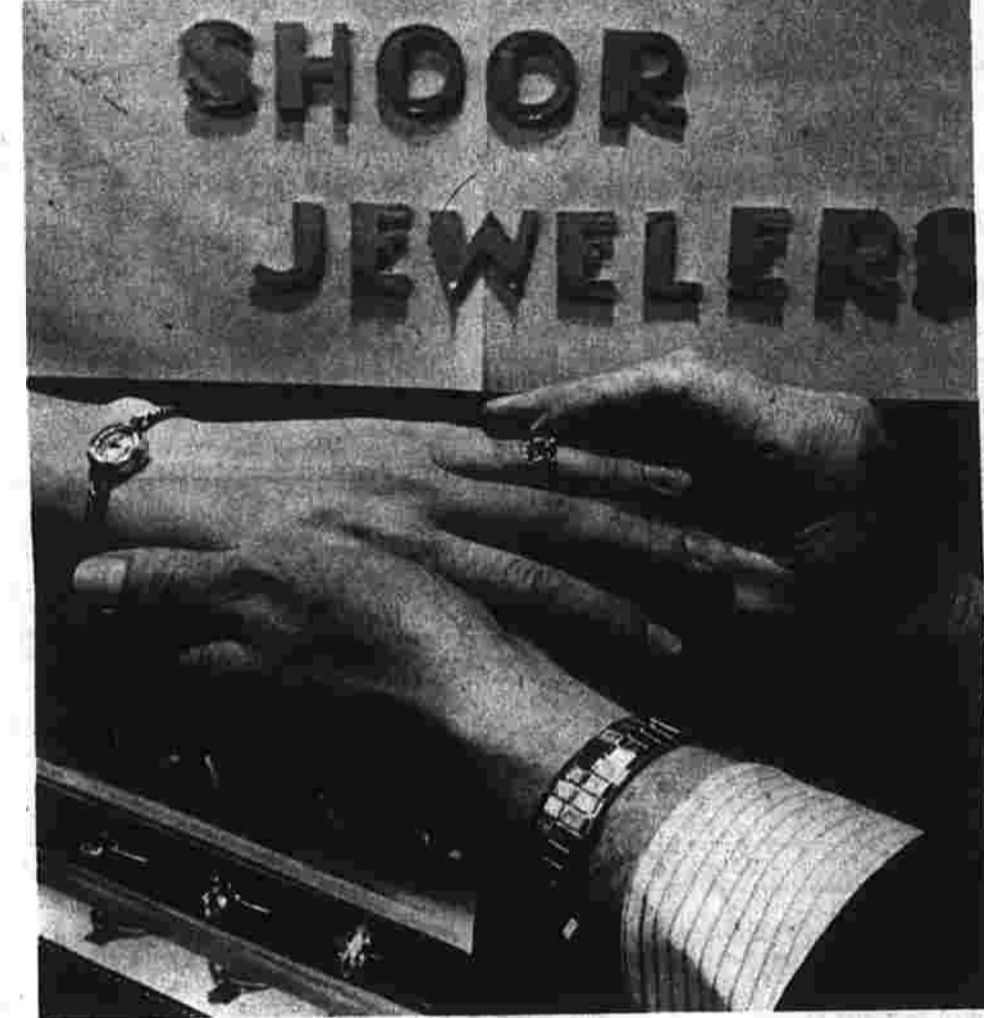

Here's How Things Are Becoming Less Formal

Naturalness, a new look in home decorating, is spreading to shops and restaurants, comments Tom Drum of Atlanta, prize-winning designer of interiors, who predicts the country store look also will make a comeback.

"Architecture is becoming people oriented," he says. "The ostentatious look is out. Department stores are becoming nice places to visit instead of flashy designer dreams. And one thing has become obvious — people do not enjoy wandering around vast space. Big rooms are being made to look smaller and cozier whether they are in homes or in stores."

It is the reason for the tented look in homes and restaurants and the trend to little boutiques and vignette shopping areas in stores, he explains.

The designer of homes and commercial buildings was one of two winners in the annual S.H. Hester awards program that cites outstanding achievements by professional designers. His winning design, comments Tom Drum, is a restaurant designed and furnished on a budget of \$20,000.

Some tricks he employed might be useful in homes, he says. Good inexpensive shortcuts include using church pews as both seats by cutting them in half. They cost \$10 a piece. Tables were made of pressed board because "tops are covered" anyway. Inexpensive director chairs were used instead of wood.

Ecology also is changing the look of the architectural environment, he points out. Brick walls of the restaurant, a former meat market, were acid-treated and painted brown. Other walls are board and batten. He used trellisage as a divider in one area, and arranged the booths in cozy groupings.

The restaurant is warm and friendly because "people are tired of obsolescence whether it is excess grandeur with scintillating lights and furnishings in stores or restaurants or the family automobile with excess metal."

Everyone is seeking his own identity. In downtown Atlanta, are redoing shops with black designers and creating a warm friendly atmosphere, says Drum.

"In designing a shoe store for a black community, we are making it look like a marvelous big den with easy chairs and a fireplace. Even big chain stores are going in that direction. Everything is less formal and the splashy places are out. One firm spent \$150,000 remodeling a store that now looks like an airplane hangar. It isn't popular with the kids it wants to attract because they are turned off gimmickery."

Drum is working on an old-fashioned variety store theme for another entrepreneur and he thinks one day "someone will be smart enough to package the old-fashioned country look and put it all over the United States." "People are ready for it because it is a natural look."

Household Hints

With a little effort you can fashion a sewing box in the shape of a couch. Cover with some pretty material from your scrap bag, padding the back and the seats. Thread may be kept under the seats. Pins and needles are stuck in the cushions and back. Tape measure and thimble may also be kept in the box under the seat.

Perforate the top of a metal adhesive tape container with a nail, attach a cord, fill with moth crystals and replace the lid. Hang in a clothes closet.

Hairdressers Present Shags, Curls, Natural Look

Young people are returning to hairdressing salons, say members of the hair fashion committee of the National Hairdressers and Cosmetologists Association, a group which recently held a show of spring and summer hairstyles in New York.

In some areas they say, young people are going back to salons in droves, and in other areas the trend is slow, but sure. According to interviews with stylists in four areas:

... In Maine young people want permanent waves, shag hairstyles and curls.

... In St. Louis they like geometrical haircuts.

... In Jackson, Mississippi they want the feminine look.

... In Detroit they are asking for a natural look.

In addition the wig rage is tapering off, say hairdressers from the four cities.

Bernard Desjardins, style director of the hair fashions group, attributed increased business at his salon in Lewiston, Me., to the tapering off of wig wear.

"More young people want an all-over curly boue hairstyle and they are accepting permanent waves that are necessary to maintain curly styles but shag hairdos are also bringing young people into the salon."

Ester Richardson, from Jackson, Miss., says, "Women are returning to the kind of feminine look in clothes and hair that men like to see." Her hair design for the show was a submerse of curls around the face.

College kids are pouring into our salons, and many of them are cutting their hair short around the face, leaving the back long so it can be worn up for a short look or pulled down for a long one or tied back with a ribbon," Miss Richardson says.

"Wigs are no longer replacing hair styles, but they are popular because of the heat and handy to own if you are a swimmer or boater."

Sal Vitale of St. Louis also likes imbalanced hairdos, but his are curly on one side, straight on the other with curly top and straight back. More young people are asking for geometrical hairdos, cutting their hair shorter, he comments, adding that wigs are dropping

off in popularity because hair looks so "unnude" when the wig is taken off. Detroit hairdressers are concentrating on giving young people a natural look, and young people are gaining confidence in them, says Louise Carter of that city. "There is a tremendous youth movement turning to professional hair grooming." Long hair will still be popular through spring, in her opinion, but hair styles are going shorter. She, too, has de-

signed the short in front, long in back look that can be versatile, straight or curly. Wigs are less important, unless they look as natural as one's own hair, she says, because "young people are rejecting all forms of artifice."

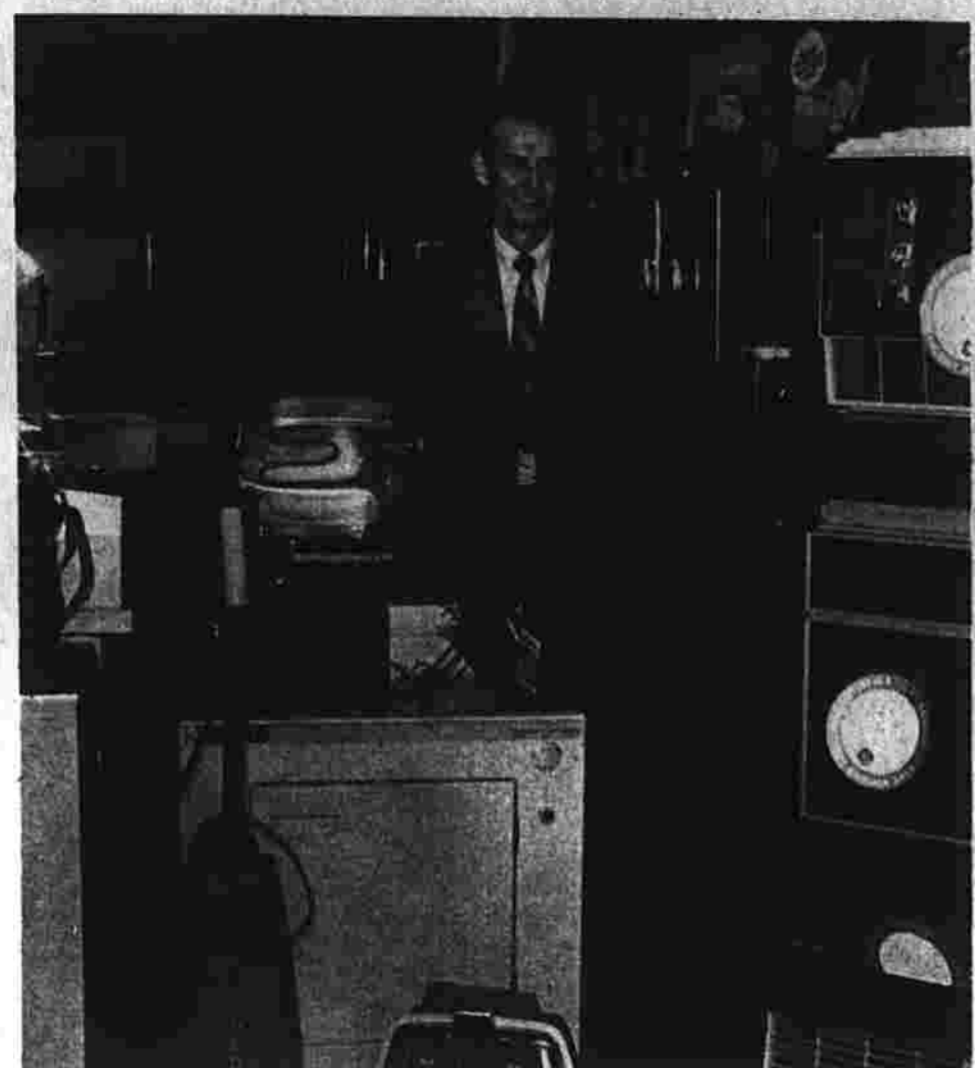
