

AP Commends Herald Reporter

HARTFORD (AP) — Reporters for newspapers in Ansonia, Manchester and New London were awarded today in the May monthly contest of cooperation among members of The Associated Press in Connecticut.

Tolland Arbitrators Recommend Contract

A three-year teacher contract with non-negotiable five per cent pay raises for each of the first two years of the contract, AP members of the story that has been recommended in a majority decision of the state arbitration panel in the Tolland Education Association-Board of Education contract dispute.
