Democratic Delegates Noncommittal, Says Poll

More than half of the 38 Connecticut delegates already selected for the Democratic National Convention are taking the same uncommitted stance as State Democratic Chairman John Bailey, an Associated Press poll reveals.

Bailey has repeatedly urged delegates not to commit themselves to any candidate for the democratic presidential nomination — to wait and see. Ten of the delegates said they were committed to Sen. George McGovern of South Dakota and three said their votes would go to Sen. Edmund Muskie of Maine. None indicated a preference for Sen. Hubert Humphrey of Minnesota.

Of the 23 delegates who said they hadn't made up their minds, two said they would poll their districts before deciding and one woman said she would wait for the California primary results before announcing whom she will support. The rest just said they were uncommitted.

Two of the delegates could not be reached Sunday. Thirteen at-large delegates will be chosen at the state convention in Hartford June 16-17, to bring the total Connecticut delegation to Miami Beach to 51. The 30 delegates were chosen at congressional district meetings last week.

Despite the large number of uncommitted delegates, State Rep. Irving J. Stolberg, chairman of the State Political Committee for McGovern, was optimistic.

The New Haven Democrat said there was a "good chance by convention time we'll have about 30 of the 38 delegates, and we also expect to have a very good share of the 13 delegates in the at-large category."

Another McGovern supporter, Sen. Abraham Ribicoff, predicted that McGovern would win the nomination on the first ballot. Ribicoff said McGovern appeared headed for victory over Humphrey in Tuesday's California primary.

Ribicoff is expected to lead the Connecticut delegation to the national convention. Twelve of the delegates chosen so far are women, including an 18-year-old black college student from Hartford, Markita Green, who aligned herself among the uncommitted.

Prison Chief Agrees To More Guards

HARTFORD (AP) — An agreement was reached early today between prison guards and the Connecticut State Correction Department on the issue of tighter security at the state prison at Somers.

One union official said the department "has agreed to put more guards on at Somers." Corrections Commissioner John P. Manson said the department will "readjust positions within the department" to add to the guard force at Somers.

Manson said it is now "a question of sitting down with our personnel and budget people" to see where the additional guards will come from. He emphasized that guards would not be transferred from one state institution to Somers. Manson said the situation at the prison is "gradually returning to normal" and that no more negotiating sessions are scheduled with guards.

The guards met late Sunday night and early today at Windsor Locks.

Angela Acquitted In Court Shootout

SAN JOSE, Calif. (AP) — The jurors who acquitted Angela Davis on murder-kidnap-conspiracy charges had no major disagreements on her innocence from the start of their deliberations, the forewoman said.

Mary Timothy revealed the lack of discord while attending a festive party celebrating Sunday's verdict. A Mexican-American on the jury said he related to defense arguments about the persecution of blacks.

Another source said the all-white jury voted at least three times before handing in its verdict. On the first ballot, taken Friday afternoon shortly after they began deliberating, the jurors voted nine for acquittal and three undecided. There were no votes for conviction during the balloting, the source said.

Hysterical sobs of joy intermingled with shrieks of happiness in the courtroom when the verdict was returned. Miss Davis wept quietly, tears streaming down her cheeks.

She was found innocent of engineering the bloody Aug. 7, 1970, Martin County courthouse escape attempt in which a judge, two convicts and their accomplice were slain. She had spent 16 months in jail before she was freed on \$100,000 bail five days before the trial began Feb. 28.

The tall, black Communist hugged and kissed members of the seven-woman, five-man jury when they met for the first time at a news conference shortly after the verdict was announced.

"This is the happiest day of my life," she told a crowd of 300 supporters outside the courthouse who had been chanting: "The power of the people—it set Angela free."

The jubilant Miss Davis declared the acquittal "a people's victory"—not a triumph for American justice.

At a private post-verdict party, the lone Mexican-American on the jury, Louis Franco, told attorneys he was moved by the defense's final arguments, which centered on persecution of blacks in America for centuries.

Prosecutor Albert Harris Jr., an assistant state attorney general, declined comment on the verdict.

During the private celebration at the home of friends here, Miss Davis toasted her acquittal and the jurors with champagne.

All but three of the jury members showed up at the private party, and Miss Davis told The Associated Press that the jurors received her warmly and brought along their husbands and wives to meet her.

Juror Robert Seidel, 69, the oldest member of the panel, said, "This was no slipshod decision."

He added, "I would say we had very few disagreements and they were of a minor nature."

Travel Eased At Wall

BERLIN (AP) — Travel to both East Germany and West Germany became easier for the 2.3 million people of West Berlin as a result of the Big Four Berlin Accord activated over the weekend.

East Germany's 17 million citizens remained walled in. Their hopes for freer movement hinged on future developments, starting with negotiations to normalize relations between the two Germanies due to begin in two weeks.

The 1971 Berlin Accord went into effect Sunday, 12 hours after a final protocol was signed by the foreign ministers of the United States, Britain, France and the Soviet Union. They met in the Allied Control Council Building in West Berlin, the same building where the agreement had been initiated nine months earlier following 33 negotiation sessions.

As a result of the accord, two pass offices opened in West Berlin Sunday to take applications from citizens wanting to visit East Berlin or East Germany, and they were promptly swamped. The offices remained open past closing time but hundreds of applicants were left standing in line.

On weekdays, five offices take applications, which East German officials said would take three to five days to process.

West Berliners can apply for up to 30 visiting days a year in the East under the new agreement.

Travelers between West Berlin and West Germany, separated by 110 miles of East German territory, reported very quick clearance in comparison to the past.

Schools Bill Has Chance

WASHINGTON (AP) — A chief House sponsor of the Senate-passed \$21.5-billion education bill predicts the massive measure with its restrictive busing provisions will be passed by the House this week.

The vote is scheduled for Thursday and although Rep. Albert H. Quie, R-Minn., thinks it will be close, he expects the House to send the bill to President Nixon.

"The more I work among the members, the more optimistic I become," said Quie at a week-end news conference. "I am confident it will pass."

The bill would combine the most-stringent limits Congress has ever placed on busing for the purpose of school desegregation with federal support for a wide range of education programs.

There is little opposition to the education provisions but the restrictions on busing have united backers and opponents of busing against the bill.

One group says the restriction will pass.

The deficit for fiscal 1973, estimated earlier at \$26.5 billion will be about \$27 billion, the Office of Management and Budget said in a report to Congress.

The federal financial situation has improved markedly since January because of increased tax collections resulting from over-withholding from paychecks.

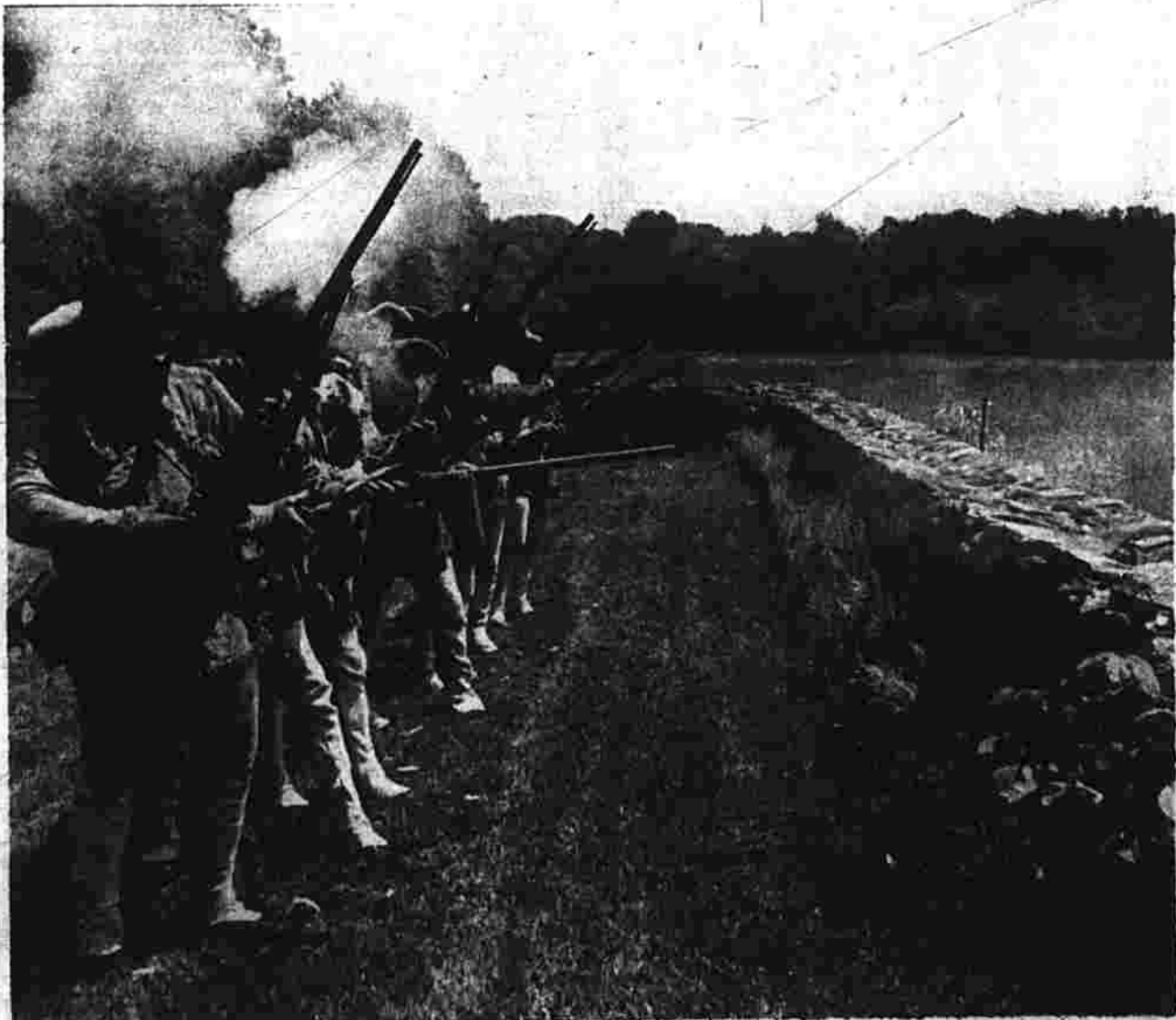

Bengali Society Stumbles

Dacca, Bangladesh (AP) — would be anarchy, said a Bengali may resort to strong-arm tactics to achieve it.
