One thing we would consider relatively certain, and that is that nobody, and certainly not either McGovern or Kennedy, ever put seriously for a moment the idea of putting these two names on the same ticket.

The Kennedy play meant that he wanted to help McGovern in the pre-convention race.

Since this has worked so well there no longer is any danger that the convention will find itself trapped in any compulsion to try to draft Senator Kennedy for President, it might be considered something of a public service on his part.

Misjudging McGovern. The California primary campaign made it clear we have misjudged George McGovern in two important respects.

It is already fashionable in punditdom to tout up where we all went wrong with his political prospects. For our part, we had not expected the vacuum that was created by the collapse of Senator Muskie and the rest of the Democratic field.

We also underestimated the appeal of Senator McGovern's cool television personality. He has the leisure (versus Republicans) of winning elections by getting himself attacked.

The second misjudgment is even more interesting. To wit, we wrote that this nomination might produce a 1964 in reverse. We still think he could quite possibly lead us down to dire defeat, but not quite for the reasons Barry Goldwater did. Senator McGovern has not now made it quite clear he is not about to go into Tennessee to sell television, or do anything else to rub his ideology into anyone's face.

But with light turnout and a comatose opposition, his devoted volunteers wound up with probably 223 of 271 delegates. Thus, New York failed to remove doubt of McGovern's national viability, but decreased the chances of stopping him in Miami Beach.

In the old days, McGovern would have faced determined, vigorous party regulars in New York. Similarly, the California challenge would have been eagerly grasped as the last chance to stop him. But in 1972, party regulars worry less about how to stop McGovern than about whether they want to stop McGovern. That one brings his first-ballot nomination close to a foregone conclusion.

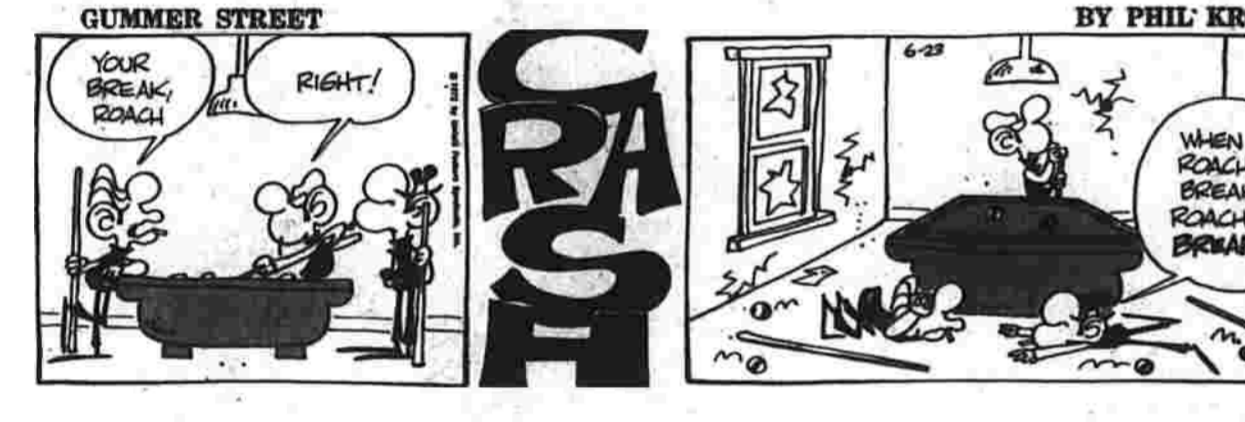

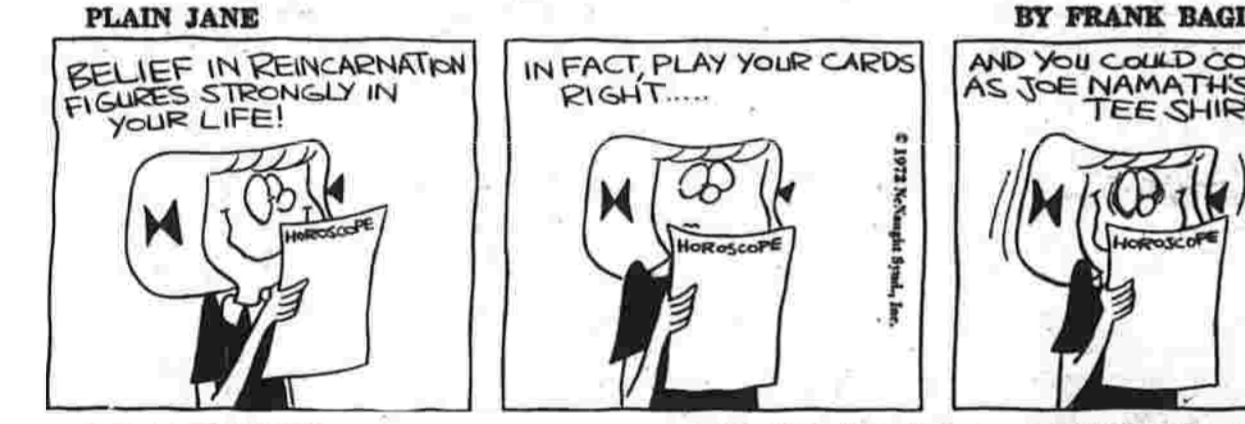

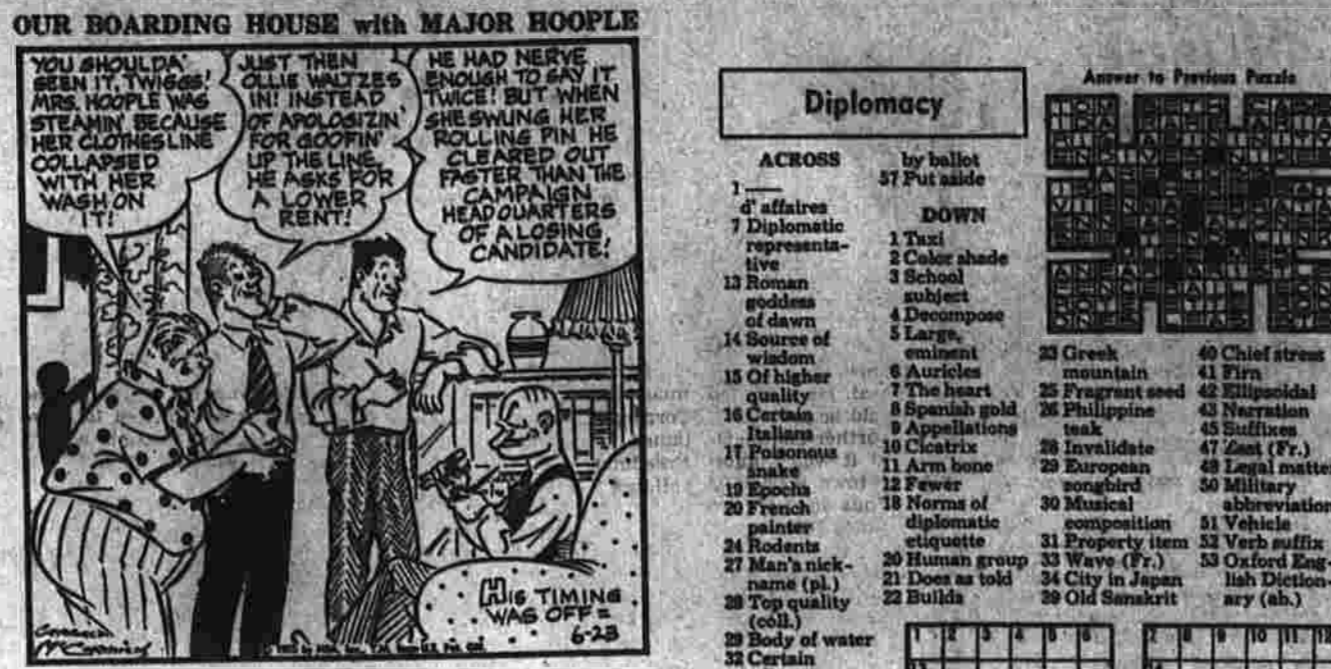
