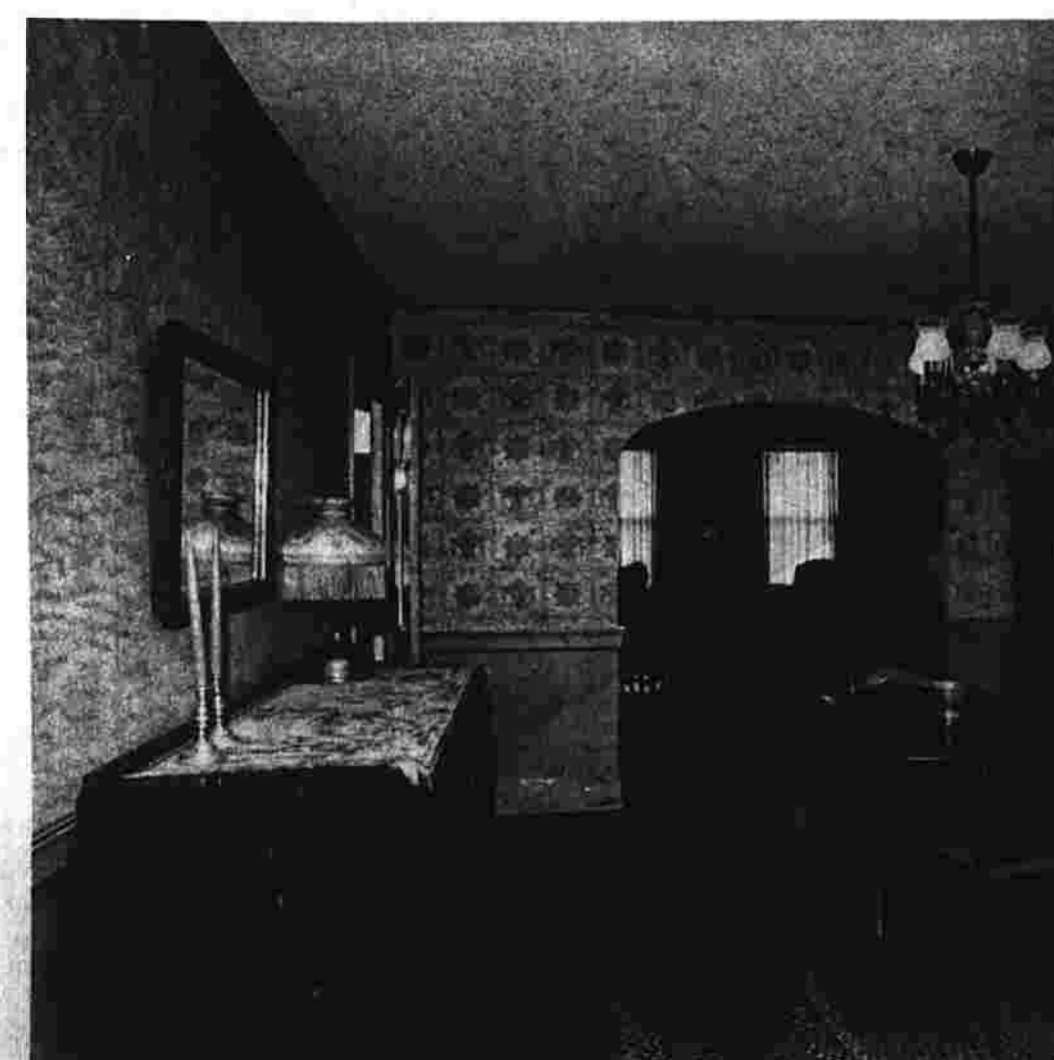

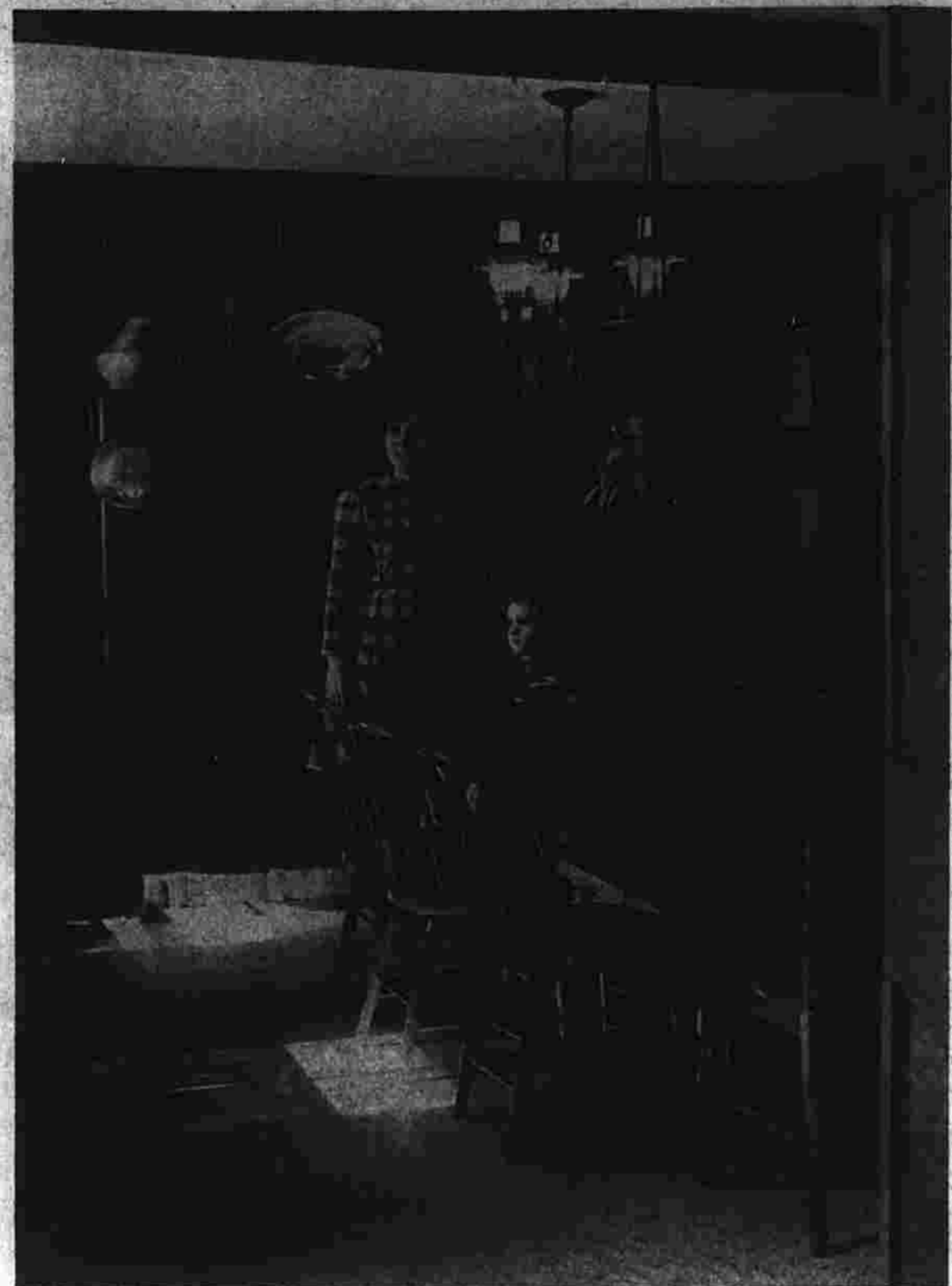

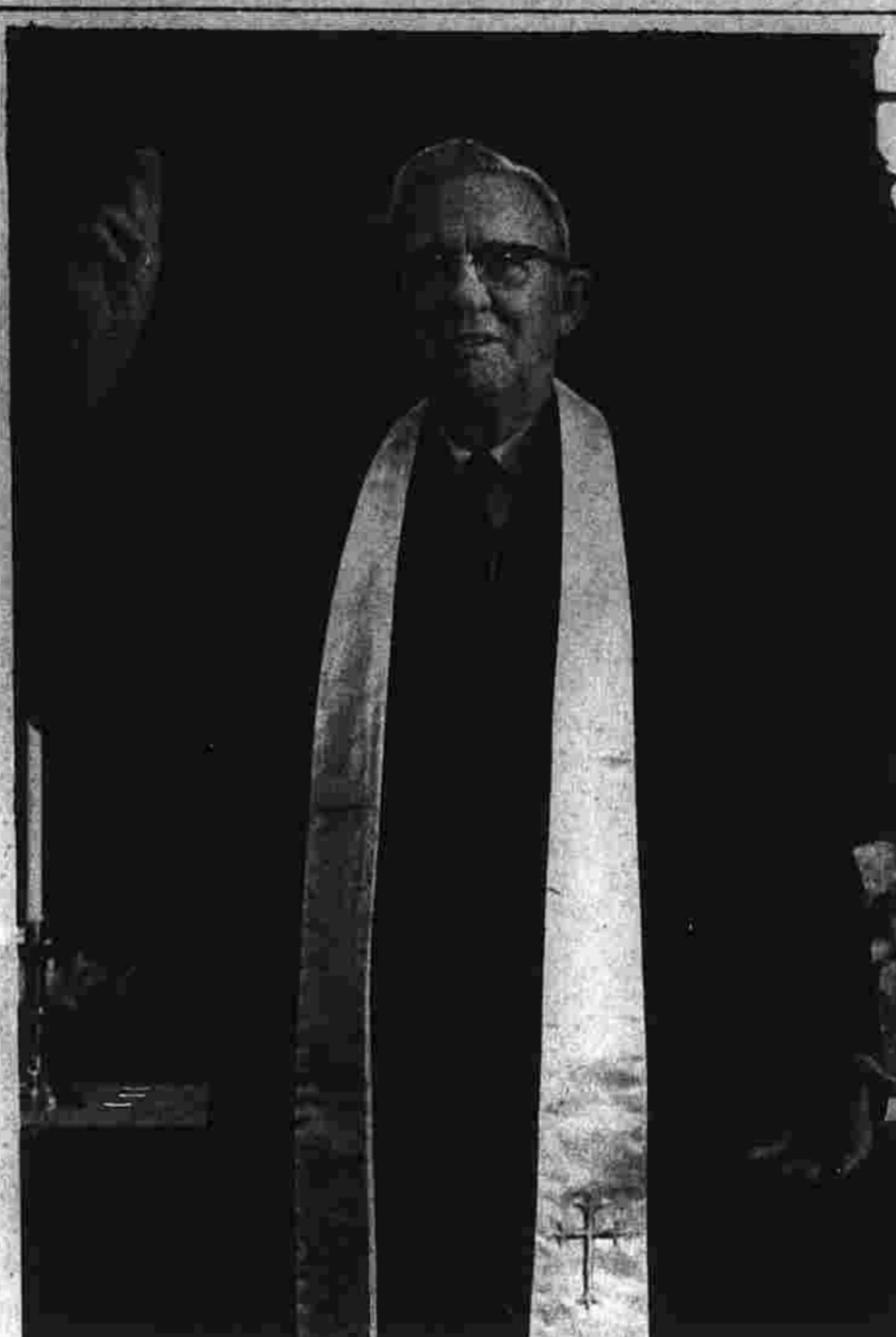

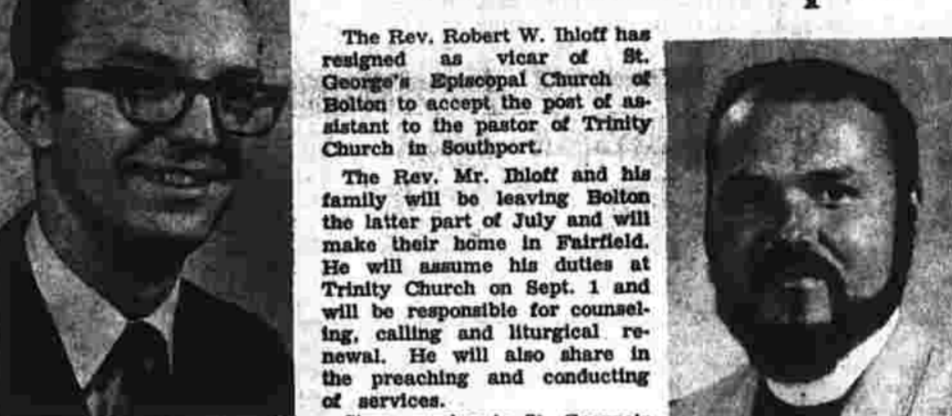

The Vegetarian Remedy. Everybody warns and admits the cost of living is climbing again, faster than it should...

First, we could try direct governmental control of the price of meat, as we are currently trying governmental controls of other national products.

Second, we can try to alter the relationship between supply and demand by permitting the import of more meat from abroad.

Third, we can try to alter the supply-demand factor by reducing our own consumption of meat.

The first and second alternatives involve a positive kind of challenge to the American farmer which no administration is going to like to undertake in a presidential election year.

And, since we have never yet noticed a political year in which a concern for the general consumer had more power than the drive to play ball with every last special group, we would recommend that anybody really interested in getting the price of meat to come down should stop looking to governmental action or to the promises of either political party, and start talking, buying, and eating like a would-be vegetarian.

White Hood Testimony. Pursuant to our own announced policy prescribing a very low amount of credibility to be extended to "mystery" witnesses, we hereby restrain our acceptance of the sensational disclosure made by a witness who donned a spectacular white hood for the cameras before she testified before a Congressional committee the other day.

The one that testified in the New York City police force, and she was testifying to the effect that she found New York City schools a "haven" for drug peddlers and drug addicts, and she was wearing the big white hood so that none of the students who had seen her while she was posing as a fellow student would be able to recognize her.

She related to the Congressional committee a line of testimony which would be quite familiar to us, we think, to every parent of any child in any high school or junior high school in the land.

But it also has to be obvious to most of us that the schools do somehow manage, under the best of circumstances, to keep between orders, to keep the pupils and temptations obviously being offered on the school scene, a surprising number of young people somehow manage to come through the exposure strong and sound for their own future contribution to their world.

Some day, after all the negative sensationalism has had its full time before the camera, somebody ought to put on a white hood and make some startling disclosures about what else goes on in the schools, besides drugs.

A Pressure Agnes Couldn't Buck. The temper and the standards of our age are such that it would not be the least surprising if somebody in Hartford County should now see the professional weatherman, because he promised us a boat with Agnes and then failed to deliver.

Such a lawsuit might allege mental anguish caused by psychosis which proved to be false; it might claim commercial damages because the weeklong forecasting of the imminence of wind and water caused the postponement of events or lowered the amount of business being done; we will have to consult our lawyers, and see what other suggestions they may have.

In the end, however, we think we will content ourselves with being simply grateful that we did not have to encounter, for ourselves, in Manchester, the full violence with which this particular batch of weather claved its way up the coast.

There is a certain deprivation in not having had this experience for ourselves. We do not quite understand how it happened elsewhere; we almost have a tendency to disbelieve the accounts in which floods appear in communities never before subjected to such experience; being just a few miles outside the reality encourages a stray thought which toy with the idea that it isn't real.

But we think we had better settle for the idea that damage and death elsewhere did not occur, and we are grateful that we, in our own fenced security, didn't have to go through the experiment of seeing what a 10-inch rainfall might do to us.

As for the weathermen, we might, instead of criticizing any disparity between prediction and what actually arrived, try with the possibility that they threw up much of the high pressure warning Agnes just could not push in against it.

Doctor Union Is Endorsed

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—There's nothing wrong with a doctor joining a union "as long as he takes care of his patients," says the retiring president of the American Medical Association. Dr. Wesley W. Hall of Reno, Nev., commented Friday during a question and answer session after his address to the Commonwealth Club. He stepped down this week as president of the AMA, which held its annual convention here. Asked if a doctors' union could strike without violating the Hippocratic oath, Hall replied: "I cannot see any violation of the Hippocratic Oath as long as a doctor who belongs to such a group takes care of his patients. This is a free country and every doctor is free to do what he wants to as long as he takes care of his patients." The AMA avoided a formal position on unionization of doctors by referring the controversial issue to further study "to determine the most effective legal way to permit collective bargaining."
