The veteran leader of Connecticut's Democratic Party, also indicated he was not happy with Connecticut people "who have carried the flag for years."

"I'll take all of us to win," Bailey said.

House Speaker William Ratchford said he would like to have "define more clearly" his positions on the issues at the presidential campaign gets under way.

"There's welfare, the minimum guaranteed annual income, tax reform, and other subjects to clarify," Ratchford said.

If McGovern moves toward the center, "we may lose a very, very small fringe," Stolberg said. "The fringe" he lost are "the very idealistically and very ideologically pure who can't compromise."

Stolberg said McGovern "is not a radical—although he may be radically honest."

The 61-member Connecticut delegation gave 45 votes to McGovern's choice for vice president, Sen. Thomas F. Eagleton. Eagleton was on the roll call vote at convention hall.

Hebron Town Agrees On Salaries Of Teachers

Acting as representatives of their respective organizations, while agreeing to sign a pact after the legislature had repealed a state income tax in 1971-1972, Hebron teachers and the town board have agreed to a salary schedule for 1972-1973. The agreement, which was made in a meeting last night at the town hall, calls for a 3.5 percent increase over the 1971-1972 schedule.

The \$322,220 represents a 20.2 percent increase over the amount budgeted last year. However, \$15,000 of this increase is for two new teachers, thus leaving an approximate increase of 18.5 percent spread over salaries for 37 teachers.

The execution of the contract completes the negotiations which began last December and according to the board's negotiations chairman, Edward Hincliff, "indicates a complete agreement on the part of the HEA and the board on all items negotiated."

Hincliff added that "it is gratifying to the board's point of view to realize that there are no new items or conditions of employment and the salary schedule for both teachers and masters level of instructors was increased to a point at which the board is able to stay within its budget."

The schedule for this year starts at \$7,200 for a teacher, a degree as opposed to \$7,325 last year and goes in ten steps to \$19,800 as opposed to \$19,444 last year. On the masters schedule, it starts at \$10,000 as opposed to \$7,800 and goes in ten steps to \$11,200 as opposed to \$11,024.

Hincliff mentioned that the board's schedule is "significant in that most towns in the area have an extended schedule which takes the higher income teachers substantially beyond the board's schedule."

"No city or town had to raise taxes" as a result of the delayed state aid, Meskill said. "What they got in effect was a bonus."

Women Answer the Ambulance Calls

STAMFORD, Conn. (AP) — The all-woman crew of Unit 99 ambulance attendants, chatting, but their ears are tuned to the police and fire radio squawking in the background. They await a call from the dispatcher that would send them speeding off in an ambulance to the scene of an accident where they would put their vehicle in Stamford.

The ambulance carries modern equipment, including a heart-beat resuscitator. Unit 99 hopes to soon have an EKG machine which will allow attendants to take electrocardiogram readings on the route to the hospital.

The all-woman crew is on duty one night a week from 8 p.m. to midnight. Other nights, the Stamford Ambulance Corps is manned by men or men and women.

The women—Marilyn King, Donna J. Morris, Marie Patterson and Fay Drummond, all of Stamford—said they feel women may be better able to stand the sight of blood better than men, but they were careful not to claim they were better ambulance attendants than men.

Any mother, they said, who has had to cope with children's cuts, abrasions and contusions gets used to the sight of blood. Discussing ambulance trips with dead or dying patients, the ladies said their strongest emotion is that they were not able to do more for their patients.

"Enjoy helping people and this is one way I can do it," said Miss Morris, a secretary-bookkeeper who likes horse-back riding.

Mrs. King said, "Just being an equipment, including a with patients, letting them know you are there, talking to them, holding their hands makes me feel I'm doing something. I've had it with women's clubs and stuff like that."

School Work Estimates Down by \$3.4 Million

Bond referendums likely to be voted on this fall will be for substantially less money than members of the Town Building Committee and the Board of Education's building and sites committees feared they might be.

The final estimated cost of additions and renovations to both Bennett and Hiling Junior High Schools has been put at \$4.5 million, \$3.4 million for each school.

Original estimates, when the projects were first conceived, were as low as \$4.7 million, but by last week's meeting of the two committees with Lawrence Associates of Manchester, architects for the Hiling work, there was fear that the cost estimates might approach \$5 million.

The Board of Education will act soon on whether to recommend to the Board of Directors that these two proposed projects be placed on the voting machines in the fall, according to Paul Greenberg, chairman of the building and sites committee.

The building committee and the building and sites committee this week reviewed the final plans on which the final cost estimate was based. Although there was not a quorum of the building committee, the consensus was to approve the plans, according to Greenberg. He noted that the building and sites committee has approved the plans.

"We are very pleased with the way the plans worked out," Greenberg says.

Greenberg is not sure when they will be presented to the Board of Education, but it will be before Aug. 1 when the Board of Directors will consider the proposals.

Does Value of Stolen Car Determine Degree of Charge

An interesting question was brought up in connection with theft of a motor vehicle as handled in the new penal code. It was the basis of a motion to dismiss argued by Public Defender Lawrence Kiaczak on behalf of Mark Bartholomew, 20, of Willimantic.

Under the new code, Kiaczak observed, larceny 1st degree, with which Bartholomew is charged, a Class C felony with a maximum sentence of 10 years, specifies that the value of the property taken exceeds \$2,000. Bartholomew is charged

with the theft of a new Thunderbird valued at \$7,000. However, larceny 2nd degree, a class D felony, maximum five years, reads: "(1) a person is guilty of larceny in the second degree when he steals property of another person if the value of the property exceeds \$500."

Kiaczak argues that this is the proper charge since it specifies theft of a motor vehicle or (2) the value of the property exceeds \$500. The logic involved, at least from one direction, is that the

legislature didn't want theft of a motor vehicle to ever be a misdemeanor which it would be if the car's value was less than \$500, therefore they specifically included only car theft as a felony even if the value was very low. Whether a very expensive car can result in a higher charge than that specified is a matter of interpretation, one possibly without precedent, but one that would affect many car theft arrests, considering the price of cars. The decision is up to Judge Joseph F. Danahy who ordered that briefs be filed on the motion.

WATERBURY, Conn. (AP) — A group of 35 Connecticut newspapers has appealed a state order barring the use of the separate male and female designations in help-wanted advertisements.

The newspapers—including all 25 of the state's daily papers—say the order amounts to a prior restraint on publication and violates the U.S. Constitution's 1st and 14th amendments.

The announcement came from Donald Spargo, president of the Connecticut Daily Newspaper Association and General Manager of the Register and Journal-Courier—the two dailies in New Haven.

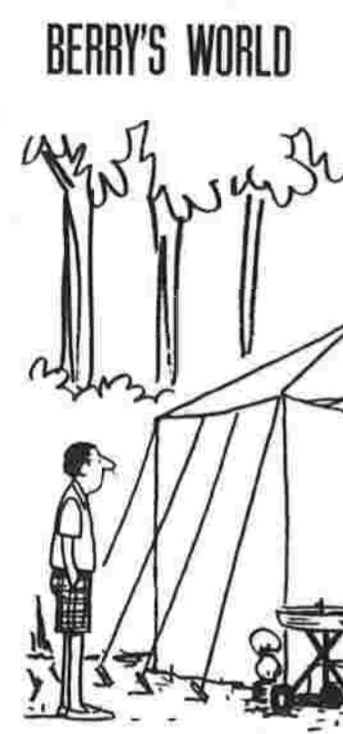
