When Our Tent Leaks



And like everything about camping except camping in the rain. And since into each two week vacation a little rain must fall, there's no escaping it.

When our family goes camping we seem to get our rain in one enormous deluge that beats upon us for three straight days. I'm convinced that someone up there is saying "Here come the Warrens. Let's see how much they can take."

On the first day, we accept the rain as a challenge. The boys are masterful and protect us by hanging up tarps and plastic sheets, and they take turns holding an umbrella over the camp fire.

The girls and I are great in the cooking department. Why, we can make fresh cinnamon doughnuts in a torrential downpour and while we work, we sing merry camp songs!

On the second day of rain, we're not singing, but we manage very nicely with a red hat, Monopoly tournament and a trip to the nearest village.

On the third day of rain, things are grim. Everything is wet including the inside of our sleeping bags, and the tent is leaking because curious fingers have touched the canvas (to see if touching the canvas really makes it leak).

In my belief, my only way to get even on this third day of rain is to TRY to be a good camper. But as I slouch down to the washroom with my toothbrush in my pocket and a wet towel tucked under my rain coat, the entire area looks to me like a redneck camp.

There's mud everywhere and just a few brave fires are still smoking. Before these tent stanzas group together, they stand as garbled children, their parents hanging down below their rain coats. It's a dismal sight.

Back at our tent there is no question of climbing to the top of the tent. The matches are wet. The stove has the sputters and the corn cobs are so limp they pour reluctantly from the box.

My stomach, outdoor family continues to take the rain in stride. It's a good day for dignified worms' our eight-year-old mumbles through a mouthful of corn flakes.

"We could go on a moose hunt," suggests a bright-eyed daughter. It's the moose hunt that makes me fall apart! I stamp my foot in a puddle and plead to go home. I cry for my electric stove, my tiled bathroom, my warm dry bed. I show my family that I'm nothing but a content-loving city girl.

Just at that moment my husband betrays my family and shows my true colors. "... the light breaks through the plastic tent and the sun comes out."

What Should Be Done? He's High Risk for Heart Attack

Dear Reader—One way to find out if a person can tolerate a medicine is to give it to him. Your husband has tolerated his medicine for a year without difficulty.

It is difficult to know for certain what you mean by normal cholesterol, since normal means different things to different physicians. Risk factors for heart disease are applied directly to the individual, since some people have high blood cholesterol levels and live for several decades without any significant difficulty.

Many people can significantly lower their blood-fat levels (both the cholesterol and triglycerides measurement) by proper dietary control. This means limiting intake of cholesterol, fat, and triglyceride fat and a blood-protein.

We have read your comments about some medicines and we would like to know if this medicine can cause him any harm. Since dieting alone kept his cholesterol level down, does he really need it?

My advice to you would be that if your husband still has any evidence of obesity at all, he should take measures to eliminate it. Also, if he is smoking he should stop. This is also true because of his ulcer problem.
