Meanwhile, Back At The Ranch Meanwhile, back at the western ranch. it may be that the only thing President Nixon really has to fear is his own recurrent impulse to make his version of a a rousing political speech.

Senator McGovern, with his promises and his platform and his associates, is the kind of target Mr. Nixon has, throughout his political career, liked to attempt to destroy. The lucky thing about Mr. Nixon is that he has somehow managed to survive in spite of his own styles of campaign oratory. But if he wants to survive this latest, and probably last test of his political career, he should be careful not to sully his own good reelection credentials with attacks on the opposition which might end up creating sympathy

President Nixon has positive things to talk about, and the temptation of seeing Senator McGovern as a sitting duck, vulnerable and easily destroyed, is a temptation he should resist.

The one thing President Nixon himself, and those who campaign for him, should ndependent voters or even the Democrats themselves to forget that this Republican President has accomplished things no Democratic President would have dared attempt.

This Republican President has brought home 500,000 men from Vietnam. He has been to Peking. He has been to Moscow. He has negotiated the SALT agree-

Any Democrat who might have been in the White House during this same period might have wanted to do some of these things, but would never have dared do a single one of them.

This is the great central strength of the President's claim to reelection. This is where he is unassallable, and where attacks on him will themselves seem 'ir-

On domestic issues, the position of the

President is somewhat less assured. He has experimented, on the economic front, even to the extent of adopting some remedies once favored by the Democrats, but the result is still something short of a clear upward curve for prosperity and employment by election day The President has given his name to historic welfare reform proposals, but turned away from really pressing for their enactment. He has chosen to be more demagogic than thoughtful on the symbolic racial issue of busing, and no observer is wise enough to know whether he is, in the end, going to have a net gain or loss from moving himself that close to

But any summary estimate of President Nixon's position has to wind up evaluating it as strong, and deserving

Governor Wallace.

The Nixon campaign, therefore, should leave the desperation type campaign oratory to the opposition and let the "new politics" have as much monopoly on the oratorical strategies of the "old politica" as it chooses. This is, history-wise, the kind of campaign President Roosevelt faced in the year when he finally replied to a scurrilous Republican attack on his dog Fala. Then, as now, the pledge was that somebody would do the same thing the incumbent President was doing, but somehow do it faster and better. An opposition party reduced to that kind of pledge seldom wins an election unless somebody tilts the charisma mercury the wrong way. Mr. Nixon should remain the President, and resist the temptation to become too much of a campaigner.
